The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., 4th Floor, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Miller, presiding.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good afternoon. We are back on the record. We have two matters on the record for this afternoon. One is a fact finding hearing for a pub crawl and the other is protest hearing. So, we are going to -- they both say 1:30. We're going to go forward with the fact finding hearing first because that's pretty limited. That'll go faster.

So, okay. You're here for the pub crawl?

MR. ORLOVE: Fact finding. Yes.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Come take a seat at the table.

MR. ORLOVE: Sure.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And are you all here for the protest?

MS. ELIZABETH KIM: Yes.

MR. STEWART: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,

1 we're going to hear them first. So, it'll be
2 at least 10 minutes.

3 Okay. Why don't we start with
4 introductions?

5 MR. ORLOVE: Sure. My name's Matt
6 Orlove. We met last August I think about a
7 Halloween pub crawl we were doing.

8 This is Edwardo Romano. He works
9 with me in our New York office as well. He's
10 actually going to be the on-site event manager
11 for the actual event for St. Patrick's Day
12 weekend. So, he'll be here.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. You
14 did -- oh, and then I'll let our investigator
15 introduce himself, too. Mr. Ghenene.

16 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I'm sorry.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I was just
18 going to let you introduce yourself.

19 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I
20 apologize.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: That's okay.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: ABRA

1 Investigator Abyie Ghenene.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
3 and, Mr. Orlove, would you just remind me
4 which pub crawl you did?

5 MR. ORLOVE: We did a Halloween
6 pub crawl. It was on just that Saturday. I
7 think it was the 27th. We did intend on also
8 doing one on December 16th, but because we
9 didn't sell as many tickets as we really
10 wanted to, we actually cancelled it
11 beforehand.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

13 MR. ORLOVE: So, we didn't do it.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And what was
15 the neighborhood you did the last time?

16 MR. ORLOVE: It was Dupont Circle.
17 It was on Dupont.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
19 are these the same establishments or similar
20 ones or --

21 MR. ORLOVE: This is actually some
22 of the same ones, but we actually have more on

1 this particular one.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

3 MR. ORLOVE: We're expecting --
4 for St. Patrick's Day is usually our biggest
5 bar crawls we do during the year. So, we have
6 a lot more venues than we usually do.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
8 your venues are they identified?

9 MR. ORLOVE: Yes.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Where?

11 MR. ORLOVE: On the third page.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
13 there are 15?

14 MR. ORLOVE: Fifteen.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And have they
16 all been approved by ABRA? Have you made sure
17 that they can all participate because some
18 cannot, some are restricted from voluntary
19 agreements, things like that?

20 MR. ORLOVE: Right. Well, I did
21 send them I think two weeks ago/a week ago.
22 So, I'm not sure if anything's been --

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All
2 right. So, Mr. Ghenene can probably respond
3 to that.

4 On page 3, you list all the
5 establishments that are participating?

6 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Yes, ma'am.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Did you have
8 a chance to review them?

9 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: No, ma'am.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Or no not
11 yet.

12 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: No, ma'am.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: No one else
14 inside has.

15 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: As far as I
16 know, no.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

18 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: But, I can
19 and will.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

21 MR. ORLOVE: If any have any
22 issues, we have no problems scratching them.

1 Not putting them on the bar crawl. Not a
2 problem.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Do you
4 want to give a quick overview of what's going
5 to happen?

6 MR. ORLOVE: Sure. And I'll just
7 kind of tell you a little bit about the
8 company. I know we kind of went over it last
9 time.

10 But, our main company is called
11 June Bug. We specialize in producing holiday
12 events not just bar crawls. We did 120 New
13 Year's Eve parties all over the country.

14 Usually, what we'll do is we buy
15 out the venue. We'll bring in DJs and it's
16 usually just a nightly event.

17 We did not do anything in D.C. We
18 have not done anything in D.C. in the past,
19 but our goal is to hopefully do something this
20 New Year's Eve. Possible Halloween as well.

21 We started Barcrawls.com in 2010.
22 We started bar crawls in just New York, Boston

1 and Philadelphia. The first time we did it
2 was actually St. Patrick's Day two years ago
3 or 2010 and we sold about 500 tickets. Last
4 year, we sold 12,500 tickets in those three
5 markets. So, this year, we are actually in 56
6 markets all over the country.

7 It's a three-day event. The
8 Friday event is actually just the kick-off
9 party. It's just like a happy hour at one
10 venue. We usually don't sell a lot of tickets
11 for it, but we have that so that we can work
12 with deal sites like Groupon so we're able to
13 sell more tickets. It's a lot more attractive
14 to have like a whole entire package to them as
15 opposed to just one event.

16 The bar crawls, there's one on
17 Saturday which is the one we're expecting to
18 be really big. It's from 11:00 a.m. until
19 2:00 a.m. From 11:00 a.m. From 11:00 -- yes,
20 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 a.m. Registration goes
21 from 11:00 a.m. until 6:00. Someone shows up
22 at registration at 7:30, they're not going to

1 be able to get a bracelet to participate.

2 We're also doing the bar crawl on
3 Sunday as well at that same times because
4 Sunday's actually St. Patrick's Day, but we
5 don't expect to sell as many tickets as we do
6 on the Saturday one.

7 Conservatively, I think we'll sell
8 500 tickets. If we sell a thousand tickets,
9 we're going to be ecstatic. I don't think
10 we'll go over a thousand, but if for some
11 reason we do, we'll take measures and have
12 more security. Whatever we need in order to
13 make sure that you guys are happy about it.

14 That's it.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Did
16 you coordinate with MPD at all?

17 MR. ORLOVE: We're meeting with
18 Commander Reese at 5:30. It was between 5:30
19 tonight or 8:30 in the morning and we're in
20 New York. So, it was early. So, we're going
21 to meet him at 5:30.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,

1 what is your security plan?

2 MR. ORLOVE: So, we work with Blue
3 Line. That's the security company we worked
4 with last time.

5 We will have one registration
6 spot. In order to register, you have to go
7 there to get your bracelet, to get your cups,
8 to get you maps.

9 So, we'll have a table that will
10 be out front. We'll have Eddie there. We'll
11 have a cashier and we'll have a security
12 guard. There will be line for people to
13 register. As they show up, the security guard
14 will be checking their actual IDs to make sure
15 they're over age. If they are, we'll be able
16 to register them and give them their bracelets
17 and cups.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Where is
19 registration going to be?

20 MR. ORLOVE: McFadden's.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. What
22 kind of wrist bands are you going to use?

1 MR. ORLOVE: If you go to the last
2 page, this is a copy of what it looks like.
3 It's actually a green wristband and it will
4 have our logo Barcrawls.com.

5 The wristband does not give you
6 access to the actual venues. The venues will
7 have their own bouncers and security out front
8 to check IDs. The wristband is only for the
9 bartenders to know that they're part of the
10 bar crawl and they can give them the drink
11 specials.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
13 each place has drink specials. How secure are
14 these wristbands? I mean can they be taken
15 off and put on somebody else or --

16 MR. ORLOVE: Not really because
17 it's like tape. So, the only way to take it
18 off is to rip it and the only way to get a new
19 one if you rip it is to actually get another
20 wristband put on you. So, you can't actually
21 just take the tape off.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. ORLOVE: I can actually send
2 you guys one if you want to actually see how
3 it is. They're pretty light. The tape is --
4 the adhesive is pretty strong.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

6 MR. ORLOVE: You have to literally
7 rip it off.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Are
9 you using any special containers for like cups
10 or anything for the drinks?

11 MR. ORLOVE: We do have cups.
12 They have our logos on it. They're -- I think
13 they're 12 ounces, but the venues don't have
14 to use those cups. A lot of times they want
15 to use their own glasses and also because
16 there's also mixed drinks or beers like most
17 people don't want to mix them anyways. But,
18 we do give them because it's like a souvenir.
19 We're doing our branding.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I
21 think there's been some instances where
22 participants have taken drinks out or the cops

1 can't tell what kind of liquid is in these
2 cups. Whether they're drinking on the streets
3 or not.

4 MR. ORLOVE: Okay.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And I don't
6 know if you can address it at least to your
7 bars that are participating that they're not
8 allowed to leave with any liquid in their cups
9 or something to that affect.

10 MR. ORLOVE: Absolutely. We'll
11 100 percent make sure that all the venues --
12 I'm sure the venues all know that, too, that
13 if anyone -- no one's going to be able to
14 leave with drinks. But, we'll take extra
15 caution to make sure that they check to make
16 sure when people are leaving there's nothing
17 inside them.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
19 we've seen some cups where it looks like
20 there's liquid, but there isn't. Do you know
21 what those cups look like?

22 MR. ORLOVE: No. Yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: There we go.

2 MR. ORLOVE: It's not what --

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You don't
4 have. You're not using that kind.

5 MR. ORLOVE: We're very cheap.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.
7 Board Members have any questions?

8 MEMBER BROOKS: I do.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

10 MEMBER BROOKS: What are the hours
11 of the crawl?

12 MR. ORLOVE: It goes from 11:00
13 a.m. until 2:00 a.m.

14 MEMBER BROOKS: All three days?

15 MR. ORLOVE: Just the two days.
16 Just Saturday and Sunday.

17 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. Friday is
18 the happy -- okay.

19 MR. ORLOVE: Right. And by the
20 way, usually with our bar crawls, most people
21 don't show up early. They show up usually
22 later, but we have it from the scope so that

1 people can kind of make their own schedule.

2 But, you can only register until 6:00 p.m.

3 After 6:00 p.m., you can't.

4 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. And, Mr.
5 Romano, are you going to be physically here in
6 D.C.?

7 MR. ROMANO: I sure will be. I'll
8 make a clone if I have to.

9 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. No, we
10 don't need a clone.

11 The phone number, now, is there a
12 phone number that they can reach you on in
13 case of an emergency?

14 MR. ROMANO: I don't know if I
15 added one here, but I definitely can make --
16 I can give my cell phone and yes, I will have
17 a mobile on me throughout the entire time. I
18 would also be in contact with Commander Reese
19 throughout and assisting him to secure -- make
20 sure everything is safe.

21 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. So, if one
22 of the licensee encounter a problem with one

1 of the participants and he wanted to notify
2 the other bars to then look out for this
3 person who's acting up and acting out, is
4 there a number they can call for that
5 information to be relayed to the other
6 establishments?

7 MR. ROMANO: Yes, I'm in contact.
8 I'm physically in contact and have been
9 building a relationship with point personnel
10 in each one of the venues. So, that should
11 anything happen down the course of the line of
12 the three days, we can all be on the same page
13 and unanimously blacklist someone or remove a
14 particular special that might be causing a
15 problem. Whatever the case may be.

16 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. And you
17 indicated that there are going to be cups with
18 your logo on them.

19 MR. ROMANO: Right.

20 MEMBER BROOKS: So, the venues
21 have these cups? Is that how you're
22 dispersing them?

1 MR. ROMANO: No, they'll receive
2 those at the registration point.

3 MEMBER BROOKS: Registration.

4 MR. ROMANO: Along with their
5 wristbands.

6 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay.

7 MR. ROMANO: Yes, and I wanted to
8 add as far as the specials as well, although
9 we have the scope of 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m.,
10 most venues won't be participating throughout
11 the entire time frame. We have -- they
12 designated certain time slots they want to
13 give their specials. Which makes it more of
14 a rush. Let's go to the next spot and --

15 MEMBER BROOKS: Sure.

16 MR. ROMANO: -- moving on. It's
17 not going to be an all out 11:00 a.m. to 2:00
18 a.m. drink fest.

19 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. Thank you,
20 Madam Chair. That's all I have.

21 MR. ORLOVE: Can I add one more
22 thing, too?

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

2 MR. ORLOVE: We actually have --
3 we'll have a full staff in our office as well,
4 our New York office. So, if there are any
5 issues, too, we can have our staff there
6 making phones to the venues, too, to let them
7 know if there's any issues with any people in
8 the crawls.

9 MEMBER BROOKS: So, you have
10 someone there until 2:00 a.m.? To 2:00 a.m.?

11 MR. ORLOVE: Yes, they'll be --
12 our office will be there until 7:00.

13 MEMBER BROOKS: Yes, right. Okay.
14 But, the bar crawl itself is from 11:00 a.m.
15 to 2:00 a.m.

16 MR. ORLOVE: Correct. Correct.

17 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. Thank you,
18 Madam Chair.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Romano
20 will be available until 2:00 a.m. Right?

21 MR. ROMANO: Yes, I'll be -- yes,
22 be available --

1 MEMBER BROOKS: Be here in D.C.

2 MR. ROMANO: -- and for breakdown
3 as well. So, at 2:00 a.m., my phone doesn't
4 go off. I'll be here to break down and again,
5 it's about building the relationship with the
6 establishments and the managers of venues to
7 make sure everything went, you know, 100
8 percent so that we can possibly do this in the
9 future.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, the
11 establishments will have your cell phone as
12 emergency contact.

13 MR. ROMANO: They already have it.
14 Yes.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How about
16 participants? If they're, you know, walking
17 around and they have a problem, can they call
18 you? Is there an emergency --

19 MR. ROMANO: We will have help
20 line available as Mr. Orlove explained. We
21 will have a help line set up in the office to
22 receive calls and then they'll dispatch them

1 or relay them over to us.

2 The managers of the establishment,
3 they're not allowed to give out the cell phone
4 per se, but an email definitely if in the
5 event that they needed to contact the customer
6 service rep for that matter and if I can get
7 to them, I'll definitely be able to contact
8 them.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I'm
10 not exactly following.

11 MR. ROMANO: Okay.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, if
13 there's a participant, a young adult
14 participating and somebody gets sick or ill
15 from, you know, alcohol poisoning or whatever
16 and they want an emergency contact, they're
17 part of this pub crawl, can they call you or
18 do they have some emergency number to call?

19 MR. ROMANO: My number will --
20 yes, if it's an emergency basis, absolutely.
21 Absolutely. My number's available and I'll do
22 everything that I can to help resolve the

1 situation.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
3 and how will they have it? Are you going to
4 have a flyer for --

5 MR. ROMANO: No, each
6 establishment will have my contact
7 information. So, there's a point person at
8 each establishment that's participating.
9 They'll have my contact information. So you
10 want to --

11 MR. ORLOVE: I'll make it even
12 easier. We do a bar crawl map that has all
13 the venues that are participating --

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

15 MR. ORLOVE: -- their drink
16 specials. On the bottom, we'll put a note
17 that says for special assistance --

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Emergency.

19 MR. ORLOVE: -- please contact
20 Eddie and it'll have his phone number.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I
22 think that's a good idea.

1 MR. ORLOVE: And we'll send you a
2 copy of that to proof before the actual bar
3 crawl.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I know
5 other pub crawls have done that.

6 MR. ORLOVE: Yes.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You know, so,
8 and the other thing that they have done is
9 given numbers or information for public
10 transportation. I mean you're obviously doing
11 it -- well, you have a map, but --

12 MR. ORLOVE: Yes.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- so as to
14 discourage driving, if you can provide some
15 information who they can call.

16 MR. ORLOVE: Yes. On the actual
17 ticketing site, there's going to be something
18 called helpful hints and we'll actually have
19 nearest train stations and different phone
20 numbers or anything that people can reach out
21 to as well.

22 But, we'll definitely make sure

1 all the literature, what people have with the
2 maps, that his number will be there. Also,
3 our main office number in New York will be
4 there, too, if someone needs to contact our
5 office as well.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
7 are you -- I'm not sure how familiar you are
8 with what's available like in D.C. because it
9 sounds like you're from New York and you're
10 from New York?

11 MR. ROMANO: Correct.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
13 there might be someone to tell you what kind
14 of public transportation is available in
15 general and I know that people have brought up
16 My Taxi. Apparently, it's a number they can
17 call for D.C. cabs, but they can call it. I'm
18 not particularly familiar with it. I'm not
19 trying to promote something, but I'm just
20 saying that because you might not be aware
21 since you're not in D.C. You might need to
22 talk to just few other people for what's

1 available.

2 MR. ORLOVE: Sure.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: The other
4 thing that we have heard done during pub
5 crawls is someone roves, you know, around the
6 pub crawls just to see how things are going.
7 They're actually out and about.

8 Do you plan to do that?

9 MR. ROMANO: Yes, I do.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
11 you would be around to watch how things are
12 going.

13 MR. ROMANO: Absolutely.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any
15 other questions? Okay. Mr. Ghenene.

16 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Thank you.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

18 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: So, the
19 name of the pub crawl is Green Kegs and
20 Hammered.

21 MR. ORLOVE: Correct.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. Is

1 the registration point going to be at
2 McFadden's on both days?

3 MR. ORLOVE: Yes.

4 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: So, there
5 will not be registration at Buffalo Billiards?

6 MR. ORLOVE: No. Is that --

7 MR. ROMANO: That's old.

8 MR. ORLOVE: It's an older one.

9 MR. ROMANO: Yes.

10 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: So, it's at
11 McFadden's both days?

12 MR. ROMANO: Correct.

13 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. And
14 have you guys spoken with the different
15 establishments to see if they're going to
16 allow patrons under 18 to be in their
17 establishment on the days of your event?

18 MR. ORLOVE: None of them will.

19 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: So, even
20 though they might be allowed to or that might
21 be their policy, you're saying that this
22 weekend they'll be no one under 18 inside?

1 MR. ORLOVE: All of the venues
2 that we have should just be for -- you
3 actually should probably answer that more.
4 Going to be at restaurants.

5 MR. ROMANO: Yes, all of our
6 establishments are restaurants and will be
7 providing food. I wasn't made aware that
8 anyone under the age of 21 would be allowed
9 into these establishments because it's all
10 going to be cornered off bars.

11 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

12 MR. ROMANO: Yes, I wasn't aware
13 that they would allow anyone underage, but I
14 can definitely check in to make sure of that
15 and make them aware that -- to add in another
16 level of security. I don't know if the
17 bartenders will be checking IDs, but if we
18 would have to add an additional security level
19 to insure that there's no one under the age of
20 21 who can consume.

21 In order to be a part of the bar
22 crawl, you have to definitely be over 21.

1 Yes.

2 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Well, I
3 mean I don't want to tell you that that's what
4 you have to do. I'm asking questions.

5 MR. ROMANO: Yes, well, I kind of
6 almost assumed that all the establishments
7 only allowed over 21 because they're only
8 bars.

9 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

10 MR. ROMANO: Yes.

11 MR. ORLOVE: We will double check.

12 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Check into
13 it.

14 MR. ROMANO: Yes, I'll double
15 check. Absolutely.

16 MR. ORLOVE: And then we'll get
17 back just to make sure.

18 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Fantastic.

19 MR. ROMANO: Yes.

20 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. Do
21 you know if they're going to be offering free
22 tastings? Is that part of your --

1 MR. ROMANO: No.

2 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: -- specials
3 or anything?

4 MR. ROMANO: No.

5 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: No, they're
6 not?

7 MR. ROMANO: They are no offering
8 anything free.

9 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.
10 Okay. The kick-off party, are they going to
11 be allowed to register that night?

12 MR. ORLOVE: No.

13 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: No one's
14 allowed and where's the kick-off party?

15 MR. ORLOVE: The kick-off party's
16 most likely going to be at Sign of a Whale.

17 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

18 MR. ORLOVE: We haven't picked it
19 and like I said, we're not expecting to sell
20 more than 50 tickets to those. We only do it
21 just for the deal sites.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I

1 understand. But, it's probably going to be at
2 Sign of the Whale?

3 MR. ORLOVE: Correct.

4 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

5 MR. ORLOVE: Or McFadden's.

6 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Or

7 McFadden's.

8 MR. ORLOVE: One of the two.

9 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

10 Okay.

11 MR. ORLOVE: We have a
12 relationship with them all over the country.
13 That's why we --

14 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I got ya.
15 This is the flyer for the events?

16 MR. ORLOVE: Yes.

17 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I notice
18 that there's no food specials advertised on
19 here. Are there going to be food specials
20 that night? Have you guys negotiated that at
21 different places or --

22 MR. ROMANO: There are. There are

1 a number of establishments that have already
2 provided us with food specials.

3 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

4 MR. ROMANO: They'll become
5 available to the patrons that are
6 participating on the day of.

7 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

8 MR. ROMANO: Once we have all the
9 specials --

10 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

11 MR. ROMANO: -- we'll give them
12 one list of all the specials and each
13 individual venue has given us whether it's
14 dollar dogs or, you know, hot wings or
15 whatever --

16 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

17 MR. ROMANO: -- in conjunction
18 with the drink specials.

19 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: So, it will
20 be distributed?

21 MR. ROMANO: Absolutely.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. And

1 are you guys working in conjunction with any
2 of the colleges around as far as advertising
3 and stuff like that?

4 MR. ORLOVE: Not really trying to
5 work with colleges. More like sporting
6 leagues is what we're really trying to go
7 after.

8 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.
9 Sporting leagues. Okay.

10 MR. ORLOVE: And not sporting
11 leagues that are associated with colleges.

12 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I
13 understand.

14 MR. ORLOVE: Regular ones.

15 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Like the
16 kick ball leagues.

17 MR. ORLOVE: Exactly.

18 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.
19 Okay. And this is the only type of wristband
20 that will be distributed?

21 MR. ORLOVE: Yes, that's it.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

1 MR. ORLOVE: The only time our
2 wristbands change is during holidays. Like if
3 it's Christmas, we use a red wristband.

4 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I
5 understand.

6 MR. ORLOVE: It's the same one.

7 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.
8 Okay. That's all I've got.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Other? Yes.

10 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I have a
11 question for Mr. Ghenene and that is have you
12 looked through the 15 participating venues and
13 can you assure us that they are all eligible?

14 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I have not,
15 but I will. Immediately following this
16 hearing, I'll look into it and make sure that
17 the voluntary agreements do not -- if they
18 exist, do not conflict with that.

19 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Not
20 necessarily the VAs, but just are they
21 eligible in terms of violations that they may
22 have had.

1 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Oh,
2 absolutely, I'll check into that.

3 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: There are one
4 or two there that seem to be quite familiar to
5 us.

6 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Yes.

7 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Thank you,
8 sir.

9 MR. ORLOVE: And just let us know
10 and if there's any problems, we'll make sure
11 they're no longer on it.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, if one or
13 two come off, would you just be going with the
14 remainder or would you be adding two more?

15 MR. ORLOVE: I think -- I think 15
16 is way more than enough. I would say usually
17 we would do eight to ten.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Could
19 you just remind me? I think you said
20 something about when they register there's
21 going to be come information for them. We're
22 talking about where you might put up your

1 contact number.

2 MR. ORLOVE: Sure.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And the
4 public transportation.

5 MR. ORLOVE: Sure. We're actually
6 going to have like -- we do like a bar crawl
7 map. It's usually a piece of paper, but it's
8 usually laminated on the back and has our
9 branding and on the front of it, it'll show
10 all the venues that are participating. It'll
11 have all the drink specials and all the food
12 specials.

13 So, if I want to go to McFadden's,
14 I can literally see if there's a \$3 draft
15 beer, a \$5 shot and half off on appetizers and
16 I know the exact times they'll be operating.

17 Because like he said, they might
18 only want to be open until 9:00 and then they
19 might have, you know, people have to pay to
20 get in. So, they want to be part of the bar
21 crawl.

22 On the bottom of this literature

1 that people are going to use because it's the
2 only way they're going to know which bars to
3 go to, which drink specials, we'll make sure
4 to put any pertinent information on the bottom
5 in a box. So, the box will Ed Romano, please
6 call for any emergencies. If we do find a My
7 Taxi or something like that that we can work
8 out a deal with, we'll have that information
9 on the bottom as well.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I mean
11 it may not be a deal thing. It just may be
12 public information.

13 MR. ORLOVE: Yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: This is how
15 you contact a taxi or something.

16 MR. ORLOVE: Right.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And this is
18 the closest Metro. So, that's all. Okay.
19 That sounds good. Okay.

20 So, it seems to me that -- I think
21 that we would -- yes.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: I'm sorry.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: No go ahead.

2 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Can I just
3 make a request that I get that map with the
4 different specials and the hours and all that
5 kind of stuff.

6 MR. ORLOVE: Of course.

7 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Fantastic.

8 MR. ORLOVE: We usually don't
9 print it out until like the week before.

10 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: That's
11 fine.

12 MR. ORLOVE: So -- and I'll make
13 sure to send it out to you.

14 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: That's
15 fine. That's fine. Perfect. Thank you.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I
17 think that -- okay. I was just conferring
18 because, you know, you're here before us today
19 and we've heard basically about the operations
20 of the crawl and I think that we want to vote
21 on it though we don't have everything exactly
22 in place.

1 So, I think what I would propose
2 is that we just, you know, conditionally vote
3 upon it pending, you know, the review that all
4 the establishments are -- whatever
5 establishments are okay. They don't have any
6 problems with ABRA and, you know, you work
7 that out with Mr. Ghenene and then also, you
8 will add the contact information onto that map
9 and also make that available to Mr. Ghenene to
10 review. Okay. So, that's what I would do.

11 Then I would move that we approve
12 the application as I articulated. Do I have
13 a second?

14 MEMBER BROOKS: I second.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any
16 other comments? Okay. All those in favor say
17 aye.

18 (Ayes.)

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those
20 opposed? All those abstaining? Okay. So,
21 the motion passes 3-0-0.

22 Okay. So, we're basically

1 approving it, but we'll sign off when we get,
2 you know, at least the establishments
3 approved.

4 Okay. Thank you. Good luck with
5 that.

6 MR. ORLOVE: Thanks.

7 MR. ROMANO: Did you need another
8 copy?

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I don't think
10 so. No. Thank you.

11 MR. ROMANO: Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Excuse me.
13 She would like a copy.

14 (Whereupon, at 1:57 p.m., the
15 hearing was adjourned.)
