ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF LPCA'S PROTEST

The Application filed by Eritrean Cultural & Civic Center, t/a Eritrean Cultural Center, for a Transfer to a New Location of its Retailer's Class CX Multipurpose Facility License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on September 12, 2016, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001).


On September 12, 2016, the Board dismissed the Protest of LPCA, because LPCA did not give the Applicant at least seven days advanced notice of the LPCA meeting, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-601(3)(B). LPCA may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.

ORDER

The Board does hereby, this 14th day of September, 2016, **DISMISS** the Protest of LPCA. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Applicant and Kevin Mullone, on behalf of the Group of Five or More Individuals and LPCA.

The Board advises the parties that the protest of the Group of Five or More Individuals remains, and the Protest Status Hearing is set for October 26, 2016 at 9:30 a.m. and the Protest Hearing for November 30, 2016 at 4:30 p.m.







Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
