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The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street N.W., Washington, D.C., Ms. La Verne Fletcher, Agent, presiding.

1 P-R-O-C-E-E-D-I-N-G-S

2 (11:43 a.m.)

3 MS. FLETCHER: Would the parties
4 in the matter of Echostage please come
5 forward.

6 This is Case No. 13-PRO-00174,
7 Echo Events, trading as Echostage, 2135 Queens
8 Chapel Road, N.E., License No. ABRA-090250.

9 This is a Retailer CN License
10 Renewal. The protest issues in this matter
11 are peace, order and quiet, and residential
12 parking and vehicular and pedestrian safety.

13 My name is La Verne Fletcher. I
14 am conducting the Roll Call Hearing as the
15 Board's agent, pursuant to D.C. Official Code
16 1601.2.

17 Introductions, beginning with the
18 Applicant.

19 MS. WILLIFORD: Hi. Good morning,
20 Ms. Fletcher, this is Kwamina Williford from
21 Holland and Knight on behalf of the Applicant
22 Echostage, and to my left is my colleague also

1 from Holland and Knight, Jessica Farmer.

2 And, should I spell it for the
3 record?

4 MS. FLETCHER: Yes.

5 MS. WILLIFORD: My name, for the
6 record, is K-w-a-m-i-n-a. Last name
7 Williford, W-i-l-l-i-f-o-r-d.

8 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. And
9 present on behalf of ANC5C.

10 MS. BUTLER: Karla Butler, K-a-r-
11 l-a. Butler, B-u-t-l-e-r.

12 MS. FLETCHER: And present on
13 behalf of the group of individuals?

14 MS. ODUNSI: Yolanda Odunsi, O-d-
15 u-n-s-i.

16 MS. THORNTON: Yolanda Thornton,
17 Y-o-l-a-n-d-a, T-h-o-n-t-o-n.

18 MS. FLETCHER: One second. Okay.

19 MS. HARO: Tamar Haro, T-a-m-a-r.
20 Last name H-a-r-o.

21 MS. BROWN: Polly Brown, P-o-l-l-
22 y, B-r-o-w-n.

1 MS. STEPHENSON: Mamie Stephenson,
2 M-a-m-i-e, S-t-e-p-h-e-n-s-o-n.

3 MS. FLETCHER: That is Mamie
4 Stephenson?

5 MS. STEPHENSON: Yes.

6 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.

7 MS. WARD: Martha Ward, M-a-r-t-h-
8 a, W-a-r-d.

9 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.

10 ANC5C has standing as a
11 protestant. For the group of individuals, I
12 am granting standing to the six individuals
13 that are present.

14 The other individuals are not
15 present and did not designate a representative
16 to appear on their behalf. And so, for the
17 purpose of Roll Call, the group of six that
18 are present today is the only group -- are the
19 only members of the group that have standing.

20 And, who is going to represent the
21 group?

22 MS. HARO: Again -- well, we

1 wanted to make sure that you have the petition
2 signed by nearly 100 residents in opposition.

3 MS. FLETCHER: Yes. If they are
4 not here and didn't designate a
5 representative, they are not recognized as
6 Protestants.

7 The individuals that are present,
8 you can represent their interests throughout
9 the process, but we look at who came today,
10 and who designated a representative.

11 I have that document that you
12 already -- could you state your name one more
13 time.

14 MS. HARO: Tamar Haro.

15 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Ms. Haro, I
16 have the protest letter in the file. The
17 protest letter does not designate a
18 representative, so, for the purpose of Roll
19 Call, we look at who showed up today and who
20 provided you with letters of designation to
21 give to us.

22 MS. HARO: Great. We would like

1 to designate ANC Commissioner, Karla Butler --

2 MS. FLETCHER: Okay.

3 MS. HARO: -- for our
4 representative.

5 MS. WILLIFORD: Ms. Fletcher, can
6 you clarify that all of the individuals who
7 showed up actually signed the petition? I am
8 trying to --

9 MS. FLETCHER: Yes. You each
10 signed the protest letter?

11 MS. ODUNSI: Yes.

12 MS. BROWN: Yes.

13 MS. STEPHENSON: Yes.

14 MS. WARD: Yes.

15 MS. FLETCHER: And, Ms. Williford,
16 just so that you know, we check for that, so
17 we will check for that. There are a lot of
18 names we will check.

19 MS. WILLIFORD: Okay.

20 MS. FLETCHER: If we don't see the
21 name, or if you don't see the name, you can
22 let us know.

1 If we were to review the list and
2 did not see the name of the individuals
3 present, then that would change the dynamic.

4 You would be contacted and
5 informed that you are not recognized as a
6 Protestant.

7 MS. WILLIFORD: Great. Thank you
8 for that. And, Ms. Fletcher, if I may. I,
9 also for the record, wanted to make a comment
10 regarding the protest filed by ANC5C.

11 MS. FLETCHER: yes.

12 MS. WILLIFORD: In particular, as
13 you are well-aware, they are required to enter
14 this pursuant to their bylaws, which actually
15 requires a quorum to be present, and a
16 majority to actually vote it within there.

17 On the basis of the resolution
18 that was submitted, it does not actually refer
19 to a quorum or the number of the majority of
20 members who actually voted in this instance.

21 And so, we would object to it on
22 that basis.

1 MS. FLETCHER: And, Ms. Butler,
2 could you respond to that, please.

3 MS. BUTLER: Yes. There actually
4 was a quorum for the ANC5C meeting on November
5 20th.

6 MS. FLETCHER: And a vote was
7 taken?

8 MS. BUTLER: A vote was taken.

9 MS. FLETCHER: That information
10 does need to be in the any protest letter.
11 For the purpose of Roll Call, I am going to --

12 MS. BUTLER: We actually state on
13 the back here, that a majority voted.

14 MS. FLETCHER: So, on the back of
15 the letter you sent to us --

16 MS. BUTLER: On the back of the
17 petition. The resolution that we submitted.

18 MS. FLETCHER: Well, let me just
19 take a look at what we have here.

20 But, go ahead, Ms. Williford.

21 MS. WILLIFORD: Yes, and my
22 apologies. I didn't mean to speak over you.

1 What it does state here -- under
2 their bylaws a majority -- it needs to -- it
3 doesn't state anything regarding a quorum and
4 actually, it is blank regarding the number of
5 members that voted.

6 We do note that there are three
7 signatories that were on there which I would
8 assume would have been present, but under
9 their bylaws, it is seven elected
10 commissioners, and the majority of them have
11 to be, four present, of which they need to
12 vote.

13 So, that information just isn't
14 within the resolution.

15 MS. BUTLER: Ms. Fletcher, we do
16 have a quorum and there are official minutes
17 that are taken at these meetings, and we can
18 definitely provide those minutes to you.

19 MS. FLETCHER: If you could --

20 MS. BUTLER: And also an
21 attendance and roll call.

22 MS. FLETCHER: So, Ms. Butler, if

1 you could email that information to Ms.
2 Williford and to us for the record, we -- we
3 need to know that a meeting was held, that a
4 quorum was present, how many voted.

5 MS. BUTLER: Correct.

6 MS. FLETCHER: A quorum.

7 MS. BUTLER: Okay. Even though we
8 -- even though it is signed stating that we
9 already --

10 MS. FLETCHER: I am going to take
11 a --

12 MS. BUTLER: Okay.

13 MS. FLETCHER: Yes. I am going to
14 take a look at your letter right now to see
15 what it says on the back.

16 MS. BUTLER: I think what happened
17 was that the initial number, but it did state
18 that a majority voted at this meeting.

19 MS. FLETCHER: So, what I have,
20 Ms. Butler, I have two pages, but I don't have
21 a -- so you have a one -- two-sided document.
22 I don't know if we are looking at the same

1 thing.

2 MS. BUTLER: For Echostage. It
3 should -- well, probably when it was scanned,
4 it was two pages, so --

5 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So, let me
6 look at -- okay. So, for me it is the second
7 page?

8 MS. BUTLER: Yes.

9 MS. FLETCHER: So, let me just
10 take a look at that.

11 It says here, "This resolution was
12 presented and approved at a properly-noticed
13 meeting of the 5C Commission on November 20 at
14 which time a majority of the members voted."

15 It doesn't say what the -- what
16 represents the majority or that they are -- or
17 that a quorum voted. That needs to be filled
18 in.

19 So, we know that there was a
20 meeting. We know that it was properly
21 noticed, but we don't know what represents a
22 quorum, or how many people voted.

1 That has to be in every letter.

2 That is why Ms. Williford is objecting to the
3 protest. But, for the purpose of Roll Call,
4 I am going to allow you an opportunity to
5 provide that information to Ms. Williford.

6 She can still object to it, but in
7 every protest letter you must state that a
8 meeting was held and that a quorum was present
9 and how many it takes to make a quorum.

10 MS. BUTLER: Okay. We will submit
11 the official minutes, too.

12 MS. FLETCHER: It just needs to be
13 in the protest letter.

14 MS. BUTLER: Okay.

15 MS. FLETCHER: Yes, but -- but I
16 am going to go ahead and grant you standing,
17 anyway. There is -- there is some discretion.
18 You could not be granted standing because of
19 that as well.

20 MS. BUTLER: Okay.

21 MS. FLETCHER: So, just make sure
22 that any protest includes that information in

1 the actual protest letter.

2 MS. BUTLER: Okay.

3 MS. FLETCHER: So, the ANC is --
4 is -- 5C is granted the standing today, Ms.
5 Butler, and you are going to get that
6 information to Ms. Williford and you can send
7 a copy to me. My card is on the table.

8 So, -- and then, of course, we
9 have got the group of six represented by Ms.
10 Butler.

11 We need to set a date for
12 mediation.

13 And, Ms. Butler, just so that you
14 know, you are going to get a notice with the
15 mediation date, but that notice is also going
16 to include dates for a status hearing and a
17 protest hearing.

18 MS. BUTLER: All right.

19 MS. FLETCHER: Mediation comes
20 first. Then there is a status hearing before
21 the ABC Board where they want to hear from the
22 parties related to the outcome of the

1 mediation.

2 So, when you get your notice, you
3 are going to have a date for a mediation, a
4 status hearing and a protest hearing.

5 And at the status hearing, because
6 you are representing the group, you can appear
7 on behalf of the ANC and the group since at
8 least five of them are present today.

9 MS. BUTLER: Okay.

10 MS. FLETCHER: And the next
11 available date for mediation is -- one second.
12 It is Friday, January the 21st at nine, ten or
13 eleven.

14 MS. BUTLER: Is there any day to
15 push -- push up the meeting before the 21st?
16 We would like to settle this as soon as
17 possible.

18 MS. FLETCHER: Well, you can --
19 just so that you -- no, you don't have to wait
20 for mediation. I am going to see if there is
21 something sooner.

22 You actually don't have to wait

1 for mediation. You can always meet directly
2 with Ms. Williford and resolve the matter that
3 way.

4 So, I am going to see if I can
5 find something earlier, but if I can't, you
6 can still -- you can discuss the matter with
7 Ms. Williford, and if you can resolve it, then
8 we wouldn't need the mediation.

9 MS. BUTLER: Okay.

10 MS. FLETCHER: Let me see if there
11 is anything before the 21st. We can do
12 Tuesday, February 4 at nine.

13 MS. BUTLER: No. I am sorry.
14 Prior to the 21st. I was trying to get
15 something sooner than the 21st.

16 MS. FLETCHER: Right. February 4.

17 MS. WILLIFORD: Oh, did you mean
18 February 21st before? I think before you said
19 January 21st.

20 MS. FLETCHER: Oh, I am sorry. I
21 should -- I meant February 21.

22 MS. BUTLER: Oh, February 21st?

1 MS. FLETCHER: Yes.

2 MS. BUTLER: Oh. Sorry. Okay.

3 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I am sorry.

4 I misspoke. Did I say January?

5 MS. BUTLER: Yes.

6 MS. WILLIFORD: Yes.

7 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you for
8 correcting me. I meant to say February 21st.

9 MS. BUTLER: Okay.

10 MS. FLETCHER: So, is that okay?

11 MS. BUTLER: That is fine.

12 February 4th?

13 MS. WILLIFORD: Is it possible to
14 do Tuesday, the -- February 18th?

15 MS. FLETCHER: I have got numerous
16 -- that day is not good, Ms. Williford.

17 MS. WILLIFORD: Yes, that --

18 MS. FLETCHER: You want to try to
19 do it before the 21st?

20 MS. WILLIFORD: If possible.

21 MS. FLETCHER: Tuesday, February 4
22 is still available at nine.

1 MS. BUTLER: Yes. The 4th is fine
2 for me.

3 MS. WILLIFORD: Okay.

4 MS. FLETCHER: So, mediation for
5 Echostage is set for Tuesday, February 4 at
6 nine.

7 MS. WILLIFORD: Thank you.

8 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Any
9 questions?

10 (No response.)

11 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.

12 The Roll Call Hearing is concluded.

13 MS. WILLIFORD: All right. Thank
14 you.

15 MS. BUTLER: Thank you.

16 (Whereupon, the Roll Call Hearing
17 was concluded at 11:56 p.m.)
