ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Naby's Island Restaurant, LLC, t/a Naby's Island Restaurant located at 1128 H Street, N.E., Washington, D.C., has failed to renew License No. ABRA-078054, a Retailer's Class CT License. Specifically, you failed to renew your license by September 30, 2010, the deadline for all Retailer's Class CT licenses, despite being notified of the renewal date.

On October 20, 2010, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist against Naby's Island Restaurant, LLC, t/a Naby's Island Restaurant located at 1128 H Street, N.E., Washington, D.C., pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to renew its Retailer's Class CT License. *See Board Order Number 2010-528.*


