AMENDED FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER

AG Corporation, t/a Fairmont Liquor and Grocery at premises 2633 Sherman Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C., holder of a Retailer's Class A License, violated D.C. Official Code § 25-722; D.C. Official Code § 25-724; and D.C. Official Code § 25-741 (a). The Board ordered the Respondent to pay a fine in the amount of \$2,750.00 by no later than thirty (30) days from the date of the Order. Furthermore, the Respondent's license was suspended for five (5) days; two (2) days served and three (3) days stayed for (1) year, provided that the Respondent did not commit any ABC violations.


The Board now seeks to amend Order No. 2010-358 to clarify that the Respondent is required to serve the two (2) days of suspension on July 22 and July 23, 2010. All other terms and conditions adopted by Order No. 2010-358 shall remain in full force and effect.


Accordingly, it is this 23rd day of June 2010, **ORDERED** that:




2. All other terms and conditions of Order No. 2010-358 shall remain in full force and effect; and

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code § 2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 500 Indiana Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001. However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1719.1 (April 2004) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion.
