CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Is Mr. Reeves here? Okay.

Okay, Mr. Reeves, will you come to the table, please?

And, if no one else is involved on this case, is anybody else here for this case?

It's a Fact Finding case, and it's a personnel issue. So, I would request that others could step out of the hearing room for this case.

I'm just going to say for the record that I've asked that the hearing room be cleared, in accordance with the Open Meetings Amendment Act, which allows us to have a closed meeting for purposes of considering personnel, or criminal histories, or matters that are of personal nature.

Okay. Hi, Mr. Reeves. Did you sign in?

MR. REEVES: Yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You did sign
2 in already. Okay. I just want to look at my
3 notes.

4 I know that you have applied for
5 an ABC Manager position.

6 MR. REEVES: Yes.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And,
8 there were a couple things in your -- or
9 something in your criminal history records
10 which gave us pause, and that's why we are
11 calling you here today, so you can have a
12 chance to address them, because when we make
13 a determination for this position we have to
14 consider your history, your character, since
15 you are dealing with alcohol here.

16 Okay. Let's see. Can you just
17 summarize, by any chance, I do have notes on
18 this, but I'd like to hear your
19 characterization of your criminal record. I
20 believe you have driving under the influence,
21 and felony destruction of property.

22 MR. REEVES: No, ma'am.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: No, not that?

2 Okay.

3 MR. REEVES: I do not have any
4 felonies on my record.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Do you
6 have a misdemeanor related to destruction of
7 property?

8 MR. REEVES: Yes.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

10 MR. REEVES: I was 23 or 24.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Can you talk
12 into your mic -- is it on?

13 MR. REEVES: Sorry.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It should be
15 green.

16 MR. REEVES: The light is on.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: You can pull it
18 towards you if you want.

19 MR. REEVES: Oh, okay.

20 The destruction of property was a
21 misdemeanor.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. REEVES: When I was, I
2 believe, 23 or 24.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Can you speak
4 a little louder?

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just leave it,
6 just talk up a little bit.

7 MR. REEVES: Oh. When I was 23 or
8 24, I can't remember which, I broke a window.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You broke a
10 window?

11 MR. REEVES: Right.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And, how old
13 are you now?

14 MR. REEVES: Thirty.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thirty.
16 Okay.

17 How did you break the window?

18 MR. REEVES: With a rock.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I mean, you
20 threw it at somebody's house, or a business,
21 or what?

22 MR. REEVES: It was a car.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: A car?

2 MR. REEVES: Yes.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And, why did
4 you do that?

5 MR. REEVES: I was drunk.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You were
7 drunk?

8 MR. REEVES: Yes, ma'am.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. How
10 about driving under the influence?

11 MR. REEVES: I was -- it's a
12 Virginia DUI. I was -- I got drunk and drove
13 home, and got caught. I mean, there's no
14 excuse for it, it was dumb.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, did you
16 have a lot of blood -- I mean, a lot of
17 alcohol in your blood? I mean, were you very
18 drunk?

19 MR. REEVES: I want to say it was
20 .12, .13 or something. I was well over the
21 limit, yes, ma'am.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And, did you

1 -- what were your penalties for those two
2 offenses?

3 MR. REEVES: 15 days in jail for
4 the DUI. The -- I think the breaking the
5 window was just probation, maybe a fine,
6 obviously, paying for the window.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And, when was
8 the DUI?

9 MR. REEVES: The DUI was October
10 11th, it will be 14th months on Friday.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And, did you
12 serve jail time?

13 MR. REEVES: Yes, ma'am, 15 days.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You did, you
15 served it. Okay.

16 And, did you completed an alcohol
17 safety program?

18 MR. REEVES: Yes, ma'am.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How was that?
20 Did you get anything out of that program?

21 MR. REEVES: Yes. I mean, I just
22 finished my ASAP classes, it's ten weeks, and

1 it just ended this Monday, and I stopped
2 drinking several months before it started.

3 So, I mean, it was educational,
4 but I didn't go to like AA meetings or
5 anything like that, along with -- since I had
6 already stopped drinking.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Were you an
8 alcoholic?

9 MR. REEVES: What's that?

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Were you an
11 alcoholic?

12 MR. REEVES: Yes, ma'am.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And, you
14 stopped drinking two months ago?

15 MR. REEVES: No, no. I said
16 several months before it started. I haven't
17 drank since the last time I got arrested with
18 the DUI. Part of my jail sentence was served
19 over weekends, and the Friday that I was to go
20 turn myself in for my final weekend I found
21 out my wife was pregnant. And, suddenly, it
22 wasn't so fun anymore. So, I just can't

1 drink. If I continue to drink, I'll continue
2 to get in trouble.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, you
4 stopped for 14 months or so, is that right?

5 MR. REEVES: That's right.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And,
7 you don't go to AA or anything, you just
8 stopped?

9 MR. REEVES: Yes.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Is
11 there anything else that you do that helps you
12 to refrain from drinking?

13 MR. REEVES: Well, I have a two-
14 week old baby at home, so I'm busy. I have
15 two jobs, and when I'm home I don't have time
16 to even drink there.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And,
18 what are your two jobs?

19 MR. REEVES: The one that I'm
20 applying for the license for is at Dixie
21 Liquor in Georgetown, like right at the Key
22 Bridge. And, on the weekends, I mean for

1 probably ten years now on the weekends, I've
2 worked security at bars. Right now I work in
3 Adams Morgan.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, is it a
5 temptation at all for you to drink being
6 around all these alcohol establishments in
7 your job?

8 MR. REEVES: It is, I mean, I see
9 my friends doing it still, but, I mean, it's
10 just, I can't. That's it. I can't control
11 it, so I can't do it.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.

13 MR. REEVES: Some people can, and
14 I can't.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.
16 Other questions?

17 Mr. Alberti?

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Reeves, where
19 in Adams Morgan are you working on the
20 weekends?

21 MR. REEVES: It's called now -- it
22 changes names quite often, now it's called

1 Shenanigans.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: Shenanigans?

3 MR. REEVES: Yes, sir.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. And, let's
5 go back to the DUI, that day, that evening.
6 What precipitated it, where were you? Were
7 you partying? Were you at a bar? Where were
8 you?

9 MR. REEVES: I went out to a bar,
10 Sign of the Whale on M Street, and I wasn't
11 planning on being there except for a few
12 minutes to see some friends, and ended up
13 staying, and had my truck there. And, did the
14 -- it was dumb, got in my truck and drove
15 home. At that time I was living in
16 Alexandria, and I got stopped in Arlington.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. I have no
18 other questions at this point.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.
22 Brooks?

1 MEMBER BROOKS: Yes, thank you,
2 Madam Chair.

3 Do you have a driver's license
4 now?

5 MR. REEVES: Yes, sir.

6 MEMBER BROOKS: So, your driver's
7 license has not been suspended?

8 MR. REEVES: It was suspended in
9 Virginia.

10 MEMBER BROOKS: In Virginia.

11 MR. REEVES: Correct.

12 MEMBER BROOKS: So, you have a
13 license in D.C., is that what you are saying?

14 MR. REEVES: I now live in
15 Maryland, that's where my license is. It's
16 suspended in Virginia. As of Monday when I
17 finished my ASAP now I can get my restricted.
18 If I was still like working in Virginia, I
19 guess, I could drive to and from work there,
20 once I go and apply for my restricted license
21 there.

22 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. So, your

1 driver's license is suspended in Virginia, but
2 you live in Maryland, is that what you are
3 saying?

4 MR. REEVES: Yes, sir.

5 MEMBER BROOKS: And, you have a
6 Maryland license.

7 MR. REEVES: Maryland driver's
8 license.

9 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay.

10 MR. REEVES: As of right now, I'm
11 not allowed to drive in Virginia, until I go
12 do the paperwork. I think that's only if I
13 was to get a job in Virginia, I could drive to
14 work with that.

15 MEMBER BROOKS: And, you are
16 working now at Shenanigans part time, as,
17 what, a doorman?

18 MR. REEVES: Yes, sir, on Fridays
19 and Saturdays.

20 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. And, you
21 are working at Dixie Liquors now also?

22 MR. REEVES: Yes, sir, that's in

1 Georgetown.

2 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. No, I'm
3 just wondering if it's a good idea to -- I
4 know jobs are hard to find, but to continue to
5 be engaged in the liquor business, one way or
6 the other, and having an issue with drinking,
7 if that's a good idea for you.

8 MR. REEVES: It's probably not the
9 best option, but it's the only one I've got
10 right now.

11 My wife is at home with a baby,
12 and I can't afford to quit either one of them,
13 let alone both of them.

14 MEMBER BROOKS: Thank you, Madam
15 Chair.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You are
17 welcome.

18 Others?

19 Am I correct to assume that you
20 certainly wouldn't be allowed to drink on the
21 job.

22 MR. REEVES: No, at either one of

1 them I'm not allowed to drink, and that's kind
2 of almost a saving grace now, because my only
3 day off is Sunday, and I'm home with the baby.

4 So, I just don't have the chance,
5 and that makes it a little easier.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I just have a
7 few other questions.

8 You know, if there is a concern it
9 would be, you know, that you would fall back
10 into drinking, right?

11 MR. REEVES: Absolutely.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, is there
13 a reason why you don't go to AA, or someplace
14 like that?

15 MR. REEVES: I just haven't needed
16 it. I don't -- I mean, I don't know exactly
17 what it's like, because I've never been. But,
18 from what I see of it like on TV, I just don't
19 think it's for me. I've gone and made it over
20 a year now, so I don't think I'm going to need
21 it.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All

1 right.

2 Any other questions?

3 Give us a minute.

4 (Whereupon, at 11:23 a.m., a
5 discussion off the record until 11:23 a.m.)

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.

7 Is there anything else you wanted to tell us,
8 with respect to us considering your
9 application?

10 MR. REEVES: No, ma'am.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I
12 guess at this point then, I would be prepared
13 to make a motion to approve the application,
14 based on the representation that we heard
15 today, that, primarily, being that you haven't
16 been drinking for 14 months, and are committed
17 to not drinking, and have two jobs that you
18 are holding right now, and a baby.

19 Okay. So, the motion would be to
20 approve.

21 Do I have a second?

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Second.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Jones, I
2 just made a motion to approve.

3 MEMBER JONES: I heard.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. We
5 haven't voted yet. If there's anything you
6 want to say or ask before we vote?

7 MEMBER JONES: No, ma'am.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Who
9 seconded the motion?

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: I did.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,
12 the motion has been seconded by Mr. Alberti.

13 All those in favor say aye.

14 (Ayes.)

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those
16 opposed?

17 MEMBER JONES: No.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those
19 abstaining?

20 The vote is 4:1:0 to approve.

21 So, okay, we will be signing off
22 on your application.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Do we have the
2 original?

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, right
4 here.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Reeves,
6 congratulations on your newborn.

7 MR. REEVES: Thank you very much.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: And, be careful.
9 that's a real hot spot there.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: If you can
11 wait one second.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: He can actually
13 go to the front counter, right?

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: You can go to the
16 service counter, and they'll have it for you
17 in a few moments. So, just wait out there.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, you can
19 tell them.
