3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: We have another
4 Protest (Status) Hearing case, Case No. 15-PRO-
5 00030, Sosnick's Liquors located at 2318 4th
6 Street, NE, License No. 72301, in ANC-5E. And
7 this is an application to renew the license.

8 Good morning.

9 ALL: Good morning.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And could you
11 identify yourselves for the record, please?

12 MS. SYLVIA KIM: Sylvia Kim. S-Y-L-V-
13 I-A K-I-M last name.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

15 MS. JEEYUN KIM: I'm her daughter,
16 Jeeyun Kim, J-E-E-Y-U-N last name Kim, K-I-M.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What is your
18 first name?

19 MS. JEEYUN KIM: Jeeyun.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Jeeyun, okay.
21 All right. And you are?

22 MS. HOBAUGH: Yes, Sally Hobaugh,

1 Commissioner for 5E10. And last name is H-O-B,
2 as in boy, A-U-G-H.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Got it. Okay.
4 All right. First of all, is there anything you
5 all wish to report to us?

6 MS. HOBAUGH: So we are in the process
7 of negotiating a settlement agreement.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So that's
9 still moving forward?

10 MS. HOBAUGH: Yes.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good. In
12 the event it doesn't culminate in a settlement
13 agreement, your Protest Hearing is scheduled for
14 July 22, 2015 at 1:30 p.m.

15 And I want to just reiterate to you
16 all that it's most important that you pay
17 attention to your Protest Information Forms and
18 Exhibit Forms that will be sent out to you prior
19 to the hearing.

20 Are you following? She's following?
21 Okay.

22 Seven days before the hearing, you

1 need to serve both the opposing parties and the
2 Board with a copy of these forms. The Protest
3 Information Form asks you to identify the issues
4 which may have gotten narrower by the time you
5 get to the hearing, hopefully, and your
6 witnesses.

7 And the Exhibit Form asks you to
8 identify your exhibits that you may want to put
9 in at the hearing as evidence and to attach those
10 exhibits as well if there are documents or
11 pictures or things like that.

12 If you don't provide those documents
13 in a timely manner, it's possible that at the
14 hearing they may be excluded because of on the
15 grounds that it was prejudicial to the other side
16 not to see it in time, not to have timely notice
17 of it and there wasn't a good reason for not
18 providing it earlier.

19 So we deal with that at the hearing.
20 But if you go to hearing, you will see that it
21 makes a big difference to have all that ahead of
22 time, then everybody is very organized and

1 focused for the hearing.

2 Do you have any questions?

3 MS. HOBAUGH: No.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Thank you.

5 MS. SYLVIA KIM: Thank you.

6 MS. JEEYUN KIM: Thank you very much.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good luck with
8 your settlement.
