The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street N.W., Washington, D.C., Chairperson Ruthanne Miller presiding.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, so that completes our Show Cause Status Hearing cases. And we next have a Fact Finding Hearing for the 54th Annual Sakura Matsuri-Japanese Street Festival. Oh, yes, come forward please.

The date of that event is April 12th, 2014. And the applicant is Mr. Hitzig, Japan-America Society of Washington.

(Off the record comments)

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you need to give us something?

MS.FOZARD: These are the answers to the questions that you sent.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, Ms. Walker will take them. Thank you. So if you would all sign in on that piece of paper. And then when you're ready introduce yourselves for the record.

MR. HITZIG: My name is Marc Hitzig, Executive Director of Japan-America

2 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I'm sorry,
3 could you speak up?

4 MR. HITZIG: My name is Marc
5 Hitzig, Executive Director of Japan-America
6 Society of Washington D.C.

7 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Thank you.

8 MS.FOZARD: My name is Colette
9 Fozard, I'm the Director of Operations for the
10 Sakura Matsuri-Japanese Street Festival.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 MR. BLANCHARD: Good morning, I'm
13 Lyle Blanchard, and I'm counsel for the Japan-
14 America Society.

15 MR. APRAKU: Good morning, I'm
16 Investigator Kofi Apraku with ABRA.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So I'm
18 looking at these questions and answers which
19 are very helpful. So how many years have you
20 been doing it here, for 54 years?

21 MR. HITZIG: Yes, we started off
22 as a bazaar. And then we made it down to the

1 Cherry Blossoms in 1992, the Freedom Blossom,
2 we've been down town since then.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, so we
4 understand that, you know, you're a very
5 reputable group. And you've always done a
6 good job. The reason you're here is I think
7 some Board Members just had concerns because
8 of the number of attendees and everything.

9 And just, we just want to check in
10 with you and see, you know, is anything
11 different from what you've been doing before?
12 And you know, in general what you're doing
13 with the alcohol?

14 So, first of all, I mean is there
15 anything different this year from last year?

16 MR. HITZIG: No, we will have just
17 as many security throughout the festival. We
18 have emergency exits that the fire marshal has
19 asked us to provide. And we'll have security
20 at those exits. We'll have two security
21 guards at every entrance of the festival,
22 which is also an exit.

1 We also will have two ID checkers,
2 professional ID checkers at each alcohol
3 place, the beer gardens and sake testing tent.
4 And each ID checker will, the first, well both
5 of them will check the same ID, twice.

6 And each person who is legal to
7 drink will have a wrist band and a hand stamp.
8 So we'll still be doing all these measurements
9 to ensure that there's no under age drinking.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So this is
11 just one day, 10:30 to 6? Okay.

12 MR. HITZIG: Yes, that's correct.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And where is
14 it held again?

15 MR. HITZIG: It's on Pennsylvania
16 Avenue between 9th and 14th streets.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And I
18 do remember somewhat from last year, so you,
19 the alcohol is in a beer garden, and in a sake
20 what?

21 (Crosstalk)

22 MR. HITZIG: Yes, last year we

1 changed it to allowing people to walk around
2 the festival with the beer.

3 And the sake is in a controlled
4 environment where it's a tasting. They get a
5 taste of six sakes plus one plum wine. And we
6 give them a bottle of water to go with it.

7 And they are, I believe the last
8 plum wine is, they are all an ounce. And they
9 are allowed to walk out of the pavilion with
10 the plum wine, which would be in a plastic
11 cup. Not in a glass.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: They can walk
13 out of the pavilion where the sake event is,
14 but they can't walk out of, with it right?

15 MR. HITZIG: No, not out of the
16 pavilion. Correct, sorry about that.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thanks okay.

18 MR. HITZIG: We give a souvenir
19 glass, shot glass that is donated by the sake
20 provider. And we don't let them carry that
21 outside the pavilion. I want to make that
22 clear. That is wrapped up in a paper towel

1 and they'll put that away.

2 MR. BLANCHARD: The entire
3 festival is a fenced event.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

5 MR. BLANCHARD: When we started in
6 '92, it was only on Freedom Plaza. And then
7 we expanded to 13th and ½ street and down to
8 9th. For many years, this is only the third
9 year it's been completely fenced in.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. How
11 many security do you have?

12 MR. HITZIG: We have approximately
13 40 to 50 police. We have 38 security guards,
14 roaming. And also that includes the ID
15 checkers.

16 And then we also have our trained
17 committee members that, we have 70 committee
18 members that are throughout the festival
19 wearing special coats.

20 They've all been trained what to
21 do if they find someone that's intoxicated or
22 not should be drinking.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Did you have
2 a question?

3 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Yes. Last
4 year you had this and had no problems?

5 MR. HITZIG: That's correct.

6 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: What, are
7 there any changes between last year and this
8 year in your plans?

9 MR. HITZIG: No, no. Since we
10 didn't have any problems we -- nothing was
11 reported to us that, any underage drinking --

12 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: The physical
13 setup is the same?

14 MR. HITZIG: Yes.

15 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: The security
16 is the same?

17 MR. HITZIG: Excuse me?

18 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: The security
19 is the same?

20 MR. HITZIG: Yes.

21 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Okay, that's
22 it. No further questions.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Other
2 questions?

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, I just do
4 have a quick question. Thank you for coming,
5 just real quick one, are you wrist banding
6 people who are allowed to drink this year?

7 MR. HITZIG: Yes. They'll get a
8 wrist band and a hand stamp.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

10 MR. HITZIG: We'll do that at the
11 beer station. The beer station and the sake
12 tasting pavilion will both have different
13 wrist bands.

14 So if someone goes to the beer
15 garden and wants a beer, and then they want to
16 go to the sake pavilion and taste some sake,
17 they will need to get a different wrist band.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: So you'll do
19 that.

20 MR. HITZIG: And vice versa.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: So they'll be
22 really decorated this year.

1 MR. HITZIG: Yes, yes. And if you
2 are, already have a hand stamp and a wrist
3 band and you go from one beer garden to the
4 other, or you go back to the same beer garden.
5 You will be ID'd again as --

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, as you
7 enter --

8 MR. HITZIG: -- we'll not take any
9 chances.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- the area of
11 the beer garden. But you're allowed to take
12 the beers outside of the garden right?

13 MR. HITZIG: Outside the garden,
14 yes.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. That's it.
16 Again thank you for coming, and hope you have
17 great weather.

18 MR. HITZIG: Thank you for that.
19 No snow.

20 (Crosstalk)

21 MR. BLANCHARD: We actually had
22 snow. I want to say '87. Before we started

1 having the festival down town, we used to
2 volunteer and help carry a float in the
3 parade.

4 And at that time we had to wear
5 like white shorts and sneakers, a T-shirt, and
6 a little, a very thin cloth Happy Coat that
7 was donated by Japan Airlines.

8 We're standing around and it
9 starts to flurry. We're all like, oh --

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm sure it was
11 pretty on the trees.

12 MR. HITZIG: It was very pretty.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Snow
14 blossoms.

15 MR. HITZIG: We kept running the
16 bus to keep warm. But hopefully that won't
17 happen.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Hopefully. Thank
19 you.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Apraku.

21 MR. APRAKU: Just a --

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry did

1 you have a question?

2 MR. APRAKU: Just a quick one. Do
3 you guys have like a hot line setup in case,
4 you know, somebody gets sick or somebody, you
5 know?

6 MR. HITZIG: Yes, we have a
7 Command Center or, also the First Aide Center
8 is on 12th Street by the D.C. Homeland
9 Security camper --

10 MR. APRAKU: That's right.

11 MR. HITZIG: -- that's parked at
12 12th and Penn, sylvania.

13 MR. APRAKU: Okay, and then I just
14 want to clarify because I was a little bit
15 confused. When it comes to the sake tasting
16 pavilion, you can't come outside with that?
17 You can't come outside with the sake, or can
18 you?

19 MR. HITZIG: The last, the last
20 one is the plum wine. And that will be served
21 in a plastic cup. So if they want to leave
22 the pavilion with that, they are allowed to

1 leave.

2 MR. APRAKU: Okay, is it
3 transparent, or is it?

4 MR. HITZIG: Yes, it's a clear
5 plastic cup.

6 MR. APRAKU: Okay, it's a clear
7 plastic cup?

8 MR. HITZIG: Yes.

9 MR. APRAKU: Okay, I'm done. I've
10 been the investigator and been to the event,
11 so I mean I really don't have anything else to
12 add.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well how
14 about, what was your experience?

15 MR. APRAKU: The experience was
16 good. I didn't, we didn't have any issues.
17 It was well ran. There was a lot of
18 volunteers. Yes, I mean the police were
19 present, so. It was pretty easy.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Are
21 you going this year?

22 MR. APRAKU: Well depends.

1 (Laughter)

2 MR. APRAKU: I mean they said
3 they're only doing it one day this year, so it
4 depends. I might be doing it for work
5 depending on how they task that out, so.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: You may have to
7 go as a civilian.

8 MR. APRAKU: Maybe.

9 MS.FOZARD: Please come enjoy.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.
11 Are there any other questions?

12 (No response)

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, so then
14 I'm going to move that we approve this
15 Temporary License Application. Do I have a
16 second?

17 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Short has
19 seconded the motion. All those in favor say
20 aye.

21 (Chorus of ayes)

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those

1 opposed?

2 (No response)

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those
4 abstaining?

5 (No response)

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Motion passes
7 5-0-0.

8 So maybe next year, I don't know,
9 I always think that maybe you won't have to
10 come back again, but I don't know. But you
11 know, these questions answered is very helpful
12 and maybe if you submit them with your
13 application to the Board ahead of time.

14 And maybe add to it, the question
15 and answer like Mr. Apraku asked about, you
16 know, a hotline or emergency or anything like
17 that.

18 MR. HITZIG: First aide.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. That
20 might have let you not have to come in. I
21 can't guarantee it though. But it's always
22 good to see you, so. We're looking forward to

1 this event.

2 MR. HITZIG: Thank you so much.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So
4 we're just signing off on your application and
5 then you'll be --

6 MR. BLANCHARD: We're not sure
7 about next year --

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh.

9 MR. BLANCHARD: -- because of Mr.
10 Trump and the renovation of the old post
11 office pavilion which is adjacent to the
12 festival site.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh.

14 MR. BLANCHARD: That may --

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: There may be
16 changes in these --

17 MR. BLANCHARD: -- we're looking
18 for a new site. There may be the one new
19 factor next year.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.
21 All right then we'll look forward to seeing
22 you.

1 MR. BLANCHARD: We still intend to
2 hold the festival.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good. Right,
4 right, we've got to get to 55.

5 MR. BLANCHARD: Yes, that's right.

6 (Whereupon, the hearing in the
7 above-entitled matter was concluded at 10:16
8 a.m.)

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
