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Voluntary Agreement Concerning Issuance of License 083420 to Green Zebra LLC t/a Café Society

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this $\underline{O^{A}}$ day of $\underline{Apr_{1}}$, 2010, by and between Green Zebra LLC (Applicant) and ANC1B (Protestant) witnesses:

Whereas Applicant has filed application 083420 with the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (ABC Board) for a new class CN02 license for premises to be known as Green Zebra, and to be located at 2001 14th Street NW, Washington, DC 20009 (Premises).

Whereas Protestant has filed before the ABC Board a protest opposing the granting of this application on the basis of their concern for peace, order and quiet;

Whereas in recognition of the ABC Board's policy of encouraging parties to a protested proceeding to settle their differences by reaching voluntary agreements, by their signatures below, the parties hereto desire to enter into a voluntary agreement whereby (1) Applicant will agree to adopt certain measures to address Protestant's concerns and to include this agreement as a formal condition of its application, and (2) Protestant will agree to withdraw its protest provided that such an agreement is incorporated into the ABC Board's order issuing the license;

In consideration of the mutual undertakings memorialized herein, the Applicant and Protestants hereby agree as follows:

A. NOISE. Applicant acknowledges familiarity with and will comply with noise-control provisions of the District of Columbia law and regulations, including preventing emissions of sound, capable of being heard outside the premises, by any musical instrument or amplification device or other device beyond the applicable noise levels for operations set forth in Title 20 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations ("DCMR 20"). The entrance door of the premises will be kept closed at all times during business hours when music is being played or any sound amplification device is being employed in the premises, except when persons are in the act of using the door for ingress to or egress from the premises. Any emission of sound during the ingress and egress of persons will not be deemed a violation of this provision. Applicant will have no amplified music on the summer garden. When the summer garden is closed the doors going to the summer garden may be open as long as no amplified music is being played on that floor.

B. SAFETY & SECURITY. Applicant agrees to provide a security plan for inclusion in ABC Board and Protestants files.

C. FOOD SERVICE. Applicant will be held to a standard of annual gross food sales of \$1,500.00 per indoor seat.

D. TRASH/GARBAGE/RODENTS. Applicant shall maintain trash/garbage removal service at least three times weekly and see that the trash and dumpster area remains clean. Applicant shall deposit trash and garbage only in rodent-proof dumpsters, where the covers fit properly and

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remain fully closed except when trash or garbage is being added or removed. Applicant shall request that its trash and recycling contractors pick trash and materials up between 9:30am-6pm.

E. PARKING. Applicant will have a parking plan that encourages transit use, and directs patrons to use nearby public parking facilities rather than parking on residential streets.

F. NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE. In the event that any of the parties is in material breach of this Agreement, it shall be entitled to reasonable notice and opportunity to cure, as a condition precedent to seeking enforcement of the Agreement. Unless the material breach is of a nature that takes longer to cure, reasonable notice and opportunity shall provide for a cure within thirty days of the date of such notice. If Applicant or the Protestant fails to cure within the thirty day period (or, with respect to a breach which reasonably requires more than thirty days to cure, fails to commence cure of such breach and diligently pursues such cure) such failure shall constitute grounds for seeking a Show Cause Order from the ABC Board pursuant to DC Official Code 25-447. Any notices required to be made under this Agreement shall be in writing and mailed via certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or hand delivered, to the other parties to this Agreement at the following addresses. Notice shall be deemed given either on the date delivered by certified mail or on the date of hand delivery,

GREEN ZEBRA LLC t/a CAFÉ SOCIETY PARKING PLAN

This PARKING PLAN ("Plan") is established by Green Zebra LLC t/a Café Society ("Green Zebra"), located at 2001 14th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. 2009, and is effective as of its opening date in Spring 2010. The purpose of the Plan is to help accommodate and facilitate the parking and transit needs of its patrons in a manner that will help to promote order within the community.

In accordance with its purpose, Green Zebra will do the following.

- Green Zebra will encourage its patrons to use public transportation by publicizing its accessibility to metro-bus and metro-rail.
- Green Zebra will encourage its patrons to use nearby public parking facilities, such as the underground parking facility located at the Reeves Government Center.
- Green Zebra will offer valet parking for its patrons as necessary during evenings when large crowds may be expected.

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Wherefore, by the signing of the representatives of Applicant and Protestant, Applicant hereby agrees to aforementioned undertaking and Protestants agrees to withdraw its protest, provided that this agreement is incorporated into the ABC Board's order issuing a Class CT license.
