**ORDER ON DISMISSAL OF PROTEST OF
A GROUP OF FIVE OR MORE INDIVIDUALS**

The Application filed by Sunnyside Group, LLC, t/a Good Stuff Eatery, for renewal of its Retailer's Class DR License, having been protested, came before the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) for a Roll Call Hearing on May 16, 2016, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 25-601 (2001).

On May 16, 2016, the Board dismissed the Group of Five or More Individuals because the protest letter was not signed by any of the members of the group listed on the Protest. Pursuant to 23 DCMR § 1605.3, all protests shall be signed by the protestant and shall contain the protestant's full name and mailing address. *See also* 23 DCMR § 1801.2(f) (requiring that the printed name and address of each petitioner, accompanied by his or her handwritten signature). The six (6) individuals merely printed their names but did not sign the protest letter.

The Group of Five or More Individuals' protest letter was received by ABRA on May 2, 2016, petition deadline.


The Group of Five or More Individuals may file a Request for Reinstatement with the Board within ten (10) days from the date of this Order.





Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
