## 1 PROCEEDINGS

- 2 FACT FINDING HEARING
- 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I know we're 40
- 4 minutes behind schedule but we're having this
- 5 next fact finding hearing, Bardo River Brewery,
- 6 license #103291. Will the owner/applicant please
- 7 approach. Do we have anyone else in the audience
- 8 who's here for this matter? You can also come up
- 9 and identify yourself for the record.
- MR. STEWART: There's no one else here for
- 11 this matter because there are no people in the
- 12 protest.
- 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's not a protest,
- it's a fact finding hearing. I think the board
- 15 had --
- MR. STEWART: But if there are no witnesses
- 17 but Murmurshe's here.
- 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The board had a fact
- 19 finding hearing, it's on the board's agenda that
- we're having a fact finding hearing and although
- they would have going to have no protest, it's my
- understanding were going to have no protest on

- 1 there, but the board is interested in just
- 2 hearing --
- MR. STEWART: There's no standing to do --
- 4 MR. SILVERSTEIN: We don't need standing,
- sir.
- 6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on Mr.
- 7 Silverstein. We're not giving anyone standing.
- 8 The board is gathering information. A fact
- 9 finding hearing, sir, and I'm new to this -- sir
- 10 -- all right, remember the board is the one who
- 11 makes this decision and what I would ask you to
- do, sir, you need to be open, transparent, and
- make sure that the board has all the information
- 14 that it has, and so therefore when the board
- makes a decision, the board will make a decision.
- 16 So -- so -- I -- I hear you, you've gone
- 17 through there, but I think that you need to trust
- 18 the board that we're going to make the right
- decision and so we're not giving anyone standing,
- what we're doing is that we're gathering
- information and that's what a fact finding
- 22 hearing is, that's -- we are gathering

- 1 information.
- MR. STEWART: The city council has decided
- that manufacturer licenses do not need to be
- 4 placarded.
- 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I am aware of that,
- 6 sir.
- 7 MR. STEWART: Nobody has standing to protest
- 8 this license. This is strictly an administerial
- 9 procedure, it is not an adversarial procedure.
- 10 There's no need for witnesses. The only people
- 11 that can call witnesses during -- the judge
- cannot call a witness, only this person in this
- desk and that person at that desk. There's
- 14 nobody at this desk. There's nobody protesting.
- 15 There's nobody who has standing in a protest,
- okay? So, we're requesting that the board do
- 17 their duty and issue this license or at least
- 18 give Ms. Fowler the okay to continue processing
- 19 this paperwork. This is an administerial thing.
- 20 If it's going to turn into an adversarial
- 21 proceeding I'm going to have to go lawyer up.
- 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sir. We haven't --

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- MR. SILVERSTEIN: Mr. Stewart will you sit
- 2 down so we can get you on the record please?
- 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We haven't even
- 4 started. All right, sir. All right. You can
- 5 decide what you want to do, sir. A fact finding
- 6 hearing is a nonadversarial -- it's not
- 7 adversarial. All that the board is doing is
- 8 gathering information and we're calling people to
- 9 gather information. And I think that it behooves
- 10 you that you want, when the board makes a
- 11 decision, that we make the right decision and so
- in gathering our information no one has standing
- here so we're not giving anyone standing, we're
- 14 gathering information. We're doing fact finding.
- 15 We are asking for information to make the
- decision. There's nothing adversarial here, at
- 17 least not from as being -- not from me being
- 18 chair. And I'll say this, sir, the only person
- who is being adversarial here is you. And I
- 20 think that if you're -- listen, sir -- if you're
- 21 asking the board to make a decision to benefit
- you, you need -- you've been sitting here -- you

- 1 sat here but we had fact finding hearings and
- they decide to lawyer up. You heard questions
- that were asked by board members because this is
- 4 what you need to understand, sir. It is better
- 5 that these questions are addressed with you here.
- 6 It is better for you to hear what the board is
- 7 saying out here so you can counter it rather than
- 8 -- that I say we go back there and we make a
- 9 decision and we're through. So, this is in your
- 10 benefit.
- MR. STEWART: I understand.
- 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, you -- so if you
- decided today -- this is your choice -- if you
- 14 believe that you need to go get a lawyer we can
- 15 adjourn this matter, you can go get a lawyer and
- we can do that, but this is in your benefit, sir.
- MR. STEWART: I understand what you're
- 18 saying, but the city council has decided that
- manufacturer licenses do not have any of these
- 20 procedures. If your application meets all the
- 21 requirements, which I think Ms. Fowler says --
- yeah, the application is complete -- then the

- 1 board's administerial duty is to issue the
- license. There is no need for any of this kind
- of adversarial -- what the Nationals have to say
- 4 has zero to do with this license.
- 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, let me ask you a
- 6 question --
- 7 MR. STEWART: The ANC has to say has zero to
- 8 do with this license. This is adversarial. You
- need to do your administrative duty and issue
- 10 this license.
- 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, let me ask you a
- question. So you're saying that you shouldn't
- even be here for a fact finding.
- MR. STEWART: If you want to ask me questions
- about the boundaries of it, whether my map was
- incorrect, those kind of things, that's fine.
- 17 What the Nationals have to say have nothing to do
- 18 with Bardo Brewery. What the ANC has to say has
- nothing to do with Bardo Brewery. The reason
- there are so many manufacturers in D.C. is
- 21 because the city council's decided that if you
- meet all the requirements you get handed the

- 1 license. It's like a driver's license. We have
- 2 met all the requirements, we want the license
- 3 delivered today, and if you are going to treat
- 4 this like an adversarial hearing then we are
- 5 going to have to go lawyer up for a four-hour
- 6 hearing. You want a four-hour hearing, that's
- 7 fine. If you want a one-hour hearing I came here
- 8 man to man to talk to you folks directly. If you
- 9 have questions about the maps, questions about
- 10 the layout, questions like that, I'd be glad to
- answer them but -- and I'm here man to man,
- person to person, to do that. If we're going to
- have this adversarial thing then I'm going to
- 14 have to lawyer up. But it's going to take a
- 15 four-hour hearing, not a one-hour hearing, that
- you're going to have to sit through.
- 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Stewart.
- MR. STEWART: That's just the way it's going
- 19 to go. It's not a threat, it's just reality.
- 20 That is the way it's going to go, these lawyers
- 21 come in, they spend four hours.
- 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, Mr.

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- 1 Stewart. Okay? This is what I'm going to make a
- 2 proposal to my. Yeah, this is not the way to do
- 3 it here, this is a fact finding hearing. You
- 4 believe that you need to be lawyered up.
- 5 MR. STEWART: No.
- 6 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, you brought
- 7 it up, okay? All that the board is doing is
- 8 gathering information and you're starting off
- 9 this, and I was -- let me finish to you, sir.
- 10 Your stance today is saying that the board, we
- 11 don't even have an author -- we don't even have -
- 12 I'm taking it that you're saying the board
- doesn't even have the authority to call you in to
- 14 ask you any questions.
- MR. STEWART: You can ask me questions.
- 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's not what you
- just said. So, this is what I'm going to do.
- MR. STEWART: And I said you can't ask the
- 19 ANC questions and you can't ask the Nationals
- 20 questions.
- 21 What they have to say has nothing to do with
- 22 this license.

- 1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You can't tell the
- 2 board what the board can or can't do, okay?
- 3 MR. STEWART: Oh, well --
- 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So this is what I'm
- 5 going to say, sir, okay? I'm going to propose to
- 6 my board that we not have this hearing today and
- 7 it be rescheduled for next week.
- 8 MR. STEWART: Okay.
- 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If you believe -- next
- week is our last hearing for the summer. If you
- 11 believe that you need a lawyer, you can be
- lawyered up and we can stay here as long as we
- need to do it, but if the board has had a fact
- 14 finding hearing and the board believes that it
- needs to call people to get more information to
- make its decisions, we will do that. It is not
- 17 adversarial. You are the only one who is making
- 18 this adversarial today. So, that's what I'm
- 19 going to -- I'm making a motion to our board
- 20 members that we adjourn this hearing. It will be
- 21 rescheduled for next week. If you believe that
- you need to have -- you believe that you need to

- 1 have a lawyer that is your choice, but you cannot
- tell the board what we can or can't do, who we
- 3 can call to ask, to rely on for information in
- 4 making the decision that we need to do. Sir, you
- 5 don't need to say anything else. I'll tell you
- 6 what the decision is. I motion. Seconded by Mr.
- 7 Short. All those in favor say aye. (chorus of
- 8 ayes.) Thank you. We'll let you know.
- 9 MR. STEWART: Next week what time?
- 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We'll let you know
- what time next Wednesday, that's the last hearing
- for the schedule. We're adjourned until 1:30.
