The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in Alcoholic Beverage Control Hearing Room, Reeves Building, 2000 14th Street N.W., Washington, D.C., Chairperson Ruthanne Miller presiding.

3	CHAIR MILLER: All right, our next
4	hearing I believe is at 2:30 and I don't see
5	anyone in the audience right now, so
6	MEMBER ALBERTI: Wait up, folks.
7	CHAIR MILLER: Wait.
8	MEMBER ALBERTI: Please.
9	(Off the record comments)
10	CHAIR MILLER: So we're going to
11	recess until 2:30 or at least until the next
12	individuals show up for the fact finding hearing.
13	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
14	went off the record at 2:21 p.m. and resumed at
15	2:22 p.m.)
16	CHAIR MILLER: Okay, so you are here
17	for the Zula Restaurant?
18	MR. WOLDAI: Yes.
19	CHAIR MILLER: All right, then I'm
20	going to call the fact finding hearing of Zula
21	Restaurant located at 1933 9th Street, N.W.,
22	License Number 60547, and ANC 1B, and, also, it's

a case involving a request to extend safekeeping. 1 2 So have a seat, please, yes. If you could introduce yourself for the record. 3 My name is Daniel MR. WOLDAI: Okay. 4 I am the owner of Zula Restaurant, 1933 5 Woldai. 9th Street. I used to be owner, there's not any 6 7 Zula Restaurant at the time, they demolished that place. 8 9 CHAIR MILLER: There is no restaurant 10 there now is that what you are saying? 11 MR. WOLDAI: Yes. I mean they 12 demolished the whole place, so there is no, there 13 is no restaurant existing in that area now. CHAIR MILLER: So the building is 14 15 demolished? MR. WOLDAI: 16 The building, yes. 17 CHAIR MILLER: When was that, in 2013? 18 MR. WOLDAI: Yes. 19 CHAIR MILLER: Okay. So what I want 20 to say is this is what's called a fact finding It's not an evidentiary hearing where, 21 hearing. 22 you know, where you're put under oath or you

present evidence and, you know, you've done 1 2 something wrong, and, you know, we're looking at 3 you that way. This is what's called a fact finding 4 because we want to find out with your safekeeping 5 license since it's been in safekeeping for 6 7 awhile, which is, you know, two years. MR. WOLDAI: Yes. 8 9 CHAIR MILLER: And I think the philosophy of the Board is that licenses are to 10 11 be used and so when do you expect to use it, if 12 you do, or what are your plans? 13 So if it's been demolished for two years what have you done since then with respect 14 15 to looking for another place or anything like 16 that? MR. WOLDAI: Yes, we're looking. 17 Ι 18 mean me and my wife were running the business for 19 like over 12 years. 20 CHAIR MILLER: Wow, okay. MR. WOLDAI: Yes, since 2000. 21 22 CHAIR MILLER: Yes.

MR. WOLDAI: So all of a sudden I mean 1 2 the landlords sold for this big investor, so we were unable to get that place. We were looking 3 to get some, a new place, and we couldn't find 4 the right place for us. 5 So all of a sudden we opened a new 6 7 deli in Rockville, Maryland where we live. CHAIR MILLER: Yes. 8 9 It's been a year now, so MR. WOLDAI: still we are, I mean we are still looking for the 10 11 right place for us, which is, we couldn't find so far so that's why I presented the extension, 12 13 whatever, for the safekeeping. So it's not the right time, so I don't 14 15 know where to find, but I keep looking elsewhere. 16 CHAIR MILLER: How are you looking? 17 Do you have real estate agent or --18 MR. WOLDAI: No. 19 CHAIR MILLER: No. 20 In fact my priority, our MR. WOLDAI: priority is to find like not to rent, if we can 21 22 able to buy. We don't want the same thing to

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happen again.

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That's why it took us some --5 invest. CHAIR MILLER: So you are looking to 6 7 buy instead of lease? MR. WOLDAI: Yes. 8 9 CHAIR MILLER: And what part of the 10 City are you looking in? 11 MR. WOLDAI: Well if it's possible the 12 Northwest area. If not I can, I don't know, 13 maybe Northeast, I'm not sure. Okay. Do you have a 14 CHAIR MILLER: 15 goal or a plan, you know, or it's just open-ended 16 by when you hope to find a new place? 17 MR. WOLDAI: Maybe. I don't know, one 18 year's time period. I am still looking, but, I 19 mean the price of the property at this time 20 exaggerates, getting high, so I guess that's why it took me some time. 21 22 I mean I am not a millionaire, so

We own the business and all of a

sudden, you know, the landlord kick you out, so

we are looking for a place to buy property and

that's the reason. 1 2 CHAIR MILLER: Yes. Okay, Board Members? 3 MEMBER SHORT: I have a question. 4 CHAIR MILLER: Okay, Mr. Short. 5 MEMBER SHORT: How long did you have 6 7 the license before 2013? You're building got torn down in 2013, you say, you're landlord put 8 9 you out in 2013? 10 MR. WOLDAI: Yes. 11 MEMBER SHORT: And how long were you in business before that date? 12 13 MR. WOLDAI: For 12 years. We opened the business in 2000. Since 2000, yes. 14 15 MEMBER SHORT: From 2000 to 2015? MR. WOLDAI: Yes. 16 MEMBER SHORT: And so what since 2013 17 18 to now you say you haven't been able to find 19 anything to use that license any place? 20 MR. WOLDAI: Well I mean in the meantime all when this happens we like take a 21 break for like awhile. We had been in the 22

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business in for like 12 years for like, you know, 1 2 seven days a week. We've been doing all this so we take 3 a break like awhile, a year, then after that 4 we'll start looking at the real estate market and 5 we cannot afford thus far. 6 7 MEMBER SHORT: And you received a letter to come here today, correct? 8 9 MR. WOLDAI: Yes. 10 MEMBER SHORT: And do you know why you 11 received that letter? Pretty much the City wants those licenses to be used. They want them to 12 13 generate business and taxes. When you have your license in 14 15 safekeeping it's really not good for you or the 16 City. So you say you don't have any plans to do anything within the next year? 17 18 MR. WOLDAI: I'm looking. I'm 19 looking. We are looking to get a place. This is 20 not the right time that's why I'm still looking, so if I can get a chance for like one year to, 21 22 you know, to open a business.

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MEMBER SHORT: Well I wish you luck, 1 2 but somebody needs to be using that license, that's why you are here today. We're trying to 3 notify you that that license needs to be used. 4 You just can't sit on it. It's got to 5 be used. 6 7 CHAIR MILLER: Mr. Rodriguez? MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. Sir, so tell 8 9 me how are you looking? When you say you are 10 looking what is the process? You don't have a 11 real estate person looking for you, right? 12 MR. WOLDAI: No. 13 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: So how are you No. looking? 14 15 MR. WOLDAI: Well through the 16 websites. 17 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Yes. That's it, 18 through the website? 19 MR. WOLDAI: Yes. Over a year, yes. 20 MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: That's, you know --I'm not happy with that. 21 Question. 22 MEMBER ALBERTI:

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1	CHAIR MILLER: Yes, Mr. Alberti.
2	MEMBER ALBERTI: Can you give me more
3	detail, what do you mean through a website, what
4	websites?
5	MR. WOLDAI: Well my wife she is doing
6	those things. I am not too involved with it.
7	She's the one in charge, so she's the one, she
8	was running the business. She was the manager
9	and she's number one.
10	MALE PARTICIPANT: Can we talk about
11	this for a minute or what are you going to do?
12	CHAIR MILLER: You want to talk about
13	this?
14	MALE PARTICIPANT: Yes, I do want to
15	talk about this, what instructions to give him.
16	I would like to talk about this.
17	CHAIR MILLER: Oh.
18	MALE PARTICIPANT: About what
19	instructions to give him.
20	MEMBER SHORT: Okay, well that
21	Yes, can we go back?
22	MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: I think that's what

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Mr. Short is asking.

2 CHAIR MILLER: Okay, we need to take a quick break. We want to just discuss about one 3 issue regarding how you should probably proceed 4 with respect to your license. 5 MR. WOLDAI: Okay. 6 7 CHAIR MILLER: So to do that I need to just have the Board vote on discussing in a 8 9 closed session. 10 MR. WOLDAI: Okay. 11 CHAIR MILLER: All right. As Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage Control 12 13 Board for the District of Columbia in accordance with Section 405 of the Open Meetings Amendment 14 15 Act of 2010 I move that the ABC Board hold a 16 closed meeting for the purpose of seeking legal advice from our counsel on the case Zula 17 18 Restaurant per Section 405(b)(4) of the Open Meetings Amendment Act of 2010 and deliberating 19 20 upon the case for the reasons cited in Section 405(b)(13) of the Open Meetings Amendment Act of 21 22 2010. Is there a second?

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1	MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Second.
2	CHAIR MILLER: Mr. Silverstein
3	seconded the motion. All those in We're going
4	to take a roll call vote on this motion now that
5	it's been seconded. Mr. Alberti?
6	MEMBER ALBERTI: I agree.
7	CHAIR MILLER: Mr. Rodriguez?
8	MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: I agree.
9	CHAIR MILLER: Ms. Miller agrees. Mr.
10	Silverstein?
11	MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I agree.
12	CHAIR MILLER: And, Mr. Short?
13	MEMBER SHORT: I agree.
14	CHAIR MILLER: Okay. Motion passes 5-
15	0-0. I hereby give notice that the ABC Board
16	will recess this proceeding until the closed
17	meeting in the ABC Conference Room pursuant to
18	the Open Meetings Amendment Act of 2010.
19	Okay, we will return shortly and then
20	give you a report.
21	MR. WOLDAI: Sure.
22	CHAIR MILLER: Okay, thank you.

1	MR. WOLDAI: Thank you.
2	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
3	went off the record at 2:32 p.m. and resumed at
4	2:57 p.m.)
5	CHAIR MILLER: Okay, we are back on
6	the record. So we just had a discussion with
7	respect to your license because it's been
8	inactive for awhile and it did not appear that
9	you were really working actively to reuse it,
10	even though you say you are looking to reuse it.
11	A couple of things I want to tell you,
12	one is you do always have the option of canceling
13	the license and then applying for a license fresh
14	again when you want a license.
15	Because in this case, I don't want to
16	get into it too much, but you are incurring fees
17	by keeping it in safekeeping. There is a new law
18	that assesses fees against you for keeping it
19	inside safekeeping in addition to renewal.
20	So I just want to bring that to your
21	attention and I also want to bring to your
22	attention the law on this in case you want to

look at what law is governing our decision with 1 2 respect to your safekeeping and it's 25-791 and it's on the website. 3 If you put ABRA into your Google 4 you'll come up with our website and you can see 5 our rules. 6 7 But it says, in one part it says if the licensee has not initiated proceedings to 8 9 resume operations or transfer the license within 10 60 days after suspension the Board may deem this license abandoned after giving notice to the 11 licensee. 12 13 And it also talks about our reviewing licenses in safekeeping every six months, so 14 15 you'll find that on the web with the laws, which 16 brings us to your particular case. Because we don't see any, much 17 18 movement on this license we are considering 19 canceling the license, but we are not canceling 20 it today. What we were going to do is extend 21 22 your license in safekeeping for another six

months, until March 31st, which is the date that 1 2 we have been giving to everybody so far that came in for an extension of safekeeping. 3 And you'll get a letter from us 4 putting this in writing, or from our counsel, but 5 at that point we would need to see a real plan of 6 7 your intent to put this license in safekeeping. A real plan meaning, you know, that 8 9 you've gone forward and you've found a location 10 or leased one or bought one, or whatever it is, 11 I'm going to leave that up to, but something really concrete in order for you to maintain this 12 13 license. So we will be scheduling a hearing for 14 15 you again before March 31st, at which point you 16 can address us as to where your license will be at that point. 17 18 And then the process is after that 19 we'll see how it goes. You know, if you've got 20 something concrete then we can extend it again for another six months in the most likelihood. 21 22 If you don't have anything, you know,

it may be canceled at that point. But I would 1 2 say that you are still able, even if it's canceled you are still able to apply for another 3 license when you are ready. 4 But as certain Board Members have 5 stated that it's Board policy not to keep these 6 7 licenses out there not being used. MEMBER ALBERTI: Sir -- May I speak? 8 9 CHAIR MILLER: Sure. 10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Sir, the Board has 11 agreed that, yes, we're going to take look in six 12 months to see where you are, but at the end of 13 the year we expect a license to be in use, or at the very least for you to have a lease agreement 14 15 for a place to put it at the end of a year. 16 So that's really the deadline we are looking at, all right. We expect to hear 17 18 concrete plans from you in six months and then 19 six months after that, one year from today, we 20 expect at the very least that you will have a lease for a place to put this, all right. 21 22 Hopefully it will be active by then,

1	all right, and if it isn't, if it isn't, your
2	license is at risk of being canceled.
3	And I can tell you that given the
4	track record of this Board it probably, given
5	those circumstances it probably, if at the end of
6	the year there is no concrete evidence that you
7	have a place to put it I expect that this Board
8	will vote to cancel given this track record.
9	CHAIR MILLER: Do you have any
10	questions right now?
11	MR. WOLDAI: No.
12	CHAIR MILLER: Okay. What I would say
13	if you do have questions, after this hearing you
14	go home and you're like I don't understand what's
15	going on really or whatever, you should feel free
16	to call the Agency and our legal counsel's name
17	is Martha Jenkins you could ask for her.
18	But the Agency is always willing to
19	help people and explain things because I know
20	that our regulations and laws are not always self
21	evident at all.
22	MR. WOLDAI: Okay. Can I get the

1	number and name of what you said?
2	MEMBER SHORT: You can stop by the
3	desk on your way out.
4	MR. WOLDAI: Okay.
5	CHAIR MILLER: Okay, first I want to
6	make a motion though to approve this license to
7	stay in safekeeping for another six months until
8	March 31, 2016.
9	MR. WOLDAI: Thank you, sir.
10	CHAIR MILLER: And to hold a hearing
11	Well we'll just approve this for right now, to
12	extend it for safekeeping until March 31st. Do I
13	have a second?
14	MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Second.
15	CHAIR MILLER: And Mr. Silverstein
16	seconded the motion. All those in favor say aye.
17	(Multiple ayes)
18	CHAIR MILLER: All those opposed?
19	(No audible response)
20	CHAIR MILLER: All those abstaining?
21	(No audible answer)
22	CHAIR MILLER: Motion passes, 5-0-0.

Okay, you're all set? 1 2 MR. WOLDAI: Yes, thank you. All right, thank you. 3 CHAIR MILLER: MR. WOLDAI: So one more question, 4 5 sorry. CHAIR MILLER: 6 Okay. 7 MR. WOLDAI: So are you going to send me any mail, letters of this thing? 8 9 CHAIR MILLER: Yes. MR. WOLDAI: Okay. And do I have to 10 11 pay anything for the next coming six months? Ι 12 need to --13 CHAIR MILLER: You will. There is a fee now to keep licenses in safekeeping. 14 So I 15 don't know where you are on your payments. You 16 should probably go to the front desk and they can help you specifically on that. 17 18 MR. WOLDAI: Okay. 19 CHAIR MILLER: Okay? 20 MR. WOLDAI: All right. CHAIR MILLER: But you've been 21 22 approved for a safekeeping for another six months

1	and giving you
2	MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Good luck. Let's
3	find a place.
4	MR. WOLDAI: Thank you.
5	CHAIR MILLER: Okay.
6	MR. WOLDAI: Yes, I will. Thank you.
7	CHAIR MILLER: All right, thank you.
8	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
9	went off the record at 3:04 p.m.)
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
