3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Our next case
4 is also a fact finding hearing. Vincent
5 DiMare at 800 Florida Avenue, N.E. in ANC 5B,
6 temporary license application.

7 Would you sign in on the piece of
8 paper on the table?

9 Okay. When you're ready would you
10 introduce yourselves for the record?

11 MR. DiMARE: Yes. Well, my name
12 is Vincent DiMare. I'm here for -- well,
13 representing Alpha Sigma Pi Fraternity.

14 MS. KANONENKO: My name is Melissa
15 Kanonenko and I'm a student at Gallaudet
16 University.

17 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE:
18 Investigator Abiye Ghenene with the Alcoholic
19 Beverage Regulation Administration.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

21 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Investigator
22 Tyrone Lawson.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
2 I'm not sure to whom I'm specifically going to
3 address the questions for. Whether it's Mr.
4 DiMare or Ms. Kanonenko, but I want to know
5 first of all did you get a letter from the
6 agency with some questions to be prepared for
7 the hearing?

8 MR. DiMARE: Yes.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
10 I'm going to be following those questions
11 somewhat so you know.

12 MR. DiMARE: All right.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Could
14 you describe the event that you're seeking the
15 application -- the license for?

16 MR. DiMARE: May I ask a question
17 first?

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.
19 Absolutely.

20 MR. DiMARE: So, what we'd like to
21 do -- the American Society for the Deaf, we're
22 planning on having a social. Do you want more

1 detail?

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, I
3 didn't know if this -- I thought it was a
4 fraternity event. It's a different event?

5 MR. DiMARE: It's a -- it's a
6 fraternity event that we do have every year.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

8 MR. DiMARE: So, it's an event
9 sponsored by the fraternity.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good.
11 Can you describe the event?

12 MR. DiMARE: It's basically a
13 party, dancing and we provide food as well.
14 Do you want to add anything, Melissa?

15 MS. KANONENKO: So, I'm here to
16 support Vince.

17 So, this is an annual event that
18 we've been having. It starts at 9:00,
19 finishes at 3:00 in the morning and all of the
20 students that are coming, if they're of age,
21 they'll -- or all students coming will have
22 wristbands and we're also -- entertainment's

1 going to be provided. Two different DJs with
2 different music. Like Vince said, we're going
3 to have food as well. Have a dance area.
4 We're going to have a body painter. What else
5 do we have?

6 MR. DiMARE: And then there's
7 going to be smash car which people will take
8 a sledge hammer, baseball bat to.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How many
10 people though?

11 MR. DiMARE: We're predicting
12 about a thousand.

13 MS. KANONENKO: And we already
14 have an agreement with Gallaudet University to
15 limit the number. No more than 1,500 is
16 within the agreement. So, right now, Vince
17 was saying that we predict about a thousand.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And will
19 there be security?

20 MR. DiMARE: Yes.

21 MS. KANONENKO: There will be
22 Gallaudet University Department of Public

1 Safety and then the fraternity has already
2 hired three of Gallaudet University's security
3 and then we will have other individuals that
4 will be in supporting role for that event as
5 well.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. You're
7 going to have a thousand people and the Board
8 usually recommends a ratio of 50 to 100
9 patrons per security personnel.

10 MEMBER JONES: Just --

11 MS. KANONENKO: It would be --

12 MEMBER JONES: -- one per 50.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: One per 50.

14 MEMBER JONES: Yes. One security
15 person for every 50 patrons.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry.

17 Yes. Okay. Thank you.

18 INTERPRETER: Can the interpreter
19 just --

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: One --

21 INTERPRETER: -- clarify?

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Would you

1 based on what Mr. Jones just said?

2 MS. KANONENKO: So, we will be
3 hiring the three individuals from Gallaudet
4 University and then depending on the numbers,
5 we'll make sure that we're in compliance with
6 the ratio by hiring additional security
7 through the fraternity.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: I have a few
10 questions related to the security.

11 You say that the campus security
12 will be present.

13 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Will they be
15 there as part of their regular duties or will
16 they be responsible for this event -- during
17 the hours of this event?

18 MS. KANONENKO: They'll be staying
19 at the event and if any problems arise with
20 the students, perhaps somebody gets out of
21 control, we already have a system set up to
22 expel that student from the event.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Now, I'm talking
2 just about the campus security not the people
3 you hire and you do know how many of the
4 campus security will be present for the event?

5 MS. KANONENKO: Hold on one
6 second. Let me just double check. I have a
7 piece of paper.

8 I can only give you the
9 information I have on hand. On this form, it
10 was an agreement between the fraternity and
11 Gallaudet's Department of Public Safety and it
12 has up to 1,500 participants and then we have
13 the Director of Public Safety who has already
14 signed and we're coordinating it with the
15 campus to make sure that we're in compliance
16 with all of the regulations for security.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Thank you.
18 Madam Chair, I will have more questions later,
19 but continue.

20 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Mr. Alberti,
21 maybe I can help because I --

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Please.

1 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: -- monitored
2 the event last year.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, good.

4 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: They did
5 have the campus police on the premises where
6 the location of the event. I do not recall
7 how many were there, but they did have
8 uniformed campus police officers that were
9 specifically assigned to the area of the
10 event. If that'll help you.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you. Thank
12 you, Investigator Lawson.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr.
14 Silverstein.

15 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Could you
16 tell us about how last year's event went and
17 if you had any concerns about the lack of
18 security if anything went wrong or if it went
19 well and you thought that they were adequate?

20 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: My extent of
21 it, Mr. Silverstein, was I monitored toward
22 the end of the event when this was at

1 nighttime. Probably roughly around closing
2 between 1:00 and 2:00 in the morning and they
3 did -- it was thinning out at the time that I
4 got there.

5 I actually went by two or three
6 times during my tour and it was pretty
7 moderately crowded. It wasn't a lot of people
8 there. It was pretty much a modest crowd.
9 Not -- not a lot of drinkers that were
10 drinking at the time.

11 They did have campus safety there.
12 They had campus -- we had -- you had -- of
13 course, initially, you had to have permission
14 to come on campus and then when you got to the
15 area that they had the event, it was cordoned
16 off so that you had to go in one entrance
17 where they were checking IDs and allow people
18 to enter the premises where they had the
19 event.

20 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: So, the
21 layout was -- so, we can almost assume that
22 they know the drill.

1 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes. Yes, I
2 can --

3 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: This has been
4 done before.

5 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes, sir.
6 Yes.

7 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: It's been
8 done without any problems.

9 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: There was --
10 I can't remember the administrator from
11 Gallaudet, female, that I worked with last
12 year on this. I think she's with the
13 counseling office or something like that or --

14 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: You don't
15 remember her name?

16 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I don't
17 remember what her name was. She was here with
18 the --

19 MS. KANONENKO: Which department
20 was she in?

21 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I want to
22 say maybe --

1 MEMBER MOBLEY: Mary Lott perhaps?

2 MS. KANONENKO: That's my
3 supervisor Ms. Mary Lott.

4 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Mary Lott.

5 MS. KANONENKO: She --

6 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I think it
7 might have been Ms. Lott.

8 MS. KANONENKO: Campus behavior.

9 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I think --
10 yes. Yes.

11 MS. KANONENKO: The coordinator
12 this.

13 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes. Yes.
14 Yes, that's it. Mary Lott. That's --

15 MR. DiMARE: And then Pamela is
16 the risk manager of Gallaudet University.

17 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes. Yes,
18 it was Mary -- Mary Lott.

19 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: So, then I
20 would ask Mr. DiMare and Ms. Kanonenko, are
21 there any changes that you see this year from
22 last year's safe and successful program?

1 MS. KANONENKO: No. So, comparing
2 it to other fraternity events? Is that what
3 you're asking?

4 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Compared to
5 this same event last year.

6 MS. KANONENKO: The process itself
7 is the same as it was. The only new
8 information is that it's going to be open to
9 the public this year.

10 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Does that
11 mean they'll be more people? A lot more?

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm sure they
13 hope so.

14 MS. KANONENKO: I can't promise.
15 We're not 100 percent sure. That's why we
16 limit it to 1,500 individuals. So, that it
17 shouldn't get too big.

18 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: One concern
19 that I'm certain that my fellow Board Member
20 Mr. Alberti and I have as well is when you say
21 that the university police will be monitoring
22 this, we want to make sure that they're going

1 to be staying there. That these are
2 specially --

3 MS. KANONENKO: Oh, yes.

4 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: -- that these
5 are specially assigned to this so that if
6 something happens somewhere else they're still
7 going to be there.

8 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

9 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Is that
10 correct?

11 MS. KANONENKO: Yes, that is
12 correct.

13 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: They are
14 assigned to this and they're not going on
15 their rounds or doing other things?

16 MS. KANONENKO: No. No, they will
17 not.

18 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: These are
19 overtime.

20 MS. KANONENKO: It's not possible
21 because the fraternity is paying for them to
22 stay at the event. So, they're being paid to

1 be there for the event.

2 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I see my
3 colleagues have questions.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Ms. Mobley.

5 MEMBER MOBLEY: I think, Board
6 Chair --

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, Mr.
8 Jones.

9 MEMBER MOBLEY: -- Mr. Jones had a
10 question before me.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.

12 MEMBER JONES: Thank you. Just
13 for clarification purposes, how many people
14 attended your event last year? Estimate.

15 MS. KANONENKO: Not all of them
16 were Gallaudet students. So, perhaps 500.
17 Thereabouts.

18 MEMBER JONES: Okay. How many
19 security staff did you hire for last year's
20 event? Estimate.

21 MS. KANONENKO: I can't answer
22 that question because I just joined and I'm

1 new to the job that I'm performing now. So,
2 I don't have those numbers.

3 MEMBER JONES: Understood. Thank
4 you. Thank you, Madam Chair.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Ms.
6 Mobley.

7 MEMBER MOBLEY: We have some
8 familiarity with the university. The event is
9 going to held in the 6th Street parking area?

10 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

11 MEMBER MOBLEY: Across from the
12 old Florida Avenue Market on the 6th Street
13 side?

14 MS. KANONENKO: Yes, correct.

15 MEMBER MOBLEY: Okay. The guests,
16 will they enter through that gate or will they
17 enter through the Florida Avenue side? The
18 main gate.

19 MS. KANONENKO: The 6th Street
20 parking, the gate there is going to be --
21 access -- it's accessed for cars will be
22 closed and the gate for pedestrians will be

1 open and that's where individuals from outside
2 will be entering.

3 Gallaudet students do not have to
4 exit campus and then reenter. They can enter
5 from campus.

6 MEMBER MOBLEY: So, just for
7 clarification, so, the outside guests will
8 have to enter from the Florida Avenue side?

9 MS. KANONENKO: No. No, the 6th
10 Street.

11 MEMBER MOBLEY: The 6th Street
12 side. Okay. Because normally, at the 6th
13 Street side, there's not security. Even now
14 and then you may see a campus police car, but
15 you're going to have something special set up
16 there? Because the main security is at the
17 Florida Avenue side. So, I'm just trying
18 to --

19 MS. KANONENKO: Yes, we've already
20 worked it out and discussed that it will be
21 open that date for pedestrian for the event.

22 INTERPRETER: Let me clarify.

1 MEMBER MOBLEY: With secure check-
2 in. That's my concern.

3 MS. KANONENKO: Yes. Absolutely.

4 MEMBER MOBLEY: Okay. Inspector
5 Lawson, you probably didn't observe that last
6 year --

7 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I'm sorry,
8 ma'am.

9 MEMBER MOBLEY: -- since you said
10 you got there later on in the time.

11 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Well, what
12 was the question?

13 MEMBER MOBLEY: The security in
14 terms of the check-in process.

15 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Oh, yes,
16 ma'am.

17 MEMBER MOBLEY: Because I know the
18 main security gate where people are actually
19 stopped and checked --

20 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes, ma'am.

21 MEMBER MOBLEY: -- is on the
22 Florida Avenue side.

1 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes, ma'am.

2 MEMBER MOBLEY: And normally at
3 the 6th Street side, there's only a campus
4 police car just stationed there occasionally.

5 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Well --

6 MEMBER MOBLEY: I'm just trying
7 to --

8 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: -- they had
9 it at a different location last year.

10 MEMBER MOBLEY: Okay. All right.

11 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: It was -- I
12 can't remember the lot, but it was near one of
13 the garages and it was in an -- I want to say
14 almost center on campus.

15 MEMBER MOBLEY: Okay. But, I'm
16 hearing her say that they've arranged for that
17 security to be beefed up. The 6th Street
18 side.

19 MS. KANONENKO: Correct.

20 MEMBER MOBLEY: All right. Thank
21 you.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Madam Chair.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, Mr.
2 Alberti.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, I have
4 several questions.

5 The event area, how is access
6 controlled? Is it fenced in?

7 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Completely?

9 MS. KANONENKO: We have a floor
10 plan here that we are -- we can share with
11 you. No that -- that's not the one. We have
12 one here.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Ah, good. Can we
14 have a copy?

15 MS. KANONENKO: Oh, absolutely.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So, it's
17 complete surrounded by --

18 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- security.

20 MS. KANONENKO: Now, on that plan,
21 you can see two different lines. There's a
22 dash line and that's a fence and the straight

1 line is tape.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Is what?

3 MS. KANONENKO: I'm sorry. Tarp.

4 It's a black tarp that's going to be used to
5 wall off the section. Do you see that on the
6 floor plans?

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes. So, how
8 many entrances will there be?

9 MS. KANONENKO: Now, if you look
10 on the left side, there is a street. It's two
11 different -- correct. And that's on the first
12 floor, ground level.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: So, all --
14 everyone attending the event will come in
15 through that area?

16 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. When do
18 people -- when do you check IDs to determine
19 that they're 21 or older or under 21?

20 MS. KANONENKO: When they arrive
21 at the entrance area where we have a system
22 set up. So, the 21 and over -- we'll have

1 different lines set up for 21 and over and
2 under 21 and then they will each receive
3 wristbands. Two different colors to designate
4 between the over 21 and under 21.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: So, you have two
6 different lines going in. Is there someone
7 checking IDs for each line?

8 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Who are
10 those people who are checking IDs? Are they
11 volunteers?

12 MS. KANONENKO: Some will be
13 members of the fraternity. Some will be
14 campus administration like myself and the
15 staff already has training.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: Who did the
17 training?

18 MS. KANONENKO: So, it was
19 conducted by my office to look for the year
20 and how to identify the proper ID for over 21
21 and under 21.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: By your office,

1 do you mean by you or someone in your office
2 or who did the training?

3 MS. KANONENKO: Campus behavior
4 and full-time staff members at Gallaudet
5 University.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. The
7 wristbands, are they the clip on or are they
8 the ones that slide -- plastic ones or rubber
9 ones that slide over the wrist?

10 MS. KANONENKO: Do I answer that
11 question, Vince?

12 MR. DiMARE: They're ones that
13 have the holes in it that clip on.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. We would
15 appreciate that before the event that you meet
16 with our investigators and you have examples
17 of the wristbands that you're going to use for
18 them. That would be helpful.

19 MS. KANONENKO: Sure. Absolutely.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: During the event,
21 will you have people monitoring the crowd to
22 make sure that someone with an underage

1 wristband does not have an alcoholic beverage?

2 MS. KANONENKO: Yes, we do.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: How many people
4 will you have that do that?

5 MS. KANONENKO: So, there is six
6 students and two staff. So, altogether eight
7 in my office and as well as other staff
8 members that are in attendance will let us
9 know and we'll be working with the Department
10 of Public Safety Campus Police to identify
11 students that are underage and drinking and if
12 so, they will be removed. The wristband will
13 be cut off and they will be removed from the
14 event.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: And how many
16 exits are there going to be and where are
17 they?

18 MS. KANONENKO: You mean for
19 emergency or regular exits?

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: For both.

21 MS. KANONENKO: There's the one
22 entrance point and exit point.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

2 MS. KANONENKO: You can see that
3 on the floor plan.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right.

5 MS. KANONENKO: Now, for
6 emergencies, if there were to be something
7 that happened, the tarps can be very quickly
8 removed and everyone can just exit the parking
9 garage in any direction.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Will someone be
11 assigned to monitor that emergency exit
12 because I'm sure it will be easy to get under
13 or around those tarps?

14 MS. KANONENKO: Vince, you want to
15 answer that?

16 MR. DiMARE: Now, what we have is
17 we have -- many of the food tables are set up
18 against the tarp. So -- and the music. So,
19 it -- there will be people that will be there
20 monitoring those areas and they will be
21 watching to make sure nobody is coming in
22 under that tarps.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you. Will
2 people be able to leave and come back in?

3 MR. DiMARE: Yes.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: When they reenter
5 -- all right.

6 MR. DiMARE: Yes, if they still
7 have a band on, then there won't be --
8 shouldn't be a problem.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Well, pay
10 particular attention to that because that's
11 sometimes where we have problems. But, my
12 next question is will the bartender -- how
13 many stations will you be serving alcohol and
14 is it just beer?

15 MR. DiMARE: It's only beer.

16 MS. KANONENKO: Just one location
17 and again, that's on the floor plan. There's
18 just one location that we'll be having
19 alcohol.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: And will the
21 bartenders monitor people who are buying many
22 drinks at one time and people who appear to be

1 underage?

2 MS. KANONENKO: Once again, we
3 have a system set up and we have -- Gallaudet
4 has it's own policies. So, you're only
5 allowed to get one cup for each wristband.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Excellent. Very
7 good.

8 MS. KANONENKO: And if we do get
9 the ABRA license, so, we're going to apply to
10 have that area monitored overnight to make
11 sure everything runs perfectly. Whoever is --
12 Vince will be given the license and he will be
13 there to monitor the alcohol station the
14 entire time.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Very good. I
16 have no further questions. Thank you.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Other
18 questions? Oh, did you? Sorry. Go right
19 ahead.

20 MEMBER MOBLEY: Just to put it on
21 the record for the wristband, those
22 individuals who are 21 years and older and

1 they have a wristband. those who are 18 to 21
2 will not have a wristband. Is that correct?

3 Just put --

4 MS. KANONENKO: No, they will have
5 a wristband as well.

6 MEMBER MOBLEY: A different --

7 MS. KANONENKO: And it's going to
8 have a different color.

9 MEMBER MOBLEY: Color. Okay.
10 Thank you. Just wanted to get it on the
11 record. Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I have
13 a follow-up on the wristband. Is it the type
14 of wristband that you have to cut to get it
15 off?

16 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So, if
18 somebody goes out, they can't give it to
19 somebody else. Right? Okay.

20 MS. KANONENKO: Correct.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you and
22 what type of crowd are you expecting to draw

1 from the public?

2 MS. KANONENKO: College students.
3 It will be a requirement that you have to have
4 a college ID with them to gain access.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Are there
6 tickets that you're selling?

7 MR. DiMARE: Yes.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you know
9 how much they're going to cost?

10 MR. DiMARE: Fifteen dollars.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. What
12 hours are you going to be serving the alcohol?

13 MR. DiMARE: So, we will start
14 serving alcohol when the event opens and then
15 we'll stop serving it an hour before the end
16 of the event which would be 2:00 in the
17 morning.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Great.
19 Thank you.

20 MS. KANONENKO: And I'd like to
21 add something. The ticket to get alcohol --
22 to get a beer, they're going to stop selling

1 those at 1:30.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And I
3 just wanted to ask the investigators because
4 I don't know, how are you planning -- are you
5 going to be working on this event? Monitoring
6 it somehow or you mentioned you did last year.
7 You came at the end.

8 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes, ma'am.
9 Last year, we weren't assigned to work the
10 event. Ms. Jenkins asked us to monitor the
11 establishment throughout our evening shift
12 when we were on nights. It was on a Saturday
13 and I was assigned to -- I went through
14 roughly three or four times during --
15 throughout the event when I first got to work
16 approximately 8:30 and then midway, a couple
17 of times and then at the end -- at the end of
18 the event, I went back to make sure that they
19 secured the alcohol and no alcohol was on the
20 premises after their approved hours of
21 consumption and sale.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How about

1 this year? Do you know?

2 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I don't
3 know.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You don't
5 know?

6 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I don't know
7 if they --

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.
9 So, any other questions? Yes. Oh. Okay.

10 This one I just -- I got -- we got
11 answers I think to all the questions except
12 I'm not clear exactly on compliance with the
13 security number of personnel. Yes.

14 I understood you to say that the
15 campus police is going to be providing
16 security and then you're going to supplement.

17 MS. KANONENKO: Depending on the
18 numbers, yes. Because we're still not sure
19 how many people are going to be coming this
20 Saturday. DPS is aware that if -- that we
21 could have as many as 1,500. So, that is --
22 it's also their limit in how many security

1 they can provide to us for the event.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: That who can
3 provide?

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Campus police.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

6 MS. KANONENKO: So, there's
7 Fabienne Collson. Collson, they're an agency
8 that also is prepared to -- is contracted to
9 provide additional security depending on how
10 many individuals do come.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And when will
12 you decide what the number is?

13 INTERPRETER: One moment.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

15 MS. KANONENKO: So, we have it set
16 up that we have enough security on standby --

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I see.

18 MS. KANONENKO: -- to respond to
19 the numbers of participants. So, if only
20 1,000 participants show up, we'll have enough
21 security for that. If more arrive, we're able
22 to call in more security to keep the number of

1 security at the level we need to have to be in
2 compliance.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Did
4 you have a concern or anything?

5 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Yes.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

7 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Like you
8 I'm concerned about -- since this year is the
9 first year that they've started this outside
10 promotion, I've have questions on where
11 they've promoted, with who they've promoted
12 and also I just -- as I understood it, she
13 mentioned the name Fabienne Collson, it looks
14 like that's the manager of the Department of
15 Public Safety for Gallaudet. Are they going
16 to be the ones who have the ability to add
17 extra security or is there an outside agency
18 separate form Gallaudet?

19 MS. KANONENKO: It will be
20 Gallaudet security officers that will be
21 provided for the event.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. That
2 answers that question. Right. And the
3 question about promotion, I understood them to
4 say they were reaching out to college students
5 in the area. Do you want to just elaborate
6 how you're reaching out to college students?

7 MR. DiMARE: So, we had a little
8 video and we've gone over to other
9 universities and some of our fraternity -- our
10 other fraternities on other campuses. So,
11 we've let them know about the events. So,
12 that's pretty much how we been spreading the
13 word. We're going to see how successful it is
14 this year.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
16 you're not using a "promoter." The students
17 are actually reaching out to other students
18 directly. Correct?

19 MR. DiMARE: So, we contact like
20 somebody at another fraternity or people we
21 know and then there -- it's kind of word of
22 mouth.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Thank
2 you. Any other concerns?

3 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Just a
4 couple.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

6 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: We talked
7 about the bands. Did they already go out and
8 buy the bands?

9 MS. KANONENKO: Yes.

10 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. What
11 is their policy about people that are working,
12 staff, drinking during the event?

13 MS. KANONENKO: No. Definitely
14 not.

15 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Well, they
16 said that they had fraternity members working
17 security and monitoring. So, that's why I
18 asked that question.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It is a good
20 question. Thank you.

21 MS. KANONENKO: So, if they're
22 working the event, they're not going to be

1 drinking. It's a student organization under
2 the Campus Behavior Office. So, our job is to
3 make sure that they will not drinking any
4 alcohol that evening while anybody is doing
5 any work for the event.

6 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.
7 Who's going to I guess controlling the
8 wristbands?

9 MR. DiMARE: There's the area that
10 has access. So, they will be at -- the
11 wristbands will be at that location. So, only
12 the people at -- that are checking IDs have
13 access to the wristband and there -- we only
14 have enough to provide up to the 1500.

15 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. My
16 question is are any of the staff members that
17 are in control of the wristbands going to be
18 the fraternity?

19 MR. DiMARE: Yes, it will.

20 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. Have
21 they coordinated with MPD and EMS for their
22 event that night? And the only reason I ask

1 that is because I saw that there's fire
2 dancing and car smashing. Things of that
3 nature.

4 MS. KANONENKO: Through the
5 Department of Public Safety on Gallaudet
6 campus.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry.
8 Did you say through the department?

9 MS. KANONENKO: Yes, that is
10 correct.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: And will
13 they be checking IDs at the point of purchase
14 as well as the point of entry?

15 MR. DiMARE: Yes.

16 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. And
17 finally --

18 INTERPRETER: I'm sorry. I'm
19 sorry. Can we clarify?

20 MR. DiMARE: No, I'm sorry. Just
21 once to get the wristband.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

1 MS. KANONENKO: And they will look
2 to make sure they have the proper color
3 wristband. So, that is the second check.

4 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Well, what
5 is going to be the colors of the wristband?

6 MS. KANONENKO: For over 21,
7 bright orange and then a blue striped for
8 under 21 not able to -- not able to drink.

9 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: A blue
10 stripe.

11 MS. KANONENKO: It's going to be a
12 wristband that has blue stripes on it.

13 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay. But,
14 not orange with blue stripes?

15 MS. KANONENKO: No. No. No.

16 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay. And
17 then --

18 MS. KANONENKO: So, we think that
19 will be easy to identify who is underage and
20 if they're holding a beer, then we can easily
21 identify that they should not be.

22 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: And the

1 earlier question is who's the responsible
2 persons that are going to be distributing the
3 21 wristbands? Is it going to be staff or is
4 it going to be the fraternity students?

5 MS. KANONENKO: Fraternity.

6 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Students?

7 MS. KANONENKO: With staff
8 supervision. They will be -- there will be
9 staff monitoring the access point and the
10 giving out of the wristbands.

11 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: You can buy
12 tickets for entry before the event?

13 MR. DiMARE: Yes.

14 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Can you buy
15 -- are there different types of tickets like
16 18 and over tickets and 21 and over tickets?
17 Are there different prices for the tickets I
18 should ask?

19 MR. DiMARE: No.

20 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

21 MR. DiMARE: They're all the same.

22 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. My

1 final question is what kind of band is it
2 that's going to be playing? What kind of
3 music is it going to be?

4 MR. DiMARE: I can't say exactly.
5 We're going to have -- we're going to have two
6 separate DJs and they're really responsible
7 for what music --

8 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. So,
9 it's a DJ. Okay. And this is an outdoor
10 event. Correct?

11 MR. DiMARE: Yes.

12 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. And
13 are you guys -- I'm sorry. Two more
14 questions.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Go ahead
16 please.

17 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: At the
18 point of entry, are there going to be people
19 with clickers or counters monitoring the
20 amount of people inside?

21 MS. KANONENKO: I can answer that
22 question. We had a meeting yesterday and yes,

1 they plan to have the little counters.

2 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay. And
3 then like Board Member Mobley was asking, on
4 the 6th Street side, are there going to be
5 permanently I guess fixed officers there
6 monitoring that area for people coming in and
7 out or loitering or hanging around or whatever
8 it is?

9 MS. KANONENKO: Our security is
10 focused on inside the event.

11 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Um-hum.

12 MS. KANONENKO: So, the Gallaudet
13 police may.

14 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.

15 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Just chiming
16 in on the occupancy. She explained that there
17 would be entrances, two separate entrances
18 that the students can enter and would they be
19 monitoring or keeping count of the students
20 that enter and the public that enter to insure
21 that it doesn't go over the capacity?

22 INTERPRETER: I'm sorry. The

1 interpreter just lost his train of thought.

2 So, your question was there are
3 two entrances to --

4 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: She
5 explained earlier --

6 INTERPRETER: -- the event.

7 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes.

8 INTERPRETER: And you will have
9 staff monitoring and counting in both
10 entrances?

11 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes, to --

12 INTERPRETER: Is that your
13 question?

14 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: -- insure
15 that it --

16 MS. KANONENKO: Let me clarify.
17 There's only one entrance into the event
18 itself.

19 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay.

20 MS. KANONENKO: People will buy
21 tickets and get their wristbands there.

22 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay.

1 MS. KANONENKO: Gallaudet students
2 will come in off -- through the campus --

3 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay.

4 MS. KANONENKO: -- to the event
5 single location and outside individuals will
6 be coming --

7 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay.

8 MS. KANONENKO: -- through the 6th
9 Street --

10 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: I got you.

11 MS. KANONENKO: -- to that
12 singular entrance. So, there's two entrances
13 that funnel to one. One for --

14 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay.

15 MS. KANONENKO: -- Gallaudet
16 students and one for out -- off-campus
17 students because they didn't feel comfortable
18 having them just come on the campus --

19 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Okay.

20 MS. KANONENKO: -- and wander.

21 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: All right.

22 Thank you for clearing that.

1 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: And the
2 final question is who is the contact person
3 that will be there that night that we can
4 call?

5 MS. KANONENKO: Mary Lott.

6 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Mary Lott.
7 Okay.

8 MS. KANONENKO: My boss. She's my
9 supervisor. My boss.

10 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: You got a
11 phone number?

12 MS. KANONENKO: Not with me at the
13 moment, but if you like I can email you that
14 information.

15 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: Okay.
16 Okay.

17 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Madam Chair,
18 I'm working this Saturday night. So.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, do you
20 think you'll stop by? We think it might be a
21 good idea.

22 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Well, the

1 Board's wish is our command.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. Okay.

3 We think it would be a great idea.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Madam Chair, it's
5 my recommendation that we do that.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great.

7 Great.

8 MEMBER BROOKS: I have one
9 question, Madam Chair.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, Mr.
11 Brooks.

12 MEMBER BROOKS: Question. Did you
13 pre-sell any tickets?

14 MR. DiMARE: yes.

15 MEMBER BROOKS: How many?

16 MR. DiMARE: At Gallaudet, we've
17 sold probably 300, but we're not sure how many
18 have been sold to outside public.

19 MEMBER BROOKS: All right. Thank
20 you.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any
22 other questions?

1 You can continue if you come up
2 with more questions.

3 INVESTIGATOR GHENENE: No. No.
4 No.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So, I
6 think we have a lot of information and it
7 sounds like things are under control. So, I
8 would recommend that we approve this
9 application.

10 Does anybody have any concerns?
11 Okay.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Tell them they
13 can get it today if they want.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: This is it.
15 Okay. This is it for you all to take across
16 the --

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Now, you need to
18 sign that. You can -- we are signing your
19 license now approving it and you can pick it
20 up today if you wait just a few minutes if
21 you'd like.

22 MR. DiMARE: Sure. Absolutely.

1 That would be great.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Great.

3 MS. KANONENKO: Thank you.

4 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: We wish you
5 well.

6 MS. KANONENKO: Do you still -- do
7 you need the copy of our floor plan?

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Safe party.
9 Yes, the floor plan.

10 INVESTIGATOR LAWSON: Yes, if you
11 can spare it, we would like it.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

13 MS. KANONENKO: Yes, that's fine.
14 That's fine. Okay.

15 (Whereupon, at 3:49 p.m., the
16 hearing was adjourned.)
