**ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR EXCEPTION
TO SINGLE SALE RESTRICTION**

This matter comes before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) on an Application for an Exception to Single Sales Restriction (Single Sales Application) filed November 23, 2016, by Travel Traders Retail, Inc., t/a Travel Traders (Applicant), for the premises located at 400 New Jersey B, Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

Pursuant to the D.C. Official Code § 25-346(e)(2)(C) one of the factors for consideration by the Board in granting a Single Sales Application is "the absence or presence of any primary or secondary tier violations within the 12 months immediately preceding the date of application, including sales to minors, use of premises for unlawful purposes, or sale to persons without a valid identification."


The Board takes administrative notice that on September 28, 2016, the Board adjudicated Case No. 16-CC-00111 against the Applicant for a Sale to Minor violation on July 22, 2016. The Board's resolution of the case was to issue a Letter of Warning for the two violations listed in the Investigative Report No. 16-CC-00111. Specifically, the Board warned the Applicant to not commit another Sale to Minor violation and to Take Reasonable Steps to Ascertain Legal Age violation. *Licensing File No. ABRA-080595, Investigative History; Investigative Report No. 16-CC-00111; Warning Letter dated October 5, 2016.*

The two violations remain as part of the Applicant's Investigative History and are recorded with an effective adjudicated date of September 28, 2016. As such, the Board denies the Application for an Exception to Single Sales Restriction because the Applicant has two (2) primary tier violations within twelve (12) months immediately preceding the date of the Single Sales Application. *D.C. Official Code § 25-346(c)(2)(C).*

Accordingly, it is this 14th day of December, 2016, **ORDERED** that the Application filed by Travel Traders Retail, Inc., t/a Travel Traders, for an Exception to Single Sales Restriction at the location 400 New Jersey B, Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., is **DENIED**.







Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
