ORDER GRANTING GOVERNMENT'S MOTION TO DISMISS

This matter comes before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) on the Government's Motion to Dismiss (Motion) Case No. 12-CMP-00438.

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration's (ABRA) record reflects that the ABC license of Garlic & Saffron, Inc., t/a Sangria Café, (Respondent) was transferred to 3636 Woodner Limited Partnership on December 5, 2012. Therefore, ABRA Licensing File No. ABRA-060551 has been closed, rendering the prosecution of this case against the Respondent moot.

Upon consideration of this request to dismiss Case No. 12-CMP-00438, the Board grants Government's Motion due to the transfer of Garlic & Saffron, Inc.'s, t/a Sangria Café, ABC License.


ORDER

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433, any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 500 Indiana Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433, stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b).
