FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Who is eligible to participate?

All on-premises establishments that do not have a settlement agreement or Board Order with any opening hours restrictions. Temporary license applications are also eligible under the law.

What period of extended hours is covered by the law?

The period starts at 7 a.m. on June 14, 2018, the first day of the FIFA World Cup Tournament, and continues each morning until July 15, the final day of the tournament. Closing hours for registered establishments will remain the same.

What is the fee for registration?

The fee for registration is \$100, which covers the entire eligible period.

When is the deadline to register?

The deadline to register is Thursday, June 7, 2018.

Does the law extend the hours of my entertainment endorsement?

No, you would need to file a one-day substantial change application with ABRA to extend the hours of entertainment listed on your entertainment endorsement.

Where do I submit the registration form?

Registration forms may be submitted to ABRA by email (abc@dc.gov), mail or in person at: 2000 14th Street, NW, Suite 400S, Washington, DC, 20009 (Office Hours: 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m., Monday-Friday).

What happens after I am approved?

Once a licensee is registered in the program, ABRA will provide the licensee with a separate 2018 World Cup license, which must be posted in a visible location at the establishment for the entire eligible period. ABRA will notify the Metropolitan Police Department of all registered establishments.

NOTICE: The District of Columbia will provide the appropriate services and auxiliary aids, including sign language interpreters, whenever necessary to ensure effective communication with members of the public who are deaf, hearing impaired or who have other disabilities affecting communications.
