The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson Ruthanne Miller, presiding.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All right.

4 I think that brings us to our Fact-Finding  
5 Hearing. Okay. Is someone here from Living  
6 Classrooms Foundation? Okay. I'm going to call  
7 your case now. Come forward and take a seat at  
8 the table.

9 We have a temporary license  
10 application for an event entitled Living  
11 Classrooms Foundation. The date of the event is  
12 April 25, 2015. The neighborhood is 3100 Benning  
13 Road, N.E., and the event takes place at Kingman  
14 and Heritage Islands.

15 Okay. So when you are ready, could  
16 you introduce yourselves?

17 MS. QUARLES: Yes. I'm Alex Quarles.  
18 I'm the Director of Development for Living  
19 Classrooms Foundation.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

21 MR. CURRY: Bryant Curry, Director of  
22 Kingman Island, Living Classrooms Foundation.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry, could  
2 you repeat your name again?

3 MS. QUARLES: Alex Quarles. It's Q-U-  
4 A-R-L-E-S.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Quarles, okay.  
6 Thank you. And, Mr. Curry, what's your position  
7 with this?

8 MR. CURRY: Director of Kingman  
9 Island.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And we  
11 have an Investigator with us?

12 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Yes, Shawn  
13 Townsend.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Great.  
15 Okay. So this is not an evidentiary hearing.  
16 It's just what we call a Fact-Finding Hearing  
17 where we have a little dialogue with you just to  
18 make sure that we understand what is going on and  
19 understand that there is enough security and  
20 protections for serving of minors and things like  
21 that.

22 And so I know this event has been

1 going on for how many years?

2 MS. QUARLES: Six years.

3 MR. CURRY: Yes, six years.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Six years, okay.

5 And were you involved with it last year?

6 MR. CURRY: I was.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I thought you  
8 looked familiar. Okay. Okay. And you?

9 MS. QUARLES: No, it's my first year.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So this  
11 involves a lot of attendees. I have in my notes  
12 that you expect 6,000. Is that correct?

13 MR. CURRY: That's correct.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So is that about  
15 what you had last year?

16 MR. CURRY: Just about, yes.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And is  
18 there something different that you are doing this  
19 year from last year?

20 MR. CURRY: We have a second stage so  
21 the main path, we are installing a DPR stage, so  
22 there will be a second gathering area, so that

1 will release a lot of the attendees from the main  
2 area. So we can, you know, congregate and  
3 provide a better experience for our guests.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So was it crowded  
5 last year?

6 MR. CURRY: Very crowded, very  
7 crowded, yes.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So this is  
9 supposed to deal with that issue?

10 MR. CURRY: Correct.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Did you  
12 have any other problems or issues last year that  
13 you are addressing this year?

14 MR. CURRY: At the front entrance, we  
15 are using a company, MissionTix to process our  
16 tickets, so that will help us with IDing. So we  
17 are using Watkins Security to ID at the front  
18 gate and they will also be around the beer  
19 stations, so they can do a secondary  
20 identification and also the beer pourers will  
21 look out for individuals who don't have, you  
22 know, the right IDs, so they won't be provided

1 any beer.

2 And it's not necessarily -- it is a  
3 small way, but we are going cupless this year.  
4 So in order to be served beer, you have to have a  
5 special cup. So if you don't have that cup, you  
6 won't get served.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So you are  
8 serving beer. Are you serving any other type of  
9 alcohol?

10 MR. CURRY: No. Only beer.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So last  
12 year you didn't have that kind of security setup?

13 MR. CURRY: We had the security, but  
14 we didn't have the cup.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. The cup is  
16 different. You have the same security company?

17 MR. CURRY: Watkins, yes.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

19 MR. CURRY: Same security, yes.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.  
21 Townsend, were you there last year by any chance?

22 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: I was not.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Did you  
2 get a report about how it went last year or  
3 anything?

4 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: No, I did not.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All right.  
6 So we didn't hear of any particular problems?

7 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: No. I heard  
8 I think it was the same, roughly about the same  
9 amount of patrons there.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

11 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: But that's all  
12 I know.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. How about  
14 security? Was security adequate? Did you have  
15 any security problems?

16 MR. CURRY: We didn't have any  
17 security problems, but we did increase the number  
18 of security --

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You increased  
20 this year?

21 MR. CURRY: -- officers.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. CURRY: We also hired D.C. Fire to  
2 help us with any medical issues, so we will have  
3 two EMT stations, two teams on bikes and also  
4 three Gators on staff, so just in case we need to  
5 retrieve someone and bring them out through the  
6 back entrance or, you know, deliver them to the  
7 parking lot so they can be escorted out. What  
8 else?

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So did you change  
10 your numbers in security? I mean, this --

11 MR. CURRY: We increased.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: This year it  
13 says, and I don't have last year's, but it says  
14 how many security individuals will be hired for  
15 the event? 45.

16 MR. CURRY: 45, right.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you recall  
18 what you had last year?

19 MR. CURRY: It was roughly 32.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

21 MR. CURRY: Or something.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: My only other

1 question is and I'm going to let other Board  
2 Members raise some questions, but do you provide  
3 free water or anything like that when it's hot --

4 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- and stuff?  
6 You do?

7 MR. CURRY: Yes, yes. We ordered  
8 these water monsters, very expensive. So they  
9 are basically Gatorade containers that hold 165  
10 gallons and they have eight spigots on them, so  
11 people can go up and get as much water as they  
12 need. And we have additional water and ice, you  
13 know, to fill up throughout the day.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Are they  
15 scattered throughout the site?

16 MR. CURRY: Yes, we have three, so  
17 there will be two in the main meadow and one in  
18 the secondary stage.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.  
20 Other questions?

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'll let Mr. Short go  
22 and then I'll have questions.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr. Short?

2 MEMBER SHORT: Good morning.

3 MR. CURRY: How you doing?

4 MS. QUARLES: Good morning.

5 MEMBER SHORT: I did come out to your  
6 event last year at the behest of one of my Board  
7 Members.

8 MR. CURRY: Okay.

9 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Alberti. And it  
10 was quite crowded. We were pleased to see those  
11 kind of events happen east of the river that area  
12 because, you know, it gives a little more  
13 exposure and business.

14 MR. CURRY: Right.

15 MEMBER SHORT: And I did hear you say  
16 this year you will have EMS there, you'll have  
17 fire.

18 MR. CURRY: Correct.

19 MEMBER SHORT: MPD, because I noticed  
20 there was a lot of traffic on Oklahoma Avenue.  
21 It was kind of hard getting in and out. And so  
22 if there is an emergency, how many police, MPD

1 police officers will you have involved in this?

2 MR. CURRY: So I have been in  
3 conversations with them because of the unique mix  
4 of space and because we are a private  
5 organization managing a D.C. property, allocation  
6 of D.C. Police to the event, I think, is kind of  
7 a gray area, so we are still trying to figure out  
8 that piece, but they are totally aware of the  
9 event. I let them know about the traffic issues  
10 and the event nature, even talking to DDOT in  
11 terms of, you know, just traffic operations up  
12 and down Benning Road at the intersection. So  
13 they are aware, but we are still discussing how  
14 we will address those issues.

15 MEMBER SHORT: When you get that  
16 straight, can you give a note back here to the  
17 Board?

18 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

19 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. It's kind of  
20 essential to make sure that your event goes off  
21 safely.

22 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

1 MEMBER SHORT: And so you address  
2 those issues and I'm pretty much satisfied. I'll  
3 try to come up again this year.

4 MR. CURRY: Okay, sir.

5 MEMBER SHORT: I hope you have nice  
6 weather like you had last year. That was  
7 beautiful weather you had.

8 MR. CURRY: We're looking pretty good  
9 as it stands right now, so --

10 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. And I guess I  
11 want to ask the Investigator, are we going to  
12 have an Investigator there this year?

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Short, we will.

14 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Thank you very  
15 much.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: I believe we'll  
17 discuss that with Mr. Moosally the Director.

18 MEMBER SHORT: That's all I have,  
19 Madam Chair. Thank you.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.  
21 Alberti? Mr. Rodriguez, do you have a question?

22 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. Mr. Curry, I

1 heard a lot about your event and what a great  
2 time it was you have had. What makes your -- I  
3 have not been there.

4 MR. CURRY: Okay.

5 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: But you know, my  
6 curiosity is piqued.

7 MR. CURRY: Okay.

8 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: What makes your  
9 event so successful?

10 MR. CURRY: I think it's based on the  
11 start. It's kind of the anti-D.C. event for the  
12 whole family, so we try and cater to families  
13 from like 1:00 to 4:00 and then as the day wears  
14 on, it kind of changes over to the younger adults  
15 and they kind of shut things down from there.  
16 But we have -- we are in partnership with REI and  
17 they are bringing out a large action-mobile where  
18 you can learn how to, you know, tune-up your  
19 bike. They are providing kayak services, free  
20 kayak services at the -- in the Kingman Island  
21 Lake.

22 I just finished building a dock there

1 last week, so that's a new addition to the park.  
2 So any time that you come out, feel free to use  
3 it.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

5 MR. CURRY: And also, we have a  
6 children's stage where children can get face  
7 painting, you know, children-friendly music. So  
8 it's an event for everyone. So we try and hit  
9 everyone, so they can have a good time.

10 MS. QUARLES: Have you been in the  
11 island before?

12 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: No.

13 MS. QUARLES: It's absolutely  
14 stunning.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes?

16 MS. QUARLES: You have no idea that  
17 you are in the District. And so I think for a  
18 lot of people, they really enjoy feeling like  
19 they are out in nature and, you know, up on the  
20 mountains and listening to Bluegrass, but you can  
21 take the Metro and walk. I mean, it's an  
22 incredible thing. So I would just add that

1 that's a big part of our success. And it's a  
2 fundraiser, so for a lot of people to be able to  
3 have a good time and support a good cause, that's  
4 important.

5 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Okay. Thank you.  
6 Sounds interesting.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Alberti?

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes. Yes, Ms.  
9 Quarles is right, as soon as you go through the  
10 gate, over the first bridge, you don't realize  
11 you are in the city until you get to the East  
12 Capitol Street Bridge, if you don't go to that,  
13 you still don't know you're in the city.

14 So but that -- well, I'll get to that  
15 in a second. How many -- what's the maximum  
16 number of patrons?

17 MR. CURRY: So we are shooting for  
18 6,000. And we are hoping to cap it at 10,000.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Cap it at 10,000?

20 MR. CURRY: Because we have the  
21 traffic --

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Just so we

1 know.

2 MR. CURRY: -- the day of --

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: You sold out last  
4 year, I know.

5 MR. CURRY: Yes, absolutely.

6 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: So you do have a max?

8 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

9 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: And that's 10,000?

11 MR. CURRY: Yes.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. The number of  
13 security is 45. I'm going to come back to that  
14 in a moment. So the beer, selling of the beer.  
15 You only have one beer station?

16 MR. CURRY: Two.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Which is right at the  
18 -- you have two?

19 MR. CURRY: Yes.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Where is -- the  
21 second one is down by the second stage?

22 MR. CURRY: Yes.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. All right. So  
2 these beer cups, when do they get a beer cup?

3 MR. CURRY: They get it when they  
4 enter, so after their ticket is scanned and IDed,  
5 if they are 21 or over, they will receive a beer  
6 can or a cistern and then if they are purchasing  
7 a ticket, that they owe, when they purchase their  
8 beer tickets, they have to purchase a cistern.  
9 So the cistern comes free with their pre-purchase  
10 ticket.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: How big is the  
12 cistern? I'm imaging a rain cistern.

13 MS. QUARLES: It's 16 ounce.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. All  
15 right.

16 MR. CURRY: This is --

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm just kidding.  
18 I'm just kidding. All right. So a 16 ounce cup.  
19 All right.

20 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: And if someone loses  
22 it, they have to purchase another one or they get

1 it at the beer station or what's the deal?

2 MS. QUARLES: They are kind of hard to  
3 lose.

4 MR. CURRY: Yes. We are hoping that  
5 they --

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: There is a lot of  
7 woods out there.

8 MR. CURRY: No, great question. We  
9 are hoping that the fact that they understand  
10 that they have to reuse it, that they will hold  
11 on to it.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: And if they don't  
13 have it, they don't get beer?

14 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

16 MR. CURRY: Basically, at this point,  
17 yes.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right.

19 MS. QUARLES: And you can purchase the  
20 mugs later.

21 MR. CURRY: Purchase another one if  
22 they can prove --

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. They can  
2 purchase another one.

3 MS. QUARLES: Yes, they can purchase  
4 them on-site.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. All  
6 right. And they have to go through another ID  
7 check, I'm assuming?

8 MS. QUARLES: Right.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. Great.

10 MS. QUARLES: Our purchase point is  
11 the same point as our beer ticket.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So now it  
13 looks like the second area, if I'm not mistaken,  
14 is way at the end.

15 MR. CURRY: Yes.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: The farthest southern  
17 end, that's a long ways between there and where  
18 you enter the road, is there anything in between  
19 going on?

20 MR. CURRY: So we will have --

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Because there is  
22 actually another sort of alcohol station, another

1 open space right there by the bridge.

2 MR. CURRY: Right. So we have  
3 solicited vendors, so local nonprofit  
4 organizations that will, you know, set up tables  
5 and discuss their, you know, organization.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

7 MR. CURRY: DDOE will be there, just  
8 to name one.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: So you will have  
10 people, you will have security monitoring that  
11 whole area?

12 MR. CURRY: Yes, absolutely.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- to make sure  
14 that --

15 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- people with  
17 cisterns look like they are old enough?

18 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: And they will be  
20 instructed to check IDs if they suspect a 16  
21 year-old has a cistern?

22 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

1                   MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. All right.  
2                   That's what we are looking for here.

3                   MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

4                   MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. And I'll  
5                   just mention, too, with regards to Mr. Short's  
6                   concerns about traffic and emergency. You do  
7                   have that between where you enter the road and  
8                   the northern end, will there be anything going on  
9                   between there?

10                  MR. CURRY: No. We are keeping that  
11                  as our logistics and --

12                  MEMBER ALBERTI: Right. So that's  
13                  free for emergency vehicles and emergency  
14                  vehicles are free to come and go from the Benning  
15                  Road entrance.

16                  MR. CURRY: Basically to that  
17                  intersection.

18                  MEMBER ALBERTI: That big A, yes,  
19                  right.

20                  MS. QUARLES: And our gate is on the  
21                  side of Benning that is going away from the  
22                  festival.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

2 MS. QUARLES: So --

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: No, I understand.

4 That's why I -- I'll explain that to Mr. Short,  
5 but, yes, it's on the northern end there. And  
6 there is that big area by the Benning Road. I'm  
7 very familiar with it. I've walked my dogs there  
8 many times.

9 MR. CURRY: Okay.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Thank you. I  
11 have no further questions. Good luck.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr. Short?

13 MEMBER SHORT: I'm kind of very  
14 familiar with that area also. In fact when I was  
15 a kid, there used to be boats down there, docking  
16 boats, but I'm so glad to hear that kayaking is  
17 coming back.

18 MR. CURRY: Oh, yes, absolutely.

19 MEMBER SHORT: That area really has  
20 been cleaned up. Now, is that island park land?  
21 Does that belong to the Federal Government or  
22 District Government?

1 MR. CURRY: District.

2 MS. QUARLES: District.

3 MR. CURRY: Originally, it was federal  
4 an then they gave it to the District. And it has  
5 been in District hands for the last 20 years or  
6 so.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

8 MR. CURRY: And we adopted it in 2006.

9 MEMBER SHORT: When I was a young  
10 person, it was the Park Police used to patrol it.  
11 But I'm glad the District owns it now. I'm glad  
12 to see events like your's taking place. I wish  
13 you the very best.

14 MS. QUARLES: Thank you.

15 MR. CURRY: Appreciate that for sure.

16 MS. QUARLES: I also take students out  
17 there for programming as well.

18 MEMBER SHORT: What's that?

19 MS. QUARLES: We take students out  
20 there during when we don't have events like this.  
21 So we run education programs as well, so it's  
22 being put to good use.

1 MEMBER SHORT: Great.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: You guys have done a  
3 great job cleaning it up with volunteers and  
4 others, you know, clearing all the bushes. I  
5 mean, I have seen a lot of changes over the last  
6 five years or so.

7 MR. CURRY: Appreciate that. We just  
8 had 300 people out last weekend. We did a huge  
9 cleanup. We probably cleaned up maybe 150 pounds  
10 of trash, removed a lot of invasive plants, so  
11 you can have a great sightline to the river.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Great.

13 MR. CURRY: You know, in preparation  
14 for the festival. We did some wood chipping.  
15 Like I mentioned last week, my crew and I were  
16 out putting up the dock, so -- and we are  
17 building a greenhouse this summer. We're going  
18 to --

19 MS. QUARLES: Community garden.

20 MR. CURRY: Yes, we have the community  
21 garden which I'll start next week.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, great.

1 MR. CURRY: And then --

2 MS. QUARLES: Seen by Benning Road.

3 MR. CURRY: Yes, at the Benning Road  
4 entrance, yes.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Great.

6 MR. CURRY: And then the asphalt in  
7 the main space, we're going to start removing  
8 that.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: And make that -- not  
10 pave it over?

11 MR. CURRY: Into a green space, yes.

12 MS. QUARLES: Grass.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Great. All right.  
14 One other question that relates to this. So the  
15 island will -- the little island between the two  
16 walk bridges --

17 MR. CURRY: Heritage.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- would people --  
19 what's it called?

20 MR. CURRY: Heritage Island.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. That's  
22 Heritage?

1 MR. CURRY: Yes.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Will people be  
3 allowed to go down there?

4 MR. CURRY: Yes. So --

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: So you will have --

6 MR. CURRY: -- they can make the loop  
7 around.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- people monitoring  
9 that also?

10 MR. CURRY: Yes.

11 MS. QUARLES: Absolutely.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. All right.

13 Yes, all right. I have no further questions.

14 It's great to hear all the progress that you are  
15 making out there.

16 MR. CURRY: Appreciate it.

17 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Alberti, I'll see  
18 you out there.

19 MS. QUARLES: Glad you like it.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Not this year, man.

21 I don't know if I'm going to be able to get a  
22 ticket in time. What have you sold so far? Any

1 idea?

2 MS. QUARLES: We hit 5,000 this  
3 morning actually.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Whew. So you better  
5 hurry and get your ticket.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Where do you sell  
7 them? Do you sell them on-line?

8 MR. CURRY: Yes.

9 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

10 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: How much are the  
11 tickets?

12 MS. QUARLES: It's  
13 kingmanislandbluegrass.com.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What?

15 MS. QUARLES: It's  
16 Kingmanislandbluegrass.com.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.

18 MS. QUARLES: And they say about using  
19 the ticket group that we are using this year as  
20 we will have a really solid eye on the numbers  
21 leading up to the event, so we will be able to  
22 adjust with Watkins and with MPD. Pretty much

1 Saturday morning we are cutting off sales on-line  
2 around 11:00, so we will have a really solid idea  
3 of our numbers.

4 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. How much are  
5 the tickets?

6 MS. QUARLES: They are a \$20 suggested  
7 donation.

8 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: And what do they  
9 cover? Just the entrance?

10 MS. QUARLES: Yep.

11 MR. CURRY: Entrance and --

12 MS. QUARLES: Entrance and your Kleen  
13 Kanteen.

14 MR. CURRY: -- the Kleen Kanteen.

15 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Okay.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And are you  
17 having volunteers in addition to security?

18 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

19 MS. QUARLES: Lots of them.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Lots of them.

21 MR. CURRY: We like --

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

1 MR. CURRY: Yes. -- are depending on  
2 volunteers in order to close the event off.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. Okay.  
4 But that day to help monitor events and things  
5 like that?

6 MR. CURRY: Actually, so they are  
7 helping us at the pouring stations and working  
8 the front gate.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

10 MR. CURRY: They are all over.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 MR. CURRY: So trash collection to  
13 stage monitors to MCs on stage, you know, so they  
14 are all volunteer.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Okay. Do  
16 you have a number or no?

17 MR. CURRY: 200.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

19 MS. QUARLES: 240.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So they are kind  
21 of your eyes and ears too in case anything is  
22 going wrong.

1 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

2 MS. QUARLES: Exactly.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

4 MS. QUARLES: And we have staff  
5 captains as well throughout the space.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. But you  
7 are in charge of that?

8 MR. CURRY: Yes.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.  
10 You're the top cat.

11 MS. QUARLES: This is the team.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay. All  
13 right. Does our Investigator have any concerns,  
14 questions?

15 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: I did have one  
16 question.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

18 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: On the  
19 application, the hours of the event is listed  
20 from 1:00 to 8:00. And then the hours of sales  
21 is 1:00 to 8:30 p.m. And then on the website it  
22 says 12:00 to 8:00. So I'm just trying to get a

1 clear understanding of it. I know it was crossed  
2 out, 12:00 was crossed out.

3 MR. CURRY: Right.

4 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: And it says  
5 1:00 here, but on your website it says 12:00 to  
6 8:00.

7 MR. CURRY: So beer sales don't kick  
8 off until 1:00.

9 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Okay.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.

11 MR. CURRY: But we are allowing  
12 patrons to enter at 12:00 just to kind of claim  
13 their space. Their personal real estate, if you  
14 will.

15 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: So beer sales  
16 is at 1:00, but the doors open at 12:00?

17 MR. CURRY: 12:00.

18 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Okay.

19 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Okay.

20 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Okay. And  
21 will there be any type of wristbands?

22 MR. CURRY: Yes, we have yellow

1 wristbands for --

2 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Okay. And  
3 that's for 21 and up?

4 MR. CURRY: Yes.

5 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Okay.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: They should correct  
7 the application here for sales.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Let's correct it and  
10 initial it now.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

12 MR. CURRY: And last call will be at  
13 7:30.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What about the  
15 number of people?

16 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: I know you  
17 mentioned, will there be food trucks there?

18 MR. CURRY: Yes.

19 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Do you know  
20 how many you have confirmed already?

21 MR. CURRY: 19.

22 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: 19. Okay.

1 MEMBER SHORT: There is 19 food  
2 trucks?

3 MR. CURRY: Right. Yes.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: And they will sell  
5 out.

6 MS. QUARLES: They always do.

7 MR. CURRY: Always, every year.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: It's a hungry crowd.

9 MS. QUARLES: It's a long day.

10 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: No further  
11 questions.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: It's a long day.

14 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: I just wanted  
15 to add that there will -- there is -- we have  
16 three other events that we will be monitoring  
17 that day as well, so we will be --

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, really?

19 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: -- monitoring  
20 this one as a tag onto that.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.

22 MEMBER SHORT: Yes, thank you.

1                   MEMBER ALBERTI: I know it's a long  
2 day, but I'm sure you will have Investigators  
3 there at some point.

4                   MR. CURRY: Yes, we will.

5                   MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

6                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So we were just  
7 thinking that you might want to -- I'll give this  
8 back to you just to update it to make it a little  
9 more accurate. I think you were discussing here.  
10 It sales the sales and service of alcoholic  
11 beverages goes to 8:30, but the event goes to  
12 8:00.

13                   MR. CURRY: Correct.

14                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So --

15                   MR. CURRY: Yes, that's a mistake on  
16 my part.

17                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. So you can  
18 change it here.

19                   MR. CURRY: I can change it?

20                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You can change  
21 it, yes.

22                   MR. CURRY: Okay. All right.

1                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And the other  
2 place we were wondering if should be changed is  
3 the number of people, because you said 6,000 but  
4 then you said maybe 10,000.

5                   MR. CURRY: 10,000. So --

6                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And your math, I  
7 mean, is 10,000 a realistic math?

8                   MEMBER SHORT: So you were going to  
9 put 6,000 to 10,000?

10                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Is that  
11 realistic, 10,000?

12                  MEMBER ALBERTI: I would suggest to  
13 put down 10,000 max.

14                  MR. CURRY: 10,000 max.

15                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

16                  MEMBER ALBERTI: We just want to make  
17 sure that technically we have that correct.

18                  MR. CURRY: All right.

19                  MEMBER ALBERTI: It will protect you.

20                  MR. CURRY: Yes, absolutely.

21                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right, right.

22                  MEMBER ALBERTI: And this way any

1 Investigator who goes out there will have an  
2 idea, because they won't be here to look at your  
3 application. They will have a better idea of  
4 what to expect.

5 MS. QUARLES: Right.

6 MR. CURRY: Okay.

7 MS. QUARLES: And we can adjust the  
8 security even the morning of if we look at it and  
9 see that it is going to be a little bit heavier  
10 than what we expect.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Probably a good idea.

12 MS. QUARLES: We anticipate that. We  
13 got a call yesterday.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

15 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Will you have  
16 counters or how are you counting the numbers?

17 MR. CURRY: So through our ticketing  
18 agency, MissionTix, they will be able to monitor.

19 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Okay.

20 MR. CURRY: And then I guess we could  
21 have counters to count as who leave, so we can  
22 have an adequate number.

1 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Okay.

2 MS. QUARLES: The numbers are tricky  
3 because people shift on and off the island.

4 MR. CURRY: Yes.

5 MS. QUARLES: So --

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: So will you sell more  
7 than 10,000 tickets?

8 MR. CURRY: Oh, no.

9 MS. QUARLES: No.

10 MR. CURRY: No.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So the point  
12 is you will limit the sale of tickets to 10,000.

13 MR. CURRY: Absolutely, absolutely.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. So we  
15 know -- all right.

16 MR. CURRY: And even as -- you know,  
17 during the day like they have sales, we  
18 identified that well before the 10,000 that we  
19 need to stop this because of, you know, we are  
20 just overwhelmed --

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

22 MR. CURRY: -- as far as staff and

1 security and everything else. We most definitely  
2 will shut that down, because we had to do that  
3 last year.

4 MS. QUARLES: Yes, we had to do that.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I have one  
7 other question. When our Investigator comes out,  
8 how they will find you, you know, how they could  
9 contact you.

10 MR. CURRY: I can give you my personal  
11 cell.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I think  
13 that would be a good idea.

14 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

15 MR. CURRY: Yes. Feel free to call me  
16 with everybody else.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Well, I  
18 will take it down, but you are going to take it  
19 down as well, right?

20 INVESTIGATOR TOWNSEND: Yes.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

22 MR. CURRY: It's (313).

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

2 MR. CURRY: 378-1423.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It actually  
4 should be on here probably.

5 MR. CURRY: I think it is.

6 MS. QUARLES: I can give you mine as  
7 well.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 378-1423, it is,  
9 yes.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: I would imagine  
11 people at the central check-in --

12 MS. QUARLES: That's what I was --

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- would know how to  
14 contact you, right?

15 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

16 MR. CURRY: Absolutely, absolutely.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.

18 MS. QUARLES: Just make sure they go  
19 in at the voluntary check-in so that they will  
20 hit one of our staff first there and then we can  
21 radio through.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. That  
3 would be basic --

4 MS. QUARLES: That way --

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- that people  
6 know how to contact you.

7 MS. QUARLES: Yes, it's the fastest  
8 way to go.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, okay.

10 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

11 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

12 MS. QUARLES: We will all have radios  
13 as well.

14 MR. CURRY: Yes.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So No. 6 says  
16 home and it's really cell, right?

17 MR. CURRY: I'm sorry? I missed that.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Your telephone  
19 number (313) 378-1423, it's really your cell,  
20 right?

21 MR. CURRY: Yes, that's my cell.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm going to put

1 that on here. All right. Because they will  
2 probably be looking at the application, so it  
3 will be right here.

4 MR. CURRY: So there is a phone number  
5 on there.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. Okay. All  
7 right. Anything else? Any other questions?

8 MR. CURRY: Do you want a secondary?

9 MS. QUARLES: Do you want a second  
10 number as well?

11 MEMBER SHORT: That would be good,  
12 yes, for the record.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

14 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes, I have a small  
15 question here.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right. Wait.  
17 He is going to give us another cell. Yours?

18 MS. QUARLES: Yes. It's (703) 618-  
19 1595.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 159 what?

21 MS. QUARLES: 95.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay, yes,

1       okay. Good. All right. Anything else? Yes,  
2       Mr. Rodriguez?

3                   MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Just a short  
4       question. Where do the proceeds go to?

5                   MR. CURRY: Oh, great question. So  
6       all the proceeds go back to educational  
7       programming that will be held on Kingman Island  
8       and also to the restoration efforts, so basically  
9       the docks. A part of my program, I work with the  
10      Workforce Development piece of our organization  
11      and graduates work with me throughout the summer  
12      and I teach them park management, you know,  
13      landscaping, basically, you know, soft skills and  
14      how to, you know, behave themselves on the job,  
15      so they make those mistakes with me, because as  
16      they move on, those employers won't have the  
17      same, you know, patience with them.

18                   Also, you know, just the community  
19      garden, that piece, I want to build that out and  
20      ultimately start a CSA and adopt families in the  
21      local area and provide them with fresh produce.  
22      So how they would adopt them, like they will come

1 out maybe once or twice a month, do some work in  
2 the garden and maybe pay \$20 and they will get,  
3 you know, delivered fresh produce once or twice a  
4 month.

5 And we will also provide them cooking  
6 courses so they can know how to use those fresh  
7 fruits and vegetables. So those are some of the  
8 things that we have on the horizon.

9 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

10 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Thank you.

11 Appreciate that.

12 MR. CURRY: No problem.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. That's  
14 really great. All right. Okay. Then, at this  
15 point then, I would move that we approve this  
16 application.

17 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Short has  
19 seconded the motion.

20 All those in favor say aye.

21 ALL: Aye.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those

1       opposed? All those abstaining? The motion  
2       passes 5-0-0. Great.

3               MS. QUARLES: Thank you.

4               CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you.

5               MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you. Good  
6       luck.

7               MR. CURRY: Appreciate it.

8               CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You probably need  
9       to wait for this, I think.

10              MS. QUARLES: Oh, okay.

11              CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I think so, yes.

12              MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Curry, you really  
13       have done a great job with the island.

14              MR. CURRY: Oh, thank you. I  
15       appreciate that.

16              MEMBER ALBERTI: Like I said, I have  
17       watched the progress over the years and it's  
18       really amazing.

19              MR. CURRY: We have a lot of work to  
20       do, but I appreciate that.

21              MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, I know, but it's  
22       coming along, so very impressive.

1 MR. CURRY: Thank you.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, I'm going  
3 to go, if not to the festival, some other time.

4 MS. QUARLES: Yes.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It sounds really  
6 great.

7 MS. QUARLES: It's a wonderful place.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. Thank you.

9 Okay.
