3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And our next  
4 case on the calendar is a Fact Finding Hearing  
5 scheduled for 10 o'clock. I don't know if the  
6 individuals are here for that, we could it  
7 start it early, if they're not we'll come back  
8 at 10:00.

9 Is anybody here for the case of,  
10 the Applicant is Michael Tabb, Georgetown  
11 Events located at 1315 K Street? Okay, not --

12 MR. ALBERTI: Well --

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

14 MR. ALBERTI: Mr. Pascal? Mr.  
15 Pascal?

16 MR. PASCAL: Yes.

17 MR. ALBERTI: Is your client for,  
18 oh, I'm sorry, I grabbed the wrong case. Well  
19 in that case never mind.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, never  
21 mind.

22 MR. ALBERTI: I thought you were

1 moving on. Never mind.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: That's all  
3 right.

4 MR. ALBERTI: I had the wrong  
5 case. Wrong case, never mind.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, so  
7 we'll recess and come back at 10:00.

8 (Off record comments)

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'll see if  
10 the other ones are here also, I guess. We  
11 have three Fact Finding Hearings. The next  
12 one is James Babin, is he here? That's not  
13 scheduled till 10:30.

14 And 11 o'clock is DCanter. I'm  
15 just --

16 (Off the record comments)

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, so then  
18 we can take a recess then since we're running  
19 ahead of schedule this morning.

20 (Whereupon, the foregoing matter  
21 went off the record at 9:49 a.m. and went back  
22 on the record at 10:02 a.m.)

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, we're  
2 back on the record. Yes, let me see if  
3 anybody is here for the second Fact Finding  
4 Hearing, which is not scheduled until 10:30,  
5 the Oktoberfest Event, James Babin? No, okay.

6 (Off the record comments)

7 (Whereupon, the foregoing matter  
8 went off the record at 10:08 a.m. and went  
9 back on the record at 10:12 a.m.)

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, we're  
11 back on the record for the fact-finding  
12 hearing of Michael Tabb with Georgetown  
13 Events, located at 1315 K Street, N.W. It's  
14 a fact-finding hearing on a temporary license  
15 application.

16 When you're ready would you  
17 introduce yourselves for the record please.

18 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I am Ross  
19 Brichelmaier. I am here with permission from  
20 Michael Tabb to represent the license, for the  
21 application for license. I'm here with  
22 Dannette Walker.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: What kind of  
2 permission? Do you have an authorization  
3 letter or anything?

4 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Sorry?

5 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you have  
6 an authorization letter or anything?

7 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I have the  
8 email, the correspondence between Dannette and  
9 Mike.

10 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: Between who?

11 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Between Michael  
12 Tabb and Dannette Walker. He's actually out  
13 of the country right now.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, I see.  
15 Okay, we see that. All right, thank you. And  
16 Mr. Jones?

17 MR. JONES: Earl Jones,  
18 investigator with ABRA.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All  
20 right, we're going to take a quick look at  
21 your application because you're a little bit  
22 late and we have another case at 10:30. Could

1 you just give us a very quick overview of your  
2 event?

3 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Sure. It's at  
4 the Sphinx Club. Do you want just capacity  
5 and all that stuff, or do you just want the  
6 general --

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Just general,  
8 what kind of party is this going to be?

9 MR. BRICHELMAIER: It's kind of a  
10 conglomeration of all our companies together,  
11 and we put together an event for Halloween and  
12 also for New Years. We do the same event for  
13 New Years without any problems.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Same amount  
15 of people, same people?

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Same, yes.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: The clientele  
18 are different companies, is that what you  
19 said?

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: So we actually  
21 promote within all of our restaurants and  
22 companies to get our, we basically have the

1 same following of all these restaurants and  
2 bars. So we're using that to bring all the  
3 same people into this Halloween event.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: How many  
5 restaurant and bars are involved? I mean, you  
6 have the following of how many?

7 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Between four  
8 and five.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And  
10 can you tell us who they are?

11 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Smith Point,  
12 Bayou on Pennsylvania Avenue, Jetty's in  
13 Surfside. There's multiple Jetty's locations.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Right, okay.  
15 So you're expecting the same amount of people  
16 as you had New Years?

17 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Same amount  
19 of security?

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And did you  
22 have any problems New Years?

1 MR. BRICHELMAIER: No. There were  
2 no issues last year. We used MPD overtime  
3 detail, and we also had between 12 and 15  
4 security. I believe that was on the  
5 application. And we had no issues as far as  
6 the event goes.

7 Also staff for this thing, it's  
8 going to be actual event staff to help us with  
9 any sort of load in and load out issues. But  
10 there are plenty of staff.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Is there an  
12 age limitation, like 21 and up, or no?

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes, it's 21  
14 and up.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, and how  
16 you are checking IDs?

17 MR. BRICHELMAIER: There are two  
18 people at the door, so the check-in there are  
19 two security at the door so they'll be  
20 checking the IDs, and then we'll be verifying  
21 tickets inside once they pass the initial  
22 security check.

1 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, when they  
2 get a drink you'll also check IDs? Is that  
3 what you said?

4 MR. BRICHELMAIER: The only people  
5 that will be inside will be 21 and up.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, so the  
7 check is at the front. Okay.

8 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes, so the  
9 very front entrance.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, all  
11 right. Board members have questions?

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yes, I do.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Sir, I missed  
15 your name. I'm sorry.

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Ross.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Ross?

18 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes,  
19 Brichelmaier.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: Your last name?

21 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Brichelmaier.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Brichelmaier.

1 Mr. Brichelmaier, okay, I'm a little confused  
2 since this is a temporary license. Are you  
3 using just the -- so we have the Sphinx Club.

4 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Sure.

5 MEMBER ALBERTI: At Franklin  
6 Square. Are you using just that license  
7 premise?

8 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Just the  
9 premise. Just for the Sphinx Club, yes.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Just the Sphinx  
11 Club. So I'm a little, why the temporary  
12 license, and maybe you don't understand this,  
13 but my question is --

14 MR. BRICHELMAIER: No, I do --

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- why a  
16 temporary license at a licensed establishment?

17 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I wasn't under  
18 the impression that they had a license. This  
19 is just how we did it with New Years, so we  
20 were going with the same procedure that we did  
21 last year.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, the Sphinx

1 Club has a CX license, I believe. So I guess  
2 just comments of more of my fellow board  
3 members, a little confused as to who becomes  
4 responsible for this event, the temporary  
5 license holder or is it the Sphinx license  
6 holder? And do you have permission from the  
7 Sphinx owners?

8 MR. BRICHELMAIER: We do. And I  
9 have the email from them with the letter with  
10 their C of O, their floor plans and  
11 everything.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Well, I'll  
13 look at the issue with my fellow board  
14 members. So what's the involvement of, at  
15 this point the Bayou, Surfside?

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct. So  
17 we're --

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: What's their  
19 involvement in this?

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: We're actually  
21 hosting the event, so Georgetown Events is,  
22 you know, we manage all these places so we're

1 doing it as a separate event to all our  
2 clientele that we're offering to.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So your  
4 outreach, your publicity is to the clientele  
5 of those establishments?

6 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Do they have any  
8 other involvement in this?

9 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I'm not sure  
10 what you mean. You mean as far as --

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: As providing  
12 staff, are they --

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes, so with  
14 most of the staff that we will have for the  
15 event will come from different establishments,  
16 whether it's security personnel or bartenders  
17 or other managers that will be there to help  
18 run the floor or the door.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Now the  
20 Sphinx Club has, I'm not familiar with the  
21 venue, but I believe it has, how many floors?  
22 Three floors?

1 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Two that we'll  
2 be using.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: What?

4 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Two that we  
5 will be using. I'm not sure if they have any  
6 other floors.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: You'll be using  
8 which floors?

9 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Their main  
10 ballroom and then their mezzanine level for  
11 the check-in.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So that's  
13 the only area that you're licensing for this  
14 event, correct?

15 MR. BRICHELMAIER: That's what we  
16 have permission from them to use.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. And  
18 you have, I think we have an application, 12  
19 private security?

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Are these  
22 security personnel who are normally employed

1 with the establishments that are  
2 participating?

3 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes, they are.

4 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, so they're

5 --

6 MR. BRICHELMAIER: No, it's not an  
7 outsourced company, no. We will be paying for  
8 MPD overtime detail --

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, so who are  
10 the security staff? Where are they coming  
11 from?

12 MR. BRICHELMAIER: They're coming  
13 from Smith Point or Bayou, or some of them  
14 will come from Fairgrounds.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, from where?

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Fairgrounds,  
17 down in Southwest.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, so these  
19 are people that are regularly employed by  
20 those establishments?

21 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: So it's not like

1 Metropolitan Security or some security firm.

2 MR. BRICHELMAIER: No.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. So they've  
4 been trained by those establishments as  
5 security personnel.

6 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, great. And  
8 the bartenders are coming from where?

9 MR. BRICHELMAIER: They'll also  
10 come from the other venues as well.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. And you  
12 have three MPD reimbursable detail?

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Just out  
15 of curiosity, who initiated the idea of  
16 getting a temporary license? I mean, was it  
17 you, was it Sphinx? Does Sphinx require you  
18 to do this?

19 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I'm not clear  
20 on who initiated it because I wasn't on the  
21 initial emails.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. You don't

1 know if the Sphinx said, well, we don't want  
2 to do this, we want you guys to get a temp?

3 MR. BRICHELMAIER: No, I don't  
4 think that was ever an issue with them. But  
5 I'm not sure whose idea it was. If it was  
6 easier for us to get the temporary license so  
7 that we were responsible for the alcohol that  
8 came in or, you know, I'm not really sure.

9 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. I have no  
10 further questions right now. Thank you.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr. Brooks?

12 MEMBER BROOKS: Yes. So you have  
13 a contract with the location?

14 MR. BRICHELMAIER: We do.

15 MEMBER BROOKS: Do, okay. And you  
16 said you had an event before, here, last year?

17 MR. BRICHELMAIER: We held a New  
18 Years' event there.

19 MEMBER BROOKS: Same thing?

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: A one-day  
21 temporary permit.

22 MEMBER BROOKS: Right.

1 MR. BRICHELMAIER: We essentially  
2 are paying for the even space, and then we  
3 become responsible for everything else.

4 MEMBER BROOKS: I see, okay.  
5 Thank you.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, just as  
7 a follow-up, you are responsible for the  
8 alcohol and, I don't know what the contract  
9 says or anything, but determine the alcohol  
10 and all liability for what might happen during  
11 your event as opposed to the Sphinx Club, is  
12 that right?

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, and  
15 that's basically in the contract?

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes.

17 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

18 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I believe  
19 they're indemnified within our rental  
20 agreement.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Mr.  
22 Jones?

1                   MEMBER JONES: I guess kind of  
2                   pardon my ignorance. I don't know what took  
3                   place at the previous event, so could you kind  
4                   of explain it to me? I know you're saying  
5                   you're kind of doing the same thing. You were  
6                   using the same floors?

7                   MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct. So  
8                   there's a mezzanine level and then it goes  
9                   downstairs --

10                  MEMBER JONES: Okay.

11                  MR. BRICHELMAIER: -- and it's  
12                  adjacent to their underground parking lot  
13                  that's within the building. On New Years we  
14                  had live entertainment as far as bands and  
15                  then we had DJs afterwards. It ran until 2:00  
16                  a.m. which I believe is the same operating  
17                  hours for here, maybe an hour earlier because  
18                  it's not New Years. We'll have food. And I'm  
19                  not sure what else.

20                  MEMBER JONES: Okay, so you all  
21                  are responsible for the alcohol?

22                  MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

1 MEMBER JONES: Where are you  
2 getting the alcohol from?

3 MR. BRICHELMAIER: From public and  
4 premium, whatever, distributors.

5 MEMBER JONES: Okay. Are they  
6 delivering that date or the day before? How  
7 is that --

8 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I believe it  
9 will be the day of.

10 MEMBER JONES: Okay. All right.  
11 And you're utilizing seven bar areas?

12 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct, as far  
13 as -- yes.

14 MEMBER JONES: Okay. And  
15 security, how are security positioned  
16 throughout the event as far as these areas are  
17 concerned and the entrances and exits?

18 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Sure. Of the  
19 15, the first initial check-in will have  
20 between five and six at the initial check-in.

21 MEMBER JONES: Okay.

22 MR. BRICHELMAIER: And then as

1 people are checked in and they're inside, then  
2 we'll have two stationed at the door just to  
3 maintain flow inside and outside, and then  
4 there'll be 12 within the venue, you know,  
5 near the stairwell and then at the different  
6 bar areas and at the stage.

7 MEMBER JONES: This ballroom  
8 picture, is that the first level?

9 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Which one are  
10 you looking at?

11 MEMBER JONES: The single  
12 ballroom.

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes, this is  
14 the --

15 MEMBER JONES: This is the  
16 entrance?

17 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Well, the  
18 entrance is on the mezzanine.

19 MEMBER JONES: And you said you  
20 had three detail, MPD detail?

21 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

22 MEMBER JONES: Okay. All of the

1 bartenders are TIPS certified?

2 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes, they are.

3 MEMBER JONES: All right.

4 MR. BRICHELMAIER: And also the  
5 two floor managers that will be there as well.

6 MEMBER JONES: Okay. And as far  
7 as staff for you guys, how many do you have  
8 that are employed to be the ones that are  
9 within the --

10 MR. BRICHELMAIER: You mean as far  
11 as --

12 MEMBER JONES: As far as your  
13 group is concerned. Do you have staff --

14 (Crosstalk)

15 MEMBER JONES: -- managers or --

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: There will be  
17 two floor managers and then one main, so there  
18 will be three.

19 MEMBER JONES: Okay. And they're  
20 part of your group?

21 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

22 MEMBER JONES: And what are their

1 duties?

2 MR. BRICHELMAIER: The one at the  
3 door will be just to deal with any issues with  
4 tickets or anything that people are coming in.  
5 And then floor issues, if there's a security  
6 concern then the security will report to that  
7 floor manager. And then the overall manager  
8 is just to see that the flow's going  
9 correctly.

10 MEMBER JONES: Okay. How are you  
11 all selling tickets?

12 MR. BRICHELMAIER: We're using  
13 Eventbrite.

14 MEMBER JONES: And what is the  
15 maximum amount of tickets to be sold?

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I believe it's  
17 between 700 and 800.

18 MEMBER JONES: And how do you come  
19 to that number? Then are you selling online  
20 as well or --

21 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Only online.

22 MEMBER JONES: It's only online?

1 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Correct.

2 MEMBER JONES: Okay.

3 MR. BRICHELMAIER: And we come to  
4 that number, that's based upon the occupancy  
5 which I believe is over 1,000. But we wanted  
6 to keep that down.

7 MEMBER JONES: So what you get,  
8 800 in total. If the service or the website,  
9 it let's you know that. Okay.

10 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Well, we get an  
11 email any time we get a sale and then they  
12 give us a weekly report. They send us a  
13 weekly report of the sales.

14 MEMBER JONES: Okay. I think  
15 that's all I have.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, any  
17 other questions? Okay, any other comments?  
18 I think that where we're at is, you know, your  
19 event sounds very similar to the one you had  
20 before. And as far as the substantive issues,  
21 you know, security, ID checking, I don't think  
22 there are concerns.

1           But there is a question though  
2           about this relationship between the temporary  
3           license and the CX license that the Sphinx  
4           Club has.

5           MR. BRICHELMAIER:   Correct.

6           CHAIRPERSON MILLER:   So I think  
7           that I'm going to suggest that the Board just  
8           look into that issue this afternoon, and then  
9           we'll just get back to you on the application.

10          Mr. Jones, did you have a question  
11          or a comment?

12          MEMBER JONES:   I've got one more  
13          question, or a couple more questions.  I'm  
14          sorry.

15          CHAIRPERSON MILLER:   Okay, that's  
16          fine.

17          MEMBER JONES:   With reference to,  
18          I guess, the age limit, what is the age limit  
19          or what is the, how are you going to determine  
20          who's able to drink and who can't drink?  What  
21          are the age limits that you're in?

22          MR. BRICHELMAIER:   So it is 21 and

1 up, and most of our establishments are in the  
2 25 to 35 range as it is, so we don't really  
3 cater to the college age level.

4 MEMBER JONES: Okay.

5 MR. BRICHELMAIER: We didn't have  
6 any issues with that last year with New Years,  
7 because I believe, you know, it is marketed as  
8 as a 21 and up and I don't think that people  
9 want to waste their money trying to get in.

10 MEMBER JONES: Okay. All right,  
11 so you guys, you're not dealing with the bands  
12 and all that kind of stuff.

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: You mean as far  
14 as like paying the bands and stuff? We did go  
15 --

16 (Crosstalk)

17 MEMBER JONES: Right. So if  
18 you're saying it's 21 and up, so you're not  
19 dealing with putting bands on people.

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Oh, you mean  
21 wrist bands. No, sorry. I thought you meant  
22 the live band. No, we're not dealing with

1 that just because, you know, there is a cutoff  
2 at 21.

3 MEMBER JONES: Okay. And if you  
4 were to have, that's not something that we  
5 want, but if something was to happen as far as  
6 some type of incident, alcohol related  
7 incident, how are you guys planning on dealing  
8 with that?

9 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I mean the  
10 standard protocol would be to, you know, if it  
11 was a security personnel or a bartender that  
12 noticed the issue or something else that was  
13 going on, the manager would be informed. And  
14 then MPD is there to support us.

15 So if they were to, you know, call  
16 in the lieutenant or sergeant, whoever was  
17 there that the procedure would be to go from,  
18 you know, the security bartender staff to the  
19 floor manager to the manager to, you know,  
20 basically pass it up the chain of command. So  
21 everybody's trained in as far as the  
22 contingencies go with that procedure.

1 MEMBER JONES: Okay. Okay.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So,  
3 you know, the purpose of the fact finding is  
4 that you are here, we could ask you these  
5 questions.

6 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Sure.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: However, I  
8 just want to make sure, since I think the one  
9 issue that we're still not clear about is that  
10 temporary license, do you have any other  
11 information that would shed light on that  
12 question as to how it came about --

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: No.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- that  
15 you're in that arrangement? No, okay.

16 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I don't. I'm  
17 sorry.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, I just  
19 wanted to make sure while you're here.

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Yes. No, I  
21 don't have anything with me. No.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay,

1 anything else?

2 MEMBER JONES: No.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Mr.

4 Silverstein?

5 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I do have  
6 just one question here. We're on a very tight  
7 schedule and we want to get things done today  
8 because we're under the gun with the federal  
9 shutdown. Is there a reason you were late?

10 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I was getting a  
11 parking ticket, actually, outside.

12 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I'm sorry?

13 MR. BRICHELMAIER: I was trying to  
14 park my car and I was in the middle of getting  
15 a parking ticket. So I was trying to deal  
16 with that. I tried to park underneath but  
17 there was --

18 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: No, not good  
19 enough.

20 MR. BRICHELMAIER: All right.  
21 Well, I apologize.

22 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, so just

1 to be clear then, I think you've answered all  
2 our questions and we're going to look into  
3 that legal question. And then we'll  
4 definitely get back to you soon, probably our  
5 general counsel.

6 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Okay, great.

7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And if you  
8 have any questions, if you don't hear  
9 anything, you can call Ms. Jenkins. But we  
10 plan on looking at this issue today.

11 MR. BRICHELMAIER: Great. Thank  
12 you.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Thank you  
14 very much.
