CONSOLIDATED ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION


This Order consolidates the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board's decision to deny the Motion for Reconsiderations filed by the Group of at least Five or More Residents and Property Owners in Case Numbers 16-PRO-00024, 16-PRO-00023, and 16-PRO-00029 because the Motion in each case involves similar facts and issues.


In Board Order Nos. 2016-324, 2016-323, and 2016-325, the Board dismissed the Group of Six for failing to sign the protest petition as required by the regulations. The Group now requests reinstatement; however, the Board is persuaded by the Applicants in this case that granting the request is contrary to the Board's precedent.


ORDER

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
