CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Our last Fact-Finding Hearing, I believe, of the morning is for Living Classrooms of the National Capital Region. That event is to take place April 26, 2014. And the applicant is Mr. Curry?

MR. CURRY: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good. Good. How are you?

MR. CURRY: Doing all right. Can't complain too much.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So what I can glean from the application or whatever is that this is a kind of community event that you are having, the glass festival?

MR. CURRY: Yes, that's correct.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. First time?

MR. CURRY: No, fifth.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Fifth?

1 MR. CURRY: This is our fifth,
2 yes.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay. I
4 know it says first time. Okay.

5 MR. CURRY: This is our fifth
6 year.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.

8 MR. CURRY: We always held
9 outside.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

11 MR. CURRY: The same location. I
12 believe of the five years, we served beer for
13 the last three years.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So
15 have you personally come here for an
16 appearance?

17 MR. CURRY: This is my first time
18 for it here.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

20 MR. CURRY: I just came on with
21 Living Classrooms last year.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. CURRY: I wasn't a part of the
2 ABRA meeting last year, so this is my first
3 time, experience like the whole process for
4 the event.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, so it's
6 your first time?

7 MR. CURRY: Correct.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But it's not
9 the --

10 MR. CURRY: Organizations.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: --
12 organizations, right. And what is Living
13 Classrooms?

14 MR. CURRY: We are an
15 environmental education organization.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

17 MR. CURRY: We provide both
18 environmental programming in schools, so we
19 have partnerships with Eastern, Eliot-Hine
20 and several other different high schools and
21 middle schools in the area. And we also have
22 two site-based locations which is Kingman

1 Island and a campground, Camp Fraser in
2 Virginia where we bring students to our
3 locations and do environmental education with
4 our different programs, teaching basically.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So are
6 you working with people who have done this
7 before or are you just doing it all by
8 yourself new?

9 MR. CURRY: No. So last year, I
10 wasn't -- I was a part of the permitting
11 process, but just not the ABRA piece.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

13 MR. CURRY: Several, four or five
14 of us that went through the process last year,
15 so we rolled over to this year. So we are
16 pretty -- you know, we understand the process
17 and how we generally set up the event every
18 year. I'm pretty familiar with it.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Are
20 you using the same security that you have used
21 in the past, do you know?

22 MR. CURRY: Watkins Security, yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, did you
2 use them before?

3 MR. CURRY: Yes.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
5 the No. 40, is that the number that you have
6 gotten in the past as well?

7 MR. CURRY: Last year was less.
8 We are expecting probably a couple more
9 people, so we increased the number this year.
10 Last year, I believe -- I'm not quite sure
11 what the number we had last year.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Is it correct
13 you are expecting 2,000?

14 MR. CURRY: That's correct.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So how
16 are you serving your alcohol? What are you
17 having? Are you having beer?

18 MR. CURRY: Yes. We're having
19 beer. We have three beer trucks.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: They are
21 trucks? Okay.

22 MR. CURRY: Um-hum. So we want to

1 use a ticket system. So basically, the
2 patrons will be IDed and checked at the main
3 entrance of the Island. Though where they
4 will come in, we will have two people at a
5 table. The first person to check IDs, the
6 second person will process the tickets.

7 The way the parking is organized,
8 we have like, basically, one-way in system,
9 one-way out. We will have two security guards
10 that will also, you know, identify, make sure
11 everyone has a bracelet. Only individuals
12 that are 21 and over will receive bracelets.

13 And also when they purchase
14 tickets, only individuals with bracelets would
15 be able to buy beer tickets and they only can
16 buy two beer tickets at a time. And that is
17 communicated to the individuals selling the
18 tickets and the distributors of beer at each
19 individual beer truck.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I'm
21 going to let others ask questions if they
22 would like. Do other Board Members have

1 questions? Yeah, Mr. Alberti?

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Hi, Mr. Curry.

3 MR. CURRY: Hi, nice to meet you.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, pleased to
5 meet you. I'm actually a frequent visitor to
6 the Island.

7 MR. CURRY: Oh, really? Okay.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Was it last year
9 you ran out of beer?

10 MR. CURRY: That was last year.
11 That's right. That was -- knock on wood, we
12 won't run out --

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: The women we got
14 around here are scrambling. So all right,
15 just a couple of questions, sort of comments.

16 You have the one-way in/one-way
17 out on the bike path there.

18 MR. CURRY: Right.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: By the parking
20 lot. But there is also that back entrance
21 down by Benning Road. How will that be
22 controlled?

1 MR. CURRY: The fence. The
2 pedestrian entrance will be closed. The
3 vehicle entrance will be closed, but we will
4 have a security guard that won't allow
5 individuals to go past a certain point.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

7 MR. CURRY: If they -- like staff
8 will be and volunteers will be able to go back
9 there, but no -- it's going to be communicated
10 that no beer will be able to go beyond that
11 point.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: So on that dirt
13 road in the back there --

14 MR. CURRY: Um-hum.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- how far will
16 people be able to go with their beers?

17 MR. CURRY: So to the left, we
18 will have porta-potties, so that will probably
19 be a section of maybe like 500 feet or so. If
20 you make the right, we are going to have a
21 second stage where --

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: On that roadway?

1 MR. CURRY: Yes, on the roadway.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, cool.

3 MR. CURRY: So we have outdoor
4 classrooms. It's probably like 1,000 feet
5 down. We are going to have a showmobile where
6 we are going to have --

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Get that first
8 sort of observation area there?

9 MR. CURRY: The second one.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: The second one?

11 MR. CURRY: I already got it.
12 There are going to be --

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

14 MR. CURRY: -- doing different
15 sessions there at the first one. Beyond that,
16 it's the second -- right before the East
17 Capitol Bridge. We will have a section there,
18 that's where the second stage will be. We
19 will have food trucks, one beer truck and
20 restrooms and those types of things.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: So I'll ask --

22 MR. CURRY: Um-hum.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- that beyond
2 that second stage and to the south and then
3 beyond the porta-potties to the north that you
4 not allow any alcoholic beverages past those
5 points. All right. Because you have to have
6 some point where you are going to --

7 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- say no more,
9 otherwise they will be walking into the woods
10 at the very southern end.

11 MR. CURRY: Absolutely. We will
12 have dedicated security at that point, so we
13 will make sure that no one goes beyond that
14 point.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

16 MR. CURRY: No one can get beyond
17 it.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right, right. So
19 I would just have those. I mean, that's a
20 pretty big area for --

21 MR. CURRY: Yes.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- 2,000 people.

1 MR. CURRY: I agree.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: And so that kind
3 of brings up the question of how many security
4 people are you going to have roaming this
5 event that will be looking to see who is
6 consuming alcohol?

7 MR. CURRY: Yes, so within the
8 open area on Kingman, I have allocated roughly
9 nine people to roam in that section. There
10 will be three people dedicated around the beer
11 trucks just making sure that no one is getting
12 beer that is not supposed to, in addition to,
13 you know, the trained eyes of our
14 distributors.

15 We will have one person or
16 actually two people around the beer ticketing
17 line, just to make sure --

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Um-hum.

19 MR. CURRY: -- that that is going
20 well. And we will have two security guards at
21 the Heritage Bridge, so no one can have beer
22 beyond the bridge. So all beer will be on

1 Kingman Island itself.

2 So there -- so when you come in --

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: So back -- oh, I
4 misunderstood you. So there is no beer down
5 by the stage, down by the --

6 MR. CURRY: Yes, yes. So when --
7 so the bridge that takes you onto the Kingman
8 Island --

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

10 MR. CURRY: -- no one can have
11 beer on the bridge. So all the beer will be
12 on Kingman Island.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

14 MR. CURRY: If that makes sense to
15 you.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: Are you serving
17 any beer beyond the bridge?

18 MR. CURRY: No.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, I thought you
20 said you were having a second beer truck down
21 by the --

22 MR. CURRY: Well, it's on -- I

1 guess if you look at the map.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, let me look
3 at this map. Let me look at this map.

4 MR. CURRY: Yes.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm going from
6 what I know of the Island and so let me just
7 see on this map how we are figuring this
8 thing.

9 MR. CURRY: So on the map in the
10 lower right hand corner, you see a bridge,
11 Heritage Island?

12 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Um-hum.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

14 MR. CURRY: So that's the -- no
15 beer will be -- no one with beer can go beyond
16 that point.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: So where does --
18 oh, I see, yeah, right. Oh, I see. Oh, I
19 gotcha, right. So no one -- right. Okay. So
20 then it's that -- okay. So once you cross
21 over the bridge and you are in that big area,
22 grassy area --

1 MR. CURRY: Grassy, yep.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- or whatever it
3 is now.

4 MR. CURRY: Um-hum. Parking lot.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Where the hill
6 collapsed last year. So then you go back this
7 road to the back that takes you to the exit to
8 Benning Road, that road in the back. And you
9 are going to -- beer will be allowed along
10 that back road, right?

11 MR. CURRY: Correct.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So that's
13 where -- how many roamers will you have back
14 there?

15 MR. CURRY: We have five people
16 roaming that road and around the second stage.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Okay.
18 Very good. And I think that that's it. Your
19 wristband is going to look like? What are
20 they going to look like?

21 MR. CURRY: They are paper with --
22 I can't remember what color they are. I

1 haven't seen them, so actually I don't know.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Are they --

3 MR. CURRY: They are not plastic.

4 They are the paper.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right. Are they

6 going to have printing on them for this

7 festival or are they just going to be plain?

8 MR. CURRY: They are generic.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Okay. You

10 definitely want to show our Investigator an

11 example of those.

12 MR. CURRY: An example of the --

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yeah.

14 MR. CURRY: Okay.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: So our

16 Investigators know when they get there what

17 they are looking for.

18 MR. CURRY: Okay. Yes, we can --

19 definitely can do that.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: I wish you the

21 best of luck. I have no further questions.

22 MR. CURRY: I appreciate it.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any
2 others? Mr. Rodriguez?

3 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: So how many
4 projected people do you forecast?

5 MR. CURRY: We are expecting
6 2,000.

7 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: 2,000?

8 MR. CURRY: Yes.

9 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: And what will
10 your crowd look like? I mean --

11 MR. CURRY: Demographic?

12 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes,
13 demographic. Older crowd, younger crowd, age-
14 wise?

15 MR. CURRY: It's a family-friendly
16 event, so we have activities for young
17 children. We actually have a tent called
18 Boogie Babes where we are going to have --
19 they are going to sing music, do arts and
20 crafts, face painting, but it's totally --
21 it's in the back. It's separate from where
22 the beer and everything else is.

1 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Um-hum.

2 MR. CURRY: So generally how last
3 year's event went, between like the hours of
4 1:00 to 4:00, it was more families. The
5 families generally left about 4:00 and then it
6 kind of switched over to more adults from 4:00
7 to 8:00. So that's generally how things kind
8 of, you know, panned out.

9 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Who did your
10 art work?

11 MR. CURRY: The art work?

12 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yeah.

13 MR. CURRY: The company is called
14 Boogie Babes. I don't know. Are you saying
15 for the --

16 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: No, I was just,
17 you know, thinking that maybe next time have
18 a better, clearer art diagram.

19 MR. CURRY: Oh, the diagram.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: We don't have the
21 original, so it might be --

22 MR. CURRY: Yeah, yeah, it's --

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- the original
2 was better.

3 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Oh, yeah, we
4 have to look at not being instrumentally --

5 MR. CURRY: I have another
6 example. I have three printouts if you want
7 these.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just for the sake
9 of the Board, none of this area, except for
10 the, you know, front end -- the Island itself
11 is sort of fenced in.

12 MR. CURRY: Correct.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: But none of your
14 area is going to be fenced in?

15 MR. CURRY: Um, no. Well, none of
16 the area is fenced in, but no one can --

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, --

18 MR. CURRY: -- interrupt things.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- that was my
20 questions about roamers. So that's the --
21 that's why I sort of requested to make sure
22 that the roamers are aware of people --

1 MR. CURRY: Gotcha.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- taking alcohol
3 off, you know --

4 MR. CURRY: The premises.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, yes, you
6 know, into the areas where -- well, there is
7 lots of woods there.

8 MR. CURRY: Gotcha. I gotcha. I
9 understand. Yes.

10 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: I have no more
11 questions. Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Short?

13 MEMBER SHORT: Good morning, sir.

14 MR. CURRY: How are you doing?

15 MEMBER SHORT: I see also you have
16 tents. How many tents are you going to have?

17 MR. CURRY: We are going to have--
18 it's six tents that we are renting and then we
19 will have three 10 x 10s that we are -- pop-up
20 tents that we are purchasing.

21 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Those tents
22 have been approved by the DCRA and the Fire

1 Department?

2 MR. CURRY: Absolutely.

3 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. And I see
4 where you have got a note here, "no cooking
5 under the tents," so you know, that's a big
6 no-no.

7 MR. CURRY: Yes, so food trucks
8 are the only vendors providing food. The
9 tents are just basically structures for like
10 where the EMTs, Whole Foods, so their staff
11 would be under tent. So there won't be any
12 cooking or anything under the tents.

13 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. And I heard
14 you mention Eastern High School and Eliot --

15 MR. CURRY: Yes.

16 MEMBER SHORT: -- Middle School?
17 I'm a graduate of Eastern High School, so --

18 MR. CURRY: Oh, okay.

19 MEMBER SHORT: -- how is this
20 money going to help the schools?

21 MR. CURRY: Well, actually, 100
22 percent of the funds goes back to my program.

1 I'm actually the Kingman Island coordinator,
2 so all events that take place on the Island
3 I'm responsible for in some form or fashion.

4 I work with the Workforce
5 Development Team. I have four guys that work
6 with me throughout the summer doing different
7 activities on the Island, so we put in
8 different trails on the island. We're
9 actually in the process of building a
10 greenhouse and we are going to work with a
11 professional gardener this year. He is going
12 to have a plot and we are going to, basically,
13 plant fruits and vegetables in the garden.

14 Our plan is to give away a portion
15 of the produce to the local community, also
16 bring in the different high schools.

17 MEMBER SHORT: Great.

18 MR. CURRY: We actually have a --
19 I believe it's Eastern, Environmental
20 Ambassador which is led by Living Classrooms
21 and they come out to Kingman Island and they
22 are going to work in the garden and do

1 different education activities.

2 Actually, Eliot-Hine, they are on
3 the Island as we speak doing different
4 environmental programs right now in the
5 garden.

6 MEMBER SHORT: That's great.

7 MR. CURRY: Right now.

8 MEMBER SHORT: I remember that
9 Island quite well. I grew up in that area.

10 MR. CURRY: Really? Okay.

11 MEMBER SHORT: So I'm very
12 familiar. And I'm glad to see the Island is
13 being put to good use.

14 MR. CURRY: Oh, absolutely,
15 absolutely. I look at it as an educational
16 tool just to expose our children to the great
17 outdoors. It's literally an urban forest in
18 the middle and D.C. is quite the jewel that no
19 one really knows about.

20 MEMBER SHORT: You think it is?

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: I do.

22 MEMBER SHORT: So I might bring my

1 grandchildren over this weekend.

2 MR. CURRY: Oh, we would love to
3 have you.

4 MEMBER SHORT: Okay.

5 MR. CURRY: It will be a great
6 time.

7 MEMBER SHORT: All right. Thank
8 you very much. That's all I have.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just real quick.
10 Are you guys involved with the aquarium at
11 Eliot-Hine?

12 MR. CURRY: No, we are not.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So that's
14 someone else who is doing sort of the
15 Anacostia River Aquarium at Eliot?

16 MR. CURRY: Yeah, I believe that
17 is someone else.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. Okay.
19 Thank you.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any
21 other Board questions? How about Mr. Peru?

22 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Yes, just some

1 things --

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

3 INVESTIGATOR PERU: -- for our
4 clarification. So the event times on the
5 application 1 to 8, is that still going to be
6 the times of the event?

7 MR. CURRY: That's the same. Same
8 time, yes.

9 INVESTIGATOR PERU: And what is
10 going to be last call for alcohol?

11 MR. CURRY: Last call is 7:30.

12 INVESTIGATOR PERU: It's going to
13 7:30?

14 MR. CURRY: Yes.

15 INVESTIGATOR PERU: And what's the
16 fee for the event?

17 MR. CURRY: A suggested donation
18 of \$10.

19 INVESTIGATOR PERU: So I know this
20 is an open roaming drinking event with --
21 based on wristbands, correct?

22 MR. CURRY: Correct.

1 INVESTIGATOR PERU: 21 wristbands.
2 So are the cups that are going to be provided
3 with the beer a certain color or is there one
4 type of cup that is going to be used?

5 MR. CURRY: Yes. Sierra Nevada,
6 they are providing the cups for the event.

7 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Do you know
8 how they look like or what they look like
9 exactly?

10 MR. CURRY: Last year they were
11 clear and I believe they had maybe like
12 Budweiser, some type of stamp on the side.

13 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Sierra Nevada
14 is providing them?

15 MR. CURRY: Yes, um-hum.

16 INVESTIGATOR PERU: So there can
17 only be one type of cup at this event?

18 MR. CURRY: No, actually, two.

19 INVESTIGATOR PERU: There is two
20 types of cups?

21 MR. CURRY: So it's the plastic
22 cup and we are in the process of going cup-

1 less. So we are working with Klean Kanteen.
2 They are providing steel like cups that are
3 reusable and patrons can take home and bring
4 back next year, so we don't have to have any
5 trash, so we are trying to eliminate plastic
6 cups in three years.

7 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Steel
8 canteens?

9 MR. CURRY: Yes.

10 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Are they going
11 to be labeled canteens?

12 MR. CURRY: Labeled with Living
13 Classrooms emblem on the side.

14 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay. And
15 your security, who is actually checking IDs
16 for everyone that wants to purchase alcohol?

17 MR. CURRY: So Living Classrooms'
18 staff is manning the front entrance, so we are
19 having --

20 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Are they
21 checking IDs?

22 MR. CURRY: -- six -- yes, they

1 are checking IDs. In addition to the
2 security, it will be one security person in
3 each line checking IDs also.

4 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Is anybody in
5 that TIPS-certified? Been through any kind of
6 alcohol awareness training?

7 MR. CURRY: No one on our staff,
8 but Watkins Security, I believe, they have the
9 TIPS training. And then also Brad, who is
10 going to be at the beer truck, he is with
11 Sierra Nevada. He is alcohol -- I forget the
12 term.

13 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay.

14 MR. CURRY: Alcohol awareness. He
15 has the alcohol awareness training.

16 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay. Does
17 any of your staff have any tools for detecting
18 fake IDs or ID checking handbooks or anything
19 like that?

20 MR. CURRY: Actually, we went to
21 get that, the ID checking handbook.

22 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay.

1 MR. CURRY: I understand that --

2 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay. I can
3 get you that.

4 MR. CURRY: -- is something that
5 we can get and have that at the truck.

6 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay. I'll
7 get you that. Okay. The wristbands you said
8 you weren't sure what color they were yet,
9 but --

10 MR. CURRY: I can get that
11 information.

12 INVESTIGATOR PERU: You can get
13 that to me?

14 MR. CURRY: Yeah. Just a quick
15 text message and I can take care of that.

16 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay.
17 Appreciate it. That's all.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I just want
19 to clarify based on your questions, the people
20 who will be checking IDs don't have training
21 on checking IDs?

22 MR. CURRY: Yes, so we are

1 planning on having a pow wow before, so
2 getting the ID -- the booklet and working with
3 Watkins Security --

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

5 MR. CURRY: -- that's kind of our
6 ability to manage that situation.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So the
8 security company has experience?

9 MR. CURRY: Right.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Is that what
11 you are saying? Do any of them -- are they
12 going to be checking IDs?

13 MR. CURRY: Yes. We have one
14 person per line at the main entrance --

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

16 MR. CURRY: -- checking bags, so
17 no alcohol is entering and also having the
18 ability just to make the process smoother just
19 going down the line and providing the
20 bracelets also.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. The
22 person who is actually checking the ID, is it

1 going to be a security person or someone else?

2 MR. CURRY: Security person and
3 also when they get to the actual event, we
4 will check the -- our -- at Living Classrooms'
5 staff will check the ID also.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. You
7 will be the second ones checking them, not the
8 first?

9 MR. CURRY: It will -- they will
10 either be the first or the second.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.

12 MR. CURRY: So we have the ability
13 -- basically, if the lines get extremely long,
14 we want to kind of, you know, keep --

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yeah.

16 MR. CURRY: -- the process kind of
17 fluid, so we will allow the security officers
18 like to kind of be preemptive and go down the
19 line. That's kind of our thinking.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Security?

21 MR. CURRY: Security.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. CURRY: Right.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.

3 So, Mr. Peru, what else? You are going to
4 give him an ID handbook?

5 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Yes.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

7 INVESTIGATOR PERU: I'll get him
8 that. I have one more question though about
9 do you have -- are there any police or Park
10 Police or anybody else that is going to be
11 part of that event?

12 MR. CURRY: No, but we have been
13 in contact through our DCRA permit and
14 communicated all of our emergency plans and
15 everything else.

16 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay. So you
17 haven't talked to any commander, any police
18 commander or anybody in that area?

19 MR. CURRY: No.

20 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Okay.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: It's probably
22 advisable that you -- he may already know,

1 because this is a big event, but you should
2 make sure that the 1st District Commander. Is
3 that the 1st District? I think.

4 MR. CURRY: I believe so.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Is aware of the
6 event and the day.

7 MR. CURRY: Okay.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm not sure --
9 well, they are going to want to know it's
10 there. I don't know whether the
11 responsibility is for Kingman Island with
12 respect to parks and police, but MPD should
13 certainly be made aware of it.

14 MR. CURRY: Okay.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Like I said, I
16 don't expect that it will be a surprise to
17 them, but you really should make -- guarantee
18 that they know about it.

19 MR. CURRY: No problem. Okay. We
20 can most definitely take care of that.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Peru, do
22 you know if we will have an Investigator

1 there?

2 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Yes, I did see
3 email from the Chief stating that there will
4 be, I think, more than one Investigator.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

6 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Yes.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: They did last
9 year.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yeah.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: They had a couple
12 and the year before.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: They can be
14 very helpful.

15 MR. CURRY: Yes, yes.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.
17 Okay. Anything else? All right.

18 I move that we approve this
19 application then. Do I have a second?

20 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Short
22 seconded the motion.

1 All those in favor say aye.

2 ALL: Aye.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those
4 opposed? All those abstaining? The motion
5 passes 5-0-0.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: If he has any
8 other questions, he can call you, correct?

9 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Yes, yes.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.

11 MR. CURRY: Sounds good.

12 Appreciate it.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So we are
14 just signing off on it now.

15 MR. CURRY: Okay.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I hope
17 you have a great event.

18 MR. CURRY: Oh, thank you for your
19 time. And the weather looks like it's going
20 to be amazing, so --

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, good.

22 MR. CURRY: -- looking forward to

1 it. A long day for me, but it's going to be
2 fun.

3 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: The times?

4 MR. CURRY: 1:00 to 8:00.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: And it's free,
6 right?

7 MR. CURRY: Yes. It's technically
8 free, but suggested donations.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right. Okay.

10 MR. CURRY: All right. Cool.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So
12 thank you.

13 MR. CURRY: Thank you.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So that
15 concludes our morning session and the Board
16 will recess and return at 1:00.

17 (Whereupon, the Fact-Finding
18 Hearing in the above-entitled matter was
19 concluded at 11:44 a.m.)
