CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good morning, everyone. I want to welcome you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

Today is April 23, 2014. My name is Ruthanne Miller. I'm the Chairperson. Joining me today to my far right is Mr. Donald Brooks and to my immediate right is Mr. Hector Rodriguez. There are three of us in attendance this morning. We will have more joining us later, but three constitutes a quorum.

Copies of today's hearing calendar and agenda are available at the receptionist desk. Please be aware that these proceedings are being recorded by a court reporter. Accordingly, we must ask you to refrain from any disruptive noises or actions in the hearing room.

1                   If you have any electronic  
2 devices, pagers, cell phones or such, please,  
3 make certain they are turned off to avoid any  
4 interruption of the proceeding.

5                   When I call your case, please,  
6 come forward and take a seat at the table.  
7 You will notice that there is a piece of paper  
8 on each table for you to sign-in. This is to  
9 ensure the correct spelling of your name for  
10 the record.

11                  The Open Meetings Act requires  
12 that the public hearing on each case be open  
13 to the public. The Board may, consistent with  
14 Section 405(b) of the Open Meetings Act, enter  
15 a closed meeting during or after the public  
16 hearing on a case to consult with an attorney  
17 to obtain legal advice, discuss settlement  
18 agreements or deliberate upon a decision in an  
19 adjudication proceeding.

20                  Okay. I'll now turn to this  
21 morning's calendar. The first case on the  
22 calendar is a Protest (Status) Hearing, Case

1 No. 14-PRO-00018, Good Hope Deli & Market  
2 located at 1736 Good Hope Road, S.E., License  
3 No. 93974, in ANC-8A. And this is a new  
4 application.

5 So if you are here for that case,  
6 would you come forward and take a seat at the  
7 table over here. Well, it depends, are you --

8 MS. CLARK: I'm Commissioner  
9 Clark.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And  
11 you are?

12 MS. SNYDER: Seres Snyder.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

14 MS. SNYDER: Good Hope Deli &  
15 Market.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Are you here  
17 for the market?

18 MS. SNYDER: Yes.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Then  
20 you sit over here and the protestant side is  
21 over there. Okay. Let's start with  
22 introductions over here again.

1 MS. SNYDER: We still negotiating.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry,  
3 what?

4 MS. SNYDER: We still negotiating.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.  
6 Are you the owner?

7 MS. SNYDER: Yes.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All  
9 right. And over here?

10 MS. CLARK: I'm ANC Commissioner  
11 Barbara Clark, Chair of 8A.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Now, I  
13 have read the transcript from the Roll Call  
14 and it's my understanding that the ANC did not  
15 file the protest within the protest period,  
16 which ended March 3rd. In fact, they filed on  
17 the 4th. Is that correct?

18 MS. CLARK: We had our meeting on  
19 the first Tuesday of every month, other than  
20 election, and I filed as an individual. And  
21 after -- we have to do -- everything that we  
22 vote on has to be in a public forum.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

2 MS. CLARK: So that was why we did  
3 it the day after.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So my  
5 understanding though is that you may have  
6 filed as an individual but you didn't have  
7 standing as an individual, that representing  
8 a Single Member District does not give you  
9 standing.

10 MS. CLARK: Right, right.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Because you  
12 would have needed to be --

13 MS. CLARK: We had to do it as --

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- a group of  
15 five.

16 MS. CLARK: -- you -- um-hum.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Or the ANC.

18 MS. CLARK: Right. And we have  
19 seven members.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. And I  
21 understand that most ANCs meet once a month,  
22 every 30 days. And however, that's why I

1 believe that the rules allow for a 45 day  
2 period in order to capture an ANC vote or  
3 allow you to take that vote.

4 MS. CLARK: Um-hum.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: However, the  
6 vote was taken after the protest period ended.  
7 And I think you may have been told otherwise,  
8 but our rules provide that you would have had  
9 to -- the ANC would have had to file a motion  
10 for an extension prior to the expiration of  
11 the protest period in order to be given  
12 standing beyond the protest period.

13 MS. CLARK: Um-hum.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And that  
15 didn't happen in your case. They did it  
16 afterwards.

17 MS. CLARK: Yes.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And we -- and  
19 it didn't come to the Board, so we never saw  
20 that. So unfortunately, where I'm going with  
21 this is that based on our regulations, you  
22 don't have standing.

1 MS. CLARK: I -- my understanding  
2 during mediation is that we were given  
3 standing.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You were. I  
5 understand that. And this happens rarely, but  
6 at Roll Call, that is conducted by our Agent,  
7 and the decision is really up to the Board.  
8 And the Board is going to be finding that you  
9 don't have standing. Even though she thought  
10 that the Board would find that you do, because  
11 it was filed after the period ended, because  
12 your protest was filed after the period ended,  
13 you can't have standing.

14 If you had sought -- I just want  
15 to tell you this because I think there are a  
16 lot of cases that, I'm sure the ANC will have  
17 and --

18 MS. CLARK: Um-hum.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- you need  
20 to know the rules. And if you miss it on one,  
21 you don't want to miss it on another one.

22 1603. Well, that's for -- 1705.5

1 would allow the ANC to seek an extension from  
2 that requirement from the Board. It says "The  
3 Board may, on the request of both the ANC and  
4 the applicant, extend the ANC's protest  
5 petition deadline for the sole purpose of  
6 allowing the ANC to vote on whether to support  
7 or protest the license application."

8 So that's the means that you can  
9 use if you have a problem with your date. But  
10 in your case, you didn't file soon enough.  
11 You didn't file with the Board and you didn't  
12 file a request for an extension before the  
13 period ended and you didn't get the approval  
14 of the applicant, so we can't give you  
15 standing.

16 MS. CLARK: So in other words, I  
17 got the wrong information when I was here.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, I think  
19 in other words, the Agent misread how the  
20 Board would rule in that case, but you had  
21 already -- you weren't misguided, because you  
22 were already late. She just thought that we

1 would accept, you know, your lateness.

2 And so I'm trying to tell you in  
3 the future, there are certain regulations you  
4 need to look at. And one is that you need to  
5 do it ahead of time, before the period  
6 expires.

7 MS. CLARK: Well, the thing about  
8 it is that we did not get the letter until it  
9 was late. We did not have a January meeting  
10 because of the snow. So which meant that it  
11 was after our February meeting that we even  
12 got the information. So therefore, and I went  
13 myself to look after I got the letter.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So let  
15 me tell you what the proper procedure is now  
16 and then we are going to vote on this. I'm  
17 going to have a Motion to Dismiss the  
18 protestant because you don't have standing.  
19 However, the rules provide if you look at --  
20 well, the rules provide that you can file a  
21 Motion for Reinstatement within 10 days of our  
22 written order on this and you can make all

1 those arguments.

2 I'm sorry. The rules provide that  
3 once -- we're going to vote on this. If we  
4 vote to dismiss you as a protestant, you have  
5 a right to file a Motion for Reinstatement  
6 within 10 days of our written order. And you  
7 can make all those arguments in that motion.

8 Okay. We're not going to rule on  
9 that today. Okay. So watch for our order and  
10 then you can file a Motion for Reinstatement.  
11 And that's -- look at -- okay. If you have  
12 any questions, you can ask our General  
13 Counsel, Martha Jenkins. Okay? But that's  
14 what the rule is.

15 Okay. If you don't have any other  
16 specific questions about this, I'm going to  
17 move on with it. All right. Do you  
18 understand? Okay.

19 Before the Board is an application  
20 for a new Retailer's Class B License filed by  
21 S & A Deli, Inc. t/a Good Hope Deli & Market.  
22 Notice of the application was published in the

1 District of Columbia Register on January 17,  
2 2014. The notice informed the public that the  
3 last date to file a protest was on March 3,  
4 2014.

5 In a letter dated February 28,  
6 2014, Chair Barbara Clark in her capacity as  
7 a Single Member Commissioner of Advisory  
8 Neighborhood Commission Single Member District  
9 8A02 filed a protest against the application.  
10 Chair Clark explained that the Roll Call  
11 Hearing on March 24, 2014 that ANC-8A did not  
12 formally vote to protest the license or submit  
13 a formal recommendation during the protest  
14 period.

15 The Board notes that an ANC, not  
16 an SMD, is entitled to standing under 25-  
17 601.4. In order to obtain standing, an ANC  
18 must file their protest within the protest  
19 period under 25-602.

20 Here the protest petition filed by  
21 Chair Clark does not constitute a formal  
22 action by ANC-8A. Therefore, the petition

1 received by the Board is insufficient under  
2 the law.

3 In addition, there is no basis in  
4 the record for granting SMD 8A02 standing on  
5 the alternative ground, such as the group of  
6 five or more residents or property owners.

7 Therefore, based on the foregoing,  
8 I move that the Board dismiss the protest by  
9 Chair Clark and do I have a second?

10 MEMBER BROOKS: Second.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Brooks  
12 has seconded the motion. I'm going to take a  
13 roll call vote on this.

14 Mr. Brooks?

15 MEMBER BROOKS: I agree.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And, Mr.  
17 Rodriguez?

18 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: I agree.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And I  
20 agree. So therefore the protest is dismissed  
21 by a vote of 3-0-0. A written order will  
22 follow and you will have 10 days in which to

1 file a motion for reinstatement.

2 Okay. Thank you very much.

3 MS. SNYDER: Thank you very much.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

5 (Whereupon, the Protest (Status)

6 Hearing in the above-entitled matter was

7 concluded at 9:48 a.m.)
