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PROCEEDINGS
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So the second pub crawl is for the Annual Bourbon Bash on June 18th, 2016. All right.

MR. KRAMER: For -- for the Bourbon Bash I would just note this is in a much smaller geographic area in Chinatown.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, why don't you tell us -- so since we just had a fact-finding hearing on another case. So prior to Mr. Leftwich talking about the event why don't you explain to us what is this D.C. Bourbon Bash.

MR. KRAMER: So this is a -- this would be the fourth annual event that we've done. The last -this would be the third year I believe in Chinatown after the first year was in DuPont. And so it's a -- a bourbon tasting event that we do right around Father's Day every year. It actually ends up being a popular Father's Day gift which I had no idea would happen, but it worked out. And Chinatown gets a little bit less crowded during the summer because there's less things going on at Verizon unless the Caps go all the way. And

1 you gets a one ounce taste at each place you go. We use

2 measured speed pourers to ensure that there are not
3 over-pourings. That is what is included in the ticket.
4 And then food at the establishments that serve food or

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INVESTIGATOR LEFTWICH: The only question that I have is clarification of check-in, start time, and what time it includes in relation to the time of the entire event.

MR. KRAMER: Check in until -- noon to three, event until 10. After 10 done. And that's -that's the case with every event. When the event is over it's over. And if they want to continue their night, they can do it, whatever they want. But the event itself is over and done with.

INVESTIGATOR LEFTWICH: And can you speak in regards to your promotional material and what it

1 states -- what information is in that.

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MR. KRAMER: Good Friends.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good Friends?
MR. KRAMER: The same -- the same as we just
did.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. And just one last question, Mr. Leftwich.

MR. KRAMER: Yes, sir.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, for Mr. Leftwich. They're -- all of these establishments are able to participate in a pub crawl?

INVESTIGATOR LEFTWICH: Yes, and are in good standing.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Do we have any questions for any for any board members? Yes, Ms. Miller.

MS. MILLER: Mr. Kramer --

MR. KRAMER: Yes, ma'am.

MS. MILLER: -- this is the fourth year, right?

MR. KRAMER: Yes, ma'am.
MS. MILLER: Okay. Do you have a record of the number of participants each year?

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MR. KRAMER: If you give me a second, I do. This is one of the smaller ones that we do, and its been in the middle hundreds most $I$ think all three years. It would take me a second to pull that up. But this has never been a four digit event.

MS. MILLER: Okay. I mean and I ask because we -- you know, we say the number 500 to 2,000. And I'm sure -- I'm pretty sure Mr. Short could speak for himself -- but that the 500 is probably palatable but the 200 seems, you know --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 2,000 you mean.
MS. MILLER: -- 2000 seems high. Right.
And if you -- if you even -- you put that in as your maximum. But, you know, we know that normally you're getting 600 or something. It's just good to know I think.

MR. KRAMER: Right. Last year was 534. I think the year before was actually a little bit bigger, but it's around there. But again, you know, that's there because I -- I know -- well, I'm -- I'm very confident that especially with the size of the venues in Chinatown and the context of $15,20,000$ people at the

1 Verizon Center 2,000 is -- I mean nothing to these people. I mean the Caps are in the playoffs right now which would make a Caps playoff game the wrong time to do it. But yeah. But -- but even -- even if there would be -- and we've actually come across this. Even if there is a big concert at Verizon Center that night, then, you know, we've -- we've applied for the event to be from 12 to 10 . But some venues might say, you know what, we need this to end at eight. And so Ms. Miller's bar might end the event at eight, and the other bars that are farther away might actually go through ten. And that's how we -- we address that.

MS. MILLER: Okay.
MR. KRAMER: That's rare. But that --

MS. MILLER: So -- so when you say
anticipated number you really do mean that number and the maximum is just if something happens and you get a --

MR. KRAMER: I -- I gave up trying to predict how many people are going to buy tickets to each event.

MS. MILLER: Okay.

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22 -- or 1,000 you tell us how you come up with your

1 numbers so we'll know how to approach the numbers.

MR. KRAMER: Right. So these are based on what has worked and what we have seen numerically in the last now -- in the last four-plus years -- five years. So that's part of it. Part of it is the popularity of the event with, you know, the margarita event at the end of this month being quite popular. The Octoberfest event in September -- because Octoberfest is in September which took me a while to realize -- that's also a big one. And that's also in part why those two event we do Saturday and Sunday. I -- I -- I -problems are more apt to occur when there's too many people like in the four or five, 6,000 range, when people fudge their numbers, or when bars are overcrowded and people are in the streets not getting in because every place is wall to wall. And they -- they bought a ticket for something, and instead of that something they're standing on a sidewalk. So I'm avoiding -I'm -- my goal is to avoid that. And the way that we do that is by making sure that the venues are ready, that they're spaced out, and that we don't set a route for -that we require them to follow. So these numbers are

1 based on what I'm comfortable with that the venues can

2 handle, what I'm confident that the guests will enjoy. And all of that based upon the experience of the prior events that we've done. Usually it's the exact same thing. The only new thing that we're doing this year event-wise is the LGBT event which I'm guessing based on -- not The Stride of Pride because we haven't had that -- but on the prior everything else. That's -- that's how I'm coming up with these numbers.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, and I -- one thing I'll -- and I'll say this to you if when you put numbers there and when you have fact-finding hearings you need to let the -- you need to inform The Board about the numbers, that you're comfortable with the numbers because I -- I -- we'll have discussions and of course Mr. Short as a public safety person and the police is always saying that well, you know, we don't -we don't require -- we think that having more than 1,000 in a neighborhood is too much. So you need to make sure that for all the presentations that you -- you let The Board know why -- why you're giving us these numbers and why these numbers are sound numbers for this pub crawl

1 to occur. I just want -- I just want you to know that
2 so you'll know what goes on in The Board's thinking. So
3 if you don't tell us and if we're -- as you hear there 4 are questions about that we believe 2,000 is too much, then you need to say if The Board was to say 1,000 , does it makes sense for you to have an event with a 1,000. So you also need to let the -- The Board know that. I'm not saying that I'm -- I'm not saying that I'm going to vote for 1,000. But I'm just letting you know that -based on the questions that are -- that have been asked here -- that you need to be prepared to tell The Board how you got to the numbers and what numbers are reasonable to deal with. Okay. Yes, Mr. Short.

MR. SHORT: Mr. Kramer, you were present for all the hearings and you heard the community especially the BIDs and a lot of the business owners who participated that were quite dismayed by what took place. Again, we're going to trust you with the 2,000 at this particular time. But just be conscious that we are watching. And I -- I for one as a board member -- I can't speak for the others -- would not like to see ever the community come in here again and complain about pub
crawls, ongoing events --

MR. KRAMER: Mr. Short, I'm --
MR. SHORT: -- take place on our street.
MR. KRAMER: -- I'm right with you on that, sir.

MR. SHORT: Okay. All right. Well, we'll be watching. And -- and again, your record dictates that right now we will just keep going the way we're going and just -- okay. Once last question I'll ask you.

MR. KRAMER: Yes, sir.

MR. SHORT: You're the only one that's going to be having a pub crawl at this particular -- at least a licensed pub crawl?

MR. KRAMER: As far as I know, yes, sir.
MR. SHORT: Okay. Now, should someone try to butt in or someone try to illegally participate during your event what will you do?

MR. KRAMER: Well, so I still have the -the hotline that Investigator Puentes (sic) -- excuse me -- Puentes gave me last time so that's the go-to. I'm not the enforcer of ABRA, MPD public safety rules. I'm

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responsible for what's going on at my venue with my event with my participants. We do have, you know, for the bourbon event -- like most of our events we have not just checking but two forms. They have to have the event specific wrist band which only goes on a set wrist, not left or right -- we choose so it's consistent that way -- and their name on their ticket which they wear around their neck which has to match their ID. So you've got one to match two to match three. If somebody who is not aware of those -- of what the ticket looks like and what the wrist band looks like in advance, I would be impressed with their forgery skills if they could get all of that together within the three hours of check-in.

MR. SHORT: Okay. Well, that -- that's a great answer. But again, if someone were to try and attempt to butt in on your licensed and Board approved event, I would -- I would just ask you as best you can notify ABRA and the Metropolitan Police as soon as possible to keep your -- your record clear.

MR. KRAMER: Exactly. They're not just a threat to the others. They're a threat to us as well.

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MR. SHORT: Okay. Thank you. That's the point I'm trying to make. Okay. Thank you very much. That's all I have, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Any other questions from any board members? Well, as you -- as you have stated, Mr. Kramer, you enjoy coming to these events. It appears that it's a learning -- it's a learning experience for you. And I -- I do appreciate your -- I mean being -- being here and speaking about the event and defending your position. So I do appreciate that. All right. With that said I then -hearing the presentation, I would support The Board granting -- approving the D.C. Bourbon Bash for June 18th, 2016 for maximum participants of no more than 2,000 people. Is there a second?

MR. ALBERTI: Second.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Alberti has seconded the motion. All those in favor say aye. [Chorus of ayes]. Opposed. [No audible response].

None. Okay. The -- The Board has granted -- and thank you Mr. -- thank you, Mr. Kramer, and -- and please continue to -- to -- as The Board says your reputation

1 precedes you. And so as long as your reputation

2 precedes you then when you come to The Board we might

MS. MILLER: We have everything. Okay.
Great. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All
right. Thank you.
