3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Wolf?

4 MR. WOLF: Yes.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good. All  
6 right. So our second Fact-Finding of this  
7 morning is with respect to Mr. Wolf's application  
8 for a manager's license.

9 Would you identify yourself for the  
10 record?

11 MR. WOLF: Sean Wolf.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So  
13 periodically we ask an applicant to come in when  
14 we have reviewed the application and we have some  
15 questions to help us decide --

16 MR. WOLF: Yes, ma'am.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- you know, and  
18 understand the applicant better.

19 MR. WOLF: Okay.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right. I'm  
21 not going to start off with the questioning  
22 though. I think, Mr. Alberti, did you want to?

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, I will.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just bear with me  
4 here. I'm trying to go back and see. Okay. So  
5 good morning, Mr. Wolf.

6 MR. WOLF: Good morning.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: You know, we bring  
8 everyone in who has had a record of offenses in  
9 the recent past.

10 MR. WOLF: Understood.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Because it's a major  
12 responsibility managing the service of alcohol.

13 MR. WOLF: I understand.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Some people take it  
15 lightly, but it's very, very serious to us.

16 MR. WOLF: Yes, sir.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. And so correct  
18 me if I have this wrong, all right? But I'm  
19 looking back at your record and in 2007 you were  
20 arrested and convicted of public drunkenness. Is  
21 that correct?

22 MR. WOLF: 2007?

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: 2007.

2 MR. WOLF: I was. Yes, that is  
3 correct. The -- I was under 21 at the time. I  
4 was 18 years-old and I was at a party. I wasn't  
5 over the legal limit, but because I had consumed  
6 alcohol, that's what they charged me with. I had  
7 to go spend the night in jail from the party.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

9 MR. WOLF: And I just paid a fine. I  
10 never went back or had court or anything. It was  
11 like a pre -- payable fine.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. And you were  
13 18, at that time?

14 MR. WOLF: I was 18, young and stupid.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Glad you  
16 recognize that. And then in 2008, you were  
17 probably 19, but you were driving on a suspended  
18 license?

19 MR. WOLF: Yes, sir.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Why was your license  
21 suspended?

22 MR. WOLF: It was -- I think it was a

1 traffic ticket. This is me remembering back. My  
2 license has been off and on suspended. I don't  
3 drive any more. I have given it up because it  
4 has always caused me problems. Just basically,  
5 it was a fine that I didn't have the money to  
6 pay, so my license was suspended.

7 And I decided to drive anyways. Of  
8 course, I was pulled over and then after the  
9 first one, they kept suspending it and it has  
10 gone on and on. I have since sold my car and I  
11 take public transportation.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Because you continued  
13 to drive without a license?

14 MR. WOLF: I just didn't get it  
15 through my head. And it took me too long to get  
16 it. I mean, it is now, but I had that battle  
17 back and forth with Fairfax County. I have never  
18 actually been in trouble really except for my  
19 driving. So I have given it up.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: So how many years did  
21 that continue?

22 MR. WOLF: Probably four years. I

1 mean, not -- no, it's not all time. You know, I  
2 would get it straightened out. I would have a  
3 license. And then something would happen and I  
4 would lose it and I would continue to drive.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, what would  
6 happen? I mean, suspending a license just  
7 doesn't -- you know, a traffic ticket just  
8 doesn't do it. What would happen?

9 MR. WOLF: No, it's if you don't pay  
10 the traffic tickets on time, they suspend your  
11 license. And it's just --

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Exactly, right.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: So were you employed  
15 during those years?

16 MR. WOLF: Yes. Most -- off and on,  
17 yes. I was also going to school.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. You were  
19 going to school?

20 MR. WOLF: Well, I was going to --  
21 yes, I was going to school. And I was -- but I  
22 was employed as well. Mostly just waiting tables

1 part-time, just trying to keep a little cash  
2 through my --

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: So what's the state  
4 of your education?

5 MR. WOLF: Continual.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: What school?  
7 Continual?

8 MR. WOLF: Continuous. I'm in the  
9 process of getting my MBA from Westwood College  
10 in Alexandria.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

12 MR. WOLF: I am not right now  
13 enrolled. I have about 15, 20 credits to finish  
14 up. I will. I will finish it up, but I've been  
15 working as a manager for the past -- since August  
16 1, 2014 and, you know, 60 hour work weeks. And  
17 it's not much time for anything else.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: And where do you  
19 work?

20 MR. WOLF: I'm a manager at Passion.  
21 District Commons Restaurant in GW. It's a member  
22 of Passion Food Hospitality.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

2 MR. WOLF: They have seven properties  
3 in Washington.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Well, that  
5 brings me now to 2012. You had a license, I  
6 guess, when you were arrested for DWI?

7 MR. WOLF: That's when I lost it, yes.  
8 And that was -- that is kind of when I realized  
9 the severity.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: How did that come  
11 about? How did that come about?

12 MR. WOLF: It was actually I was  
13 bartending, at the time. I was I guess hired to  
14 -- a friend of mine was having a Christmas party,  
15 a pretty lavish party and -- at Crosspointe,  
16 which is in Fairfax County, a really nice area.  
17 And he turned his basement, basically, into a  
18 little party room. He had a bar and he paid me a  
19 little bit of money to bartend there.

20 After the party was over, we stuck  
21 around and I wasn't planning on drinking at all  
22 that night. I thought I was working. I didn't

1 realize that I was part of the party. And then  
2 at the end, he just -- you know, we started  
3 drinking some champagne and I didn't realize that  
4 I was as intoxicated as I was when I drove home.

5 I paid the price for it pretty  
6 heavily. I have completed everything that  
7 Fairfax has asked me to do, which was a little  
8 community service. I had to do alcohol safety  
9 action program, which was 10 weeks, one hour a  
10 week.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

12 MR. WOLF: And I learned my lesson.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: So did they give you  
14 a breathalyzer or blood test? How did they  
15 determine the level?

16 MR. WOLF: They -- well, they gave me  
17 a breathalyzer test there and then they actually  
18 took me to do another one at the station.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Do you remember what  
20 the level was?

21 MR. WOLF: It was almost 2 percent,  
22 1.8, I think.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. .18?

2 MR. WOLF: Yes. Point -- yes.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, let's hope it's  
4 .18, because otherwise you would be dead.

5 MR. WOLF: Yes, right, right.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: No, I understand what  
7 you are saying. But I shouldn't make light of  
8 that, because that's more than just a couple of  
9 glasses of champagne. That's pretty --

10 MR. WOLF: That was some shots.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Pardon?

12 MR. WOLF: That was taking shots.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, okay, yes,  
14 that's substantial.

15 MR. WOLF: I understand.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

17 MR. WOLF: And I'm sorry, I don't take  
18 light of that situation.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: No, I mean, you -- I  
20 didn't say you were. I was making light of it.

21 MR. WOLF: Okay. I would never put  
22 myself in that situation again.

1                   MEMBER ALBERTI: I understand. Okay.  
2                   What have you learned?

3                   MR. WOLF: Well, you know, part of the  
4                   Alcohol Safety Action Program is they show you a  
5                   lot of videos. Mostly they are -- what I saw was  
6                   commercials from other countries. I guess their  
7                   TV Laws are different and they can be a little  
8                   bit more graphic. And they show, you know, the  
9                   true cause of, you know, when you think you are  
10                  having a good time, but if you get behind the  
11                  wheel, it -- the potential that could happen it's  
12                  tremendous.

13                  And the one that really got me because  
14                  I have a daughter and she is 8 years-old. She  
15                  actually was just accepted into an advanced  
16                  academic program in Fairfax County. She is doing  
17                  -- for third grade is when it starts. But one of  
18                  the commercials that really hit me was there was  
19                  a family playing in their backyard and they had  
20                  really high bushes for a gate. And all of a  
21                  sudden a car came crashing through the gate and  
22                  killed the little girl.

1                   And that kind of hit home for me. And  
2                   it really sunk in there.

3                   MEMBER ALBERTI: So your daughter was  
4                   born when you --

5                   MR. WOLF: When I was -- I had just  
6                   turned 18.

7                   MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

8                   MR. WOLF: I turned 18. A week later  
9                   the Steelers won the Superbowl and a week later  
10                  my daughter was born. It was the best --

11                  MEMBER ALBERTI: Are you married?

12                  MR. WOLF: No. She was my high school  
13                  sweetheart and we really tried. We were just too  
14                  young.

15                  MEMBER ALBERTI: That's fine. I don't  
16                  need that history.

17                  MR. WOLF: Yes, sir.

18                  MEMBER ALBERTI: I just want to know  
19                  what your marital status is.

20                  MR. WOLF: Single.

21                  MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. And do  
22                  you have custody or visitation with your

1 daughter?

2 MR. WOLF: We have never gone to have  
3 it legally worked out. We just work it out  
4 ourselves. We are on really good terms. She is  
5 with me two days a week when I am not working.  
6 And because my schedule is flexible, I can -- her  
7 mom is okay with me picking her up whichever two  
8 days I have, so it works out better for  
9 everybody.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Whereabouts do  
11 you live? I think your address is here.

12 MR. WOLF: 7433 Beulah Street,  
13 Alexandria.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: What street?

15 MR. WOLF: Beulah.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: Beulah Street?

17 MR. WOLF: Yes, sir.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: So that's pretty far  
19 south then down by Landmark?

20 MR. WOLF: It's -- oh, it's actually  
21 past that. Franconia Springfield is the Metro I  
22 use.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So you have  
2 access to the Metro?

3 MR. WOLF: I have to, yes, sir.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

5 MR. WOLF: I actually walk. It's --  
6 my house is about 10 minutes from the Metro  
7 walking, so it's easy for me to commute without a  
8 vehicle.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Thank you very  
10 much.

11 MR. WOLF: You're welcome.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: I have no further  
13 questions.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Other questions?  
15 I just want to confirm with you that you haven't  
16 had any other incidents with alcohol since 2012,  
17 have you?

18 MR. WOLF: No. I haven't been in any  
19 trouble.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Anything  
21 else you want to say to us?

22 MR. WOLF: I just really hope that you

1 rule in favor, because I'm working now. I mean,  
2 I am a manager, but because I don't have my ABC  
3 License, I'm not allowed to open or close the  
4 restaurant. I can't be the only manager there  
5 and it has just put a real strain on everybody  
6 else. I just kind of want to pull my weight.  
7 That's all.

8 MEMBER SHORT: Madam Chair?

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, Mr. Short?

10 MEMBER SHORT: Good morning, sir. How  
11 are you?

12 MR. WOLF: Good morning.

13 MEMBER SHORT: I'm glad you took those  
14 classes and you saw what a drunk driver can do,  
15 how devastating it is.

16 MR. WOLF: It is.

17 MEMBER SHORT: And you saw somebody  
18 else's kid get killed.

19 MR. WOLF: Yes.

20 MEMBER SHORT: And you said that the  
21 night that you were working for a friend in his  
22 basement, you were working as a bartender.

1 MR. WOLF: Yes, sir.

2 MEMBER SHORT: And now you want a  
3 permit to bartend here in Washington, D.C. Is  
4 that correct?

5 MR. WOLF: To manage a restaurant for  
6 -- I'm not going to be behind the bar. I  
7 wouldn't be applying -- I am not a bar manager.  
8 I'm going to be managing the dining room service,  
9 but it is a lot of alcohol in the building. I  
10 don't have a problem with alcohol, if that's  
11 where you are going with this. I mean, I really  
12 -- I very rarely drink. I just --

13 MEMBER SHORT: It just so happened  
14 that night that you got arrested that you did  
15 have a drink that night?

16 MR. WOLF: Yes.

17 MEMBER SHORT: Have you had a drink  
18 since that time?

19 MR. WOLF: I have.

20 MEMBER SHORT: You have?

21 MR. WOLF: Yes, sir. But I have never  
22 gotten behind the wheel of a car and I haven't

1       been excessively drinking. But you know, for  
2       Thanksgiving I had wine with my family.

3               MEMBER SHORT: And also your permit to  
4       drive was taken away from you?

5               MR. WOLF: It was for a period --

6               MEMBER SHORT: And yet you still  
7       drove?

8               MR. WOLF: That's correct.

9               MEMBER SHORT: No further questions,  
10      Madam Chair. Thank you very much, sir.

11              CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay, I think  
12      we are almost finished, but could you remind me  
13      why you drove on your suspended license?

14              MR. WOLF: It was a mistake that I  
15      realize now. But to be honest, at the time, I  
16      was going through a breakup. I was going to pick  
17      up my paycheck from -- at the time I was working  
18      at Le Diplomate. And I was going to get my  
19      paycheck and I couldn't wait. Well, I could  
20      have, I should have waited, but I decided not to  
21      do it, because I wanted to get a U-Haul truck and  
22      move out of the house that I was living at.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.

2 MR. WOLF: It was a bad mistake.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And this  
4 suspension was not related to drinking. It was  
5 related to non-payment?

6 MR. WOLF: Non-payment of the fines.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Fines. Okay.

8 All right.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Can I just --

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes?

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: I'm sorry, Mr. Wolf,  
12 but I just got a comment. So you were going to  
13 pick up a U-Haul truck, but you had a suspended  
14 license.

15 MR. WOLF: Well, I was going to get  
16 the money for the U-Haul truck. My aunt was  
17 going to help me.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

19 MR. WOLF: She was going to drive the  
20 truck.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. All  
22 right. I just hope that you have -- I'm going to

1 vote in favor of -- I would approve your license.

2 All right. That's my opinion. All right.

3 However, I just hope that you have matured since  
4 then. All right. I think there are signs that  
5 I'm getting that you have matured since you were  
6 18 years-old.

7 MR. WOLF: Right.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: But I'm going to keep  
9 my fingers crossed, because I think that that's  
10 what the issue is here. You just need to be more  
11 cognizant of what your actions are and the  
12 repercussions of your actions.

13 MR. WOLF: Thank you. And I just  
14 wanted to say also since I started working as a  
15 floor manager, it was August 1, 2001, I've done a  
16 lot of other things. Not necessarily -- I  
17 haven't completely quit drinking, because I  
18 haven't seen that I had a problem with it. Like  
19 I would be able to have a beer after work with a  
20 friend or something like that and then go home.

21 But you know, aside from that, I have  
22 been exercising a lot more. I jog before I go to

1 work and a couple of times a week, two or three  
2 times a week, I go to the gym and actually work  
3 out. I feel great.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. Thank you  
5 for that.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any other  
7 questions? Okay.

8 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Oh, Madam Chair?

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, Mr.  
10 Rodriguez?

11 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. Mr. Wolf,  
12 yes, I think that this should make you more aware  
13 of your customers and that's the key here. If  
14 you are a manager of the liquor that is being  
15 served, then the key is your awareness of your  
16 customers. And are they able to drive safely and  
17 the kids out there, right?

18 MR. WOLF: Absolutely.

19 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Right. Right?

20 MR. WOLF: Yes, sir.

21 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: And obviously,  
22 keeping the job is very important if you are

1 raising a family.

2 MR. WOLF: Very. Yes, sir.

3 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Right?

4 MR. WOLF: Yes, sir.

5 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Okay. That's all  
6 I want to say on that.

7 MR. WOLF: Okay. My restaurant is in  
8 GW, basically, on campus almost, so we get a lot  
9 of people that are trying to drink on a fake ID.  
10 So we are very vigilant and maybe the fact that I  
11 have gone through this on the short end of the  
12 stick helps me realize how serious it is.

13 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: We're very  
14 concerned about that, that's why you are here.

15 MR. WOLF: Thank you.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Anything  
17 else? Okay. Then I'm going to make a motion  
18 that we approve Mr. Wolf's Manager's License  
19 based on the responses that we have gotten today,  
20 that I think are very enlightening with respect  
21 to the different offenses and where he is today.

22 I am convinced, at this point, you

1 haven't had any incident within three years and  
2 you have at least the first couple were when you  
3 were very young, and I'm also convinced that you  
4 have learned a lot and can use this experience to  
5 help you with respect to dealing with others who  
6 are drinking.

7 MR. WOLF: Thank you.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So I hope I'm not  
9 disappointed, but I don't think I will be.

10 MR. WOLF: You won't be.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All right. Then  
12 there is a motion to approve. Is there a second?

13 MEMBER BROOKS: Second.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Brooks has  
15 seconded the motion.

16 All those in favor say aye.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Aye.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Aye.

19 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Aye.

20 MEMBER BROOKS: Aye.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those  
22 opposed? All those abstaining?

1 MEMBER SHORT: Opposed.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Then the motion  
3 passes 4-1-0. Okay.

4 MR. WOLF: Thank you.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So one  
6 minute.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, you can actually  
8 go to the front desk and get your license.

9 MR. WOLF: Thank you.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: I mean the paperwork  
11 will take a moment to get there, but you can do  
12 that today.

13 MR. WOLF: Okay. I appreciate it.  
14 Thank you.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: You're welcome. Good  
16 luck. Don't disappoint us.

17 MR. WOLF: You won't be disappointed,  
18 sir.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Sir? Oh,  
20 you told him?

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: I told him. He is  
22 going to the front office and we'll just sign it.
