CHAIRPERSON MILLER: We can now move to our hearing cases with the afternoon's agenda. And if I'm not mistaken, I think we've had a change in schedule and we're going to be hearing Mie N Yu. Okay.

Hi. Sorry to keep you waiting.

And if you can sign in if you haven't done that already and make sure your name is spelled right in the record.

Thank you all for changing around your schedules.

So, when you're ready, did you get a letter asking you all these questions about your event?

MR. CHERNER: Yes, and I do have a couple of copies from the two programs that have updated, just very small updates and there are different diagrams as well.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Our staff will take it.

1 Okay. Whenever you're ready. I
2 think if you can give us an overview about
3 your event.

4 MR. CHERNER: Sure. I'll start
5 with Taste of Georgetown and that event is
6 scheduled for June 2nd.

7 The layout of the overall festival
8 is the same except the beverage pavilion has
9 moved to the other side of Wisconsin Avenue to
10 the Eagle Bank parking lot. It's a little bit
11 smaller space that we can control a little
12 better. We've gotten a new set of barriers to
13 put up there instead of sort of the ones that
14 were previously around the Verizon parking lot
15 that had more gaps in them. So, we'll just
16 have one main entrance and exist.

17 The event is to raise money for
18 the Georgetown Ministry Center and for the
19 Help the Homeless Campaign. It's a family
20 event, so anywhere from young children up
21 until -- up through the elderly. The event
22 itself is from 11:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. And

1 then we've asked for our permits to be
2 available for that same time frame from 11:00
3 to 4:00. Last years we went from 12:00 to
4 5:00. We started an hour later and it
5 concluded after the festival. We didn't
6 necessarily love the fact that people wanted
7 to sort of all come virtually after the food
8 areas were closing down so that's why we
9 wanted to move it to the same time frame as
10 the event.

11 We do have Blues Alley
12 Entertainment coming to the festival having
13 performances for the entire time frame from
14 11:00 to 4:00 with 15-minute breaks for the
15 performances.

16 Ticket sales. We'll have separate
17 tickets for food and beverage so that we can
18 keep them separate from each other. We have
19 coordinated with MPD fire EMS, DCRA. John is
20 here with us from the Georgetown bid to handle
21 all of that and we have our special events
22 permit as well.

1 In terms of security personnel, we
2 have a combination of people doing ID checks
3 at the door from Mie N Yu. Part of our MPD
4 detail is scheduled to just be at that
5 entrance and exit for the beverage pavilion.

6 Two establishment managers at the
7 event as well as there are staffing volunteers
8 from Mie N Yu and from the Georgetown bid.

9 The security personnel that we
10 have scheduled as I was saying is the
11 combination of five rotating at that door
12 between always having one MPD officer, two
13 people doing ID checks, as well as the roaming
14 ABRA managers.

15 Overall, I believe, we've hired 12
16 plus a supervisor for the day and they're
17 scheduled from midnight the evening before
18 until 8:00 p.m. once we break down the entire
19 festival.

20 In terms of checking IDs, all of
21 them are TIPS certified employees from Mie N
22 Yu that work our doors at the restaurant and

1 what we do is we have two of them with one of
2 the ABRA managers switch off so everyone gets
3 a break every hour.

4 In terms of oversight of the
5 serving of alcohol, that's a combination of
6 volunteers from other local Georgetown
7 establishments that we had last year and
8 volunteers that we trained last year from our
9 TIPS certified staff.

10 Only patrons over 21 are allowed
11 in the pavilion and they will have wristbands
12 as well. We printed up that white ticket this
13 year which is a little different but it has a
14 full barrier with just the one entrance on
15 Wisconsin Avenue for the pavilion. And then
16 if there was any sort of discovery of under-
17 age purchasers, they would directed right to
18 that MPD officer right at the front gate to
19 handle it as they see fit based on what the
20 issue was.

21 In terms of volunteers or staff,
22 they are allowed to consume after their shift.

1 But the people working can't have any alcohol
2 during their shift.

3 And the whole thing is to get
4 money for the Georgetown Ministry Center.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: The
6 Georgetown Ministry Center?

7 MR. CHERNER: Yes, they help --
8 you can tell them better.

9 MR. WIEBENSON: They provide
10 homeless services. They're based in
11 Georgetown, but they're about 19 churches in
12 all funded by either fund raisers or
13 contribute to the church and assist to provide
14 outreach, directional service, referral
15 services, so they're headquarters is actually
16 right in Verizon alley. And then they have
17 outreach that goes around Georgetown in some
18 of the broader areas.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: The homeless?

20 MR. WIEBENSON: Yes.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh.

22 MR. WIEBENSON: And so the bids

1 publish it for them to provide homeless
2 services instead of duplicating their
3 services, they do a pretty good job of
4 managing the folks we have and providing
5 services. We worked with them both with our
6 clean team, but then for the event provide
7 financial assistance to them as well.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What kind of
9 services do they provide?

10 MR. WIEBENSON: The Ministry?

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, the
12 one--

13 MR. WIEBENSON: I think they -- at
14 their center they have everything from showers
15 and food supplies and as needed if it's really
16 hot, to do a -- what they call hyperthermia.
17 They have referrals for jobs or if they need
18 other social services they routinely work with
19 mental health services. And they have
20 outreach folks that kind of wander around,
21 either knowing spots where homeless folks
22 might be or just to see what's going on in

1 Georgetown. If they need to refer them to
2 another agency, get them something to it,
3 sometimes getting them bus fare to wherever
4 they -- a variety of services.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. That's
6 great. Okay.

7 Did you do this last year, this
8 event -- festival? You did?

9 MR. WIEBENSON: Yes.

10 MR. CHERNER: Yes, this is the
11 19th year.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 19th year?

13 MR. CHERNER: It's the third year
14 that GMU has been involved, although the first
15 year we did help with oversight. Last year
16 and this year we applied for the permit to
17 oversee the entire beverage pavilion.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

19 MR. WIEBENSON: The first 18 had
20 been in October, but Georgetown was so busy in
21 October with races, marathons, Halloween, we
22 decided to move it to June to try and free up

1 another week in Georgetown and the restaurants
2 have less going on, homecomings and other
3 things.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So, were
5 there any problems last year?

6 MR. CHERNER: There were no
7 problems last year except for the people that
8 wants to keep spending time in the beverage
9 pavilion when we were closing down and that
10 was what we didn't want to have the beverage
11 pavilion open with everything else shut down.
12 Last year we sort of felt it would be nice way
13 for people to get off the street and try to
14 reopen it up to traffic and we realized we'd
15 rather people go into the restaurants in
16 Georgetown after we close down instead of
17 taking to our beverage pavilion. That's why
18 we're closing at the same time this year.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you check
20 for IDs at more than one point or just one
21 point?

22 MR. CHERNER: Just at the entrance

1 and no one is allowed in that pavilion without
2 that ID check.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Board
4 Members, any questions?

5 MEMBER NOPHLIN: Madam Chair, have
6 the investigators reviewed this?

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm not sure.
8 I think our legal staff is going to check.

9 Sometimes we have an investigator
10 with us in the hearing room and so we don't
11 have one today so we're not sure whether an
12 investigator has reviewed your application.

13 What other type of review did you
14 go through, security -- did you say Homeland
15 Security was there? Did you do that?
16 Sometimes people come here and they've gone to
17 the different agencies before they get to us.

18 MR. WIEBENSON: Oh, just as part
19 of our special event license where we went to
20 DCRA, Department of Health, DDOT, MPD.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

22 MR. WIEBENSON: The whole kind

1 of--

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So you have?

3 MR. WIEBENSON: Yes.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right? So,
5 have you had a security review?

6 MR. WIEBENSON: Yes, we had a
7 security, the traffic controller did all those
8 type of things looking in. We met with our
9 ANC folks. Bill Sterrill jumped in to give
10 everything from traffic control to what he's
11 seen over the years. Had him craft a plan
12 based upon input we get from them, from the
13 MPD, whoever is on site at the previous
14 events. And then any changes in Georgetown
15 which changed traffic flow, things like that,
16 with construction or other things like that.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How about to
18 the policy if someone gets intoxicated or gets
19 ill from drinking?

20 MR. CHERNER: Yes, we actually
21 just went through that with the insurance
22 measures and said that we would happily get

1 them -- either take them into one of our
2 establishments in order to get them hydrated
3 and get them some food, some of the tastings,
4 whatever they would need. Time is what they
5 need really more than anything to help them.
6 We're happy to purchase them a cab ride home
7 if they need it as well. But the other things
8 is we don't sell more than three taste tickets
9 at a time. Three tastes equals one drink.
10 Each one is a third of a drink. So, we're
11 serving less than one drink at a time. So, we
12 haven't run into that issue and we hope not
13 to. But we do have some of those measures in
14 place if need be.

15 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Gentleman,
16 19th year?

17 MR. CHERNER: Yes, sir.

18 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Any problems
19 last year?

20 MR. CHERNER: No, sir.

21 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Any problems
22 the year before?

1 MR. CHERNER: No, sir.

2 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Any problems
3 the year before that?

4 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: There was one
5 problem one year. I'm not sure how many years
6 ago.

7 MR. WIEBENSON: Six years ago, I
8 believe.

9 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: It was
10 basically and same old, same old drill.

11 MR. WIEBENSON: Yes, sir.

12 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Any changes,
13 I mean, other than the time of year, other
14 than changes in the operation?

15 MR. CHERNER: Really just the
16 location. At one point it was on the Grace
17 Church lawn and the church didn't really love
18 that being the center of the drinking focus.
19 Last year it was at the Verizon lot which is
20 under construction. We were all looking for
21 a more secure site because people could go
22 sort of behind where we had the tents last

1 years onto the grass area by the canal. Now
2 we have a fully closed off unit with the two
3 walls of the Eagle Bank and then the two walls
4 that we'll have for ticket --

5 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: So, we're
6 basically on very familiar ground here.
7 You've done this before. It's worked well.

8 MR. CHERNER: Yes, sir. Thank
9 you.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I understand
11 we have -- we have an investigator here.

12 Would you identify yourself,
13 please?

14 INVESTIGATOR CORIALES: Sure.
15 Ileana Coriales. I'm an investigator at ABRA.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Have you
17 reviewed this application?

18 INVESTIGATOR CORIALES: No.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: No, okay.
20 Taste of Georgetown? I don't know if you
21 heard about it before.

22 INVESTIGATOR CORIALES: Yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. You're
2 familiar with it?

3 INVESTIGATOR CORIALES: With the
4 event, yes.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Do you
6 have any questions for them?

7 INVESTIGATOR CORIALES: No.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Nophlin,
9 do you have any questions?

10 MEMBER NOPHLIN: No.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.
12 Yes?

13 MEMBER NOPHLIN: Well, Madam
14 Chair, if she could review the plan itself, I
15 would feel better with the Board Members, if
16 in fact there is an issue that you may you can
17 explain to the event.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

19 MEMBER NOPHLIN: Concerning the
20 event.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Madam Chair, what
22 I would suggest is that the Board can see,

1 just exchange, information with Investigator
2 Corialis and then later today or tomorrow we
3 can have suggestions for the Licensee,
4 questions of them. That you contact them and
5 invite their support and if she has any
6 questions about the event that you contact
7 Investigator Coriales. Okay. Can we leave it
8 that way?

9 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I think
10 that's a great idea.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: And we're always
12 there to answer your questions and help out.

13 MR. CHERNER: Thank you.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Nophlin,
15 is that okay with you?

16 MEMBER NOPHLIN: Yes, it is.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Fine.

18 MEMBER NOPHLIN: Yes, it is.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All
20 right.

21 Then I think --

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: I just have a

1 question.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Go
3 ahead.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: It seems like a
5 small area. How many people will fit into
6 that area that's --

7 MR. CHERNER: It actually is the
8 same area as last year. The area not counting
9 the grass area behind --

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

11 MR. CHERNER: We normally only say
12 that we can have about 200 people in the
13 pavilion at any given time.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

15 MR. CHERNER: Through a rotating
16 basis over the day that we end with somewhere
17 between 600 and 800 in the pavilion.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right. Right.
19 And so how do you control how many people --
20 just --

21 MR. CHERNER: We have the people
22 counters, the clippers and we count them in

1 and out and sort of just keep track of how
2 many are coming.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

4 MR. CHERNER: And then we also
5 have people on site from MPD and we sort of
6 ask them if they can let us know and go on
7 their request.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Very good. Thank
9 you very much.

10 MR. CHERNER: Thank you.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 Anything else? Okay.

13 Then I would move that we approve
14 this application. All those in favor say aye.

15 (AYES)

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Those
17 opposed? Those abstaining? Okay. Then we're
18 just going to sign off on your application.

19 Thanks for stepping in, Ms.
20 Coriales.

21 INVESTIGATOR CORIALES: No
22 problem.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: We talked
2 about one of them, right? There are two of
3 them?

4 MR. WIEBENSON: Yes.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: The Yards Park is
6 the second one.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, the Yards
8 Park.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: That's a new
10 event.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Is that a new
13 event?

14 MR. CHERNER: Yes, so I don't
15 know.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just give me a
17 yes or no, I'm curious.

18 MR. CHERNER: It's a new event.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, great.

20 (Whereupon, the above matter was
21 concluded at 2:03 p.m.)
