P-R-O-C-E-E-D-I-N-G-S

(9:52 a.m.)

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Is anyone here for our Fact-Finding Hearing on the pub crawl, the Christmas Crawl/Tacky Sweater Bar Crawl? He is running late. Okay. I think we had a phone call from that person.

(Whereupon, at 9:53 a.m. a recess until 10:12 a.m.)

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Are the individuals here for The Christmas Crawl/Tacky Sweater Bar Crawl? Okay. Okay. She will help you in a minute. Thank you. Okay. Okay. If you are ready?

MR. KAPLAR: Ready. Fire away.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Introduce yourself for the record, please.

MR. KAPLAR: My name is John Kaplar. I'm the Director of The Christmas Crawl.

CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: I'm

1 Investigator Kofi Apraku. Last name spelled  
2 A-P-R-A-K-U with ABRA.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm sorry,  
4 what did you -- who did you say your title  
5 was, Mr. Kaplar?

6 MR. KAPLAR: The Director of The  
7 Christmas Crawl.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Director of  
9 The Christmas Crawl. Okay. So have you done  
10 one of these before?

11 MR. KAPLAR: My third time here,  
12 yes.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Third time  
14 here. Okay. Let's make this quick. Same  
15 area, same establishments?

16 MR. KAPLAR: Mostly, yes, and a  
17 couple different establishments. The only new  
18 one is the Fiesta Restaurant and Lounge.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And  
20 have you checked out all these establishments  
21 with ABRA to make sure that they can  
22 participate?

1 MR. KAPLAR: Yes.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Good.

3 Is this event, basically, the same as the last  
4 two or has it been growing or what?

5 MR. KAPLAR: It has been growing.

6 This year we expect around 1,300 people. Last  
7 year we had about 1,200.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

9 MR. KAPLAR: It's about the same.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Any problems  
11 last year?

12 MR. KAPLAR: Nope, very smooth.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

14 MR. KAPLAR: Yes.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. Have  
16 you changed anything this year? Improved it  
17 by any --

18 MR. KAPLAR: We added that one  
19 bar, so we have 12 bars and then we have 45  
20 food and drink specials.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Have  
22 you checked with MPD?

1 MR. KAPLAR: Yes. They are  
2 scheduled to have six officers on duty at the  
3 Front Page Restaurant.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Great. And  
5 quickly, what's your IDing process?

6 MR. KAPLAR: We have two people at  
7 the entrance to the Front Page Restaurant.

8 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: At  
9 registration?

10 MR. KAPLAR: Yes.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. So you  
12 get wristbands?

13 MR. KAPLAR: If they walk through,  
14 then the wristbands or cash sales.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And --  
16 okay. All right. And each bar has their own  
17 security? Is that going to be the situation?

18 MR. KAPLAR: Right.

19 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: And do you  
20 have, I'm just skimming this now, a contact  
21 person for the participants if they have any  
22 problems?

1 MR. KAPLAR: We do on the handout  
2 that each crawler is given, there is a phone  
3 number.

4 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Great.  
5 Okay. All right. Board Members have  
6 questions?

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Your cups, are  
8 they opaque or translucent?

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: There is a  
10 cup actually in the flyer.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: I see it, but I  
12 can't tell. Is it translucent or --

13 MR. KAPLAR: Oh, it's red. No,  
14 it's not translucent.

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay.

16 MR. KAPLAR: It's a solid red.

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: Personally, as a  
18 Board Member, next year I would ask that you  
19 consider translucent cups like the previous.  
20 It's just easier. You've got thousands of  
21 people, it would be nice if our Investigators  
22 and the police could tell very quickly whether

1 someone has got a liquid in their cup.

2 MR. KAPLAR: Okay.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: It just helps  
4 everybody. I know it's hard to monitor,  
5 people are walking around and people escape  
6 from the establishments and haven't finished  
7 the drink. It just makes it easier so to  
8 prevent people from drinking on the street.

9 MR. KAPLAR: And that's actually a  
10 change I can make for this crawl.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Great.  
12 Thanks.

13 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So are you  
14 having additional security to each  
15 establishment's security?

16 MR. KAPLAR: From last year, yes,  
17 we are. We pumped it up, I think, two  
18 officers and two more private security  
19 officers from last year.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So I mean, it  
21 says -- I'm looking at your page 3 it says  
22 total number of hired Christmas Crawl

1 employees for security, 10.

2 MR. KAPLAR: Yes, those are my  
3 friends, football guys, the big guys that will  
4 be there for crowd control and direct people  
5 to and from.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: So they will  
7 be roaming in between the establishments?

8 MR. KAPLAR: No, just at the Front  
9 Page.

10 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Just at the  
11 Front Page. 10, okay. Is there anybody  
12 roaming in between, you know, on the streets  
13 to make sure there are no problems?

14 MR. KAPLAR: There is not, no.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: No, you  
16 didn't -- you have never done that?

17 MR. KAPLAR: I haven't.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And  
19 how many are on-call? Are you on-call for a  
20 problem?

21 MR. KAPLAR: I'll be there, you  
22 know, of course, but we can actually hire more

1 people to roam the streets if that's needed or  
2 more officers.

3 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: We have had  
4 not necessarily even officers, but we have  
5 heard from other pub crawls where they have  
6 had just had employees or whoever just out on  
7 the streets where they are walking just to see  
8 how everything is going.

9 MR. KAPLAR: Okay. That's not  
10 scheduled, but we can definitely do that.

11 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.  
12 I think that has worked well.

13 MEMBER ALBERTI: Have we asked who  
14 the establishments contact if they notice  
15 somebody?

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, the  
17 contact, not really, no.

18 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, sir, do you  
19 have a -- have you explained to the  
20 establishments that they -- have you given  
21 them a contact number to alert you of any  
22 problems that they are having?

1 MR. KAPLAR: Yes.

2 MEMBER ALBERTI: So that you can  
3 pass information on to the other  
4 establishments saying well, we've got two or  
5 three guys here you better watch out for?

6 MR. KAPLAR: Yes, sir.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay, you do.

8 MR. KAPLAR: Yes. They have my  
9 cell phone and also Ryan, he is the assistant.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: Okay. Great.  
11 Thank you.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Any  
13 other questions? Okay. Mr. Apraku?

14 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Yes. I had  
15 one issue with the Midtown. From my -- from  
16 the research that I did this morning, it  
17 states that its voluntary agreement says that  
18 they cannot have -- they cannot participate in  
19 pub crawls. They had an early amendment, but  
20 the amendment -- the amended voluntary  
21 agreement states that the previous voluntary  
22 agreement still remains in full effect and

1           that one does state that they cannot  
2           participate in pub crawls.

3                         So that was, I guess, maybe the  
4           only issue that I had with the applicant's  
5           application, if that -- that they cannot  
6           participate.

7                         MEMBER BROOKS: Thank you, Mr.  
8           Apraku.

9                         CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yeah.

10                        MEMBER BROOKS: Thank you.

11                        MR. KAPLAR: So how do we go about  
12           this? Do we kick them off the crawl or --  
13           yes?

14                        CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

15                        MR. KAPLAR: Okay.

16                        CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I mean, did  
17           somebody tell you that could participate?

18                        MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, Ms. Miller,  
19           what I would suggest is that I would be  
20           willing to approve this with -- contingent  
21           upon a final decision on Midtown. And I would  
22           ask that Mr. Kaplar consult with our general

1           counsel who will review the voluntary  
2           agreement, make a final decision as to whether  
3           they can participate and if they can't, then  
4           you need to remove them from your pub crawl.

5                        I think we should -- we can just  
6           allow our general counsel to review this and  
7           make a final decision. I appreciate Mr.  
8           Apraku bringing that to our attention.

9                        CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Do you have  
10          that with you?

11                       INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: I do have it  
12          with me.

13                       CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Look at it  
14          now?

15                       MEMBER ALBERTI: Do you want to  
16          look at it now? Okay.

17                       MR. KAPLAR: What's the time frame  
18          for that? Is that pretty quick to --

19                       CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Ms. Jenkins  
20          can look at it right now. Right now.

21                       MEMBER ALBERTI: Yeah, it's quick.  
22          We understand that you really need to move

1 along here on this thing.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But can I  
3 ask, I want to ask you if you, you know, knew  
4 that all these could participate? What was  
5 that based on?

6 MR. KAPLAR: We have a signed  
7 contract which states that they know that they  
8 have to follow the ABRA Guidelines.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh.

10 MR. KAPLAR: And they sign that  
11 contract.

12 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: It was on  
13 their representation?

14 MR. KAPLAR: Yes.

15 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.  
16 Because we do have our Investigator go over  
17 the list and I didn't know whether you had  
18 done that before or not with an Investigator.

19 MR. KAPLAR: I trusted them.

20 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yeah, okay.

21 MR. KAPLAR: A mistake, I guess.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Kaplar, in

1 the future, I mean, we are here to help.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes.

3 MEMBER ALBERTI: You can contact  
4 our general counsel and have her -- give her  
5 the list of establishments and she will have  
6 staff review them and report back to you. And  
7 it makes it easier. You come in and you'll be  
8 confident that you have the right answers.

9 MR. KAPLAR: Okay.

10 MEMBER ALBERTI: So you might want  
11 to do that a week ahead of time before,  
12 because a lot of establishments aren't paying  
13 attention. I mean, they don't know.  
14 Sometimes they don't know whether they are  
15 eligible or not.

16 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Okay.  
17 So there wasn't enough information to be  
18 really sure about the agreement, so we don't  
19 want to rush that. So, I mean, basically, I  
20 think the Board is amenable to approving, you  
21 know, this pub crawl as is. But if we find  
22 when -- our general counsel is going to look

1 at the underlying agreement, which I don't  
2 think is right here right this minute, if we  
3 find that they are not eligible, we will tell  
4 you and strike it from the application.

5 MR. KAPLAR: Okay.

6 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. All  
7 right.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: We will do the  
9 quickly.

10 MR. KAPLAR: All right. I  
11 appreciate it.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: You're welcome.  
13 Thank you.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yeah. It's  
15 not a complicated thing, but we just don't  
16 have it here right now.

17 MR. KAPLAR: Okay.

18 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But in the  
19 future, next year, yeah, check with ABRA.

20 MR. KAPLAR: Yes.

21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Yes, okay.

22 MR. KAPLAR: Thank you.

1 MEMBER ALBERTI: Good luck.

2 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Thank  
3 you. Have a good event. All right. Thank  
4 you very much. I think that's it for pub  
5 crawls. Is it not?

6 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Nick's  
7 Riverside Grill?

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: Right.

9 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, I don't  
10 have it. Oh, okay, got it.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: The bottom of  
12 page 8. At the bottom of page 8.

13 INVESTIGATOR APRAKU: Yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.

15 (Whereupon, the Fact-Finding  
16 Hearing in the above-entitled matter was  
17 concluded at 10:24 a.m.)
