


ORDER VACATING BOARD ORDER NO. 2014-218


The Application filed by Beg Investments, LLC, t/a Twelve Restaurant & Lounge, for renewal of his Retailer's Class CT License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on April 21, 2014, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001). In Board Order No. 2014-218, the Board canceled the license based on the licensee's failure to appear at a required hearing and failed to file for reinstatement. The Board now **VACATES** Board Order No. 2014-218 and orders ABRA's Licensing Division to process the new renewal application filed by the Applicant. Therefore, on this 21st day of May 2014, the Board hereby permits the licensee to resume operations in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-315(c).



Pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 (April 2004), any Party adversely affected by this Order may file a Motion for Reconsideration within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 500 Indiana Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433, stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b).
