
ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

On December 29, 2015, the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration's (ABRA) Enforcement Division determined that 1610 Restaurant, LLC, t/a Stetson's, was out of business.

On December 30, 2015, the ABRA's Licensing Division mailed via Unites States Postal Service (USPS) a written notice to the Licensee. The notice advised the Licensee that if its establishment was no longer operational, the license must be surrendered to the Board for safekeeping or the license would be cancelled pursuant to the District of Columbia Official Code § 25-791. ABRA mailed the notice to the Licensee at its address of record.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 17th day of February, 2016, that 1610 Restaurant, LLC's License No. ABRA-060455 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Licensee.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
