 Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street, N.W.,
 Suite 400S, Washington, D.C. 20009, Chairperson
 Ruthanne Miller, presiding.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. We
4 are running just a little bit behind, Mr.
5 Fonseca. I was confused. I apologize. We will
6 be with you shortly. Okay.

7 So our next order of business is --
8 they threw me a curve on our schedule, I
9 apologize, I have to blame somebody.

10 The next order of business is a Fact-
11 Finding for a pub crawl. The event is March 4,
12 2015. And the event is GoCrawling -- well,
13 Paddy's Boozer Day, I think sponsored by
14 GoCrawling.com.

15 So the parties are here. Can I have
16 introductions, please?

17 MR. FALL: Sure. Albert Fall.

18 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. And
19 with you today?

20 MR. FALL: Yes, he is my partner.

21 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And does he
22 have a name?

1 MR. FALL: Yes.

2 MR. DORMEUS: Ricardo Dormeus.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: I'm sorry,
4 I didn't hear it.

5 MR. DORMEUS: Ricardo Dormeus.

6 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Dormeus.
7 Okay. Thank you.

8 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Investigator
9 Dorshae Demby with ABRA.

10 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.
11 Welcome, gentlemen. Thank you for being here,
12 Mr. Demby.

13 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Thank you.

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. So we
15 have a pub crawl application before us. It is
16 March 4, 2015.

17 MR. FALL: And actually, the event is
18 March 14th.

19 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: March 14,
20 2015. Okay. If I misread it, that's what we
21 have in our record.

22 MR. FALL: Thank you very much.

1 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. So--

2 MR. FALL: I also have a few copies of
3 the documents. You guys need it or --

4 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: I think we
5 have them as part of the -- were these submitted
6 with the license application?

7 MR. FALL: Yes. There were just a few
8 actual documents added, an example of our sales
9 page, which states you have to be 21 and over to
10 participate.

11 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Yes, I don't
12 think -- you can -- well, Ms. Jenkins will get
13 them from you and you can start whenever you are
14 ready.

15 MR. FALL: I only have five copies,
16 unfortunately. I thought there was going to be
17 five of you guys today, so --

18 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Just one
19 moment, please. Okay. Proceed, gentlemen. Go
20 ahead.

21 MR. FALL: I'm sorry?

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Go ahead and

1 proceed.

2 MR. FALL: Oh.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Why don't
4 you give us sort of an overview of what your
5 plans are.

6 MR. FALL: Well --

7 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: What we
8 really are interested in is, you know, who is
9 going to participate in terms of establishments.
10 How many people? And what sort of security
11 measures you may have taken --

12 MR. FALL: Sure.

13 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: -- going to
14 the clubs.

15 MR. FALL: We submitted the same
16 security plans as we always do with all of our
17 events, including this last one we just did for
18 Valentine's Day and it was on February 14th.

19 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

20 MR. FALL: At Valentine's. So it is
21 pretty much a similar security plan. We're
22 expecting -- you know, we put 3,000. We don't --

1 we haven't reached that number yet, but it's just
2 something that we have and we are heading
3 towards --

4 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

5 MR. FALL: -- hopefully some day. So
6 the first three pages just sort of overview our
7 security plan. Like I said, which is very
8 similar.

9 The fourth page is the participating
10 venues. We are looking at 10 venues as of right
11 now. We just have 15 listed just in case some
12 drop out. We had an issue with our past events
13 and we ended up having less than we anticipated.

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

15 MR. FALL: The fifth page states our
16 check-in venues, which are three venues, almost
17 at every block, so we can spread the crowd
18 evenly. So that would be Jin Lounge, which is
19 right up here on 14th and U, Ben's Next Door and
20 then Tap & Parlour, which is on 11th and U, I
21 believe.

22 The sixth page is just a map or review

1 of the participating establishments, just so you
2 can get a visual idea of where the venues are.

3 You will see our contract following
4 that. It states our drink specials, a clause for
5 all the venue staff, security personnel for each
6 50 patrons in the establishments. We also
7 encourage our participating establishments to
8 sell food as well, so we can balance out the
9 alcohol consumption.

10 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Great.

11 MR. FALL: The following page is --
12 actually, we just signed up a Jumbo Pizza place
13 on U Street, again, so we can introduce more food
14 into the mix.

15 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Yes.

16 MR. FALL: And you will see the
17 contract there as well.

18 The following page is a letter to the
19 3rd District Station. We always keep them
20 informed of our venues that are participating in
21 the event taking place. And we -- our contact
22 has been Officer Scott Gerhardt and Lieutenant

1 Jonathan, I believe.

2 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

3 Great.

4 MR. FALL: So they are going to inform
5 -- they have both replied back saying okay.

6 The following two pages are just
7 examples of our sales page, again, stating that
8 you need to be 21 or over in order to participate
9 and it has been highlighted and circled. I don't
10 know if you guys see it or not?

11 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

12 MR. FALL: And the second to the last
13 page is a sample of our wristbands, which we
14 issue out to our participants. We also have a
15 driver wristband for people who don't drink, so
16 we give them a wristband for that as well and
17 they get free sodas and free waters.

18 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

19 Great.

20 MR. FALL: And the last is just the
21 alcohol safe practices and healthy decisions
22 which we email to the venues and also our

1 participants before the event.

2 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. I'm
3 going to ask you several questions in no
4 particular order.

5 MR. FALL: Sure.

6 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: So do the
7 participants get drink and food specials?

8 MR. FALL: Yes, they do, yes. All the
9 venues that are restaurants, lounges that offer
10 food, we actually recommend that they offer two
11 specials, two food specials.

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. And
13 what are the drink specials? Is it standard or
14 is it different by --

15 MR. FALL: It's standard, similar to
16 what we did in February as far as pricing. \$3
17 beers, \$4 mixed drinks and \$5 shots.

18 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

19 MR. FALL: The shots are always priced
20 a bit higher, so people don't over-indulge on
21 them.

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: That's a

1 good thing, that's a good thing. Now, will you
2 have more than 10 establishments if they want to
3 participate?

4 MR. FALL: We actually want to stop at
5 10. We just have 15 listed --

6 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Yes.

7 MR. FALL: -- that way we can have a
8 backup plan in case someone pulls out, which is
9 what happened this past event that we had.

10 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. I'm
11 going to come back to that in a moment, but so
12 every participant goes to one of the three check-
13 in places?

14 MR. FALL: Check-in, yes, exactly.

15 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And you can
16 either -- can these people preregister?
17 Obviously, you said that the preregister --

18 MR. FALL: Yes, you have to buy
19 tickets on-line. What happens is they will buy a
20 ticket on-line. They will choose the location
21 they want to register in and check-in. And we
22 are limiting, we are capping those venues to a

1 specific amount each venue. Once they show up
2 there, you have to -- they are checked by
3 security at the front door.

4 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Yes.

5 MR. FALL: The security that is -- the
6 venue security, of course. And then we double
7 check their ID and then they fill out a
8 registration thing, which is pretty much a
9 liability --

10 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

11 MR. FALL: -- contract.

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And the
13 price range is?

14 MR. FALL: It starts at \$10 and goes
15 up as high as \$20.

16 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. And
17 the only thing they get -- that is access to the
18 drink specials?

19 MR. FALL: Yes, access to the --

20 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Do they get
21 anything else?

22 MR. FALL: -- drink specials, the food

1 specials and now we have added a pizza place as
2 well.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. So
4 that's all they get for their --

5 MR. FALL: Yes.

6 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.
7 Great. I haven't looked over this. Do you have
8 a contact number for participants to call if they
9 need --

10 MR. FALL: Yes. It's actually listed
11 on our sales page and we also list it as well on
12 the map. The map is not ready yet, but the event
13 map which features --

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

15 MR. FALL: -- every establishment has
16 our phone number and our email.

17 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And who --
18 so how many volunteers or people are you going to
19 have working from your organization?

20 MR. FALL: We have eight including
21 myself and Ricardo.

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: How many?

1 MR. DORMEUS: 10.

2 MR. FALL: 10 people altogether.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. And
4 who is going to be central for -- I assume you
5 are going to get calls. You are going to have a
6 number that establishments can call in case they
7 need to notify you.

8 MR. FALL: Yes, that will be me or
9 Ricardo. It's a general number that gets
10 forwarded to either me or him. So if I don't
11 pick up, he will pick up.

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. Very
13 good. And have you checked with our Investigator
14 as to whose -- about the eligibility of all these
15 places?

16 MR. FALL: Actually, I haven't. I was
17 supposed to be scheduled, I think, at 5:00 today
18 and before that it was supposed to be next month,
19 but I wanted something earlier, so I can check in
20 with you guys and see what we need to adjust.

21 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. Okay.
22 If we approve this, it will be approved

1 contingent upon --

2 MR. FALL: The venues?

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: -- all these
4 venues being -- knowing which -- and you have to
5 give us at least a week lead time in telling us
6 what the venues are.

7 MR. FALL: Okay. That's fine, yes.

8 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And allowing
9 us to approve them. So all right, so just
10 putting that out there.

11 MR. FALL: Thank you.

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Before I go
13 to -- I have one other matter before I go to the
14 Board, so Investigator Demby?

15 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Sir?

16 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: I want to
17 come back to you later, but I have a question for
18 you right now.

19 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Okay.

20 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Tap &
21 Parlour, are they eligible off the top of your
22 head?

1 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Yes. Everybody
2 that was presented on the first list that they
3 gave us, he has two new ones on there, everyone
4 else is eligible to participate.

5 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.
6 Great. I thought there was some issue with that
7 establishment, but I might be mixing them up with
8 someone else. So I apologize for that. Okay.
9 Other Board Members questions?

10 MEMBER SHORT: I did have one.

11 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Mr. Short?

12 MEMBER SHORT: I do remember the last
13 time you were here.

14 MR. FALL: Yes.

15 MEMBER SHORT: And you gave us a
16 number. How many people did you eventually get
17 at that?

18 MR. FALL: Less than 700. So it was
19 way less. We did actually reach out to Scott
20 Herman, which is case MPD Security and told him
21 the same thing. If we need them, we will get in
22 touch with them two weeks prior to the event. So

1 I reached out to him already. I just didn't
2 include the email in here, because I didn't get a
3 chance to. I just printed this out just right
4 now before I walked in here.

5 MEMBER SHORT: How did the hours work
6 out for you at the last one?

7 MR. FALL: How many? I'm sorry.

8 MEMBER SHORT: How did your hours, the
9 hours --

10 MR. FALL: Oh, it worked out pretty
11 well. I think most people showed up after 2:00.
12 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. is when people checked in and
13 it was snowing that day. I don't know if you
14 guys remember or not. It was a pretty bad snow
15 storm. So I think it started getting quiet
16 around 9:00 or so. 9:00 or 10:00.

17 MEMBER SHORT: And you ended at 10:00,
18 correct?

19 MR. FALL: We ended at 10:00, of
20 course, yes.

21 MEMBER SHORT: And I mean, did that
22 work? We would --

1 MR. FALL: It worked out pretty well.
2 Yes, I would say it worked out pretty well. I
3 think 10:00 is a good time because it gives also
4 the establishment about an hour break for them to
5 get their regular crowd as well.

6 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. That's the kind
7 of feedback I have been trying to wait to hear.

8 MR. FALL: I think 10:00 is a good
9 time, yes, especially for the weekends, Saturday.

10 MEMBER SHORT: Thank you very much.

11 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Other Board
12 Members? Mr. Silverstein?

13 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I just wish you
14 guys good luck and I'm sure this will be fine.

15 MR. FALL: Thank you.

16 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: But I have a
17 couple of words here on behalf of some members of
18 my family whose first names are Shannon, Fiona,
19 Garrett, Kelly and Erin, who spells her name E-R-
20 I-N, as in Ireland. That part of our family came
21 here on what had been slave ships in 1946 because
22 the slave trade was ended with Britain in 1833.

1 And when the Irish were starving to death, those
2 ships were brought into service to bring them.
3 They were often called coffin ships, because they
4 were starving and there was one ship that had
5 four people who survived the trip.

6 The Irish have very thick skin and
7 great humor.

8 MR. FALL: I believe that.

9 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: And they are
10 very, very proud of their history. But we have
11 to be -- I'm not into political correctness, but
12 we want to be kind to all ethnic groups. And I
13 just have a little queasiness about Paddy's
14 Boozer Day. I think that we could find a better
15 way in the future to do so. I wish you guys good
16 and great luck.

17 MR. FALL: We are open to that. It's
18 just --

19 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I wish you guys
20 good and great luck, but I think that some people
21 -- you know the joke the world was waiting for us
22 over Irishmen from the Simpsons and they take a

1 lot of beating.

2 MR. FALL: We will keep that in mind.

3 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Please next year
4 if we can find some other way to do it.

5 MR. FALL: For this one it's too late,
6 but I have to give you the heads up since we have
7 been marketing it for about two weeks now under
8 that name, so switching it right now is going to
9 confuse everyone. But we will keep that in mind,
10 of course, yes.

11 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: This is the
12 nation's capital, so --

13 MR. FALL: Yes, of course.

14 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Of course.

15 MR. DORMEUS: It's partly my fault
16 because I kind of put it out there. It's
17 supposed to stand for Paddy's Pub Day.

18 MR. FALL: Boozer is probably a slang
19 term for pub.

20 MR. DORMEUS: For pub.

21 MR. FALL: And I'm not sure if it's
22 not Irish.

1 MR. DORMEUS: Since this is a pub
2 crawl, we decided to go with boozier. Americans
3 might think it's something else.

4 MR. FALL: Yes.

5 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Who uses the
6 name boozier?

7 MR. DORMEUS: Boozier is the slang word
8 for -- Irish slang word for pub.

9 MR. FALL: Irish slang word for pub.

10 MR. DORMEUS: And since it's a pub
11 crawl, I thought it was perfect.

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Oh, okay.

13 MR. FALL: But it's like the Irish--

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Like the
15 Irish use the word crack for a good time. Have a
16 good crack.

17 MR. DORMEUS: It actually stands for
18 Paddy's Pub Day, but --

19 MR. FALL: Yes.

20 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Oh, okay.

21 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: All right.

22 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: So that's wicked

1 smart.

2 MR. FALL: Yes.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: We digress.

4 Thank you.

5 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Thank you very

6 much. Good luck.

7 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Thank you

8 for that message, Mr. Silverstein.

9 MR. DORMEUS: When we find a day that
10 everyone will know the day of, so they don't get
11 any --

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

13 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Some might take
14 it --

15 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Right.

16 MR. FALL: No problem.

17 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: But thank you.

18 MR. FALL: Thank you for the
19 suggestion.

20 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Thank you. Good
21 luck.

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Thank you

1 for those words of wisdom, Mr. Silverstein. And
2 the bit of humor.

3 All right. So, Investigator Demby, do
4 you have anything? Questions you would like to
5 ask or anything like that?

6 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Just a few. On
7 the Memorandum of Agreement No. 5 --

8 MR. FALL: Yes.

9 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: -- are you
10 familiar with it?

11 MR. FALL: Yes, very familiar with
12 that.

13 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Okay. It says
14 that "GoCrawling.com to publicize, promote and
15 advertise the event inside your pub, bar,
16 nightclub, lounge or restaurant, social media
17 outlets."

18 MR. FALL: Yes.

19 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: When it comes to
20 promoting and advertising inside of the
21 establishments, exactly what do you mean or what
22 have you done here?

1 MR. FALL: We put up acrylic. We will
2 try something new. For this one we are doing
3 tents, like putting up tents. Each side has the
4 flyer and it says what the event is just in case
5 the venues want to tell their customers that
6 there is an event going on.

7 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Are you putting
8 any advertisements on windows inside of the
9 establishment?

10 MR. FALL: We might put up some. We
11 normally -- we have put up posters before with my
12 previous company inside the restrooms, but not on
13 the windows.

14 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Not on the
15 windows?

16 MR. FALL: Not on the windows.
17 Absolutely not, no. We try not to do that, no.
18 It's not good looking for the venue either.

19 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Well, outside of
20 that some of them are forbidden by their
21 settlement agreements.

22 MR. FALL: Good to know.

1 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: One last
2 question. At the bottom of that same document--

3 MR. FALL: Sure.

4 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: -- it says "It is
5 hereby understood that GoCrawling.com will not be
6 serving any alcohol during the event.

7 GoCrawling.com is hereby held harmless with an
8 alcohol-related incidents during the event." So
9 this is your event, right?

10 MR. FALL: Yes.

11 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: So I just want to
12 understand exactly where their responsibility
13 starts and stops in relation to events that may
14 occur with participants of your event.

15 MR. FALL: Okay. Well, as you can
16 see, if you have the whole contract, the venues
17 are required to have security on staff.

18 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Okay.

19 MR. FALL: Which I believe is 50 --
20 for every 50 patrons one security personnel at
21 least.

22 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Yes.

1 MR. FALL: From my understanding. So
2 our responsibility is to make sure everyone that
3 comes into the venue gets checked by the venue
4 security before they even get to us. Once they
5 get to us, we double check their ID. Check them
6 in and then they find also that it's not on the
7 contract, which is a liability.

8 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Okay. So is it
9 understood by you that because this is your
10 event, if say, for example, over-consumption
11 occurs by somebody that was attending your event
12 that has your bracelet on, that not only will the
13 event be held liable or --

14 MR. FALL: Well, think of the --

15 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: -- will the
16 establishment be held liable?

17 MR. FALL: -- the establishment is
18 held liable for things like that.

19 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Hold on. But
20 it's your event.

21 MR. FALL: I understand that.

22 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Right? So I just

1 want to make sure that you understand that you
2 have some sort of responsibility in that as well.

3 MR. FALL: Of course, yes, right.

4 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Okay.

5 MR. FALL: Obviously, the venue has to
6 also watch the way they serve their customers.
7 We can't be there pouring the drinks for them.
8 So what we do we just send out this agreement and
9 we make sure they know about it. And also if you
10 look at the last page which is the healthy
11 choices, that also goes out to the venues as
12 well.

13 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: I understand.

14 MR. FALL: So you understand that?

15 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: I fully
16 understand that.

17 MR. FALL: I do understand what you
18 are saying about that.

19 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: I fully
20 understand that you can't pour drinks for them,
21 but any instance where we have an establishment
22 where the owner owns the venue --

1 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And then you
2 can chime in.

3 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: -- he is
4 responsible for what his bartenders pour.

5 MR. FALL: Of course.

6 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Because at the
7 end of the day, it's his thing.

8 MR. FALL: Yes.

9 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: So this is your
10 thing. And if it happens with something
11 attending your event --

12 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: I'm going to
13 interject here. So, Mr. Demby, good question. I
14 appreciate it very much.

15 I understand legally you need to have
16 this.

17 MR. FALL: Yes, of course, yes.

18 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: So in terms
19 of liability, you can deny responsibility for
20 liability in the courts, right?

21 MR. FALL: Yes.

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: But when it

1 comes to this Board --

2 MR. FALL: I understand, yes.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: -- if people
4 are over-served, there will be shared
5 responsibility with the establishment and with
6 you. And I think that's what Mr. Demby is trying
7 to get at.

8 MR. FALL: Okay. That's fine.

9 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: So that
10 everybody understands that you do some shared
11 responsibility, at least in the eyes of this
12 Board.

13 MR. FALL: Well, we do our best --

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay?

15 MR. FALL: -- to make sure that the
16 venues are not over-serving, you know. And we do
17 have a contractual agreement also can send a
18 memorandum like a week prior to the event letting
19 them know, you know, you shouldn't be over-
20 serving. Also, our prices are a little bit
21 higher than most pub crawls in the city and we do
22 that also to avoid over-consumption.

1 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. I
2 mean, you have done a good job in the past, but I
3 just --

4 MR. FALL: Thank you.

5 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: -- want to
6 make sure we understand each other.

7 MR. FALL: Of course, yes.

8 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And who is
9 responsible. Okay. Mr. Jones, do you want to
10 add something?

11 MEMBER JONES: Yes. I just want to --
12 it sounds like you get it, you understand it and
13 you comprehend it, but I'll just take a moment to
14 reflect on what you are communicating to me as an
15 individual Board Member by the nature of your
16 responses to the Investigator.

17 This is your activity. This is your
18 event. It wouldn't be taking place if you
19 weren't here asking us for permission to put it
20 on. And what I like to see in licensees and
21 people that are coming before us to ask for this
22 privilege is the desire to take ownership and

1 responsibility for all the aspects of the
2 activity that they put on and that they are
3 responsible for.

4 I clearly understand there is a legal
5 matter, a legal issue, a legal discussion that we
6 are having, which you are covering yourselves.
7 This is good CYA, right?

8 MR. FALL: Yes.

9 MEMBER JONES: I get that. But in
10 terms of how you are dialoguing with the
11 Investigator and how you work with ABRA and how
12 you work with this Board, I need to get that
13 sense from you that you feel and acknowledge and
14 recognize your responsibility to the city, to the
15 public and to this organization that you are here
16 before asking for this privilege that you own the
17 activities and the results of this activity that
18 stem from it.

19 Doing the best that you can is great,
20 but when it's all said and done, I'm looking at
21 you in your eyes and saying hey, man, I need to
22 know that you recognize that you are asking for

1 this privilege and that you own the
2 responsibility for ensuring that this is a safe
3 activity.

4 We understand mistakes happen. We
5 understand you can't be everywhere all the time,
6 but I need to know that you recognize that that
7 is what you should be trying to do, to make sure
8 that you have a successful event where nothing
9 happens, no issues. And this is really not
10 something for you to comment on. I just want you
11 to recognize what I need you to own as an
12 individual Board Member.

13 And I'm not speaking on anybody else
14 but myself, but when I hear things like that and
15 when I see the nature of your responses, and I'm
16 not saying you didn't give them attitude, you
17 weren't disrespectful or rude, but it's almost
18 like I got the impression that you weren't trying
19 to take ownership for the fact that something may
20 happen in this event.

21 And I need to know that you recognize,
22 because that's one of the issues that we have

1 collectively with these pub crawls. It's like
2 oh, yes, we do these pub crawls. It's not really
3 my event. Well, it's my event. I make some
4 money off of it, but if something bad goes down,
5 it's not on me, it's the club, they did it. I
6 don't like that. And I'm just kind of speaking
7 to you from a real standpoint, that's a concern
8 that I have and that's my reluctance with pub
9 crawls is that sense or sentiment.

10 So I don't think you meant to give off
11 that impression, but I wanted to give you fair
12 warning, that's what I was starting to get from
13 you before it got too far down that path. That's
14 all I had to say. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

15 MEMBER SHORT: I concur wholeheartedly
16 with that statement.

17 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. So
18 question on this?

19 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Well, not on --

20 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. So
21 I'll get to you --

22 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: -- Mr. Jones'

1 separate question.

2 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: -- in a
3 second. Okay. We'll let the Investigator talk
4 first. All right. So you heard, you got the
5 message?

6 MR. FALL: Yes.

7 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: You know, I
8 think it is shared -- the sentiments are shared
9 by many of us on the Board. A quick comment, if
10 you would like.

11 MR. DORMEUS: I totally agree. We
12 personally wouldn't want anything bad to happen
13 because that's also bad business on us.

14 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Yes.

15 MR. DORMEUS: Because when we -- we
16 want to be here on the long run and we don't want
17 any negative comments on any of our events, so
18 that will also effect our numbers in the future.
19 So we do want to make sure, yes, we do take
20 ownership for anything bad as far as that would
21 be happening at our events.

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: And like it

1 or not, we are holding you accountable.

2 MR. DORMEUS: Of course.

3 MR. FALL: I just wanted to say it
4 wasn't meant that way.

5 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Right. We
6 understand that.

7 MR. FALL: If you guys have
8 suggestions on how we can improve that, you know,
9 we are taking notes.

10 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: It was as
11 much advice from Mr. Jones as anything.

12 MR. FALL: Of course.

13 MR. DORMEUS: Thank you.

14 MR. FALL: Thank you. We appreciate
15 it.

16 MR. DORMEUS: Yes.

17 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: So
18 Investigator Demby, I interrupted you. Do you
19 have anything else?

20 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: No, that was all
21 I had, sir.

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: All right.

1 Thank you very much.

2 INVESTIGATOR DEMBY: Thank you.

3 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Great
4 questions. Thank you. Okay. Mr. Rodriguez?

5 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. Well, you
6 know, this will have impact on not just locals
7 but visitors, international, national and
8 regional visitors, so you know, it's a service,
9 but --

10 MR. FALL: Okay.

11 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: -- I want to ask
12 you about the participants. Did you do this last
13 year? I'm new on the Board.

14 MR. FALL: No, actually, I didn't. I
15 was with a previous company, we done a few
16 events, but we didn't do anything last year.

17 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Okay. Because I
18 just wanted to see how you got your estimates
19 between 2,000 and 3,000.

20 MR. FALL: It's just the number we
21 shoot for, something we have on the wall that we
22 look towards every event.

1 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Oh, okay.

2 MR. FALL: It's our goal, but --

3 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Okay. I was just
4 thinking maybe you did this last year and you
5 have --

6 MR. FALL: No, absolutely not, no.

7 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: That's all I have,
8 Mr. Chair.

9 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay. Thank
10 you. Any other questions from the Board? Okay.
11 So I'm going to move that we approve this pub
12 crawl application. I think we will sign it
13 today, but it is contingent upon you at least a
14 week ahead of time making sure that you review
15 all of the participants with our investigator.

16 MR. FALL: Sure.

17 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Okay.

18 MR. FALL: Thank you.

19 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: All right.
20 So that's my motion. Do I have a second?

21 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

22 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: All right.

1 Mr. Short seconded the motion.

2 All those in favor say aye.

3 ALL: Aye.

4 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: All those
5 opposed? The motion carries 6-0. And we will do
6 it today if you would like.

7 MR. FALL: Thank you very much.
8 Appreciate it.

9 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: You're
10 welcome. Good luck, guys.

11 MR. FALL: The truck will be late
12 again.

13 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Thank you
14 very much. Thank you for your cooperation.

15 MR. DORMEUS: Thank you.

16 ACTING CHAIRMAN ALBERTI: Thank you.

17 (Whereupon, the Fact-Finding Hearing
18 in the above-entitled matter was concluded at
