
ORDER ON PRAECIPE OF DISMISSAL

On November 3, 2016, the District of Columbia (Government) filed a Praeipce of Dismissal seeking dismissal of the charge listed in the Notice to Show Cause Hearing filed against Mockingbird Hill, LLC, t/a Mockingbird Hill (Respondent), in Case No. 15-CMP-00882. *See* ABRA Show Cause File No. 15-CMP-00882.

The Government seeks to dismiss the charges because the Government's witness is no longer available for the hearing. Specifically, the Investigator is no longer employed with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA).







Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-433(d)(1), any party adversely affected may file a Motion for Reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) days of service of this Order with the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration, 2000 14th Street, N.W., Suite 400S, Washington, DC 20009.

Also, pursuant to section 11 of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, Pub. L. 90-614, 82 Stat. 1209, D.C. Official Code §2-510 (2001), and Rule 15 of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, any party adversely affected has the right to appeal this Order by filing a petition for review, within thirty (30) days of the date of service of this Order, with the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 430 E Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; (202/879-1010). However, the timely filing of a Motion for Reconsideration pursuant to 23 DCMR §1719.1 (2008) stays the time for filing a petition for review in the District of Columbia Court of Appeals until the Board rules on the motion. See D.C. App. Rule 15(b) (2004).
