15	MR. FONSECA: Yes, he did. He's read
16	it. He understands it. And we waive reading.
17	CHAIR MILLER: Okay, good. Ms.
18	Gephardt, any preliminary matters?
19	MS. GEPHARDT: Yes, there is a
20	preliminary matter. We have reached an Offer in
21	Compromise in this case which consists of a
22	written warning. Since this is a first secondary

1	tier violation.
2	CHAIR MILLER: Mr. Fonseca, let me
3	just ask you is your client agreeable to that
4	Offer in Compromise?
5	MR. FONSECA: Yes, as a warning
6	letter, we are.
7	CHAIR MILLER: Ms. Gephardt, I just
8	want to find that in the penalty schedule. Is it
9	a mandatory warning, or discretionary warning?
10	MS. GEPHARDT: I believe it's a
11	mandatory warning. And that is for the cover
12	charge entertainment endorsement, for cover
13	charge. DCMR-1002.1.
14	CHAIR MILLER: Okay. So I'm looking
15	at the schedule. It looks to me like it's a
16	discretionary warning. You're telling me it's a
17	mandatory warning?
18	MS. GEPHARDT: I thought it was a
19	mandatory warning, but if that's what you're
20	reading, then
21	CHAIR MILLER: Well
22	MR. FONSECA: We'll take it.

Do you see it? CHAIR MILLER: You'll 1 2 take it? Okay. Okay, any comments on that? 3 I just read the penalty MS. GEPHARDT: 4 schedule, but either way, if it's discretionary 5 or mandatory, we're still staying with the 6 7 written warning. CHAIR MILLER: You still recommend a 8 9 warning? 10 MS. GEPHARDT: Yes, that's correct. 11 CHAIR MILLER: Okay. Did you want to 12 say anything else about that? 13 MS. GEPHARDT: No, that's --14 CHAIR MILLER: Do you want to address 15 it? 16 MR. FONSECA: I'd just put on the record, absent a warning, that we were prepared 17 18 to litigate the issue of whether this was truly a 19 cover charge. But in light of the fact for the 20 future, this licensee has gone ahead and included it onto its endorsement, the cover charge for the 21 22 It just seems unfair to the client to future.

litigate something when it's going to be a 1 2 warning at this point. And any mitigation has already been done. 3 CHAIR MILLER: Okay. 4 MR. FONSECA: Under the circumstances, 5 this was an all-inclusive New Year's Eve, which 6 7 is typical in the industry. So it's not charging someone at the door. It's prepaid tickets. So 8 9 that really would have been the issue to 10 litigate. So under the circumstances, we think a 11 warning is the "just" thing to do. 12 CHAIR MILLER: Okay. Thank you. Any 13 questions by Board Members? (No audible response) 14 15 CHAIR MILLER: Okay. I would move to 16 accept this Offer in Compromise, because I believe the circumstances in this case to be 17 18 justified by a warning. In any, and that's at 19 our discretion to do so. 20 MEMBER SHORT: Second. Okay, and second. 21 CHAIR MILLER: 22 other comments? All right those then in favor of
