3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Hi. Welcome to the ABC
4 Board. Would you introduce yourselves for the record,
5 please?

6 MS. CHAPMAN: I'm Anne Chapman with Rocklands
7 Barbeque and Grilling Company.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right. Hi.

9 MS. STATLAND: And I'm Jorie Statland with
10 Georgetown University.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What's your last name?

12 MS. STATLAND: Statland.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Statland. Okay.

14 MS. STATLAND: Spelled S-T-A-T-L-A-N-D.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Was yours Chapman?

16 MS. CHAPMAN: Chapman with a, "P."

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

18 MS. CHAPMAN: Chapman.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So you're having
20 a homecoming. And we just want to hear a little bit
21 more about it, how you're serving the alcohol and how
22 you're monitoring so that it's not served to those

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1 under 21, the basic kind of thing. So --

2 MS. CHAPMAN: Okay.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- this shouldn't take
4 too long. Okay.

5 MS. CHAPMAN: Great. Thank you.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So you want to
7 just give us an overview of the event and how the
8 alcohol will be controlled?

9 MS. STATLAND: Right. Well, let me -- can I
10 give you this map? Give it to her first.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Sure. Wait. Do you
12 just have one? Yeah, thank you. Wait. The -- hold
13 it. Our assistant's going to help you, Ms. Walker.

14 MS. STATLAND: Thank you. So the Homecoming
15 Tailgate event takes place on Georgetown's campus in a
16 big parking lot space, which you'll see from the map.
17 And we have about 5000 attendees. The entire area is
18 barricaded with, you know, the metal barricades. We
19 have one point of entry where we have lines. And we
20 have 80 security personnel from -- that we're hiring
21 from Evolution Protective Services, who will be
22 checking IDs.

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1 So we will have ID scanners, which they'll
2 use. And of course, they'll -- they're trained to use
3 their discretion in terms of, you know, if an ID is
4 real but it doesn't match with the person.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Uh-huh.

6 MS. STATLAND: So they will be making those
7 judgment calls. If someone does present a fake ID,
8 they will not be allowed to enter. The ID will be
9 confiscated and they'll go through the university
10 disciplinary process. We will be -- anyone who's over
11 21 and presents a valid ID -- and we do require two
12 forms of ID. So in addition to the photo ID, they'll
13 have to have a backup, whether that be their student ID
14 or a credit card.

15 And all of those over 21 will be wrist-
16 banded. And everyone under 21 will receive two X's on
17 their hands.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Uh-huh.

19 MS. STATLAND: So it's very visible. They
20 can't, you know, pass off a wrist band or anything like
21 that. Once they're inside the tailgate, the beer
22 service will be -- we have TIPS-trained bartenders that

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1 were hired from Personnel Plus. And they will be
2 distributing the beer. They have been instructed to
3 look for the wrist bands. If anyone has X's on their
4 hands, they will not be allowed to be served.

5 If anyone is overly intoxicated, they will
6 not be served. We have security stationed at the beer
7 lines as well to regulate that. In addition, we have
8 our Campus Department of Public Safety officers, who
9 will be at the tailgate and will be working in tandem
10 with the security company. So that's the basic process
11 but please ask any questions you have.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, I think -- I see
13 in the application you estimate 3000 people; is that
14 correct?

15 MS. STATLAND: We get between 4000-5000. Not
16 all of those are --

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.

18 MS. STATLAND: -- over 21. We do open the
19 event up to students. So

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But the -- is that
21 number for the Homecoming event total, not for the
22 people who are going to come to the tailgate?

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1 MS. STATLAND: The tailgate is usually
2 between 4000-5000.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It is? Okay.

4 MS. STATLAND: Yeah.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So then -- and you have
6 a lot of other people on campus at the same time?

7 MS. STATLAND: The majority of those
8 attending Homecoming would tend to tailgate. That's
9 our main event. We do have some family programming
10 during the weekend, like, a movie night. So, you know,
11 we have registrants for the weekend that are definitely
12 not coming to the tailgate. But

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But you don't have,
14 like, sports events going on at the same time?

15 MS. STATLAND: We do have a football game --

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You do? Football,
17 right.

18 MS. STATLAND: -- following the tailgate.
19 Yeah. But that's not through our registrations.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

21 MS. STATLAND: That's separate.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay. So is it -

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1 - have you been doing this tailgate thing for many
2 years?

3 MS. STATLAND: Yeah.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So it -- and
5 every -- and you've had about the same type of
6 security, etc., set up?

7 MS. STATLAND: Uh-huh.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And it's worked for all
9 these years, no problems?

10 (No audible response.)

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Do Board members
12 have questions? Here comes our investigator. Okay.
13 Mr. Ghenene, you can introduce yourself for the record
14 when you're ready.

15 MR. GHENENE: Sure. Abyie Ghenene, ABRA
16 investigator.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So just to fill
18 you in basically, it's Georgetown's homecoming. It --
19 for many years the same way, expect, like, 4000-5000 in
20 this tailgate parking lot situation. What'd you say
21 about security, 7 -- what was your number in security,
22 8?

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1 MS. STATLAND: We have 20 that we're hiring
2 from --

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Twenty.

4 MS. STATLAND: -- a security company, about
5 ten Georgetown Department of Public Safety officers and
6 then we have about 100 Georgetown staff, who are also
7 at the event doing registration and checking in.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

9 MS. CHAPMAN: There's also additional 45-50
10 Rocklands catering staff on site. And we keep our eyes
11 obviously peeled for any shenanigans and report them
12 immediately.

13 MS. STATLAND: Yeah, we have 40 bartenders as
14 well.

15 MR. NOPHLIN: Sorry, could you speak a little
16 louder in the mike and --

17 MS. CHAPMAN: Me?

18 MR. NOPHLIN: Yes.

19 MS. CHAPMAN: I said we also -- we
20 additionally have 45-50 staff members from Rocklands on
21 site working the event and additionally 40 bartenders
22 that they've hired -- Georgetown's hired.

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1 MR. NOPHLIN: Thank you.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Have you had problems in
3 the past with anyone getting over-intoxicated?

4 MS. STATLAND: We have not since I -- I've
5 been working on this event for the past three years.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Uh-huh.

7 MS. STATLAND: And we haven't had any
8 incidents.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you -- and are there
10 instructions to the people who are staffing as to what
11 to do if there --

12 MS. STATLAND: Yeah. Our DPS, our Department
13 of Public Safety officers, handle all of those issues.
14 So, you know, if one of our staff or one of our hired
15 security noticed an issue, they're instructed to
16 connect with a DPS officer. And if it's, you know, an
17 issue of someone simply getting belligerent and, you
18 know -- they'll be escorted out of the tailgate. If
19 it's a health issue, then, you know, first our campus
20 EMS is called. And obviously, if it's an issue that
21 requires, you know, hospitalization, then Georgetown
22 University Hospital is right on campus. So

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1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

2 MS. CHAPMAN: It's pretty early. It goes
3 from 11:00-3:00 but the --

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Uh-huh.

5 MS. CHAPMAN: -- beer service ends at 2:00
6 p.m.

7 sharp. So it's pretty early and pretty short
8 event to get them out and over to the game.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Are there
10 questions? They're also doing a wrist band on those who
11 are 21 and older and black X's on the hands of those
12 who aren't. Do you have any concerns of questions?

13 MR. GHENENE: Yeah, I've got two questions.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

15 MR. GHENENE: Are you guys representatives of
16 Rocklands?

17 MS. CHAPMAN: I am a representative of
18 Rockland.

19 MR. GHENENE: Okay. You guys will have a --

20 MS. STATLAND: And I'm with Georgetown.

21 MR. GHENENE: Okay. You guys will have a
22 caterer's license?

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1 MS. CHAPMAN: We do.

2 MR. GHENENE: Okay. So I guess I'm confused
3 as to why they're not using their caterers and they're
4 applying for a temporary.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Why they're not using
6 their caterers and their what?

7 MR. GHENENE: License.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: In their license
9 application?

10 MR. GHENENE: Uh-huh.

11 MS. CHAPMAN: That -- there's a -- like, a
12 two- liner in there that if you're catering for a party
13 of greater than 100, you need to get a one-day permit.
14 You can't --

15 MR. GHENENE: Okay.

16 MS. CHAPMAN: -- use your caterer's license.

17 MR. GHENENE: And this event is going to be
18 restricted just to this parking lot outside of
19 McDonough?

20 MS. STATLAND: Right. It's all barricaded.
21 It's one point of --

22 MR. GHENENE: Okay.

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1 MS. STATLAND: -- entry and exit but, you
2 know, it's -- we have security stationed and --

3 MR. GHENENE: Okay. And the Reflex Band, is
4 that a Georgetown University --

5 MS. STATLAND: No. It's a -- it's an '80s
6 cover band in the area. So --

7 MR. GHENENE: Okay.

8 MS. STATLAND: -- I think they're more all
9 over.

10 MR. GHENENE: And the event will be over at
11 3:00?

12 MS. STATLAND: At 2:00. At 2:00 we stop beer
13 service and we start, you know --

14 MR. GHENENE: Clearing? So at 3:00 --

15 MS. STATLAND: Yeah.

16 MR. GHENENE: -- it'll be cleared out? And
17 that's -- this is a Saturday?

18 MS. STATLAND: Uh-huh.

19 MR. GHENENE: Okay.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good. Any other
21 questions? Do you have any questions for us? Okay.
22 Looks good. Looks good so I think we'll be ready to

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1 sign off. What do you do if it's bad weather?

2 MS. STATLAND: It's rain or shine.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You get wet?

4 MS. STATLAND: Raincoat.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

6 MR. GHENENE: Oh, is this -- is this all you
7 can drink?

8 MS. STATLAND: It is -- it is an open bar --
9 or beer, rather.

10 MR. ALBERTI: I have a quick question. Is
11 Rocklands providing the alcohol or just the -- just the
12 snack?

13 MS. CHAPMAN: We will be providing the
14 alcohol.

15 MR. ALBERTI: Okay.

16 MS. CHAPMAN: We are getting the license to
17 have a --

18 MR. ALBERTI: So the license is really --
19 who's -- I mean, I'm a little curious as -- you have a
20 -- I think this is Mr. Ghenene's confusion and it's
21 sort of sparked confusion with me too, is so who's
22 applying for this license? Is it --

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1 MS. CHAPMAN: Rocklands.

2 MR. ALBERTI: Rocklands is --

3 MS. CHAPMAN: Rocklands is applying.

4 MR. ALBERTI: Okay.

5 MR. GHENENE: That's my -- that was my
6 confusion.

7 MR. ALBERTI: Oh, because it doesn't say that
8 on the application; is that correct?

9 MS. CHAPMAN: Is it Samuel Ford?

10 MR. ALBERTI: I -- wait, wait, wait. What's
11 the application say? It says, "Sponsoring organization
12 -- sponsoring event is Georgetown University."

13 MR. GHENENE: Uh-huh.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I see what you're trying
15 to say. John Snedden, who is he?

16 MS. CHAPMAN: He's our president.

17 MR. ALBERTI: But it doesn't say Rocklands is --

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: He's what?

19 MS. CHAPMAN: He's the president of
20 Rocklands.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right, okay.

22 MS. CHAPMAN: He -- they file the paperwork.

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1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yeah, it says,
2 John@rocklands.com.

3 MS. CHAPMAN: Uh-huh.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But then it says, "Event
5 is Georgetown University" -- the organization
6 sponsoring the event. That's the confusion. Okay. The
7 organization sponsoring the event is Georgetown
8 University. Applicant's name is John Snedden. What
9 wasn't clear, I think, was that John Snedden was
10 Rocklands.

11 MS. CHAPMAN: Yes, Rocklands --

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, I see -- I see --

13 MR. ALBERTI: So John Snedden -- okay. Yeah,
14 I'm sorry. Go ahead.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I was just going to say
16 you can see Rocklands at the email address.

17 MS. CHAPMAN: Oh

18 MR. ALBERTI: Well, yeah, but --

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

20 MR. ALBERTI: But -- okay.

21 MS. CHAPMAN: I have a letter from John
22 saying that I can come and speak on his behalf.

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1 MR. ALBERTI: I understand. I just --

2 MS. CHAPMAN: Okay.

3 MR. ALBERTI: I -- it's just a matter of
4 getting our records straight.

5 MS. CHAPMAN: Oh, okay.

6 MR. ALBERTI: All right.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right.

8 MR. GHENENE: So should we -- this guy isn't
9 here. He's the president of Rocklands. Should we have
10 him come in (inaudible) Rocklands?

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Your letter says that
12 you're authorized to represent --

13 MS. CHAPMAN: Yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- Mr. Snedden or --

15 MS. CHAPMAN: And Rocklands.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: You can put that in the
17 file. That's fine.

18 MR. ALBERTI: Ms. Miller, I would recommend
19 that we ask the applicant to amend the application to
20 put, "/Rocklands," there so that we know it's the
21 caterer who's applying for the one-day.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Sure. Thank you.

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1 MR. ALBERTI: Mr. Ghenene, thank you.

2 MR. GHENENE: Uh-huh.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yeah. So in the future,
4 you should -- you should do it that way too so that we
5 know who's responsible --

6 MS. CHAPMAN: Okay.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- for the liquor.

8 MS. CHAPMAN: So applicant's name should be
9 Rocklands?

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, he can just put --
11 or, "/Rocklands," so that we know Mr. Snedden --

12 MS. CHAPMAN: Okay.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- is of Rocklands.

14 MS. CHAPMAN: All right.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Correct? I mean, you --
16 yeah, anything else? Okay. I think we're set. I
17 think you're set. Have a great event. Thank you very
18 much.

19 MS. CHAPMAN: Thank you. Do we need to wait
20 and get a copy of it or --

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, wait. Yeah.

22 MS. CHAPMAN: Yeah? Okay. Thank you very
