
ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Micro Market and Beer and Wine, LLC, t/a Micro Market Beer and Wines, (Respondent), located at 2007 1st Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., has failed to pay the second year license fees for its License No. ABRA-079226, a Retailer's Class B License. Specifically, the Respondent failed to make the second year payment for its license by September 30, 2015, the deadline for all Retailer's Class B licenses, despite being notified by ABRA of the payment date.

On November 4, 2015, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist against the Respondent, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to make the second year payment for its Retailer's Class B License. On November 4, 2015, ABRA's Enforcement Division confirmed that the Respondent is out of business.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 2nd day of December, 2015, that Micro Market and Beer and Wine, LLC's License No. ABRA-079226 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
