**ORDER ON AMENDMENT TO SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT
AND WITHDRAWAL OF PROTESTS**

The Application filed by Pilar Hospitality Group, LLC, t/a Bar Pilar (Applicant), for a Substantial Change to include a Summer Garden to its Retailer's Class CR License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on November 30, 2015, and a Protest Status Hearing on January 13, 2016, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001).

The official records of the Board reflect that the Applicant, ANC 1B, and A Group of Five or More Individuals, entered into Settlement Agreement (Agreement), dated June 16, 2009, that governs the operation of the Applicant's establishment. This matter comes now before the

Board to consider the Parties' Amendment to Settlement Agreement (Amendment), dated January 2016, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-446 (2001).

The Agreement has been reduced to writing and has been properly executed and filed with the Board. The Applicant; Commissioners James A. Turner and John Green, on behalf of ANC 1B; and Joan E. Sterling, on behalf of SDCA; are signatories to the Agreement.

This Agreement constitutes a withdrawal of the Protests filed by ANC 1B and SDCA.

Accordingly, it is this 24th day of February, 2016, **ORDERED** that:

1. The Application filed by Pilar Hospitality Group, LLC, t/a Bar Pilar, for a Substantial Change to include a Summer Garden to its Retailer's Class CT License, located at 1835 14th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., is **GRANTED**;
2. The Protests of ANC 1B and SDCA in this matter are hereby **DISMISSED**;
3. The above-referenced Amendment to Settlement Agreement, dated January 2016, submitted by the parties to govern the operations of the Applicant's establishment is **APPROVED** and **INCORPORATED** as part of this Order, except for the following modifications:

Section A (Summer Garden Hours) – The term “shall” shall be replaced for the term “may”.


Section B (Summer Garden Capacity) – This Section shall be modified to read as follows: “Pilar hereby agrees to abide by and not exceed the number of seats listed on its Certificate of Occupancy issued by the DC Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs.”

Section E (Use of Entertainment Endorsement on Summer Garden) – The following language shall be removed: “...and agrees that it will send a notice to the ANC and Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance at least two weeks prior to each of the six such uses.”

The parties have agreed to these modifications.

4. All terms and conditions of the original Agreement, not amended by the Amendment, shall remain in full force and effect; and
5. Copies of this Order shall be sent to the Applicant, ANC 1B, and SDCA.





Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. ~~AMENDMENT TO VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT~~ *Paul*

THIS AMENDMENT TO VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT ("Amendment"), made and entered into this ___ day of January 2016, by and between *10 12 14 920* ~~Pilar Hospitality Group, LLC~~ t/a Bar Pilar ("Pilar"), Advisory Neighborhood Commission 1B ("ANC 1B") and Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Pilar is the holder of a Retailer's License Class CT for premises known as Bar Pilar located at 1833 14th Street, NW, Washington, DC 20009;

WHEREAS, Pilar entered into a Voluntary Agreement dated June 16, 2009 (the "Agreement"), which agreement was approved by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and remains in full force and effect;

WHEREAS, Pilar has now applied for a substantial change to its license, to allow Pilar to operate a rooftop summer garden (the "Summer Garden");

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this Amendment whereby Pilar will adopt certain measures to address ANC 1B's and Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance concerns, such measures to be formal conditions to the approval of the license conversion, in exchange for ANC 1B's and Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance agreement to the substantial change and withdrawal of their protest.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and undertakings hereinafter set forth and other good and valuable consideration, Pilar and ANC 1B and Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance hereby agree as follows.

A. Summer Garden Hours. Pilar hereby agrees that the Summer Garden shall remain open until the maximum permitted hours on the license for the establishment, but

will agree to close the retractable roof above the Summer Garden by 12:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday nights (technically Saturday and Sunday mornings) and 11:00 p.m. on the evenings of Sunday through Thursday.

B. Summer Garden Capacity. Pilar hereby agrees that the "No. of Seats" for the Summer Garden set forth on the Certificate of Occupancy to be issued by the District of Columbia Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs for the Premises shall not exceed forty-five (45).

C. Entire Agreement. This Amendment and the Agreement set forth the entire understanding of the parties with respect to Pilar's alcoholic beverage license.

D. Withdrawal of Protest. In consideration of Pilar's agreement to the provisions of this Amendment, ANC 1B and Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance supports Pilar's application for a substantial change, and hereby withdraws its protest to the application, and joins with Pilar in requesting that the substantial change be granted and the license be issued in accordance with the Board's normal procedures.

E. Use of entertainment endorsement on Summer Garden. Pilar agrees that it will not use its entertainment endorsement on the Summer Garden more than six times per year, and agrees that it will send a notice to the ANC and Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance at least two weeks prior to each of the six such uses.

F. Full Force and Effect. Except as specifically provided herein, the Agreement remains in full force and effect.

G. Business Improvement District (BID) Pledge. ~~The Applicant hereby acknowledges that they are aware of efforts to form a BID in the neighborhood and pledges to contact the BID and explore ways to support its creation.~~

ORDER ON VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT AND DISMISSAL OF PROTEST

The official records of the Alcoholic Control Board (Board) reflect that Pilar Hospitality Group, LLC, t/a Bar Pilar, Applicant for Class Change from Retailer's Class CR to Class CT License located at 1833 14th Street, N.W., Washington D.C., and Brianne Nadeau, Chair, ANC 1B, Peter Raia, Commissioner, ANC 1B, and Ronald Clayton, on behalf of a Group of Five Protestants (collectively, the Parties) have entered into a Voluntary Agreement (Agreement) dated June 16, 2009, setting forth the terms and conditions that govern the operation of the Applicant's establishment. This Agreement constitutes a withdrawal of the Protest of this Application.¹

¹ The Board notes that although three individuals, Ramon Estrada, Phyllis Klein, and Juan Mayer, seceded from the Group of Five or More Protestants represented by Ronald Clayton and are not signatories to the Voluntary Agreement, they lack standing on their own to protest this Application pursuant to D.C. Code § 25-601. Thus, their Protest is, by this Order, **dismissed** for want of standing under this provision. The Board further notes that it received a letter regarding the designation of a different representative on June 18, 2009, for certain individuals; however, that letter was received after the signed Voluntary Agreement had been submitted to the Board for approval.







**VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT CONCERNING CHANGE OF
LICENSE CLASS, PILAR HOSPITALITY GROUP, LLC**

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this ~~16~~^{16th} day, June, 2009 by and among Pilar Hospitality Group, LLC (the "Applicant"), Advisory Neighborhood Commission 1B ("ANC 1B"), Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2B ("ANC 2B"), and Ronald Clayton, on his own behalf and on behalf of hereinafter named individual protestants ("Clayton"); (ANC 1B, ~~ANC 2B~~ and Clayton are sometimes hereinafter referred to as "Protestants")

WITNESETH

WHEREAS, Applicant is the holder of a Retailer's License Class CR02 for premises known as Bar Pilar located at 1833 14th Street, NW, Washington, DC

WHEREAS, Applicant has filed an application with the District of Columbia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board ("ABC Board") for conversion of its license to a Class CT01;

WHEREAS, Protestants have filed a protest opposing the conversion of the license class;

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this Voluntary Agreement whereby Applicant will adopt certain measures to address Protestants' concerns, such measures to be formal conditions to the approval of the license conversion, in exchange for Protestants' agreement to the license conversion and withdrawal of their protest.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and undertakings hereinafter set forth and other good and valuable consideration, the Applicant and Protestants hereby agree as follows.

A. MINIMUM FOOD SERVICE. Applicant will be held to a standard of forty percent (40%) of the gross annual receipts from the sale of food or having annual gross food sales of \$1,800.00 per occupant. Applicant agrees that the establishment will be shut down and completely vacated, except for routine maintenance and cleanup, by closing time each night. Applicant agrees that there shall be no after-hours activity.

B. RECYCLING. Applicant agrees that no glass recyclable material shall be dumped in outside containers after 9:00 p.m.

C. TRANSPORTATION AND PARKING. Applicant shall encourage transit use.

D. MODIFICATION OF VOLUNTRARY AGREEMENT. This Agreement may be modified only by mutual agreement of the parties with the approval of the ABC Board for acceptance and enforcement.

E. BINDING EFFECT. This Voluntary Agreement shall be binding upon and enforceable against the successors and assigns of the Applicant during the term of the license to which this Voluntary Agreement applies.

F. NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY TO CURE. In the event that any of the parties is in breach of this Agreement, it shall be entitled to reasonable notice and opportunity to cure, as a condition precedent to seeking enforcement of the Agreement. Unless the breach is of an emergency nature or is a repetition of a prior breach, reasonable notice and opportunity shall provide for a cure within thirty days of the date of such notice. If Applicant or the licensee fails to cure within the thirty day period (or, with respect to a breach which reasonably requires more than thirty days to cure, fails to

commence cure of such breach and diligently pursues such cure) failure shall constitute a cause for seeking a Show Cause Order from the ABC Board pursuant to DC Official Code 25-447. Unless otherwise noted above, any notices required to be made under this Agreement shall be in writing and mailed via certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or hand delivered, to the other parties to this Agreement at the following addresses. Notice shall be deemed given as of the time of receipt or refusal of receipt.

G. WITHDRAWAL OF PROTEST. In consideration of Applicant's agreement to the provisions of this Voluntary Agreement, the Protestants support the conversion and issuance of a Class CT license to Applicant, and hereby withdraw their protests to the conversion of the License, and join with the Applicant in requesting that a Retailer's Class CT01 license be issued in accordance with the Board's normal procedures.

H. AUTHORITY.

Clayton signs this Agreement on his own behalf and on behalf of Tanja Bos, Tobyn J. Anderson, Ken Patterson, Richard Tanenbaum, Susan B. Fulton, Alexander Lofgren, Dion Sutton, Jennifer Boone, Rodney Jackson, Alex Mayer, Tom Lewis, Juliana Thorpe, Tom Coumaris, Zelda Litwin, P.D. Klein, Russell L. Page, Jr.,

Allen W. Rotz, Elwyn Ferris, Eric A. Muhl, Barry Selinger, Cameron Russell, Sarah De Witt, Nicholas Ackerson, Philip McNamara, Yukina C. Koike, Samantha Beisel, James G. Parks, Norma P. Lombardi, Jennifer Taylor, and Liesel Danjczek (the “Group of 5 Protestants”). Clayton warrants that he is authorized to sign this Agreement on behalf of the Group of 5 Protestants. Representatives of ANC 1B and ~~ANC 2B~~, by their signatures below, represent that they have been authorized to sign this Agreement by their respective Commissions. Applicant represents that Michael L. Benson, who has signed as Managing Member of Pilar Hospitality Group, LLC, is authorized to sign this Agreement on behalf of Applicant.

WHEREFORE, by the signing of the representatives of Applicant and Protestant, Applicant hereby agrees to aforementioned covenants and Protestants agrees to the issuance of the Class CT license to Applicant, and withdraws its protest, provided that this agreement is incorporated into the ABC Board’s order issuing a Class CT license, the issuance of which is conditioned upon compliance with the Voluntary Agreement.


