ORDER ON REINSTATEMENT OF CAG PROTEST

The Application filed by Gypsy Sally's Acoustic Tavern, LLC, t/a Gypsy Sally's for a Substantial Change to expand its interior, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on August 4, 2014, and a Protest Status Hearing on September 17, 2014, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001).

On September 17, 2014, the Board dismissed the Protest of CAG, because CAG failed to appear at the Protest Status Hearing. On September 18, 2014, CAG filed a request for reinstatement of its Protest. In its request the CAG stated that a medical injury prevented its representative from attending the Protest Status Hearing and time did not allow notification to Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) staff. Therefore, the Board finds good cause to reinstate CAG's Protest.

ORDER

The Board does hereby, this 24th day of September, 2014, **REINSTATES** the Protest of CAG. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Applicant, ANC 2E, and CAG.



Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433, any Party adversely affected by this Order may file a Motion for Reconsideration within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 500 Indiana Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433, stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b).
