3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Deedee? Do you
4 have a problem with Deedee telling them out in
5 the hallway?

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: No. I have no
7 problem with Deedee telling them.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Then he can amend
9 it.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right. Just be
11 mindful that we have two others.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Thank you.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All right.
15 The next case involving the Ethiopian Soccer
16 Tournament is Climax Restaurant & Hookah Bar
17 located at 900 Florida Avenue, N.W., License No.
18 88290, in ANC-1B.

19 MR. YEGZAW: Good morning.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good morning.
21 When you are ready, if you would identify
22 yourself for the record, please?

1 MR. YEGZAW: All right. My name is
2 Solomon Yegzaw. I'm the owner of Climax
3 Restaurant & Hookah Bar.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Could you spell
5 your last name, please?

6 MR. YEGZAW: Y-E-G-Z-A-W.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good.
8 And?

9 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Investigator Jason
10 Peru with ABRA.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Great.
12 I'm trying to read your dates on the application.
13 Is it July 1st to July 4th?

14 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. What hours
16 do you want to be open?

17 MR. YEGZAW: Until 6:00 a.m.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Until 6:00 a.m.?

19 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So when would you
21 start? Just you are not asking for 24, so what
22 would the hours be?

1 MR. YEGZAW: No, I'm not asking for
2 24.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. When do
4 you start?

5 MR. YEGZAW: 11:00 to 6:00.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 11:00 to 6:00.
7 Okay. And have you done this before?

8 MR. YEGZAW: No. It will be my first
9 time.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And how
11 many people do you anticipate each day?

12 MR. YEGZAW: Probably, it's two
13 floors, I'll anticipate 100 to 200 people.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Each day?

15 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. How many
17 people do you normally have?

18 MR. YEGZAW: Well, normal I would do
19 60, 70, but --

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 60, 70?

21 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. YEGZAW: My capacity is 200
2 capacity.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Your capacity is
4 for what?

5 MR. YEGZAW: 200.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: 200.

7 MR. YEGZAW: No more. It's two
8 floors.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Two floors.
10 Okay. And what's your security? You have
11 security already, right?

12 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How much security
14 do you have?

15 MR. YEGZAW: I'll have that day until
16 6:00 seven security.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Six or seven?

18 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And how many do
20 you normally have?

21 MR. YEGZAW: Normally, I have work
22 days two, weekends three.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

2 MR. YEGZAW: Sometimes if I expect
3 it's going to be busy, I'll have four.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And you
5 would, I assume, serve subject to your license
6 hours, correct?

7 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Which are -- is
9 it weekends 3:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. the other
10 days?

11 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All right.
13 Board Members have questions?

14 MEMBER SHORT: I have one, Madam
15 Chair.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr. Short?

17 MEMBER SHORT: You have a deck on the
18 top of your second floor, correct?

19 MR. YEGZAW: Yes, we do.

20 MEMBER SHORT: And you will be from
21 11:00 a.m. in the morning until 6:00 a.m. the
22 next morning?

1 MR. YEGZAW: Um --

2 MEMBER SHORT: Are you going to be
3 using that deck?

4 MR. YEGZAW: That -- I'll -- I might
5 use it for smoking cigarettes outside, but I'm
6 not going to serve food or any soft drinks or
7 hookah. I'm not going to serve out there.

8 MEMBER SHORT: No alcohol out there on
9 the deck you said?

10 MR. YEGZAW: What is it?

11 MEMBER SHORT: Will you have alcohol
12 out there on the deck?

13 MR. YEGZAW: Regularly my hours, yes,
14 until 11:00 and 12:00, but after that, I'm not
15 going to serve. But for this time, I might let
16 the people to go out for smoking cigarette, but
17 I'm not going to serve over there. I'm not going
18 to use that.

19 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. So it won't
20 affect the neighborhood so much?

21 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

22 MEMBER SHORT: You'll be doing

1 everything inside mainly?

2 MR. YEGZAW: I'll consider that.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Short, he is
4 limited to 11:00 p.m. for operations of that deck
5 per his settlement agreement.

6 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. All right.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: So we --

8 MEMBER SHORT: I just wanted to make
9 sure because this is a special --

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. I think
11 your message is we expect him to abide by those
12 hours for his outdoor deck.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

14 MEMBER SHORT: Do you understand that?

15 MR. YEGZAW: Yes. I understand that.

16 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Got it on the
17 record. That's all I wanted.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right.

19 MEMBER SHORT: And you do realize that
20 Investigators will be coming by there to check
21 and make sure everything is going smoothly?

22 MR. YEGZAW: Yes, absolutely.

1 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. That's all I
2 have, Madam Chair. Thank you.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Alberti?

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: So since the previous
7 applicant reminded me that this is July 4th
8 weekend, you have only asked for hours until
9 3:00, I think. 2:00 a.m. and 3:00 a.m. Is that
10 your plan?

11 MR. YEGZAW: No, well, we do -- we
12 usually do what is July 4th we have extension
13 hours, consent out past that one hour.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

15 MR. YEGZAW: To serve alcohol.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: So I just -- just to
17 be clear, so there is no confusion, I'm going to
18 ask you to amend your application to reflect
19 those extended hours. It's just a technicality.
20 You will just --

21 MR. YEGZAW: Yes. I might have made
22 a mistake.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Ms. Walker?

2 MR. YEGZAW: That I might consider
3 July 4th we having one hour extension hour.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, if you have
5 permission to -- if you have already been granted
6 permission, you can operate until those extended
7 hours. I just want to make sure that it is
8 consistent with what is on your application.

9 MR. YEGZAW: Okay.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: It's just --

11 MR. YEGZAW: All right.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Ms. Walker will help
13 you make that correction.

14 MR. YEGZAW: Okay.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And one way or
16 the other, you are saying you already have
17 permission?

18 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So that's why you
20 didn't seek it, correct?

21 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Alberti is
2 just saying oh, if it's on this form and it's
3 consistent with --

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- what you have
6 got.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: It's a technicality.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. It doesn't
9 matter.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: I understand why you
11 did it. It's fine. I just wanted to make sure
12 we --

13 MR. YEGZAW: All right. Thank you.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, okay.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: So I believe it is,
18 I'm looking at my calendar now, Friday, Saturday
19 that you are allowed to stay open until 4:00,
20 right?

21 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. So,

1 Deedee, the 3rd and the 4th that he would be
2 allowed to stay open until 4:00. Just say 2:00
3 a.m. and then 6:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday, July
4 3rd and 4th. Say 4:00 a.m., sorry.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Did you say just
6 with your deck that, basically, you are just
7 sticking to the rules in the settlement agreement
8 that you -- right? That you have to follow. The
9 deck? I know Mr. Short asked about the deck.

10 MR. YEGZAW: Um-hum.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I was looking at
12 something at the time, but did you say that you,
13 basically, are following your settlement
14 agreement or --

15 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- whatever with
17 respect to the deck?

18 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And that will
20 remain the same?

21 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

1 MR. YEGZAW: Always Investigator show
2 up and make sure that I'm not selling any alcohol
3 outdoor after 11:00 and 12:00.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

6 MR. YEGZAW: I always consider to put
7 a security guard there to make sure nobody taking
8 alcohol out there.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay. Mr.
10 Peru, do you have something to add here?

11 INVESTIGATOR PERU: My only concern --

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

13 INVESTIGATOR PERU: -- with this is
14 the noise.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

16 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Because we have
17 had so many noise problems in the past. And you
18 know, there was a violation back in January for
19 noise of a Board Order that was issued because
20 they added to the Board Order in reference to
21 hearing noise inside of their residence.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

1 INVESTIGATOR PERU: So that is kind of
2 what we are doing as Investigators always getting
3 calls out there.

4 I haven't personally gotten a call in
5 a couple of months to go out there. I have had
6 several conversations with the owner about
7 adjusting his levels to where it's -- I mean, we
8 have been on the phone with him inside of a
9 residence saying hey, keep it at this level.

10 So my only concern would be for these
11 hours is that those same rules are followed and
12 that he is, you know, aware of the noise. And
13 the deck, I just want to add to the Board that
14 although hours for the deck are restricted at
15 11:00, any -- that any time you enter or exit the
16 deck from the establishment, the door opening --

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

18 INVESTIGATOR PERU: -- you know, the
19 sound is escaping during that time.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

21 INVESTIGATOR PERU: So you know, to
22 protect the establishment from getting any more

1 violations and for the residents in that
2 neighborhood from noise, I would almost say after
3 11:00, you know, anybody needs to smoke, they
4 need to go outside out front.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

6 INVESTIGATOR PERU: You know, I just--
7 that's my opinion on it. I think there is too
8 many factors involved and with music being that
9 late and that early in the morning.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

11 INVESTIGATOR PERU: So --

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Because even if
13 he is not serving alcohol, there may be music
14 going on, correct?

15 INVESTIGATOR PERU: And that's where
16 we have the biggest problem.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. I think
18 that's a really good point because I actually
19 have that image vivid in my mind of that deck and
20 the residents behind the deck. And if there has
21 been a noise issue, that seems to make sense to
22 me what Mr. Peru is saying, that there not be any

1 exiting onto the deck after 11:00. How do you
2 respond to that?

3 MR. YEGZAW: I did a double door for
4 that. When I said double door, the door is
5 closed by itself. And then my -- not didn't say
6 and I did something different on the deck. I
7 covered with bulletproof glass. I mean to say
8 soundproof glass. I covered that specifically
9 two weeks ago.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Wait. I want to
11 step back because, okay, you did that to reduce
12 noise. As far as what the rules are for the deck
13 now with respect to the Board Order or settlement
14 agreement, can individuals go and smoke on the
15 deck after 11:00?

16 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

18 MR. YEGZAW: They smoke, but they
19 cannot take anything out there.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So but
21 what I think what Mr. Peru was getting at and
22 what I'm concerned about is if you are open 24

1 hours during this time period, does that mean 24
2 hours people could go out and sit on the deck and
3 talk and smoke?

4 MR. YEGZAW: They can't sit, no, not
5 at all. Just to smoke cigarette. We won't let
6 them talk, just smoke cigarette. Even though
7 when they go out, it's a double door.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

9 MR. YEGZAW: That's put --

10 MEMBER SHORT: Madam Chair?

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What's the
12 problem with them going out the front and smoking
13 at 2:00 in the morning?

14 MR. YEGZAW: It's two floors. The
15 first floor always they go out.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

17 MR. YEGZAW: But the second floor is
18 kind of convenience to go out in the back instead
19 of going stairs and downstairs. But the first
20 floor, of course, they go out in the front.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So it's just
22 convenience you are talking about?

1 MR. YEGZAW: Yes, for customers.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

3 MEMBER SHORT: Madam Chair?

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Short, yes.

5 MEMBER SHORT: The reason why I asked
6 that question is because of the complaints we had
7 here about the deck. I would -- I personally as
8 a Board Member, wouldn't feel comfortable signing
9 for you to have this permission to do this.

10 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

11 MEMBER SHORT: Unless you agree that
12 nobody use that deck after 11:00.

13 MR. YEGZAW: After 11:00?

14 MEMBER SHORT: After 11:00.

15 MR. YEGZAW: Not to smoke cigarettes?

16 MEMBER SHORT: Not to do anything,
17 because you are opening and closing that door and
18 that's going to be confusion for the Investigator
19 who comes out, confusion for the people who
20 signed the agreement with you and so I don't
21 think we want to have that gray area. Just don't
22 -- if we don't do it, then why the problem? Once

1 that door opens, that music is coming out.

2 MR. YEGZAW: There is a double door.

3 MEMBER SHORT: We understand that.

4 But that's the problem you had with the noise. I
5 would think it was proven on your part --

6 MR. YEGZAW: But I adjusted by
7 Investigators and then I made sure that there is
8 no music going out there and by the neighborhood.
9 And we had just done that actually. So our
10 person that hired not to make the sound come out.

11 MEMBER SHORT: Okay.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.
13 Alberti?

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Ms. Miller, I concur
15 with Mr. Short. We haven't seen any
16 modifications. We are not aware of the
17 modifications you made to your deck, so I concur
18 with Mr. Short. I am not prepared to sign this
19 unless you stipulate today that you will not
20 allow anyone to use the deck for any purposes
21 after 11:00 p.m., that's where I'm at.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Let me

1 just say this. It's not even stipulated. I
2 mean, it's in our authority if we sign-off on
3 this, it sounds like that there may be enough
4 Board Members will sign-off only with the
5 condition that smoking -- that you not be allowed
6 to use the deck after 11:00.

7 And I just want to say this for
8 clarification. We are only talking about your
9 application for the soccer tournament week or
10 whatever few days it is. We are not talking in
11 general that oh, now, you can't ever use the deck
12 after 11:00.

13 We are looking at this application and
14 we are saying this one you are asking for 24
15 hours.

16 MR. YEGZAW: Oh, it's for this.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And we don't want
18 24 hours people smoking on your deck, which means
19 not just the opening and closing of the door, it
20 means people talking. You can't tell people they
21 can't talk or whatever. It's just 24 hours,
22 there has got to be a limit where your neighbors,

1 at least as far as I see it and I see it and I
2 see a few other people feel the same way, that
3 your neighbors are entitled to some peace and
4 quiet after a certain hour, at least for this
5 week where they are going to be putting up with
6 24 hour people coming to your establishment.
7 That's where I'm at, I think.

8 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: I agree, Madam
9 Chair.

10 MEMBER SHORT: Thank you, Madam Chair.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Does that sound
12 reasonable?

13 MEMBER SHORT: Yes.

14 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Madam Chair, could
15 I just add to that?

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

17 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Just to support
18 your statement and in the agreement as well, Page
19 12, Section 50, it references closing at 11:00 to
20 prevent nearby residents from being disturbed by
21 unreasonable late-night patron noise.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

1 INVESTIGATOR PERU: So specific to
2 patron noise as well as just music, so, you know,
3 the outside talking and smoking is just as
4 disturbing as --

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

6 INVESTIGATOR PERU: -- listed in the
7 Board Order or the agreement.

8 MR. YEGZAW: Well, could I please let
9 me say since I'm applying until 6:00, let me stay
10 until maybe 1:00 and then after that I'll close
11 down. Until 1:00?

12 MEMBER SHORT: Madam Chair, can I just
13 comment again?

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

15 MEMBER SHORT: I'm trying to work with
16 you. We want to sign-off where you have these
17 special days for this special event. We are
18 asking you just to give the neighbors a break.
19 Don't use it after 11:00 and you won't have any
20 problems.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Peru, could
22 you tell me what the order is that he is subject

1 to right now for the deck?

2 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Yes. The one
3 section references the second condition imposed
4 requires Climax to end its outdoor operation at
5 11:00 p.m. during the week and midnight during
6 the weekend. This condition will prevent nearby
7 residents from being disturbed by unreasonable
8 late-night patron noise.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: There you go.

10 INVESTIGATOR PERU: However, there is
11 an amended order. I'm sorry.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Yes?

13 INVESTIGATOR PERU: On November 19,
14 2014, that then references Climax outdoor seating
15 hours shall end at 11:00 p.m. Monday through
16 Friday, and midnight Friday through Saturday,
17 which is similar to the first one.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

19 INVESTIGATOR PERU: And then it also
20 references hearing noise inside a residence after
21 11:00 p.m.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What do you mean

1 it references --

2 INVESTIGATOR PERU: It says Climax
3 shall not permit amplified music or sound to
4 emanate from the --

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh.

6 INVESTIGATOR PERU: -- establishment
7 that may be heard inside the residence after
8 11:00 p.m.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So but on
10 the license the licensed hours are 11:00 on
11 weekdays and 12:00 on weekends, basically, Friday
12 and Saturday?

13 INVESTIGATOR PERU: Yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I could go along
15 with that. I don't know why this would be
16 different, we need to make this different.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, I'm sorry.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: The hours that he
19 is subject to on his license and per our order is
20 11:00 -- to use the deck 11:00 weekdays and 12:00
21 on weekends. I don't see why we need to change
22 it for this.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, oh, it's 12:00 on
2 weekends.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. I'm okay with
5 the 12:00 on weekends, but again, the condition
6 is no one will -- unlike your normal operation
7 where someone can go out there and smoke after
8 12:00 a.m. as long as they don't have a drink in
9 their hand, for this event, I want assurances and
10 I want a commitment that no one will use the deck
11 even for smoking. No patrons will use the deck
12 after 11:00 weekdays or 12:00 p.m. on the
13 weekends just during this event.

14 MR. YEGZAW: Okay.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. That's
16 where I'm at. For all the reasons and concerns
17 that Mr. Short stated earlier --

18 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

19 MEMBER SHORT: You nodded your head,
20 but will you state for the record yes or no to
21 this?

22 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

1 MEMBER SHORT: You say yes?

2 MR. YEGZAW: Yes.

3 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Thank you.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Well, I
5 think that needs to be added to the application
6 that we are signing off on.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

9 MEMBER SHORT: We have to make those
10 changes.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: So Ms. Walker will
12 make sure.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, let's do the
14 other one. Oh, okay. We are almost complete
15 with this case. Any other questions on this? So
16 I'll tell you, we're just adding to your
17 application that requirement, that there is no
18 patron use of the deck after 11:00 on weekdays
19 and after 12:00 on weekends --

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, and Ms. Walker--

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- for this
22 application.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Excuse me. I'm
2 sorry. And Ms. Walker will have him initial it.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just so he knows.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: She is just
6 writing it in for you, which is consistent
7 basically with your license.

8 MR. YEGZAW: Okay.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. You can
10 make the motion on that, yes. Okay. Okay.
11 Good. All right. So this application has been
12 amended to indicate that there won't be any use
13 on the deck by patrons after 11:00 p.m. on
14 weekdays and 12:00 a.m. on weekends during these
15 events.

16 Okay. All right. I'm ready to move
17 or to sign-off on this. It looks like somebody
18 else has already signed. Do all the Board
19 Members want to sign-off on this application?

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: If that's a motion to
21 approve this, then I'll second that.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good.

1 All those in favor say aye.

2 ALL: Aye.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: All those
4 opposed? All those abstaining? The motion
5 passes 6-0-0.

6 Okay. We will give you this
7 application back just momentarily. Do you have
8 any other questions?

9 MR. YEGZAW: No, ma'am.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Thank you.

11 MR. YEGZAW: All right.
