**ORDER VACATING CANCELLATION OF LICENSE AND  
REINSTATING LICENSE**

On April 22, 2015, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued Board Order No. 2015-175 cancelling Dennis S. Hodge, t/a Family Liquors' (Licensee) License No. ABRA-021877. The license is in safekeeping. Specifically, the Licensee failed to renew his license by March 31, 2015, the deadline for all Retailer's Class A licenses. *See* Board Order No. 2015-175.

On November 20, 2015, Dennis Hodge, Sole Proprietor, sought reinstatement of his Retailer's Class A License No. ABRA-021877. In support of his request for reinstatement, Mr. Hodge stated that he was unaware of the cancellation deadline. The Licensee agrees to renew his license and pay all the pending license fees and the associated late fees if his request is approved by the Board.

The Board finds that the reinstatement of the license is proper.



Hodge, t/a Family Liquors, located at 710 H Street, N.E., Washington, D.C., by the Board on April 22, 2015, be and hereby is **VACATED** and that the Retailer Class A License No. ABRA-021877 is **REINSTATED**. 

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14<sup>th</sup> Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
