That's Case No. 12-PRO-00043, Albert's Liquors, located at 328 Kentucky Avenue, S.E., License No. 77335, in ANC 6B.</p> <p>Are the parties on that case here? Please come forward. And when you're ready, would you introduce yourselves for the record? Do we -- I understand that -- do we have an interpreter here?</p> <p>MS. MCKENZIE: Yes.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. I just want to have you introduce yourself for the record. And I'll - - I'd like to swear you in, if I could. All right.</p> <p>And what is your name?</p> <p>MS. MCKENZIE: My name is Monica McKenzie.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: McKenzie. Okay. And what language will you be interpreting?</p> <p>MS. MCKENZIE: I'll be Spanish.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Spanish. Okay. So would you raise your hand? And do you solemnly affirm that you will faithfully and accurately interpret the</p>	4
3	<p>proceedings in this matter from Spanish into English and from English into Spanish to the best of your ability?</p> <p>MS. MCKENZIE: I do.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. Thank you very much. Okay. And then -- and who is with you?</p> <p>MS. MCKENZIE: Mr. Jorge Ventura, Albert Liquors.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And is he the owner? Is he the --</p> <p>MS. MCKENZIE: He's the owner.</p> <p>MR. VENTURA: Yeah.</p> <p>MS. MCKENZIE: He is the -- "I am the owner."</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay, okay. Fine.</p> <p>Thank you. Good morning.</p> <p>MS. GREEN: Good morning. Carol Green, ANC 6B.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.</p> <p>MS. GREEN: Commissioner and chair of the ABC Board.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Well, let me ask you if you want to address any preliminary matters in this</p>	5
2	<p>case. I'm familiar -- if I'm correct, there's a letter that was submitted by Mr. Ventura, asking the Board to dismiss the protest. Do you have a copy of that letter, Ms. Green?</p> <p>MS. GREEN: I do and I do have a -- should have a response from us.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: I'm not sure that we do. But I'd --</p> <p>MS. GREEN: We sent out an email and also a hard copy.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, let me check. I think this was on our agenda for this afternoon.</p> <p>MS. GREEN: Yes.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: But since you're here this morning, I thought I'd give you an opportunity if you wanted to address it. And the Board can give you its feedback right now instead of this afternoon when you would be here. Do you want to -- maybe you can just tell me -- tell us what your response was.</p> <p>MS. GREEN: There's so many of these things.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Oh, okay. If that's too difficult --</p>	4
3	<p>MS. GREEN: I wasn't prepared --</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: -- we'll wait.</p> <p>MS. GREEN: -- for this. So I --</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: That's okay. All right. We're going to look for that response just so that we can have that. Because we were -- we intended to decide this this morning for you. It's a -- it's a very basic issue and important for you to have a decision on and hear the Board on. But what we'd like to do is just come back to your case, if you -- if you can stay a little long, while we just look for that email.</p> <p>I can understand that you, you know, you didn't know you were going to have to talk about it. And you have a lot of cases in your head. I understand.</p> <p>MS. GREEN: It was a jolt to start the trial.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. And you don't have it with you, correct?</p> <p>MS. GREEN: We don't.</p> <p>CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay.</p> <p>MS. GREEN: Sorry.</p>	5

So if you wouldn't 3 mind taking a seat in the audience and we'll call you 4 again after we locate that. 5 (WHEREUPON, at 9:56 a.m., the hearing went 6 off record until 10:07 a.m.) 7 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Okay. We are -- we're 8 turning to Case No. 12-PRO-00043. Okay. It's my 9 understanding that the email was found with the letter. 10 However, it will take us a while to read that letter. 11 And it is on our agenda for this afternoon. So the 12 Board will take the time later to read both letters. 13 And we have -- we've read the first one that I've 14 talked to for Mr. Ventura -- and then address it at the 15 agenda. 16 It was on our agenda item this afternoon. I 17 just wanted to give the parties any opportunity, since 18 you're here, to say anything else to that point about 19 the request for -- that ANC be dismissed. If you had 20 anything else to add, we would take it -- or would hear 21 it. 22 Okay. So we'll look at the letters and we'll</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">8</p> <p>1 documents, please see Ms. Fashbaugh at the conclusion 2 of this hearing. 3 It's important that you review the rules 4 closely and follow them before and during the protest 5 hearing. You are required to complete and submit the 6 protest information form, sometimes referred to as a 7 PIF, seven days before the date of the hearing. This 8 document needs to be submitted to ABRA and to the 9 opposing parties in this matter. 10 If we do not receive a copy of your PIF, your 11 application or your protest, whichever side you're on 12 may be subject to dismissal. So pay careful attention 13 that you get that PIF form in in that time frame and 14 serve the other parties. The form greatly assists the 15 Board in focusing at the hearing and facilitating the 16 process and keeping the parties on point. 17 If you have any questions, contact Ms. 18 Fashbaugh at 202-397-3971. And you could stop by today 19 if you have any questions. She's here. Okay? 20 MS. MCKENZIE: What is her name? 21 CHAIRPERSON MILLER: Ms. Fashbaugh, F-A-S-H- 22 B-A- U-G-H. Okay. Anything else? Okay.
