MEMBER BROOKS: Now what time are we supposed to have the folks from the Greek festival? Is that 10:00 or 11:00? 10:00, right?

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Our next Fact-Finding Hearing is St. Sophia Greek Orthodox Cathedral and I understand they are running late. They won't be here until 11:00.

MEMBER BROOKS: Oh, 11:00, okay.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So we will recess and come back at 11:00.

INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Would you like me to hang on to all of this stuff?

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. What's that from?

INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: That was the Drink D.C., LLC. I forget the name of the --

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: The first one?

INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: The very --

1 yes, Bite of D.C.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you need
3 it? I would say check with -- I don't know.
4 Check with Martha.

5 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I have most
6 of the information already in the packet they
7 gave. This is just like a large map and maybe
8 a couple additional pieces.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Well,
10 I don't think the Board needs it.

11 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But --

13 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I'll hang on
14 to it.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- Martha
16 might have some reason for it. I don't know.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: You guys use it.

18 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes. Okay.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. We
21 will see you in a little while.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: It's in your

1 hands now.

2 (Whereupon, at 10:30 a.m. a recess
3 until 10:51 a.m.)

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm going to
5 start. We are on a busy schedule. So yes,
6 everyone is coming out. I'm going to call the
7 Fact-Finding case of St. Sophia Greek Orthodox
8 Cathedral for their temporary license
9 application for May 17 through 19, 2013 at
10 2815 36th Street, N.W.

11 Why don't you introduce yourself
12 for the record. We are also going to be
13 joined, I believe by an ABRA Investigator.

14 MR. ZISSIS: My name is Aris
15 initial A. Zissis, Z-I-S-S-I-S.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

17 MR. ZISSIS: I'm an American
18 citizen. I have a green card.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Zissis is
20 your last name?

21 MR. ZISSIS: Zissis.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Zissis?

1 MR. ZISSIS: Z-I-S-S-I-S.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

3 MR. ZISSIS: The only one in the
4 phone book.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It's your
6 last name though?

7 MR. ZISSIS: Yes.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

9 MS. DIPPEL: That is his last
10 name.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Because it
12 looks like -- on the application, it looks
13 like it's your first, but, okay. Mr. Zissis,
14 welcome. Okay.

15 MS. DIPPEL: I am Elizabeth
16 Dippel. I'm Aris' partner and I'm the
17 assistant manager at the festival.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. What's
19 your last name again?

20 MS. DIPPEL: Dippel.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

22 Dippel, right. Okay. So you are going to

1 have your annual festival hopefully.

2 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Molloy,
4 I'll let you put your name on the record.

5 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Brian
6 Molloy, Investigator with ABRA.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. We
8 just started. We just started with
9 introductions. Okay. So it's going to be the
10 same as it is every year? Same amount of
11 people expected?

12 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Last
14 year there was an issue about selling alcohol,
15 if I'm not mistaken. Am I mistaken?

16 MS. DIPPEL: An issue on that?

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Did you have
18 any issue last year?

19 MR. ZISSIS: No.

20 MS. DIPPEL: Not that I'm aware
21 of.

22 MR. ZISSIS: No.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Did you come
2 before the Board last year?

3 MS. DIPPEL: Yes, we have been
4 here. This is our third time.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. Okay.
6 Unless I'm mixing you up with someone else.
7 I thought there was an issue.

8 MS. DIPPEL: No. I don't know.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Selling
10 bottles of wine or anything like that?

11 MS. DIPPEL: No.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Do you
13 have -- did you have any problems last year?

14 MS. DIPPEL: Not that I'm aware
15 of.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

17 MS. DIPPEL: The Investigator told
18 us that we did a great job, so I would say no,
19 we did not have any --

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

21 MS. DIPPEL: -- issues.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And have you

1 been having this event more than three years,
2 correct?

3 MS. DIPPEL: Oh the church --

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Many years?

5 MS. DIPPEL: -- has had it many
6 years.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

8 MS. DIPPEL: But Aris and I have
9 been in charge of the alcohol enforcement --

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

11 MS. DIPPEL: -- for about -- no,
12 not five, about three or four years now.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So
14 everything is the same. You are going to be
15 serving alcohol? How is that going to be --

16 MS. DIPPEL: Beer and wine.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Beer and
18 wine.

19 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
21 how do you control the sale of the alcohol?

22 MS. DIPPEL: There are two

1 stations that you can purchase alcohol. One
2 is an outdoor taverna and one is inside the
3 basement of the church. At the point of sale,
4 someone checks their -- one of the volunteers
5 that works the stand checks the ID card and
6 puts one of these bands onto the person who is
7 going to -- whose ID has been checked.

8 Once you put the band on, you
9 can't get them off. Whatever this fabric is,
10 it's impossible to tear or rip and that's how
11 we ensure that the person's ID has been
12 checked.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And do these
14 volunteers have training in checking IDs?

15 MS. DIPPEL: They do. They are
16 all adults. None of them are like 18 years-
17 old. They are all mature people. And many of
18 them have experience working in restaurants,
19 so they have a natural built-in, but Aris and
20 I have a meeting with them before the shift
21 begins to be sure that they understand their
22 responsibilities.

1 And we are there to ensure that
2 everything --

3 MR. ZISSIS: We are at the
4 beginning to the end --

5 MS. DIPPEL: -- goes smoothly.

6 MR. ZISSIS: -- we are on the
7 premises 12 hours a day for the three days.
8 So the implementation of your guidelines are
9 100 percent assured that there will be no
10 violations. It never happened and I don't
11 think it will ever happen again.

12 The clientele or the customers,
13 they are mature people coming with the cart
14 with the babies, enjoy the dancing, new music,
15 it's very ethnic thing.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

17 MR. ZISSIS: We don't discriminate
18 for other nationalities. I want you to know
19 that. And we oversee constantly around the
20 clock, Elizabeth and I. We train volunteers.
21 The chefs train them. They all were trained
22 within last year, so we have sometimes new

1 people because nobody wants to volunteer
2 often.

3 So there is no infraction
4 occurred, I can assume you of that.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
6 it's buffet-style? How is the food and the
7 drink served?

8 MS. DIPPEL: There are two
9 different types of food. One is more like a
10 cafeteria-style where it is a hot plate that
11 you are ordering, like a dinner, and that is
12 inside in the basement of the church.

13 Outside they have the grills, so
14 they have the --

15 MR. ZISSIS: The lambs.

16 MS. DIPPEL: -- grilled lamb and
17 Souvlaki and they are tented areas and the
18 people just line up and --

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do they come
20 to a separate table to get the alcohol?

21 MS. DIPPEL: Yes. There are two
22 stations for alcohol --

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

2 MS. DIPPEL: -- inside is like a
3 big long table that is a bar set off on the
4 side of the room. And outside it's a totally
5 different one, a separate stand.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And what kind
7 of alcohol are you serving?

8 MS. DIPPEL: Beer and wine.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Beer and
10 wine. And how is it served?

11 MS. DIPPEL: It is served both by
12 -- in a glass.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

14 MS. DIPPEL: Or the wine you can
15 purchase by the bottle. But the bottles are
16 opened and the glasses are given to the
17 customer, however many IDs are being checked
18 for that bottle of wine.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So how does
20 that work? When you buy a bottle, it is open,
21 correct?

22 MS. DIPPEL: Yes, always.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So then how
2 many IDs do you check? How does that work?

3 MS. DIPPEL: Well, if there are
4 three people buying that bottle of wine, we
5 will give them three glasses.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: With the
7 wine?

8 MS. DIPPEL: Um-hum.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you have
10 to see the three people? I mean, somebody
11 says --

12 MS. DIPPEL: Oh, yes. The IDs
13 have to be checked.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. There
15 is -- so you -- I want a beer, follow --

16 MS. DIPPEL: Yes. And then if you
17 are taking the wine --

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- one from
19 my table.

20 MS. DIPPEL: -- to a table to go
21 sit down with their friends or whatever, there
22 are -- Aris and I are always out there

1 scouting around to be sure that they are not
2 sharing that bottle with someone who doesn't
3 have --

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

5 MS. DIPPEL: -- a band on.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Yes,
7 Board Members, other questions?

8 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Just one
9 quick question. Are there -- will there be
10 any opportunity for people to buy unopened
11 bottles of alcohol to take off-premises?

12 MS. DIPPEL: No, absolutely never.

13 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Okay.

14 MR. ZISSIS: They won't even take
15 the leftovers at the closing of the festival
16 out to their cars. They either consume it on-
17 premises on time or throw it away.

18 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Thank you.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Other
20 questions? Mr. Alberti?

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes. I forget, I
22 saw this last year and so I forget from year-

1 to-year, so excuse me for these questions --

2 MS. DIPPEL: That's okay.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- I should know.

4 Is this -- the whole area fenced in?

5 MS. DIPPEL: Yes, it is.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes. And how is
7 it fenced in? Is it a courtyard or something?
8 Can you describe that to me?

9 MS. DIPPEL: Well, it's basically
10 a parking lot with a lift gate as you come
11 into the area.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

13 MS. DIPPEL: But for pedestrians
14 who aren't coming in through the lift gate in
15 a car, they have to go through certain
16 entrances. The fence is about, I'm going to
17 guess --

18 MR. ZISSIS: 48 inches.

19 MS. DIPPEL: -- 4 feet high.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

21 MS. DIPPEL: And it is an orange
22 mesh that gets installed each year.

1 MR. ZISSIS: That's the security.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: That surrounds
3 it?

4 MS. DIPPEL: Surrounds the entire
5 church property.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

7 MS. DIPPEL: And then there are
8 two entrances on the street side where
9 security guards are posted and those are
10 entrances. And there is a security guard at
11 the lift gate where they can come in by car.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Great.
13 Are you selling beer also?

14 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

15 MR. ZISSIS: Yes.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: The cups that you
17 sell beer in, will they be -- will you be able
18 to distinguish those from cups that have other
19 beverages?

20 MS. DIPPEL: There are two kinds
21 of -- two colors of cups. The clear ones are
22 usually the ones that, in the past, now, I

1 haven't seen what they have ordered for this
2 year, but they have been clear, are for the
3 beer. And then sodas. most of the people just
4 take the can as it is, but if they want a
5 glass with that, that's usually a color.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Great.

7 MR. ZISSIS: One is provided by
8 Budweiser, a very reputable company. The
9 other one is ethnic. It's called Fix, F-I-X.
10 The drinks, bottles 12 ounce.

11 MS. DIPPEL: And the bottles get
12 opened and poured into the cup. We don't give
13 them the bottle.

14 MR. ZISSIS: We keep the bottles.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you. I
16 wish you good weather for this.

17 MS. DIPPEL: Yes, that's the
18 important part.

19 MR. ZISSIS: You know, this is
20 interesting, it's a very elegant affair, it
21 caters to anybody who want to come in. The
22 weather is important. Sometimes \$400,000 in

1 three days. The city gets the commission for
2 the -- for whatever.

3 MS. DIPPEL: For whatever taxes
4 are.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

6 MR. ZISSIS: And I told yesterday
7 I was able to preach this, said one make a
8 prayer, you know, so for good weather today,
9 but I don't know.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, I'll keep
11 my fingers crossed for you.

12 MR. ZISSIS: Well, thank you.

13 MS. DIPPEL: Thank you.

14 MR. ZISSIS: We like to see you
15 coming there some day to offer you the Greek
16 custom or whatever.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you.

18 MR. ZISSIS: Honestly, I want to
19 see you.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: No, I understand.
21 Next year.

22 MR. ZISSIS: He mentioned who was

1 coming, maybe he called me though I don't know
2 why.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

4 MR. ZISSIS: But I can see the way
5 they are looking, you know, and no problem.
6 Never happened. It did happen before, that's
7 why you all have this hearings now.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

10 MR. ZISSIS: Five, six years ago,
11 if you remember. The timing was -- over the
12 time some people are still enjoying the food
13 and the wine and the Investigator, I don't
14 want to give the name, he no longer with the
15 group here, he told us Greek who is in charge?
16 We are more professional than he was. He was
17 a counter -- singing at the church, you know.
18 And he says you see these people, it's after
19 9:00 they are still eating and drinking and he
20 starting saying I apologize. He was very rude
21 actually. He is no longer with them.

22 He said you want me to put my

1 finger in my -- in their mouth and pull their
2 foot out and laughed.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

4 MR. ZISSIS: He's creative.

5 Almost 20,000 people in the good weather show
6 up there. 20,000.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 20,000.

8 MR. ZISSIS: In three days.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

10 MR. ZISSIS: So it's not --

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 MS. DIPPEL: It's 10,000 in three
13 days.

14 MR. ZISSIS: Well, with inflation.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Your
16 application says 3,000 per day.

17 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

18 MR. ZISSIS: Well --

19 MS. DIPPEL: It depends.

20 MR. ZISSIS: It would be better to
21 be --

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you have

1 security?

2 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

4 MR. ZISSIS: Um-hum.

5 MS. DIPPEL: There is security.

6 It's a private company. Their name is
7 Business Resource and Security Systems. They
8 are on Rhode Island Avenue in Washington, D.C.
9 They provide the security and the gentleman at
10 the church who is one of the coordinators for
11 the entire festival, Peter, is meeting with
12 them, I think, this afternoon to go over.

13 And he also said he has a meeting
14 with them where all the -- they switch off
15 people during, you know, different shifts,
16 different staffs and whatever. So he will
17 have a meeting with that entire group, 20
18 something people total involved, and they will
19 all be walked through the property to see
20 exactly what is needed to be done, what their
21 responsibilities are as far as the security.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Is it

1 the same one you used last year?

2 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

4 MR. ZISSIS: They are the same
5 actual security group.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Are
7 there other Board questions?

8 MEMBER BROOKS: Yes.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Brooks?

10 MEMBER BROOKS: I have one
11 question. Who are you using for your
12 wholesaler or retailer for the liquor?

13 MS. DIPPEL: Well, we are the
14 wholesaler for -- we are the importers and we
15 don't -- we go on a permit basis in
16 Washington, D.C. We don't have a wholesaler
17 for our Greek wines.

18 MEMBER BROOKS: I see.

19 MS. DIPPEL: And the Budweiser
20 distributor, I think, is -- who is it, State?
21 Is there somebody called State or National?
22 I'm not sure who the Budweiser --

1 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Your former
2 was Capital Eagle?

3 MS. DIPPEL: Capital Eagle, then
4 that's the same. They are the same ones every
5 year. They get the Budweiser from them.

6 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. Thank you.
7 Thank you, Madam Chair.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I
9 didn't understand. Did you say that you are
10 a wholesaler?

11 MS. DIPPEL: We are an importer
12 and in Washington, D.C., we don't have one of
13 the big wholesalers representing our products.
14 We sell it directly to the customer on a
15 permit basis.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

17 MS. DIPPEL: And we do the same
18 with the church.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So you have
20 an import permit?

21 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Other

1 questions? Mr. Molloy?

2 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes. So
3 Business Resource and Security Systems, how
4 many security members will they be providing
5 per day?

6 MS. DIPPEL: Per day, there will
7 be on-duty at each --

8 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes.

9 MS. DIPPEL: -- seven.

10 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Seven? And
11 that will be -- so --

12 MS. DIPPEL: Some of them are
13 stationary at the entrances.

14 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Um-hum.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: There is an
16 armed guard who sits in the main hallway out
17 side of the office. He accompanies the people
18 that collect the cash register money
19 periodically when he makes his tour.

20 And there are two who roam the
21 grounds, you know, just watching for --

22 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Wristbands?

1 MS. DIPPEL: -- anything.

2 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay. So at
3 any -- if we have an investigator show up at
4 any given time between noon and 10:00, they
5 will be able to find seven security guards
6 working?

7 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

8 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay. Will
9 they be in uniform or marked?

10 MS. DIPPEL: They are in uniform.

11 MR. ZISSIS: Yes.

12 MS. DIPPEL: Their security
13 uniforms.

14 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: And do you
15 remember what the uniforms look like? Are
16 they like yellow --

17 MS. DIPPEL: I think they are
18 black.

19 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: And are
20 they --

21 MS. DIPPEL: You know, I think
22 black with an emblem on it.

1 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: And are they
2 labeled security?

3 MS. DIPPEL: Armed guard who sits
4 in the main hallway.

5 MR. ZISSIS: Kind of yellowish
6 thing, you know.

7 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

8 MR. ZISSIS: It could be
9 identified easily, you know, visually.

10 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: So anyone
11 who has spotted them would know for sure
12 that's a security guard?

13 MR. ZISSIS: Oh, yes, very easily.

14 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay. All
15 Right. And then you said you would be going
16 over ID training with your volunteers?

17 MR. ZISSIS: Yes.

18 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

19 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: What
20 training do you guys have with identifying
21 fake IDs?

22 MR. ZISSIS: Number one is to do

1 this, check the ID cards. Two is if you see
2 a client or a customer who frequents, you
3 know, the bar to have many drinks, you know,
4 some people like to have six, seven, eight
5 beers, we identify them. Politely we tell
6 them, sir the law says, you know, that you
7 have had too many.

8 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

9 MR. ZISSIS: As a matter of fact,
10 we did have a case where an attorney who lives
11 nearby 38 years-old and Elizabeth and I
12 confronted him politely, not like a bully, and
13 he recognized us. And I said you are an
14 attorney, so you should know that -- I think
15 you're not drunk, but you're not affected yet,
16 but the indication is that the consumption you
17 are using could affect you a little bit.

18 He said thank you very much for
19 reminding me of that and that was the end of
20 it.

21 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: All Right.
22 But as far as like spotting a fake ID from a

1 legitimate ID, what training do you guys have?

2 MR. ZISSIS: Oh, we have -- on the
3 driver's license?

4 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes.

5 MR. ZISSIS: Well, that's --

6 MS. DIPPEL: Fake?

7 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: If it's a
8 fake --

9 MS. DIPPEL: None.

10 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: All Right.

11 Do you have -- we can provide ID books --

12 MS. DIPPEL: We did -- you did
13 provide.

14 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: -- for you
15 guys.

16 MS. DIPPEL: Yes, we have that at
17 the church.

18 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

19 MS. DIPPEL: Yes. So we use that.

20 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Do you
21 remember -- is it the same -- did we give it
22 to you last year, because the IDs change from

1 year-to-year. Would you like an updated one
2 as well?

3 MS. DIPPEL: Sure. Give us a new
4 one.

5 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

6 MS. DIPPEL: Certainly. I
7 remember the one thing that the instructor
8 gave us, the TIPS last year, the easy way to
9 check the ID, I guess it's on the local ones
10 is if it's a face front picture or whether it
11 is a profile picture. You know, it's an
12 underage person, then you really have to look
13 at that date for whatever --

14 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes. Well,
15 regardless of the photo always look at the
16 date.

17 MR. ZISSIS: I assure you. Let me
18 tell you something.

19 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes.

20 MR. ZISSIS: This year we printed
21 this. It's sort of yellow that we can put on.
22 It says -- it's written St. Sophia --

1 MS. DIPPEL: St. Sophia --

2 MR. ZISSIS: -- Spring Festival.

3 So if anybody has a fake one, yellow, we don't
4 approve it this year. It will be this color.

5 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: All Right.

6 MR. ZISSIS: For the print one, so
7 the color.

8 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: With regards
9 to the bottles of wine, you said you were
10 going to sell and open.

11 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

12 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Could one
13 patron walk up and say I want one bottle of
14 wine opened up and you would serve an entire
15 bottle to the patron or are you going to have
16 a minimum number of people required? Because
17 we do have laws about over-serving an
18 individual and there are many individuals
19 where drinking an entire bottle of wine would
20 be over-serving.

21 MR. ZISSIS: No, we never
22 witnessed that that one takes the bottle and

1 consumes it or with another --

2 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes. Well,
3 not --

4 MR. ZISSIS: -- affair, you know.

5 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes.
6 Definitely I understand the general
7 characteristic, but I was wondering if you
8 have a rule per se against serving a bottle of
9 wine to one patron?

10 MS. DIPPEL: I don't know that we
11 have a rule per se, but if there needs to be
12 one, we can instigate that.

13 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I would
14 recommend maybe a minimum of two patrons per
15 bottle.

16 MS. DIPPEL: Two all right.

17 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Because an
18 entire bottle for one person, depending on the
19 size, might be asking for trouble, I think.

20 MR. ZISSIS: You know, it never
21 occurred to me. I've been there for about 15
22 years and it's the same affair.

1 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

2 MR. ZISSIS: I never witness
3 anything of rowdy people come in for well, any
4 kind of a problem, maybe a couple of drinks
5 and most of them it's nothing. It's a family
6 affair. Kids come in. They enjoy the music.
7 I don't dance Greek dances. I'm Greek, but I
8 don't dance it. I would be like a clown if I
9 do that.

10 So they enjoy it themselves. And
11 they drink diligently. You don't have to go
12 out and get drunk.

13 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes.

14 MS. DIPPEL: Yes, it's not like
15 nightclub type of atmosphere.

16 MR. ZISSIS: Controlled constantly
17 the behavior. That I can assure you will
18 never happen. Well, I tell you 30 years ago
19 that I been with them. They like Ouzo. I had
20 to be a little vulgar in my expression. Ouzo
21 is 92 proof. It's a very ethnic drink. It
22 smells like Zambuka without the sugar in it.

1 And it's very inviting to get intoxicated.

2 So about 25, 30 years ago, they
3 used to buy that Ouzo. We didn't have any
4 guards or anything, you know, guidelines about
5 21 years-old. So anyway, the students from
6 American -- the Georgetown University and
7 George Washington University, they used to
8 bring their girlfriends.

9 Let's go get drunk with Ouzo.
10 That's true story. So they were drinking, no
11 supervision or anything and then they were
12 getting happy sexually and they were having
13 sex in the bushes of the neighbors' houses.

14 So then -- true story. The house
15 tell me about it. And then the committee of
16 the church had no more Ouzo. So we never sell
17 Ouzo since then.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

19 MR. ZISSIS: Under oath.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All Right.

21 MR. ZISSIS: Scout's honor.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So we have

1 another party waiting for their case --

2 MR. ZISSIS: Okay.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- also
4 scheduled for 11:00, but I don't want to cut
5 you off. Do you have --

6 MEMBER BROOKS: Was that on the
7 record?

8 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I was more
9 concerned --

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So we need to
11 shorten the answers, I think, a little bit.

12 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Yes.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But that was
14 an interesting story.

15 MR. ZISSIS: Oh, yes.

16 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I missed the
17 intros. Are you Ms. Dippel?

18 MS. DIPPEL: Yes.

19 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay. In
20 your application packet, you said you would be
21 obtaining an ABC manager's license. Have you
22 done that yet?

1 MS. DIPPEL: I was obtaining a
2 license?

3 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: It is a --

4 MS. DIPPEL: No, when we came in--

5 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: It says "She
6 will certainly file necessary ABC manager's
7 license application."

8 MS. DIPPEL: When we came in to
9 file our applications here, they said that we
10 didn't need a manager's license because Aris
11 was the person on the original license.

12 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

13 MS. DIPPEL: There was no need for
14 a second --

15 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I'm not
16 saying there was --

17 MS. DIPPEL: -- your own people
18 told me that.

19 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: -- a need.
20 Yes, no, I'm not saying there is a need.

21 MS. DIPPEL: Okay.

22 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I just saw

1 in the letter that you said you were going to
2 get one.

3 MS. DIPPEL: Well --

4 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: But -- so
5 that's -- that part has changed.

6 MS. DIPPEL: We intended to do
7 that.

8 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: All Right.

9 MS. DIPPEL: But the people here
10 told us that that was not needed.

11 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: Okay.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Do you
13 have any other questions?

14 INVESTIGATOR MOLLOY: I'm all set.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any
16 Board questions? Any licensee questions? No.

17 Okay. Now, we have done this a
18 few times. I guess many times, many, many,
19 many times. Okay.

20 All Right. Then I'm satisfied
21 that everything is taken care of and so I will
22 move approval of this temporary license

1 application of St. Sophia Greek Orthodox
2 Cathedral for May 17 through 19, 2013

3 Do I have a second?

4 MEMBER BROOKS: Second.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those in
6 favor say aye.

7 ALL: Aye.

8 All those opposed? All those
9 abstaining? The motion passes 5-0-0. Okay.
10 I hope you get good weather.

11 MS. DIPPEL: Thank you very much.

12 MR. ZISSIS: Thank you very much.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you.

14 MR. ZISSIS: And I hope to see
15 this group show up.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, maybe.

17 MR. ZISSIS: But identify
18 yourselves, please. Thank you very much.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you.

20 MR. ZISSIS: Have good weather.

21 (Whereupon, the Fact-Finding
22 Hearing was concluded at 11:14 a.m.)

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
