3 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Next case,  
4 please, 09-CMP-00795 and 09-251-00297, 1215  
5 CT, LLC t/a Current. Parties forward and  
6 introductions, please.

7 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Good morning, Mr.  
8 Chairman. Good morning, Members of the Board.  
9 Makan Shirafkan with the Law Office of  
10 Shirafkan and Associates representing the  
11 licensee.

12 MR. JEWAYNI: Yama Jewayni,  
13 managing member.

14 MR. ALANIS: Rob Alanis, general  
15 manager.

16 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: So you are  
17 the managing member of -- and your name again,  
18 sir?

19 MR. JEWAYNI: Yama Jewayni.

20 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Spell your  
21 last name.

22 MR. JEWAYNI: J-E-W-A-Y-N-I.

1                   ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Thank you,  
2 sir. One moment, please. Sorry for the  
3 delay. My apologies. I just wanted to make  
4 sure I was talking about the right things at  
5 the right time.

6                   Okay. Introductions, please?

7                   INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Hi,  
8 Investigator Jabriel Shakoor, ABRA.

9                   ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Hello, Mr.  
10 Investigator.

11                  MR. SHIRAFKAN: Makan Shirafkan,  
12 Law Offices of Shirafkan and Associates.

13                  ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Yes, we got  
14 you guys. I'm good with you guys. I just  
15 needed to make sure I introduced him real  
16 quick. Thank you very much, Mr. Shirafkan.

17                  This is a Fact-Finding Hearing.  
18 As such, it is a non-adversarial process. Our  
19 goal is to try to gain information as to what  
20 happened with Investigative Reports No. 09-  
21 CMP-000795 and 90-251-00297 and then decide  
22 whether or not there is enough information

1 here to move forward with some other action or  
2 as happened in the case before you, no further  
3 action.

4 So as is our custom, we normally  
5 start with our Investigator, Mr. Shakoor.

6 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Thank you,  
7 Mr. Chairman. My summary will cover three  
8 separate dates on which I visited Current.

9 First, on Sunday, October 25,  
10 2009, at approximately 11:35 p.m., I visited  
11 Current to monitor for ABRA violations. I  
12 observed a large crowd outside the entrance  
13 and a female door person collecting money from  
14 patrons.

15 The female door person informed me  
16 that there was a \$10 cover charge. I later  
17 identified myself and spoke with ABC Manager  
18 Rob Alanis. Mr. Alanis stated that Current  
19 was hosting an event for D.C. Hair Salons that  
20 night.

21 Mr. Alanis stated that the cover  
22 charge had reduced from \$20 to \$10. I advised

1 Mr. Alanis to apply for the cover charge  
2 endorsement.

3 On Thursday, October 29, 2009, I  
4 visited Current to monitor for ABRA  
5 violations.

6 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: What date  
7 was that, sir?

8 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Thursday,  
9 October 29, 2009.

10 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Yes.

11 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: I visited  
12 Current to monitor for ABRA violations. Upon  
13 arrival, I observed new signage reading  
14 Current Sushi. I later spoke to Mr. Alanis  
15 who stated that the new signage was installed  
16 earlier during the day. I advised Mr. Alanis  
17 to apply for new trade name change.

18 On Tuesday, January 19th, I  
19 reviewed ABRA records and spoke to program  
20 manager of licensing, Mrs. Balmelle. She  
21 informed me that on January 13th Current  
22 applied and was approved for the new trade

1 name and cover charge endorsement.

2 In addition, there was an assault,  
3 which I received a police report that is dated  
4 on Sunday, November 22, 2009. A large  
5 altercation took place between the security  
6 members of Current Sushi and a group of males.

7 From my investigation, I  
8 interviewed a witness who observed the  
9 incident. And I spoke with Current Sushi  
10 staff members who were present.

11 I was unable to review the  
12 security footage as the incident occurred just  
13 outside the front doors.

14 From my investigation, I was able  
15 to determine that a group of males arrived to  
16 join a patron who was already inside. They  
17 were asked to wait at the door because the  
18 establishment was at capacity. The group  
19 became upset and tried to force their way in  
20 against the security.

21 One of the males threw a line post  
22 at the front glass. MPD who was in the area

1 responded and the group fled. No arrests were  
2 made.

3 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Any  
4 questions, Board Members?

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: No.

6 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: I do.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, actually, I  
8 do, too.

9 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Yes.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Go ahead, go  
11 ahead.

12 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Thank you  
13 so much.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Sure.

15 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Since the  
16 October 25th and the October 29th interaction  
17 with the investigators, has Current or has  
18 1215 CT, LLC applied for a cover charge  
19 endorsement?

20 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Yes, Mr. Chairman.  
21 We have.

22 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: And did you

1 apply --

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: And have you  
3 applied for a trade name change?

4 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Yes, we have.

5 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Okay. Both  
6 have been granted to you?

7 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Yes, Mr. Chairman.

8 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Fantastic.  
9 And when were those approved by ABRA?

10 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Let me pull the  
11 letter in a second.

12 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: I believe  
13 it was the 15 of January.

14 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Yes.

15 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: 14.

16 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Of  
17 November?

18 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Of January,  
19 this month.

20 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Of January  
21 13. January 13 or 14.

22 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Mr. Chairman, if I

1 may? The entertainment endorsement was a few  
2 weeks prior to that. We are just waiting for  
3 DCRA to give us the okay to do the trade name  
4 change. Just for clarification.

5 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Okay. So  
6 you currently are in possession of an  
7 endorsement that allows you to charge a cover?

8 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Yes.

9 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Okay.  
10 Good. Any other questions?

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, I do.

12 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Sure, go  
13 ahead, Mr. Alberti. Yes.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Are we asking  
15 questions of the investigator or the parties?

16 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Yes. Well,  
17 based on what the investigator has stated, you  
18 can ask any questions, at this time.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Mr.  
20 Shakoor, can you tell me, I'll ask you and  
21 I'll probably go to the owners also, just how  
22 large this pub is?

1                    INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Two floors,  
2 mid-size.

3                    MEMBER ALBERTI: How big are the  
4 floors? How many patrons per floor, typically  
5 or approximately?

6                    INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: From my  
7 monitoring, most of the patrons are normally  
8 upstairs --

9                    MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

10                   INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: -- during  
11 event times, so I would say 100 to 150  
12 patrons.

13                   MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. And then  
14 there is some capacity downstairs?

15                   INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Correct.  
16 Usually during events, a few patrons go  
17 downstairs, maybe a few by the bar, but it's  
18 not really a main event at all.

19                   MEMBER ALBERTI: Do they have a  
20 security plan?

21                   INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Yes, they  
22 do.

1                   MEMBER ALBERTI: So they have a  
2 security plan.

3                   INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: A very  
4 large manual actually.

5                   MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Does the  
6 security plan address the location of cameras?

7                   INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: No, it does  
8 not.

9                   MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. I'm just  
10 going to be a little informal. I'll go to the  
11 owner, Mr. Jewayni.

12                   My concern is that you have an  
13 incident outside. Obviously, this was right  
14 at the door. If you're attracting a crowd  
15 that is going to be that large and that  
16 boisterous, I'm a little concerned that maybe  
17 we need a security camera focused on the door,  
18 if that's possible.

19                   It's for your benefit and for the  
20 Boards. If you can come in, you know in this  
21 case, showing a video these guys throwing a  
22 pole through the window, we would be going oh,

1 that answers that.

2 So you know, it's to everybody's  
3 benefit. And I know it's an extra expense,  
4 but, you know, as the Chair said things happen  
5 and you need to protect yourself and protect  
6 the citizens and that's where we're coming  
7 from.

8 So that's my concern. And maybe  
9 you might want to consider that.

10 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Absolutely. If I  
11 may, we actually had this discussion earlier  
12 today, too, and we will be adding cameras.

13 MR. JEWAYNI: Actually, we have a  
14 quote on this.

15 MR. SHIRAFKAN: We've already  
16 received a quote on pricing, so we are already  
17 in the process of actually adding that camera.

18 MR. JEWAYNI: Not only that  
19 location, but at a couple other locations  
20 also.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Great. What  
22 other locations do you have?

1 MR. JEWAYNI: It's a hallway going  
2 to the deck, because of a blind spot.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, yes. I would  
4 really, really recommend that.

5 MR. JEWAYNI: We just did a review  
6 of all the angles that we're adding on.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right. Thank  
8 you. Thank you very much.

9 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Mr. Brooks?

10 MEMBER BROOKS: Yes, thank you,  
11 Mr. Chairman.

12 Investigator Shakoor, now, I just  
13 want clarification. Has the name change been  
14 granted?

15 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: As I was  
16 told by the program manager, yes, it has.

17 MEMBER BROOKS: It has been  
18 granted.

19 INVESTIGATOR SHAKOOR: Yes.

20 MEMBER BROOKS: Okay. Thank you.

21 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Mr. Chairman? If  
22 the Board would like, I have a copy of the new

1 license with the trade name change and the  
2 entertainment endorsement.

3 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Sure. You  
4 can bring that forward if you would like.

5 MR. SHIRAFKAN: If I may?

6 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Yes. Thank  
7 you very much, sir.

8 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Thank you.

9 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: We are not  
10 going to take any further action on this. But  
11 I will say a couple of things.

12 No. 1, when I went to go to  
13 Current seven months ago, six months ago, they  
14 tried to charge me a cover charge and then  
15 they tried to charge the girl behind me a  
16 different amount. So it has been going on a  
17 long time.

18 For better or for worse, you have  
19 a Chairman that actually goes out. I mean,  
20 you don't really ever see me in the club,  
21 because I'm not really a club guy, but I go  
22 out and I have friends that go out.

1                   You know, I worked at Roxanne's  
2 before it was T.G.I. Friday's. I worked at  
3 Annie's before it was the clothing store up on  
4 Wisconsin now whatever it is. I worked at,  
5 you know, Omar's in Chicagos before it was  
6 Buffalo Billiards. I mean I lived here 17  
7 years, right?

8                   I will tell you what concerns me.  
9 Again, we are not taking any further action.  
10 You guys are going to be totally fine. It is  
11 trend and volume, right?

12                   I mean, there is just a lot of  
13 stuff happening around the club. So we've got  
14 to try to figure out a way to kind of like  
15 stop the low level noise from happening,  
16 right? Like look if you guys want to open up  
17 three places, I'll be the first one to support  
18 you. I love businesses in the District of  
19 Columbia. I love our social economy. I love  
20 our nightlife.

21                   We are getting hip. The city is,  
22 you know, growing, the population is growing,

1 it's all good and it's a good time to be a  
2 club owner if you want to be. If you're a  
3 good operator, just be careful, right?

4 We have the best investigative  
5 staff, I think, of any alcohol licensing  
6 agency probably in the country, maybe next to  
7 Las Vegas. So we are out all the time. I  
8 mean, we are going to find things. It's  
9 inevitable that we don't, there's just so many  
10 of us.

11 So if you could do a better job of  
12 trying to keep this low level noise from  
13 happening, then the big thing will never  
14 happen and then you will never be here and we  
15 wouldn't have to talk to you guys, even though  
16 I like your new counsel.

17 But go have a great day. All  
18 right. Thanks.

19 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Thank you, Mr.  
20 Chairman.

21 MR. JEWAYNI: Thanks.

22 ACTING CHAIR BRODSKY: Thanks,

1 guys. You're welcome.

2 (Whereupon, the Fact-Finding  
3 Hearing in the above entitled matter was  
4 concluded at 11:44 a.m.)

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
