3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case  
4 on our calendar is a Show Cause Hearing, Case No.  
5 18-AUD-00027, La Dulce Noche, License No. 92426.

6 Will the parties, please, approach and  
7 identify themselves for the record, please?

8 MS. SCHMIDT: Good morning. Amy  
9 Schmidt, Assistant Attorney General for the  
10 District of Columbia.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,  
12 Ms. Schmidt.

13 MR. SOLLOSO: Good morning. Jose  
14 Solloso, the owner.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, sir,  
16 I did not get your last name.

17 MR. SOLLOSO: Jose Solloso.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso?

19 MR. SOLLOSO: Solloso.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Solloso.

21 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,

1 sir. All right. So this is a Show Cause Hearing.

2 Are there any preliminary matters in  
3 this case?

4 MS. SCHMIDT: Yes. In this matter, Mr.  
5 Solloso has indicated that he is going to  
6 stipulate to the facts of the report and he just  
7 wishes to make a statement concerning these  
8 facts.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So  
10 why don't you tell me what is it that Mr. Solloso  
11 is stipulating to, please.

12 MS. SCHMIDT: He is stipulating -- he  
13 will be stipulating to Charge 1, which is failure  
14 to comply with retail requirements as mandated by  
15 DC Code § 25-113(b)(3)(B) and in other words, he  
16 failed to comply with the food sales percentages  
17 that are mandated by the statute.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So  
19 he is going to make a statement. So what is it  
20 that you are -- what is it that you recommend  
21 that the Board do?

22 MS. SCHMIDT: We recommend that the

1 Board fine Mr. Solloso, this is his third  
2 primary, \$4,000 and that this -- his license  
3 shall be suspended indefinitely until this fine  
4 is paid. And he can have up to 90 days to pay it.

5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All  
6 right. Mr. Solloso, can you raise your right  
7 hand, please?

8 Whereupon,

9 JOSE SOLLOSO  
10 was called as a witness by Counsel for the  
11 Government, and having been first duly sworn,  
12 assumed the witness stand and was examined and  
13 testified as follows:

14 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes, sir, I do.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So  
16 can you -- there is a sign-in sheet, so make sure  
17 that you sign in your name, so we have the proper  
18 spelling of your name.

19 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes, sir.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what is it  
21 that you want to say, sir?

22 MR. SOLLOSO: Well, I go to plead

1 guilty with explanation.

2 I try -- the numbers they have is  
3 correct. I do the number to give it to the  
4 booking person. And well, I try hard to do the  
5 correct thing, but in my establishment, my menu  
6 is very low price and the liquor is not low, but  
7 it's, you know, beer. I don't serve too much  
8 liquor anyhow.

9 And the thing is any person who said,  
10 you know, a couple customers go to there, ask for  
11 a plate, divide the plate. The plate cost sample  
12 \$20. Divide the plate and ask for two, three,  
13 bills, that's the same price. That mean for, you  
14 know, balance and the price of the liquor and the  
15 food, sometimes I have a problem.

16 And especially, you know, sometimes in  
17 the summer, sometimes in the winter. I do now is  
18 I lower the price of the menu, the food, I do a  
19 little better, but, you know, still that's just  
20 my explanation.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So let me ask  
22 you a question, sir. Are you -- what are you?

1 Are you a restaurant? I'm not being facetious.  
2 Are you a restaurant? Are you a bar? I mean, what  
3 are you?

4 MR. SOLLOSO: Well, I have both. I  
5 have a little bar that a little bar like seven  
6 booths. I sell -- like angled seven booths by  
7 four. Four for one side, seven booths for the  
8 other side. I mean, the bar is not big. They  
9 don't drink at the bar. They drink at the  
10 tables. But everybody when go to eating there,  
11 especially the Spanish people, they ask for, you  
12 know, an entertainment for the (speaks in  
13 Spanish), that's a little thing cost \$10.99,  
14 \$9.99 a small plate. And ask for four bills, two  
15 and two. And the price of beer go up and the  
16 food to go low, you know. And that's my numbers.

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's what I'm  
18 asking you. That's what I'm asking you, sir.

19 MR. SOLLOSO: But what can I say to  
20 the customer? No, you cannot drink four beers?  
21 You -- I need to sell more food?

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But that's why

1 I'm asking you. Are you -- because if you are  
2 saying that you have a little bar --

3 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes, the bar is --

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- if you have  
5 a little bar, a little bar should not mess up  
6 your food sale, because when I see a little bar,  
7 I see a little bar.

8 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, if you had  
10 a big bar and a little --

11 MR. SOLLOSO: No, I don't.

12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- and two  
13 tables -- yeah, but you are saying to me you have  
14 a little bar, so maybe you need to look to see  
15 are you really a restaurant or are you a tavern.

16 MR. SOLLOSO: Well, it's not a tavern.  
17 It's a restaurant, but I don't know.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm not -- I'm  
19 just saying to you you are telling me you have a  
20 little bar and so if you have a little bar, then  
21 you shouldn't be generating that much money from  
22 a little bar, because you should be generating a

1 lot of food.

2 MR. SOLLOSO: I understand, but the  
3 bar is not the big, you know, sale that gets the  
4 bar. The most problem we have is when they eat.  
5 At the bar, they drink one, two beers and go.  
6 The thing is when they eat. When they eat, they  
7 ask for food, okay, but the food test -- well,  
8 you know, you saw the check. The food is lower  
9 sometimes than beverage.

10 But right now because the bar is a  
11 small bar, the bar is not raise much money  
12 anyhow. But it's not much -- you know, it's not  
13 much explanation, you know. That's why I plead  
14 guilty, because my -- I understand my beverage go  
15 up and the food sometimes, sometimes not always.

16 MEMBER ALBERTI: May I ask him?

17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr.  
18 Alberti.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: Mr. Solloso?

20 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes.

21 MEMBER ALBERTI: Is there some reason  
22 that you can't be a tavern? That you couldn't

1 get a Tavern License?

2 MR. SOLLOSO: No. No, there's not  
3 some reason. The thing is I don't know the --  
4 where I have the establishment good to have a  
5 problem for having dancing. I don't know. But I  
6 never applied for it.

7 MEMBER ALBERTI: My suggestion to you,  
8 I mean, well, I'll take that back.

9 I will just tell you that one of the  
10 ways to solve your problem --

11 MR. SOLLOSO: Yeah, I understand.

12 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- would be to ask  
13 for a class change and become a tavern. Now, I  
14 understand the licensing fee is a bit higher, but  
15 it's marginally. I mean, we are talking a couple  
16 hundred dollars, which is cheaper than this --  
17 much cheaper than this fine.

18 MR. SOLLOSO: I understand. Well,  
19 that's why this thing is not happening all -- you  
20 know, they happening now. Yeah, I tried to  
21 figure out why.

22 MEMBER ALBERTI: Yeah, no, I

1 understand.

2 MR. SOLLOSO: Because of the food too  
3 high or what, but, you know, this not happen  
4 before. I hope that now I think it's correct. I  
5 hope we going the right way. Probably won't need  
6 to change the license, because, you know, I tried  
7 the solution to trouble.

8 MEMBER ALBERTI: And I understand the  
9 problem that you face, but again --

10 MR. SOLLOSO: Yeah, okay. Thank you.

11 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- one of the  
12 solutions is --

13 MR. SOLLOSO: Thank you. Thank you.

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- to apply for a  
15 Tavern License. It doesn't -- the only obstacle  
16 is dealing with the community probably and that--

17 MR. SOLLOSO: Yeah, well, things  
18 happen. And I, you know, understand.

19 MEMBER ALBERTI: All right. Thank  
20 you.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso,  
22 did you own this establishment in August of 2015?

1 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes.

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

3 Because you had this same issue in August of  
4 2015. All right. So what is it that you are  
5 asking us to do, sir? What do you want us to do?

6 The Government told us that they need  
7 to -- we need to charge you -- how much did you  
8 say?

9 MS. SCHMIDT: \$4,000.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: \$4,000 and give  
11 you 90 days to pay.

12 MR. SOLLOSO: Well, if you don't have  
13 other consideration, what can I do?

14 MEMBER ALBERTI: Well, this is a Show  
15 Cause, so --

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm --

17 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- we don't have to  
18 announce the --

19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, I know.

20 MEMBER ALBERTI: -- penalty.

21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I know. I'm  
22 asking him, I mean, they agreed to the penalty,

1 to the facts. The Government told me what they  
2 want. He said he wanted explanation, so I'm  
3 asking him what is it that you want me to do.  
4 What decision do you want the Board to make?

5 MR. SOLLOSO: Like I say, I agree.  
6 You know, I pled guilty in the situation. I  
7 mean, I have always a situation.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.  
9 Okay. Anything else you want to say, sir?

10 MR. SOLLOSO: No. Thank you.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All  
12 right. As Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage  
13 Control Board for the District of Columbia and in  
14 accordance with DC Official Code Section 2-574(b)  
15 of the Open Meetings Act, I move that the ABC  
16 Board hold a closed meeting for the purpose of  
17 seeking legal advice from our counsel on Case No.  
18 18-AUD-00027, La Dulce Noche, pursuant to DC  
19 Official Code Section 2-574(b)(4) of the Open  
20 Meetings Act and deliberating upon Case No. 18-  
21 AUD-00027, La Dulce Noche, for the reasons cited  
22 in DC Official Code Section 2-574(b)(13) of the

1 Open Meetings Act.

2 Is there a second?

3 MEMBER SHORT: Second.

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has  
5 seconded the motion. I will now take a roll call  
6 vote on the motion before us now that it has been  
7 seconded.

8 Ms. Wahabzadah? Oh, I didn't realize  
9 she was not here.

10 Mr. Silverstein?

11 MEMBER SILVERSTEIN: I agree.

12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short?

13 MEMBER SHORT: I agree.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Alberti?

15 MEMBER ALBERTI: I agree.

16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?

17 MEMBER CATO: I agree.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Isaac?

19 MEMBER ISAAC: I agree.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson?

21 I agree.

22 As it appears that the motion has

1 passed, I hereby give notice that the ABC Board  
2 will recess these proceedings to hold a closed  
3 meeting in the ABC Board conference room pursuant  
4 to Section 2-574(b) of the Open Meetings Act.

5 Thank you. This matter is in recess.

6 Mr. Solloso, what I'll ask you to do  
7 and maybe you can just investigate, maybe before  
8 you leave here today, you can talk to someone in  
9 the Licensing Office who can give you at least  
10 some preliminary information about maybe if you  
11 want to consider changing -- investigating a  
12 class change.

13 Meaning that to change from a  
14 restaurant to a tavern, what that consists of and  
15 whether or not you believe -- and then you will  
16 make a decision whether or not it is worthwhile  
17 making that -- whether or not you believe your  
18 community would agree to a class change from a  
19 restaurant to a tavern, because at least if you  
20 have -- if -- as you are saying, you are truly a  
21 restaurant, but you are selling food.

22 With food, the food price is not a

1 while lot and people are coming in buying beers.  
2 I don't know, but so at least you can sit down  
3 with someone from the Agency who will explain to  
4 you the different classes and then you can make a  
5 decision whether or not you want to approach the  
6 community just to make the change.

7           And if you have been a good operator,  
8 if you have a good relationship with the ANC,  
9 maybe they won't fight it. I don't know. But  
10 that's a decision that you have to make. But I  
11 would say since you are here, you can just stop  
12 by the front desk and just ask to speak with  
13 someone in licensing, so they can give you  
14 information about what a tavern is and whether or  
15 not you -- and for you to decide if that's  
16 something you want to consider. Okay, sir?

17           MR. SOLLOSO: Okay. Thank you.

18           CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.  
19 Thank you very much. Have a good day. All  
20 right. That's it.

21           (Whereupon, the Show Cause Hearing was  
22 concluded at 11:06 a.m.)
