| 4 | Okay. This is a Show Cause (Status) Hearing. |
| 5 | Did you receive notice of this hearing? |
| 6 | MR. ROMEO: Yes, ma'am. |
| 7 | CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Did you read |

| 18 | Are there any preliminary matters at this |

| 21 | there are. First off, Lotus, I think, appears |

have them all called, so I -- we are appearing on behalf of 11-CMP-00512, 11-251-00347, 11-CMP-00257 was declined by the Office of the Attorney General, but you called it, I think. CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I did. But just to get that on the record.

MS. PHILLIPS: Okay. And then, let me get the full case numbers for the others.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I have the other case numbers right in front of me.

MS. PHILLIPS: Okay.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, okay, so it follows this one anyway. 11-251-00204, 11-251-00204(a) and 11-251-00216.

MS. PHILLIPS: Thank you -CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. MS. PHILLIPS: -- Madam Chair.

And then it was my understanding of case numbers that have A, B and Cs that the ones with letters following the number, like 204 and 204(a), that 204(a) supplants 204. That's
the way I looked at it, as duplicating both of them.

But I appear here to offer -- to present an offer in compromise that the parties have agreed to present to the Board on one, two, three, four, five cases that you have.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MS. PHILLIPS: All right. The offer in compromise for all of the cases is a fine of $\$ 11,000$.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Could you hold on one minute, please? I'm sorry.

MS. PHILLIPS: Certainly.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, okay. There a lot of cases here and the Board had been looking at already -- there are two separate groups. And now, your lumping them altogether makes it more difficult. Is there a problem with your --

MS. PHILLIPS: Oh, I can --
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- with our
taking them, you know, each group at a time? Even though you are all here, we've called all the cases.

MS. PHILLIPS: No.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MS. PHILLIPS: I was prepared to delineate the cases by notice. Though there are a lot of cases, there are only two notices. So --

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well --
MS. PHILLIPS: -- well, whichever you prefer.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MS. PHILLIPS: I mean, I just wanted -- there are a lot of cases, but I just want you to recollect that there are only two notices. So the District combined several cases into one notice and then they combined two others in --

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.
MS. PHILLIPS: -- another notice.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

MS. PHILLIPS: So I am prepared to delineate them just presenting one, so however you prefer.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Then the Board prefers that they be divided as they are on the calendar and that we deal with the two separate groups.

MS. PHILLIPS: So my recollection if you called 512 and 347 --

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Correct.
MS. PHILLIPS: -- first --
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Correct.
MS. PHILLIPS: So we'll deal with those first. The offer in compromise for the two cases that we just delineated, there is a total fine of $\$ 4,000$ to be paid in 60 days. And a suspension, six suspension days served. And I have got the dates all combined, so the dates that the parties presented to me of dates which they have indicated they are open are 7/22 through 7/30, which I have to subtract three from that.

| 16 | MS. PHILLIPS: This notice talks |
| 17 | about two failure to follow Board orders on |
| 18 | two different dates. The dates of the failure |
| 19 | to follow the Board order was November 2, 2011 |
| 20 | and December 11, 2011. |
| 21 | CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. |

failures to have police details. And I just divide everything in half. \$2,000 for the first one and a three day suspension days served and \$2,000 for the second and three suspension days served.

I combined all of the dates for all of them, so they would be served at one stretch, but since we are dividing them, the days for this notice --

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MS. PHILLIPS: -- and these two cases will be 7/22 to 7/27. I believe that should add up to four -- six, rather six.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So let me ask the licensee then, do you agree to a \$4,000 penalty to be paid within 60 days, six suspension days served from July 22nd through July 27 th for the violations associated with 00512 and $00347 ?$

MR. MPRAS: Ma'am, we do, but this
was done -- initially, we did as a global settlement for all the charges, so we request
that the -- that 204 and 216 be read at this time, so the entire penalty can be combined.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So 20 -- let me look at this. So are you saying you don't necessarily agree to this unless it is part of a settlement with the other case?

MR. MPRAS: Excuse me, that's how we negotiated with the OAG's office and were told it would be presented that way.

MS. PHILLIPS: Pending acceptance by the Board.

MR. MPRAS: Yes, pending acceptance.

MS. PHILLIPS: Everything is always --

MR. MPRAS: Of course, of course.
MS. PHILLIPS: -- pending
acceptance of the Board, which the Board has denied.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry,
different people are talking at once. So is that your -- is that -- I didn't hear what you
said.
MS. PHILLIPS: I agreed that pending acceptance by the Board, I would present them all mass.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MS. PHILLIPS: And I will still
present the days for the two separate notices to run contiguously, because I think that is appropriate for these five cases.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. But the question is procedurally, you know, we need to know whether -- I thought that you were, you know, on board with proceeding with this case first and then the other part. But if you're not, then we need to hear the other part and then decide.

MR. MPRAS: If you could do that?
But we have agreed to that for these particular charges.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, one second. Okay. I just wanted to confer with counsel on this. There are two separate
charges and the Board does not wish to have them consolidated and that it's our authority not to consider an OIC with them consolidated, even though that's what you would like to do.

So at this point, we have one, if you want to proceed with an OIC on one, we will consider it at a time. If you do not want to proceed with an OIC on one, then we can set for hearing.

MR. MPRAS: Ma'am, may we proceed in one fashion if possible, since they are all consolidated? 204 and 216 were listed first on the agenda. Maybe if they could go first.

MEMBER ALBERTI: They're not.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: They are not listed first on my agenda. That's why I called the other one first.

MS. PHILLIPS: Not on my agenda, either. Nope.

MR. MPRAS: May I confer with someone?

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. Are we

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ready?
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MR. MPRAS: Yes, ma'am.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MR. MPRAS: We would like to proceed.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MS. PHILLIPS: Madam Chair, for the Board, just for the record, is that 204, 204(a) and 216 cases did occur earlier chronologically in time than the cases that we are now discussing.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
MS. PHILLIPS: Just for the record.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So what we have before us now is an offer in compromise on 512 and 347.

MS. PHILLIPS: I'm sorry, I missed that.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 512 and 347, unless you want me to read the whole number out again.

MS. PHILLIPS: No, no, no. I'm good.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Just so we are clear. That's first on the agenda with this case, that's where we have now an offer in compromise that has been presented to the Board.

And at this point then, I think I want to repeat to the licensee my question, you know, whether the licensee is agreeable to the offer in compromise of $\$ 4,000$ penalty to be paid within 60 days, six suspension days served from July 22nd through July 27 th?

MR. MPRAS: We agree.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You do agree.
Okay.
MEMBER ALBERTI: Can $I$ ask a question?

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You want to ask a question?

MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.

Alberti has a question.
MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Romeo, I was looking at your website for Lotus and it indicates that your days that you are open are Tuesday through Saturday. Are Sunday and Monday days that you are regularly open?

MR. ROMEO: A lot of times we are not open. But if we have special events, we are open on Saturday and Sunday, depending on how we can get the cop detail. What happens is --

MEMBER ALBERTI: But if you don't have special events you don't?

MR. ROMEO: No, no, we don't. Normally, on Monday -- Sunday and Monday, just for the record, we open up early and we do close early. We have early events. It depends. If we don't have anybody, then we close up early. A lot of times on Saturday, we close at midnight because it's not busy.

MEMBER ALBERTI: But you are
normally open on Sunday?

MR. ROMEO: Yes.
MEMBER ALBERTI: That's a day you're normally open?

MR. ROMEO: Yes.
MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you.
MR. ROMEO: You're welcome.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, Mr. Jones has joined us. Okay.

All right. Any other questions?
Then we have before us an offer in compromise of $\$ 4,000$ to be paid within 60 days with six days suspended to be served July 22nd through July 27th.

I would move that we accept this offer in compromise. Do I have a second?

MEMBER NOPHLIN: Second.
CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Any other comments?

All those in favor of accepting the offer in compromise say aye.

> ALL: Aye.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those
opposed? All those abstaining? Then the vote is 6-0-0 to accept the offer in compromise. Okay.
(Whereupon, the Show Cause (Status) Hearing in the above-entitled matter was concluded.)
