ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE


The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that JIC, LLC, t/a Jordan's, located at 523 8th Street, S.E., Washington, D.C., has failed to pay the second year license fees for License No. ABRA-076290, a Retailer's Class CT License. Specifically, you failed to pay the license fees for the period of 2011 to 2012, for your license by September 30, 2011, the deadline for all Retailer's CT licenses, despite being notified of the payment date.


On March 21, 2012, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist, No. 2012-109, against JIC, LLC, t/a Jordan's, located at 523 8th Street, S.E., D.C., pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to pay the license fees for the period of 2011 to 2012.

While ABRA's Enforcement Division attempted to serve the Order to Cease and Desist, it was determined that the Licensee is out of business.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 11th day of April, 2012, that JIC, LLC's License No. ABRA-076290 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Licensee.






