**AMENDED FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW,
AND ORDER**

Green Island Café/Heaven and Hell, Inc. t/a Green Island Café/Heaven and Hell at premises 2327 18th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., holder of a Retailer's Class CT License, was found by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) to have violated D.C. Official Code and District of Columbia Municipal Regulations. The Board ordered the Respondent to pay a fine in the amount of \$4,000.00 by no later than thirty (30) days from the date of the Order. Furthermore, the Respondent's license was suspended for thirteen (13) days; six (7) days served and six (6) days stayed for one (1) year, provided that the Respondent did not commit any ABC violations.

The Board now seeks to amend Order No. 2010-369 to clarify that the two suspension days levied for Charge I are to be stayed rather than one day of suspension served and one day of suspension stayed. Thus the total number of days of suspension for all five charges is thirteen (13); with six (6) days served and seven (7) days stayed for one year pending no further violations. All other terms and conditions adopted by Order No. 2010-358, to include the dates of suspension, July 13, 2010 through July 18, 2010, shall remain in full force and effect.

Accordingly, it is this 30th day of June 2010, **ORDERED** that:


1. Green Island Café/Heaven and Hell, Inc. t/a Green Island Café/Heaven and Hell at premises 2327 18th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., holder of a Retailer's Class CT License, will have its license suspended for thirteen (13) days; with six (6) days served and seven (7) days stayed for one year pending no further violations.

2. All other terms and conditions of Order No. 2010-369 shall remain in full force and effect.





Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 500 Indiana Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 (April 2004) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion.
