ORDER AMENDING BOARD ORDER NO. 2015-145

On April 22, 2015, by Board Order No. 2015-145, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) approved the Settlement Agreement, dated March 31, 2015, entered between La Cucina Biologica, LLC, t/a Coppi's Organic Restaurant, ANC 3C, and CPCA to govern the operations of the Applicant's establishment.

The Board now seeks to amend Board Order No. 2015-145 to make clear that its official records reflect that the Protests filed by ANC 3C and CPCA in this matter were withdrawn.

Further the Board dismisses the Mark Rosenman and Evelyn Idelson Group under § 25-609(b), which requires the Board to dismiss all groups protesting the Application when an ANC enters into a settlement agreement with an applicant. Id.; D.C. Official Code § 25-609(b).


All other conditions adopted by Board Order No. 2015-145 shall remain in full force and effect.

Accordingly, it is this 13th day of May, 2015, **ORDERED** that:

1. Board Order No. 2015-145 is **AMENDED** to make clear that the Protests of ANC 3C and CPCA in this matter are hereby **WITHDRAWN**;
2. The Protest filed by Mark Rosenman and Evelyn Idelson Group is **DISMISSED** pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-609(b);
3. All other conditions adopted by Board Order No. 2015-145 shall remain in full force and effect; and
4. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Applicant, ANC 3C, and Mark Rosenman and Evelyn Idelson, on behalf of the Group of Five or More Individuals.







Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433, any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
