3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And now we have
4 a couple of Fact-Finding Hearings. And these
5 Fact-Finding Hearings involve personnel issues,
6 so, in those cases, we ask that only the party
7 involved be in the hearing room to respect their
8 privacy.

9 And the first Fact-Finding Hearing is
10 with respect to Mr. Jose Pineda. That's right,
11 yes. Thank you.

12 Mr. Rivero, I'm sorry, would you mind
13 taking the conversation outside, so that we can
14 have a private personnel hearing? Thank you very
15 much. Okay. Good morning, Mr. Pineda.

16 MR. PINEDA: Good morning. My name is
17 Jose Pineda.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry, what
19 did you say?

20 MR. PINEDA: My name is Jose Pineda.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you. And
22 did you sign-in as well?

1 MR. PINEDA: I sign this.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. On that
3 piece of paper?

4 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good. You have
6 applied for a manager's license. And the reason
7 we asked you to come in is some Board Members had
8 some questions relating to your application.

9 MR. PINEDA: Yes, I'm aware.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I'm going
11 to start off, but I'm not going to do the
12 majority of the questioning. Okay.

13 So you filed an application and I
14 believe you checked a box which said, you know,
15 it asked whether you had been convicted of a
16 misdemeanor during the last five years or felony
17 during the last 10 years and you said no. You
18 checked no in your box. It was Question No. 8.

19 And then we have attached to your
20 application your records, official records
21 regarding any convictions. And I think there may
22 have been a discrepancy with respect to actually

1 having been convicted.

2 MR. PINEDA: Yes. Actually, when I --

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So do you want to
4 start with that and then we will follow-up?

5 MR. PINEDA: Yes. Actually, when I
6 filed the paper, I was --

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Pineda, can you
8 move that microphone a little bit closer to
9 yourself, please.

10 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: And speak into it.

12 MR. PINEDA: So when I applied for the
13 first time, I knew that I was --

14 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Excuse me, Mr.
15 Pineda, can you move the speaker a little closer?
16 Thank you, sir. Thank you.

17 MR. PINEDA: Yes. When I applied the
18 first time, I knew what I did, but I was like --
19 I wasn't thinking that it was a felony.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: You what? I'm sorry.

21 MR. PINEDA: I didn't think it was
22 like a felony. It was like a mistake I made. I

1 wasn't supposed to check the box.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

3 MR. PINEDA: Or a felony or other.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Could you speak
5 a little louder? We are having trouble --

6 MR. PINEDA: Yes, sorry. When I
7 applied for my license --

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

9 MR. PINEDA: -- I know there was a box
10 that asked for convictions.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

12 MR. PINEDA: And it was my fault that
13 I marked no.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

15 MR. PINEDA: I had one.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You marked no.
17 You consciously marked no?

18 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And why
20 did you do that?

21 MR. PINEDA: Because I wasn't thinking
22 like it was like a big deal, which I made

1 mistake. I realize it was a big mistake I made.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You realize you
3 made a mistake?

4 MR. PINEDA: Yes, when I marked the
5 box no.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: When did you
7 realize you made a mistake?

8 MR. PINEDA: Later when I got my --
9 when I went to get the record.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: When you went to
11 get your records?

12 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And did you take
14 any action to correct your mistake?

15 MR. PINEDA: I did.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You did?

17 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What did you do?

19 MR. PINEDA: I took the classes like
20 I was supposed to take classes. I completed.
21 And I been calling my case manager every like
22 once a month.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I'm going
2 to let others have some questions. Mr. Alberti,
3 did you have some questions?

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Good morning, Mr.
5 Pineda. Thank you, Ms. Miller.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Pineda, okay, we
8 all make mistakes. So you made a mistake on your
9 application. Okay. But I want to talk about
10 your bigger mistake, the one about 10 months ago.
11 All right?

12 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: You were arrested for
14 DWI --

15 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- in April of 2014.

17 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Did they do a
19 breathalyzer, the blood test? What did they do?

20 MR. PINEDA: They did a breathalyzer.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Do you know what the
22 level was?

1 MR. PINEDA: I was like .7 the first
2 night I was in.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: .7?

4 MR. PINEDA: I mean, 0.07.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: .07. Okay. All
6 right.

7 MR. PINEDA: And then, sorry, they
8 make a second one when I was in the station and
9 it reads 0.0 -- 10.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Pardon?

11 MR. PINEDA: They make a second test.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

13 MR. PINEDA: It reads 0.10. So it was
14 going up.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. 0.10?

16 MR. PINEDA: Yes. That was when they
17 did the second.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, .10, okay. So
19 that implies to me, I mean, I don't know for
20 sure, that you had been drinking recently before
21 you got in the car.

22 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So how does --
2 I mean, what was going on?

3 MR. PINEDA: Oh, I was just going to--
4 I was with my cousin.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

6 MR. PINEDA: And I was going to drop
7 him off at his place and then I was going back to
8 my --

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: So where had you been
10 drinking?

11 MR. PINEDA: In my place, in my house.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: In your house?

13 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So you were
15 given 100 -- you were sentenced to 180 days and
16 it was suspended. What else did they -- what
17 other conditions did they put on you?

18 MR. PINEDA: Well, I had to take
19 classes, the alcoholic classes.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. How many
21 classes was that?

22 MR. PINEDA: 10 days. I mean, 10

1 weeks, two hours per week.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Two hours per week?

3 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: 10 --

5 MR. PINEDA: And I completed.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: You completed that?

7 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

9 MR. PINEDA: And then it was my
10 optional if I can have interlock occur.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm sorry, speak up
12 a little bit.

13 MR. PINEDA: So it was like my option
14 to have this interlock in the car installed.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

16 MR. PINEDA: For six months, which I
17 did.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: So for six months you
19 had that little --

20 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- it's like a thing
22 to test whether you are too drunk to drive?

1 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. In the
3 car.

4 MR. PINEDA: For the last six months,
5 yes.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. And is
7 that all over now?

8 MR. PINEDA: It's going to be over
9 this month, at the end of the month.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: At the end of the
11 month.

12 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Where will you
14 be working if you get this license or where are
15 you working now, I mean?

16 MR. PINEDA: I work in Georgetown
17 restaurant called Peacock Cafe.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Called what?

19 MR. PINEDA: Peacock Cafe.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Peacock?

21 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Lastly, what

1 have you learned?

2 MR. PINEDA: Oh, I learned not to
3 drink and drive like in a hard way.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry, what
5 did you say?

6 MR. PINEDA: I learned like not to
7 drink and drive at the same time.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: So how do you manage
9 that?

10 MR. PINEDA: No, I don't drink any
11 more if I drive. I don't have this alcoholic
12 drink and I just like once in a month or like a
13 special occasion.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. I have no
15 further questions.

16 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Mr. Short.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Short?

18 MEMBER SHORT: Good morning, sir.

19 MR. PINEDA: Good morning, sir.

20 MEMBER SHORT: How long have you been
21 in the United States of America?

22 MR. PINEDA: I been here since 1997.

1 MEMBER SHORT: Since '97?

2 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

3 MEMBER SHORT: And you know the laws
4 of the country?

5 MR. PINEDA: Yes. Not 100 percent,
6 but I --

7 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Now let me ask
8 you this, if this license was permitted to you
9 and someone said in the bar and you were serving
10 or you had your manager's license, would you
11 serve him if you thought they had too much
12 alcohol?

13 MR. PINEDA: No.

14 MEMBER SHORT: You would not?

15 MR. PINEDA: Can you repeat the
16 question?

17 MEMBER SHORT: If you were granted
18 this application that you have put into this
19 Board to be an ABC Manager and you were serving
20 at a bar, would you serve someone you suspected
21 of having drank too much?

22 MR. PINEDA: I would not serve this

1 person.

2 MEMBER SHORT: You would not serve
3 this person?

4 MR. PINEDA: No. If I know the person
5 is already drunk.

6 MEMBER SHORT: And why wouldn't you
7 serve that person?

8 MR. PINEDA: Because I'm concerned
9 this guy if he gets more drinks, he might like go
10 outside and get hit by a car or he might be
11 driving or something.

12 MEMBER SHORT: Very dangerous, isn't
13 it?

14 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

15 MEMBER SHORT: Do you know the ratio
16 of people that die from people that drive behind
17 the wheel that have drank too much?

18 MR. PINEDA: I believe a lot. It's a
19 lot of people.

20 MEMBER SHORT: What did you answer?

21 MR. PINEDA: I believe it's a lot of
22 people who die.

1 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Well, I'm not
2 one to throw stones. Life has given me a couple
3 of second chances myself and the Board has called
4 you in today to see whether or not we should give
5 you a second chance to do this. But do you
6 realize Washington, D.C. has a major problem with
7 underage drinking and drunkenness of people
8 driving cars?

9 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

10 MEMBER SHORT: How would you help
11 prevent that from being worse?

12 MR. PINEDA: First of all, if I work
13 in a place like not to sell alcohol to anybody
14 underage. I would also tell my colleagues not to
15 do the same thing. Like not -- if somebody like
16 a friend ask for a drink and like to make sure
17 this guy is over 21 to drink.

18 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Well, since your
19 last arrest, have you had a drink?

20 MR. PINEDA: No drink.

21 MEMBER SHORT: You don't drink
22 anything any more?

1 MR. PINEDA: No. Only like in where
2 I work they do the wine tasting. It's like one
3 sip, two sips and that's it.

4 MEMBER SHORT: So you have had
5 alcohol?

6 MR. PINEDA: Yes. Because they do
7 like wine tasting once a month. That's the only
8 alcohol I taste the wine.

9 MEMBER SHORT: Do you think that's
10 kind of tampering with the -- with your
11 resistance because you have already had these
12 three arrests?

13 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

14 MEMBER SHORT: It's kind of dangerous?

15 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

16 MEMBER SHORT: I have no further
17 questions. Thank you.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.
19 Rodriguez?

20 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. Mr. Pineda,
21 good morning.

22 MR. PINEDA: Good morning, sir.

1 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Glad you are here.
2 We just wanted to talk to you and make sure that
3 we understand, you know, that you understand --

4 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

5 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: -- how important
6 your job is in terms of managing the liquor
7 situation in your establishment.

8 So we take very seriously the control
9 and safety of your clients. And so you are going
10 to be responsible in managing that liquor license
11 and making sure that those clients don't over do
12 it. Okay? And that's why we wanted you here, in
13 addition to wanting to meet you.

14 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

15 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: You know, we wanted
16 to make sure that you understand how seriously we
17 take your job.

18 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

19 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: And so thank you
20 for coming in. I appreciate it.

21 MR. PINEDA: Thank you, sir. Thank
22 you for having me in.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Other questions?

2 Mr. Brooks?

3 MEMBER BROOKS: Yes, just one

4 question. Mr. Pineda?

5 MR. PINEDA: Pineda.

6 MEMBER BROOKS: Pineda, okay. We

7 called you in to see you face-to-face. And we

8 expect, of course, honest answers from you.

9 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

10 MEMBER BROOKS: Correct? Now, you

11 said that you haven't had a drink in quite a

12 while, other than wine tasting?

13 MR. PINEDA: Yes. For the -- since

14 like April, since I was arrested.

15 MEMBER BROOKS: April, okay. But you

16 haven't had a drink say this morning, today

17 early?

18 MR. PINEDA: No.

19 MEMBER BROOKS: No drinks?

20 MR. PINEDA: Just like coffee, water.

21 No drinks.

22 MEMBER BROOKS: Just coffee this

1 morning?

2 MR. PINEDA: Yes.

3 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. Thank you,
4 Madam Chair.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I just
6 have one other question, because I am looking at
7 the record that we have before us. And with
8 respect to the disposition of your case with, you
9 know, the 180 days suspended, etcetera. It says
10 something like transport minor child to/from
11 court ordered facility, to/from place of
12 religious worship.

13 MR. PINEDA: Yes. I have a --

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What is that
15 about?

16 MR. PINEDA: -- little girl and I
17 brought her to school every morning.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Oh, so you
19 were allowed to drive her to -- drive just to
20 those places?

21 MR. PINEDA: Yes, yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All right.

1 Any other questions? Any motions, at this point,
2 or does the Board wish to take this under
3 advisement?

4 MEMBER BROOKS: I would take it under
5 advisement.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All right.
7 So what that means is we've got, you know, the
8 information that we needed to get, to meet you,
9 ask you questions that were on our mind.

10 MR. PINEDA: Okay. Thank you.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And we are going
12 to now, not now, but when we are finished with
13 the hearings, review your record one more time
14 and then we will let you know.

15 MR. PINEDA: Okay. Thank you.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Thank you
17 very much.

18 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Good luck, sir.

19 MR. PINEDA: Thank you.
