**ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE**


The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Jacqueline February, t/a 4th Street Market, located at 6900 4th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., has failed to renew its License No. ABRA-020058, a Retailer's Class B License. Specifically, you failed to renew your license by September 30, 2011, the deadline for all Retailer's Class B licenses, despite being notified of the renewal date.

On December 14, 2011, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist against Jacqueline February, t/a 4th Street Market, located at 6900 4th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to renew its Retailer's Class B License.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-501, you are therefore **ORDERED** by the Board on this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2012, that Jacqueline February's license No. ABRA-020058 is **CANCELLED**.




