ORDER SUA SPONTE TO CONSOLIDATE PROTESTS

THIS CAUSE is before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) *sua sponte*.

The Application filed by Chaplin Restaurant DC, LLC, t/a Chaplin (Applicant), for Substantial Change to change its hours of operation and alcoholic beverages sales, service, and consumption, to its Retailer's Class CR License, having been protested, came before the Board for a Roll Call Hearing on December 28, 2015 and a Protest Status Hearing on January 27, 2016.

There is also pending before the Board an Application filed by the Applicant for Substantial Change to include an Entertainment Endorsement, which was also protested and came before the Board for a Roll Call Hearing on February 8, 2016. This matter is scheduled for a Protest Status Hearing on March 9, 2016 at 9:30 a.m.

The Board now seeks to consolidate Case Nos. 15-PRO-00119 and 16-PRO-00005. The Board finds that a consolidation of these cases is appropriate because the parties, the witnesses, and the issues are the same in both protest cases. Additionally, the Board finds


that as a matter of administrative economy and fairness to the parties, consolidation of the two protests is proper.


ORDER

Therefore, for the reasons stated above the Board, on this 2nd day of March, 2016, *sua sponte* **CONSOLIDATE** Case Nos. 15-PRO-00119 and 16-PRO-00005. Therefore, the Protest Hearing for both protest cases shall be consolidated into one hearing, to be held on April 20, 2016 at 4:30 p.m.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
