
ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that American Foreign Service, t/a Foreign Service Club (Respondent), has failed to renew its License No. ABRA-001008, a Retailer's Class CX Club license. Specifically, the Respondent failed to renew its license by March 31, 2016, the deadline for all Retailer's Class CX Club licenses, despite being notified of the renewal date.

On April 27, 2016, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist against American Foreign Service, t/a Foreign Service Club, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to renew its Retailer's Class CX Club License.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 4th day of May, 2016, that American Foreign Service's License No. ABRA-001008 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
