(9:55 a.m.)

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: We have a Fact-Finding Hearing next that is scheduled for 9:30. Are the Capital Pride people here? Great.

Okay. Good morning.

MR. WATSON: Morning.

MR. CORBETT: Good morning.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Why don't we start with introductions for the record?

MR. WATSON: Hi, I'm Jason Watson. I am the applicant.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

MR. CORBETT: And Robert Corbett, the Operations Director for Capital Pride.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Robert, what's your last name?

MR. CORBETT: Corbett.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Corbett? Okay. You are the directions what?

MR. CORBETT: Operations Director.

1                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Operations  
2 Director.

3                   INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Investigator  
4 Kofi Apraku with ABRA.

5                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good morning.

6                   INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Good  
7 morning.

8                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.  
9 So I think you are here before us because it's  
10 a very large event that you are going to be  
11 having. And I have in my records that you  
12 expect about 100,000 in attendance?

13                  MR. WATSON: At the entire event,  
14 yes.

15                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Throughout  
16 the --

17                  MR. WATSON: Not in the tented off  
18 liquor areas that are fenced off.

19                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

20                  MR. WATSON: But just for the  
21 entire festival.

22                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: For the

1 entire festival. All right. And you have  
2 already gone before the Mayor's Task Force and  
3 other --

4 MR. WATSON: Yes.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right, that's  
6 what I figured. So basically reviewed your  
7 security arrangements and things like that?

8 MR. WATSON: Correct.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And you have  
10 also appeared before this Board for several  
11 years?

12 MR. WATSON: I have.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I don't know  
14 if you have personally or not.

15 MR. WATSON: I haven't personally,  
16 but I know Pride has itself. I think I have  
17 managed Pride, the liquor tents for six years,  
18 but we never had to go before the Board.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, you  
20 haven't?

21 MR. WATSON: Because we have never  
22 had any infractions.

1                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

2                   MR. WATSON: It's all, I think we  
3 said, the last five years that I haven't done  
4 it and I just took it back on this year, so --

5                   MR. CORBETT: Yeah, Green Lantern  
6 is kind of our historization. In the past, we  
7 have been with Nelly's, so the Nelly's staff  
8 has actually been here. I have been here a  
9 few times myself. But yes, really the only  
10 change is the Green Lantern is kind of our  
11 host organization.

12                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So why  
13 don't you just quickly give us an overview of  
14 how you are handling the alcohol and sale to  
15 minors issue.

16                  MR. WATSON: Well, inside of the  
17 tented-off or fenced-off liquor areas, minors  
18 will not be allowed.

19                  CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

20                  MR. WATSON: There will be  
21 security, ID checks. We have hired a security  
22 firm that will be checking IDs and placing

1 wristbands on people to enter that area. So  
2 for beer, liquor and wine, you have to be  
3 inside of those areas and you must be 21 to  
4 enter those. So basically, no one under 21  
5 will be allowed in there and they are fenced  
6 off, therefore, liquor can't go out or in.

7 So and just like in any ABC  
8 establishment, I wouldn't allow any type of  
9 beverages in or out. So no water, no juice,  
10 sodas, anything in or out the gates just to  
11 prevent that. That's what we have done in the  
12 past and it seemed to work pretty well.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So no  
14 minors can accompany any adults into that  
15 area?

16 MR. WATSON: Absolutely not.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So okay. And  
18 is that the way you have handled it in the  
19 past or is this different?

20 MR. WATSON: Yes, it is.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Have  
22 you had any problems in the past?

1 MR. CORBETT: We have not had  
2 problems, no.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How about  
4 with respect to anyone -- plans in case anyone  
5 gets sick from, you know, alcohol?

6 MR. CORBETT: Sure. We actually  
7 are contracted through -- DC Fire has actually  
8 got one unit, but we also have contracted two  
9 advance life support systems, two BLS systems  
10 and multiple roving teams. So we are very  
11 well covered for the special event.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good.  
13 All right. I'm going to let -- do other Board  
14 Members have questions? Okay. But before we  
15 get to our Investigator, just do you have any  
16 questions of the applicant?

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Where is this  
18 tented area?

19 MR. CORBETT: There are two fenced  
20 in beverage gardens. One of them is on  
21 Constitution kind of right at 6th Street, but  
22 the other one is on Constitution at 3rd

1 Street.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, very close to  
3 each other. Like within like three blocks.

4 MR. CORBETT: Correct, yeah.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: How large are  
6 they?

7 MR. CORBETT: The one at 6th Street  
8 is maybe about 200 x 50 feet. The one on  
9 Constitution and 3rd is probably about double  
10 that.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. I have a  
12 large package here. I was looking for a  
13 diagram. Is there a diagram of that in here?

14 MR. CORBETT: There are diagrams  
15 in there.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Pardon?

18 MR. CORBETT: There is a diagram.

19 MR. WATSON: I placed a broad  
20 diagram and a blown-up diagram, so you could  
21 see.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, yes, right,

1 right. I've got it. I've got it here. I'm  
2 sorry. I just didn't -- haven't gotten -- I  
3 was looking at the back and didn't look  
4 forward since I saw maps of the back. It's my  
5 fault. Okay.

6 And how many entrances are there?

7 MR. WATSON: One. Just one per  
8 area.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: One per area?  
10 Okay. Great.

11 MR. WATSON: And something we are  
12 also doing this year that we haven't done, I  
13 don't think, in the past is they are offering  
14 food inside of the main beverage garden, the  
15 bigger one, so there will actually be food for  
16 people that are drinking as well inside of  
17 there this year.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Great.  
19 Thank you.

20 MR. WATSON: Thank you.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr.  
22 Silverstein?

1                   MEMBER SILVERSTEIN:   So  
2                   essentially, you have been doing this for many  
3                   years, but are there any changes physically  
4                   between this year and last year?

5                   MR. CORBETT:   The only change is  
6                   we have extended the beverage garden, so that  
7                   it reaches out towards the stage, but, other  
8                   than that, it's really been the exact same as  
9                   we have been doing for many years.

10                  MEMBER SILVERSTEIN:   And you have  
11                  had no infractions, no problems that I know  
12                  of.

13                  MR. CORBETT:   I believe -- yes,  
14                  about five years ago we had somebody that took  
15                  a bottle and rushed out the gate. We actually  
16                  apprehended her right away. There was an ABRA  
17                  Agent that was right there that wrote up a  
18                  ticket to Nelly's. Nelly's was actually able  
19                  to get that as, you know, we were really right  
20                  on top of it. They got a bottle about 5 feet.

21                  MEMBER SILVERSTEIN:   Okay. I have  
22                  no further questions.

1                   CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.  
2 Apraku?

3                   INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: You guys are  
4 using Metropolitan Security Professionals?

5                   MR. WATSON: Yes, that --

6                   INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Okay.

7                   MR. WATSON: Yes.

8                   INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: And are you  
9 -- do you know if they are TIPS-certified, by  
10 any chance?

11                  MR. WATSON: I don't know if they  
12 are personally. I know that all of our  
13 bartenders will be and I will have probably  
14 nine other people on staff that will be. And  
15 I plan on having a training with them that  
16 day, but they are more there for just the  
17 security and the intimidation factor for  
18 people that are coming in and out that might  
19 want to try anything.

20                  We have never had an incident  
21 there of any kind of violence or --

22                  INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Okay.

1                   MR. WATSON:  -- I think the year--  
2                   the five years I did it prior to the past five  
3                   years, we had one fake ID that somebody tried.  
4                   We have never really even had -- and I think  
5                   somebody threw a fit one year because they  
6                   couldn't bring their baby in.  But other than  
7                   that, the five years I did it, we never had  
8                   any type of issues there with that.  But I  
9                   generally go over it with them and they do  
10                  already have the ID handbooks and everything  
11                  for them as well.

12                  INVESTIGATOR APRAKU:  Okay.  And  
13                  do you guys have a capacity for like your beer  
14                  gardens?  Is there like a max amount of people  
15                  who can get in there?  Because I mean,  
16                  assuming the fact you guys have 100,000 --

17                  MR. WATSON:  Right.  We have never  
18                  reached that.  I know in the five years I did  
19                  it, we hadn't.  And they are actually bigger  
20                  now than they were then and where they placed  
21                  them and moved them.  We have never reached  
22                  capacity, so I don't know.  It has never been

1 so full that we said -- we even visited the  
2 fact that we would even have to cut it off,  
3 because it's just standing room only.

4 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Okay.

5 MR. WATSON: And it has always  
6 been very roomy, so I have never felt the need  
7 to.

8 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Okay. And I  
9 think I have one more question. I mean, this  
10 was like detailed, so, I mean, it covered most  
11 of what I had to ask. But on the ABRA side,  
12 I know that there will be Investigators.  
13 Hopefully there are going to be Investigators  
14 who are going to be at the event. What would  
15 you need? Is there anything specific that you  
16 would need from us in regards to, you know,  
17 how we operate while we are at the event?

18 MR. WATSON: No.

19 MR. CORBETT: Do you guys actually  
20 bring the signage, like the --

21 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Yes, yes.

22 MR. CORBETT: Yes. So I know that

1 signs were used, but --

2 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Yes, we  
3 always bring our ID books and we bring  
4 signage.

5 MR. WATSON: I already picked all  
6 that up.

7 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Okay.

8 MR. WATSON: We got all that.

9 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Okay. So  
10 that's all I have.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I just  
12 have a follow-up about the food and the  
13 standing room only. There are no tables to  
14 eat food? Is that it?

15 MR. CORBETT: There is a few.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

17 MR. CORBETT: But if you -- it  
18 really is meant to be kind of standing room.

19 MR. WATSON: Because it's in front  
20 of a live performance stage is where the main  
21 garden is. There is less so at the other  
22 garden, but there is not food there as well.

1 That's just a beer garden and liquor garden  
2 when you first walk in.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So  
4 what kind of food do you have or will you  
5 have?

6 MR. CORBETT: Festival food.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Just kind of  
8 pick-up while you're watching?

9 MR. WATSON: Yes, food trucks and  
10 hot dogs and pizza.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 MR. WATSON: And things of that  
13 nature.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All  
15 right. Any other questions? Any questions  
16 from you all?

17 MR. CORBETT: No.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.  
19 Then I'm going to move that we approve this  
20 application for Capital Pride. Do I have a  
21 second?

22 MEMBER BROOKS: I second.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Brooks  
2 has seconded the motion.

3 All those in favor say aye.

4 ALL: Aye.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those  
6 opposed? All those abstaining? The motion  
7 passes 6-0-0.

8 Okay. And we are just going to  
9 sign-off on this. Okay. Thank you very much.

10 MR. WATSON: Okay. Thank you.

11 MR. CORBETT: Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Have a great  
13 event.
