3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, the
4 next case on our calendar is another Fact
5 Finding Hearing. The Applicant is Stephen
6 Ball, Washington City Paper and Arts and
7 Crafts Festival.

8 Are they here? Hi, okay. This is
9 known as the Crafty Bastards Arts and Crafts
10 Festival.

11 MR. COBURN: Hello.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Hi, okay,
13 welcome.

14 MR. BALL: Good morning.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good morning,
16 when you're ready if you would introduce
17 yourselves for the record.

18 MR. BALL: Stephen Ball for
19 Washington City Paper.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

21 MR. COBURN: I'm Skip Coburn,
22 executive director of the Night Life

1 Association. Good morning everybody.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Good morning.

3 MR. STEWART: Supervising

4 Investigator Craig Stewart, ABRA.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

6 MR. COBURN: The supervisor
7 investigator, my buddy right here, has just
8 asked me if I have any, please ask me the
9 question for the record?

10 MR. STEWART: Let me see if you
11 have details, Mr. Coburn.

12 MR. COBURN: Apparently nobody has
13 provided the investigator with any information
14 about this event. I find that amusing.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: He's a quick
16 study though.

17 MR. STEWART: Yes.

18 MR. COBURN: This is my copy.
19 I'll borrow it back --

20 MR. STEWART: No, she has a copy
21 for me. There you go. No problem, thank you.

22 MR. COBURN: Thank you for asking.

1 MR. STEWART: Sure.

2 MR. COBURN: It's okay.

3 MR. STEWART: You can continue,
4 I'll catch up.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So I'm aware
6 that there was this festival last year and it
7 was very crowded, very successful I believe.
8 And --

9 MR. BALL: Yes, this will be the
10 10th year.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: This will be
12 the 10th, oh, but he moved locations last
13 year, right.

14 MR. BALL: Yes, from Marie Reeds
15 Center in Adams Morgan to Union Market.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right, okay.
17 So why don't you, just to get us on the same
18 page, give a quick overview of the festival
19 and specifically where the alcohol fits in?

20 MR. BALL: Sure.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

22 MR. COBURN: This is, as many

1 other events have been recently in the fenced
2 in Union Market parking lot. In addition to
3 be inside the fenced in entire parking lot,
4 the only area where alcohol will be served is
5 also in additionally fenced in area inside the
6 bigger fenced in area.

7 All the alcohol will be sold by
8 just one entity. One point is, you know, one
9 point of sale only. The temporary license
10 will be used only.

11 As opposed to what was submitted
12 when we turned this in, they did decide in
13 addition to the extensive security staff,
14 which is Allied Barton, they have professional
15 security company running their security and
16 plus their 140 volunteers, which I find
17 inundating, they also are going to use
18 wristbands. I've never done an event where
19 they had a 140 volunteers.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Just for the
21 alcohol?

22 MR. COBURN: No, no, for the

1 entire event.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.

3 MR. COBURN: Not for the entire --

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

5 MR. COBURN: But so I was just
6 emphasizing that they've gone way overboard in
7 terms of supervision for all aspects of public
8 safety and health. And then they have
9 professional security company guards checking
10 ID's with the volunteers at the beer, they're
11 only selling beer, at the beer area.

12 And they are going to use
13 wristbands, although when we submitted this we
14 answered no.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.
16 So, yes, I know you thoroughly answered the
17 questions, but sometimes things change and
18 Board Members often have follow-up questions.
19 So how big an area is being devoted to this
20 beer area? Beer garden?

21 MR. BALL: Roughly one tenth, well
22 one eighth of the entire footprint of the

1 Union Market. We have the schematics of the
2 floor plans.

3 MR. COBURN: Did you get the site
4 plan that I submitted? No.

5 MR. STEWART: This here?

6 MR. COBURN: That would be the
7 same thing.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oops, I've
9 got the same thing.

10 MR. COBURN: I don't know the
11 exact, well I can look here. It's
12 approximately 70 feet plus --

13 MR. STEWART: It's this whole
14 section, right?

15 MR. BALL: Yes.

16 MR. COBURN: 70 plus 93 and a 115.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: May I just
18 interrupt very quickly?

19 MR. COBURN: Yes.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Can you identify
21 where --

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- where in the
2 schematic, what section?

3 MR. COBURN: Here with all the
4 little squares, the little baby squares in
5 this upper corner.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, great.

7 MR. COBURN: It's that, it's this
8 --

9 MR. BALL: You might need to turn
10 the page, open it up so it shows the whole
11 thing.

12 MR. COBURN: It's okay, they can
13 see. It's this upper right hand corner with
14 all the little tables.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

16 MR. COBURN: So this, if I can
17 open it up here without everything falling
18 out. So this is the entire parking lot. And
19 the upper like one quarter is --

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Got you.

21 MR. COBURN: -- the fenced in beer
22 area.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Thank you.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

3 MR. COBURN: Good question.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So is there
5 food also being served with the beer?

6 MR. BALL: Yes, there are about
7 nine food trucks that will be there throughout
8 the day.

9 MR. COBURN: Plus all of the
10 vendors inside.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: In this area
12 or?

13 MR. BALL: Yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And
15 food, so it's nine food trucks and then beer
16 and other drinks, non-alcoholic drinks?

17 MR. BALL: Yes. Sodas, water,
18 honest tea.

19 MR. COBURN: And all the vendors
20 inside Union Market will be selling food as
21 well.

22 MR. BALL: Yes.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. Is
2 there a separate entrance to get into this
3 fenced in area?

4 MR. BALL: Just to get into that
5 fenced in area or to, you would have to go
6 through the festival to get into there.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. No,
8 you're in the festival --

9 MR. BALL: You see where the two
10 tents, little small tents here are, that's
11 where you would go into that festival, that's
12 where we'll have security as well.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Can
14 people under 21 go in the area?

15 MR. BALL: Yes, the whole is going
16 to be family friendly. We have three sets of
17 wristbands.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

19 MR. BALL: One just to walk into
20 the festival for each day. A different color
21 for each day.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, once you

1 pay to make sure they --

2 MR. BALL: Yes.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, all
4 right.

5 MR. BALL: And then to get into
6 the beer festival or the beer garden area,
7 they'll be a separate third or a separate
8 colored wristband.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well what's
10 the third, did you say three?

11 MR. BALL: There's one for each
12 day. So there's a blue one for one day and a
13 red one for another day and then a different
14 colored one for the beer.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, I see,
16 okay. So I mean how many people can, are you
17 controlling the number of people like in the
18 previous fact finding we heard?

19 MR. BALL: We're probably going to
20 keep it around 600 or 700. But at the end of
21 the day this is more of an add-on to the event
22 then it is the focal point.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

2 MR. BALL: The biggest crowds are
3 going to be primarily shopping throughout the
4 other tents.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right. Okay.

6 MR. COBURN: If you never have
7 happened to go to this event it's amazing
8 because they not only have arts and crafts
9 vendors there that are selling wares, they're
10 having little tutorials and teaching people
11 how to do things. And they have some of the
12 vendors actually have it setup so that kids
13 and other people can sit down and actually
14 create stuff. So it's real cool.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I actually
16 was at the one, Meridian.

17 MR. BALL: They're very cool.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes. So who
19 is checking, you're checking ID's at the
20 entrance?

21 MR. BALL: Yes, we're checking
22 ID's at the entrance to the beer garden.

1 That's going to be run by Allied Barton
2 Security.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

4 MR. BALL: They are the in-house
5 security for Union Market. We've hired
6 additional staff beyond their normal Union
7 Market staff --

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

9 MR. BALL: -- to supplement. And
10 so we'll have, we've allocated four just for
11 that specific area. And then we have another
12 additional six plus a supervisor that will be
13 throughout the rest of the festival kind of
14 managing shoplifting or anything like that.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So can they
16 bring drinks out --

17 MR. BALL: No.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: They can't
19 bring drinks out, okay.

20 MR. BALL: Non-alcoholic drinks.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right.

22 MR. BALL: We're not using cups,

1 so they'll, so it will be easy to identify.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All
3 right, other questions?

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just a follow-up.

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, Mr.
6 Alberti.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: So the beer is
8 only sold in bottles?

9 MR. BALL: Cans.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Cans and bottles.

11 MR. BALL: Cans.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. But you
13 are allowing other drinks to be taken outside
14 of that area?

15 MR. BALL: Just bottled water or
16 bottled soda.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Oh, are you using

18 --

19 MR. COBURN: No cups. No cups.

20 MR. BALL: No cups at all.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Great, that makes
22 things easy. I think. It makes it easier to

1 monitor.

2 MR. BALL: We try.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: For everyone.

4 Great. Whose doing the ID checking?

5 MR. BALL: Allied Barton Security.

6 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, great. No
7 other questions.

8 MR. BALL: Thank you.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Thank you, good
10 luck.

11 MR. BALL: Thank you.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: It's a great
13 event.

14 MR. BALL: Thank you.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Wait, don't
16 go yet. Are there other, other Board Members
17 have questions? Okay, Mr. Stewart?

18 MR. STEWART: I have some, yes.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Go ahead.

20 MR. STEWART: Thank you. On the
21 fact finding questionnaire, I guess you sent
22 to the director?

1 MR. COBURN: Yes.

2 MR. STEWART: And the application,
3 the application says sales from 10:00 a.m. to
4 6:00 p.m. and on your, I guess the document
5 you submitted to us it says from 11:00 a.m. to
6 6:00 p.m.?

7 MR. COBURN: You're going to have
8 to, from time to time, what are your actual
9 hours of alcohol sales?

10 MR. BALL: We're not going to open
11 the beer garden till 11:00. We'll have the
12 food trucks open, but we won't start serving
13 alcohol until 11:00.

14 MR. STEWART: Okay.

15 MR. BALL: We just added the extra
16 hour in the application for just in case.

17 MR. COBURN: I think the 10:00
18 a.m. was the event and 11:00 a.m. is alcohol
19 sales.

20 MR. BALL: Right.

21 MR. STEWART: Okay. Will there be
22 a last call?

1 MR. BALL: Yes, 6:00 p.m.

2 MR. STEWART: But that's when the
3 event ends?

4 MR. BALL: Oh, I'm sorry, 5:30
5 p.m., yes.

6 MR. STEWART: 5:30. Did you
7 provide a Public Space Permit for that type of
8 event?

9 MR. COBURN: No, because it's on a
10 private parking lot. It's on the Union Market
11 parking lot which is not public space.

12 MR. STEWART: Will there be tents?

13 MR. COBURN: Yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you have a
15 tent permit?

16 MR. COBURN: I do.

17 MR. BALL: Yes.

18 MR. COBURN: I do.

19 MR. STEWART: Okay. You have that
20 available?

21 MR. COBURN: I do. You can go
22 ahead and ask more questions while I look for

1 it.

2 MR. STEWART: Okay. How about
3 entertainment, do you have entertainment?

4 MR. BALL: There will be a demo
5 stage with various crafters demonstrating --

6 MR. STEWART: I mean I'm talking
7 about like live bands, music or anything?

8 MR. BALL: No, no. I mean we'll
9 be pumping in music through our PA system when
10 there aren't demos going on stage. When we're
11 kind of between the demos, but that will be
12 for entertainment.

13 MR. STEWART: Okay. How many
14 staff members will you have selling alcohol?

15 MR. BALL: Selling? We'll have
16 one that will be selling tickets or two that
17 will be selling tickets and then those tickets
18 will be given to our six openers, I guess.

19 MR. STEWART: And are they
20 employees of yours?

21 MR. BALL: Half are employees and
22 half are volunteers.

1 MR. STEWART: Okay, and what's
2 their level of training for serving alcohol?

3 MR. BALL: They are, three of them
4 are tip certified. And those are the ones
5 that are going to be kind of overseeing that
6 specific 10 by 20 space. Or 10 by 30 space.

7 MR. STEWART: Are your employees
8 and security, will they be distinguished by
9 any clothing?

10 MR. BALL: Allied Barton, they'll
11 all be in uniform, yes.

12 MR. STEWART: Allied Barton is
13 serving the alcohol?

14 MR. BALL: Oh, no, they'll be in
15 Washington City Paper t-shirts, yes.

16 MR. STEWART: Okay. Are they
17 allowed to drink, the employees?

18 MR. BALL: Absolutely not.

19 MR. STEWART: Allied Barton,
20 that's a regular security company?

21 MR. BALL: Yes.

22 MR. STEWART: What's their

1 training with regards to alcohol events?

2 MR. BALL: They have special
3 event, they do special event security as well.

4 MR. STEWART: And they're level of
5 checking ID's and fake ID's?

6 MR. COBURN: I provided them with
7 ID checking book. And that same company is
8 the in-house security company at Union Market.

9 And so they are doing this
10 regularly, almost every Saturday, Sunday at
11 these events. Either inside Union Market or
12 in the parking lot. And I've given them
13 copies of the ID book.

14 MR. STEWART: Okay.

15 MR. COBURN: The current, the 2013
16 book.

17 MR. STEWART: Will there be any
18 Metropolitan Police there?

19 MR. COBURN: No, MPD approved this
20 event, signed off on it as a special event on
21 private property. And because there was no
22 street blockage, MPD determined that no police

1 were necessary. No MPD police.

2 MR. STEWART: That's all I have,
3 Madam, thank you.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I just
5 want to ask, will you be there all day?

6 MR. BALL: I will.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, great.
8 Okay, any other questions? All right. Do you
9 have any other questions?

10 MR. BALL: No, ma'am.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

12 MR. COBURN: Thank you very much.

13 MR. BALL: Thank you.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well we're
15 going to, wait for this.

16 MR. COBURN: I think Craig asked
17 really good questions, I think it would be
18 great if those questions were added to
19 interrogative questionnaire.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, I hear
21 what you're saying.

22 MR. COBURN: Good questions.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, they are
2 good questions, yes, so okay. It was good to
3 hear your answers in person somewhat too and
4 add a little bit of a give and take about
5 what's happening.

6 I think that what happens you know
7 if, after many years if it's the same thing
8 then it becomes less necessary to come in
9 because I know that it's a little bit of an
10 effort to come in. But, and sometimes it can
11 make a difference to us to really understand
12 what you're doing and for you to hear some of
13 our concerns and --

14 MR. BALL: Absolutely, we're happy
15 to be here.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

17 MR. COBURN: And I have to admit
18 it's fun to come here in an non-adversarial
19 context.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So I hope to
21 make the festival. I don't know, I hope to.

22 MR. COBURN: Oh, I hope you can.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I heard great
2 things about it from last year.

3 MR. COBURN: And it's in that
4 really nice area now. It's --

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I know, that
6 parking lot is great for these events.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: I save my --

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What?

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- allowance
10 every year for your festival. I said, I save
11 my allowance every year for your festival.

12 MR. COBURN: Great.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you have a
14 question?

15 MR. COBURN: He wanted to know
16 when he might be able to pickup --

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right here,
18 we'll all set.

19 MR. COBURN: Thank you everybody.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you.

21 MR. STEWART: Thank you.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you

1 very much.

2 (Whereupon, the hearing in the
3 above-mentioned matter was adjourned at 10:50
4 a.m.)
